- The 38th edition of the women's singles at the Miami Open presented by Itaú features the WTA's Top 20, led by defending champion and World No.1 **Iga Swiatek**
- Last year, Swiatek won the title and this fortnight looks to become the seventh different player to defend this title. After a first-round bye, she will start her defense against either **Katerina Siniakova** or **Claire Liu**
- In addition to Swiatek, two other previous Miami winners are in the draw – **Victoria Azarenka** (2009, 2011, 2016) and **Sloane Stephens** (2018) – with a further three runners-up also in attendance – **Bianca Andreescu** (2021), **Karolina Pliskova** (2019) and **Jelena Ostapenko** (2018)
- The No.2 seed this fortnight is recent Australian Open champion **Aryna Sabalenka**, who, having fallen in the second round here 12 months ago, can continue to make inroads into Swiatek's 3,235-point lead at the top of the WTA rankings. She will begin her challenge against either Stephens or **Shelby Rogers**



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- Leading the charge for the home nation is No.3 seed **Jessica Pegula**, who will face either **Linda Fruhvirtova** or a qualifier in her opening match. Last year, she made it all the way to the semifinals here, overcoming Stephens, **Elena Rybakina** and **Paula Badosa** along the way
- Rounding out the leading quartet of seeds is No.4 **Ons Jabeur**, who reached the fourth round at the Hard Rock Stadium in both 2021 and 2022, and opens her latest challenge against either a qualifier or **Maryna Zanevska**
- The pick of the first-round pairings thrown together in Sunday's draw is Andreescu versus **Emma Raducanu**, who will face off for the right to play No.7 seed **Maria Sakkari** in the second round
- *One to Watch* – **Linda Fruhvirtova**. Last year at Miami, Fruhvirtova made the most of her wildcard to reach the fourth round. She returns inside the Top 50, following an impressive 12 months, which have seen her win a maiden WTA title at Chennai and reach the last 16 at the Australian Open

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NO.1 RANKING

Current World No.1 Iga Swiatek is defending 1,000 ranking points as defending Miami champion. As she holds a 3,235-point lead over No.2 Aryna Sabalenka, the Pole is guaranteed to remain in top spot at the culmination of the tournament, thus extending her total number of weeks at the summit to 53 (including the week of April 3).

This is the 38th year of the WTA tournament at Miami. Some facts and figures since 1985:

- Seventeen different women have won the singles title at Miami. Aside from **Serena Williams** who has won a record eight singles titles, other multiple winners are **Stefanie Graf** (5), **Venus Williams** (3), **Victoria Azarenka** (3), **Monica Seles** (2), **Arantxa Sánchez Vicario** (2), **Martina Hingis** (2), **Kim Clijsters** (2) and **Ashleigh Barty** (2)
- The title has been won 11 times by the current WTA No.1 ranked player and 32 times by a player who held the No.1 ranking at some point during their career. Of the former champions at Miami, only five have not held the No.1 ranking: **Gabriela Sabatini** (1989), **Svetlana Kuznetsova** (2006), **Agnieszka Radwanska** (2012), **Johanna Konta** (2017) and **Sloane Stephens** (2018)
- The final has featured the Top 2 seeds seven times (1985, 1986, 1988, 1989, 1993, 2001, 2014) with the top seed winning six of those finals; the No.1 seed has won the final 14 times overall
- An American has won the singles title 14 times, with the last of these coming in 2018 (Stephens)
- Florida resident S.Williams is the most successful player in the tournament's history, winning more matches (76) and titles (8) than any other player:
