### WORLD NO.1

For the fourth major in a row, **Iga Swiatek** enters as WTA World No.1. Swiatek attained the ranking on April 4, following the retirement of Ashleigh Barty. The Pole's 2022 campaign was highlighted by a 37-match wins streak – the longest on Tour for 32 years – which eventually came to an end with a loss to Alizé Cornet in the third round at Wimbledon.

This stellar form brought Swiatek eight titles in 2022, including her second and third Grand Slams at Roland Garros and the US Open. She is seeded No.1 at the Australian Open this year, where her best result from four previous appearances was a semifinal run 12 months ago.

This fortnight will mark Swiatek's 42nd and 43rd weeks at No.1, where she will remain following the conclusion of the tournament, regardless of the results in Melbourne.

### ACTIVE GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS

The 2022 season welcomed one new Grand Slam champion: **Elena Rybakina** won her maiden Grand Slam singles title at Wimbledon in July, defeating Ons Jabeur in the final. There are 16 active Grand Slam champions, four of whom have lifted the trophy previously at Australian Open: **Sofia Kenin** (2020), **Naomi Osaka** (2019, 2021), **Angelique Kerber** (2016) and **Victoria Azarenka** (2012-13).

### STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST ROUND SUCCESS

Sixteen players have earned their main draw place by winning through the qualifying rounds. At the 2021 US Open, Emma Raducanu became the first qualifier, male or female, to win a major title in the Open Era. Before that, the deepest run by a qualifier at any of the majors was to the semifinals – achieved by Nadia Podoroska at 2020 Roland Garros, Alexandra Stevenson at 1999 Wimbledon and Christine Dorey at the 1978 Australian Open.

### TEENAGE KICKS...

There are **seven** teenagers in the women's singles draw at the 2023 Australian Open.

The Czech Republic's **Brenda Fruhvirtova** (15) is the youngest player in the field at Melbourne this year, followed by compatriot **Sara Bejlek** (16), **Linda Fruhvirtova** (17), **Talia Gibson** (18), **Diana Shnaider** (18), **Coco Gauff** (18) and **Polina Kudermetova** (19).

A teenager has won a Grand Slam singles title 36 times (15 different players) in the Open Era most recently at 2021 US Open when **Emma Raducanu** (18yrs, 274 days) won her first major title. The youngest player to win a Grand Slam title in the Open Era is **Martina Hingis** at 1997 Australian Open (16 years, 105 days).
