## 2023 ROLAND GARROS

The first national French Championships for women were held in 1897, with foreign competitors eligible to take part from 1925. As such, this year's Roland Garros represents the 116th staging of the event overall, and 93rd edition since international players were admitted (the tournament was not held during WWI and WWII). This year also marks the 56th staging of the Open Era (which began in 1968). Of the 128 players in the singles main draw, 104 gain direct entry based on WTA Singles Rankings (week of April 17, 2023). In addition, there are 16 qualifiers who play three rounds of qualifying matches, as well as eight wildcards.

## WORLD NO.1

Iga Swiatek has held the World No.1 ranking since April 4, 2022. During the Roland Garros fortnight, Swiatek will spend the 61st and 62nd consecutive weeks atop the WTA Rankings, the 12th most weeks at No.1. Her streak, as it extends to 62-straight weeks; only Steffi Graf (186 weeks) and Martina Hingis (80 weeks) held the No.1 ranking longer than Swiatek on their respective first stint at No.1.

## SINGLES NO.1 SCENARIOS

For the first time since taking over as World No.1 Iga Swiatek will be playing a tournament with the No.1 ranking on the line.

- Swiatek is defending 2,000 points as the defending champion.
- Sabalenka reached the third round last year at Roland Garros (130) and also has points from 's-Hertogenbosch (180 points, as runner-up) dropping off her ranking points.

Therefore, Sabalenka has a chance to overtake Swiatek at No.1 after Roland Garros.

- Swiatek will need to reach the quarterfinals to have a chance to stay at No.1.
  - If Sabalenka reaches R16 or QF, then Swiatek would need to reach SF to have a chance of staying No.1
  - If Sabalenka reaches SF, then Swiatek would need to reach the final to have a chance of staying at No.1
  - If Sabalenka reaches the final, Swiatek could hold on to No.1 only by winning the title

Should Swiatek lose prior to the QF, then Sabalenka will take over as World No.1 on Monday, June 12, after Roland Garros.

## SINIAKOVA HITS CENTURY MARK AT NO.1

May 29 marks Katerina Siniakova's 100th week as doubles World No.1. Siniakova has held the No.1 ranking since September 12, 2022, and the two weeks at Roland Garros will mark her 38th and 39th consecutive weeks atop the doubles rankings. Siniakova will become the eighth woman to hold the doubles No.1 ranking for 100+ weeks, along with Martina Navratilova (237), Liezel Huber (199), Cara Black (163), Lisa Raymond (137), Natasha Zvereva (124), Aranxta Sanchez-Vicario (111) and Roberta Vinci (110).

## ANNIVERSARY QUEENS

Among other notable anniversaries, the 2023 edition of Roland Garros marks 10 years since **Serena Williams** captured her second French title to complete her double Career Grand Slam.

Twenty years ago, **Justin Henin** overcame compatriot Kim Clijsters to lift her first of four French titles, and first of seven slam titles overall.

YEAR	CHAMPION
5 years ago – 2018	World No.1 <b>Simona Halep</b> won her first slam title and became just the sixth player to win both the girls' singles title and the women's singles title at Roland Garros, as well as the fourth woman to win a Grand Slam singles title after three or more runner-up appearances.
10 years ago – 2013	<b>Serena Williams</b> captured her second of three eventual Roland Garros titles, defeating the defending champion Maria Sharapova in the final. It was her sixteenth slam singles title overall and set a record for the longest gap between successive French Open titles (her first title came in 2002).
15 years ago – 2008	<b>Ana Ivanovic</b> claimed her first and only Slam title at the French Open, making her the first Serbian woman to win a singles Slam title and the second Serbian overall after Novak Djokovic won his first major title at the Australian Open earlier that year.
20 years ago – 2003	<b>Justine Henin</b> won her first grand slam title by defeating fellow Belgian Kim Clijsters, making her the first Belgian woman to win a Slam title. She would go on to win four more titles at Roland Garros.

30 years ago – 1993	<b>Steffi Graf</b> won her third of six Roland Garros title, reclaiming the World No.1 ranking with a three-set win over Mary Jo Fernandez.
35 years ago – 1988	On her way to winning the calendar Golden Slam, a feat no one else has completed, <b>Steffi Graf</b> lifted her second Roland Garros title and third slam title overall. She would go on to win 22 slams, the most in the Open Era until Serena Williams surpassed her in 2017.
40 years ago – 1983	In the first Roland Garros event to have a 128-player draw, <b>Chris Evert</b> won her fifth of seven Roland Garros singles titles by defeating Mima Jaušovec.
45 years ago – 1978	<b>Virginia Ruzici</b> became the first woman from Romania to win a slam title when she defeated Mima Jaušovec in two sets at Roland Garros. Ruzici also won the French Open doubles event with Jaušovec in 1978 and reached the mixed doubles final as well.
50 years ago – 1973	<b>Margaret Court</b> defeated Chris Evert to win her fourth Roland Garros title. This was Chris Evert's very first appearance at Roland Garros, and Court's last slam title on the clay.

## STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with 10 or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's Roland Garros draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Iga Swiatek (15-1 in 1r, 93.8%):** Swiatek has been defeated in 1r only once in 16 Grand Slam main-draw appearances, at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic)
- **Madison Keys (34-5 in 1r, 87.2%):** Has suffered a couple of opening round exits in recent seasons, at 2021 US Open (I. Stephens) and 2020 Roland Garros (I. S.Zhang). Other three losses at this stage came in her teenage years, at 2012 Australian Open (I. J.Zheng), 2013 US Open (I. Jankovic) and 2014 Roland Garros (I. Errani)
- **Coco Gauff (12-2 in 1r, 85.7%):** Only first-round defeats came at 2020 US Open (I. Sevastova) and 2022 Australian Open (I. Q.Wang)
- **Elina Svitolina (30-6 in 1r, 83.3%):** Svitolina has won 26 of her last 27 opening round matches at the Slams – dating back to 2015 Australian Open – with her only loss coming at 2018 Wimbledon (I. Maria). Owns a 9-0 record here in Paris
- **Elise Mertens (20-4 in 1r, 83.3%):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances, however, following this she won 18 straight matches at this stage before this run ended at 2022 US Open (I. Begu)
- **Victoria Azarenka (49-10 in 1r, 83.1%):** Four of her 10 first-round exits came in her opening six major appearances. In recent years she has been defeated in the opening round at the Australian Open in 2019 (I. Siegemund) and 2021 (I. Pegula), and US Open in 2019 (I. Sabalenka)

## QUALIFIERS AT GRAND SLAMS & ROLAND GARROS

Sixteen players earned their main draw place by winning through the qualifying rounds this year, along with three lucky losers – Aliona Bolsova, Nao Hibino and Viktoria Kruncakova.

Emma Raducanu became the first qualifier, male or female, to win a major title in the Open Era by winning the 2021 US Open. Before that, the deepest run by a qualifier at any Grand Slam was to the semifinals – achieved by Nadia Podoroska at 2020 Roland Garros, Alexandra Stevenson at 1999 Wimbledon and Christine Dorey at the 1978 Australian Open.

## ROLAND GARROS MISCELLANY

- The 116th staging of the women's singles at French Championships (having first been played in 1897)
- Only five times, in 1933 (**Margaret Scriven**), 2010 (**Francesca Schiavone**), 2017 (**Jelena Ostapenko**), 2020 (**Iga Swiatek**) and 2021 (**Barbora Krejckikova**) has the singles title at Roland Garros not been won by a Top 10 seed
- The players who have won the most Roland Garros singles titles (in the tournament's entire history) are **Chris Evert** (7); **Stefanie Graf** (6); **Margaret Smith Court** (5); **Justine Henin** and **Helen Wills-Moody** (4); and **Hilde Sperling**, **Monica Seles**, **Arantxa Sánchez-Vicario** and **Serena Williams** (3)
- USA has won the most titles at Roland Garros (29) ahead of Germany (10), then Australia (9) and Great Britain (8)
- The players who own the most doubles titles are **Martina Navratilova** (7), **Simonne Mathieu**, **Natasha Zvereva** and **Gigi Fernandez** (6 apiece)
- Two years ago, **Barbora Krejckikova** became the first player since **Mary Pierce** in 2000 to sweep the singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros. **Lucie Safarova** also contested both the singles and doubles finals in 2015 (finished runner-up in singles, champion in doubles) and **Coco Gauff** in 2022 (finished runner-up in singles and doubles).
- There are three former or current No.1s in the 2023 main draw: **Victoria Azarenka**, **Karolina Pliskova**, and **Iga Swiatek**
- Longest match (time): 4 hours, 7 minutes – V.Buisson (FRA) d. N. Van Lottum (FRA) 67 75 62, 1r, 1995
- Longest match (games): 56 games – K Melville (AUS) d. P.Teeguarden (USA) 97 46 1614, 1r, 1972. Since the introduction of the tiebreak in 1973, the record is 46 games, which has happened twice
- A left-handed player has won the singles title 10 times (most recently, **Monica Seles** in 1992)
- The singles title has been won without dropping a set 21 times (most recently, **Iga Swiatek** in 2020)
- Five players have won the title after saving match point: **Osborne DuPont** (1946); **Smith-Court** (1962); **Myskina** (2004); **Henin** (2005) and **Barbora Krejckikova** (2021)
- Only six players have won the Roland Garros women's singles title after winning the Roland Garros girls' singles title (**Halep**, **Durr**, **Jausovec**, **Mandlikova**, **Capriati** and **Henin**)
- Previous girls' singles winners in this year's main draw are: **Kanepi** (2001), **Cornet** (2007), **Mladenovic** (2009), **Jabeur** (2011), **Bencic** (2013), **Kasatkina** (2014), **Gauff** (2018), **Fernandez** (2019), **Noskova** (2021)

- Last year, **Iga Swiatek** won her second Roland Garros title – becoming the first woman to win multiple Roland Garros titles since Maria Sharapova claimed her second title in 2014
- Two years before, **Barbora Krejckova** won her first Grand Slam in singles on her fifth main draw appearance at the majors, and she became the first woman since 2000 to sweep the singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros. Having saved a match point en route, she also became the first Czech woman to win Roland Garros since Hana Mandlikova in 1981
- Five years ago, **Simona Halep** became the second woman from Romania (after Virginia Ruzici) to win a Grand Slam singles title when she beat Sloane Stephens in the Roland Garros final
- Ten years ago, **Serena Williams** won her second Roland Garros title, giving her at least two titles at every Grand Slam
- In 2011, **Li Na** won the title at Roland Garros as the No.6 seed, the first Asian to win a Grand Slam singles title
- Twenty years ago, **Justine Henin** claimed her first Roland Garros title over compatriot Kim Clijsters
- In the Open Era, the Top 2 seeds have played in the final 12 times, with the No.2 seed winning seven times (most recently 1995)
