2023 WIMBLEDON

This is the 136th Wimbledon Championships. The event was first held in 1877, with the first women's singles championship being staged in 1884. This is the 129th staging of the Wimbledon women's singles championship and the 55th of the Open Era, which began in 1968 and saw the introduction of prize money. Due to the pandemic, the tournament was not held in 2020.

WTA WORLD NO.1

Poland's Iga Swiatek has held the WTA World No.1 ranking since April 4, 2022 and will extend her streak to 67 consecutive weeks atop the rankings, including the weeks of July 3 and July 10 during Wimbledon; only Steffi Graf (186 weeks) and Martina Hingis (80 weeks) held the No.1 ranking longer than Swiatek on their respective first stint at No.1.

ACTIVE GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS

Last season welcomed a new Grand Slam champion in the form of Elena Ryabkina here at Wimbledon, while Aryna Sabalenka won her first Major at the Australian Open earlier this year. There are 17 active Grand Slam champions, seven of whom have lifted the trophy previously at Wimbledon: Simona Halep (2019), Angelique Kerber (2018), Garbiñe Muguruza (2017), Elena Rybakina (2023), Petra Kvitova (2011, 2014), and Venus Williams (2000-01, 2005, 2007-08).

STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with 10 or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's Wimbledon draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Iga Swiatek (16-1 in 1r, 94.1%):** Swiatek has been defeated in 1r only once in 17 Grand Slam main-draw appearances, at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic).
- **Madison Keys (35-5 in 1r, 87.5%):** The American owns an 8-0 record in opening rounds at Wimbledon. Has suffered five opening round exits in recent seasons, most recently at 2021 US Open (I. Stephens) and 2020 Roland Garros (I. S.Zhang). Other three losses at this stage came in her teenage years, at 2012 Australian Open (I. J.Zheng), 2013 US Open (I. Jankovic) and 2014 Roland Garros (I. Errani).
- **Coco Gauff (13-2 in 1r, 86.7%):** Only first-round defeats came at 2020 US Open (I. Sevastova) and 2022 Australian Open (I. Q.Wang).
- **Elina Svitolina (31-6 in 1r, 83.8%):** Svitolina has won 27 of her last 28 opening round matches at the Slams – dating back to 2015 Australian Open – with her only loss coming in that stretch at 2018 Wimbledon (I. Maria). Of six losses overall in opening round at Slams, three have been at Wimbledon (5-3 in R128)
- **Elise Mertens (21-4 in 1r, 82.6%):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances, however, following this she won 18 straight matches at this stage before this run ended at 2022 US Open (I. Begu). She is 4-1 in R128 at Wimbledon.
- **Victoria Azarenka (49-11 in 1r, 81.7%):** The former World No.1 is 13-1 in opening round at Wimbledon, losing only her tournament debut in 2006 (I. to WC Agnieszka Radwanska).

Also worth noting...

- **Elena Rybakina (12-3 in 1r at Slams):** After losing in the first round in her first two Grand Slam appearances – 2019 Roland Garros (I. Katerina Siniakova) and 2019 US Open (I. Karolina Muchova) – has won 12 of last 13 with the only loss in that stretch coming at 2022 US Open (I. Clara Burel). The only time the defending champion lost in opening round at Wimbledon was 1994 (Graf, I. McNeil).
- **Venus Williams (74-17 in 1r at Slams; 20-3 in 1r at Wimbledon):** In first 23 appearances at Wimbledon has lost in the opening round only three times – 1997 (I. Grzybowska), 2012 (I. Vesnina) and 2019 (I. Gauff)
- **Qinwen Zheng (6-0 in 1r at Slams)**
- **Emma Raducanu (6-1 in 1r at Slams)**
- **Petra Kvitova (45-12 in 1r at Slams, 10-4 at Wimbledon)**

QUALIFIERS AT GRAND SLAMS & WIMBLEDON

In 2010, Estonian Kaia Kanepi became the sixth qualifier in the Open Era to reach Wimbledon QF. The best result by a qualifier at Wimbledon came in 1999 when Alexandra Stevenson advanced to SF.

At the 2022 US Open, Emma Raducanu became the first qualifier, male or female, to win a major title in the Open Era. Before that, the deepest run by a qualifier at any Grand Slam was to the semifinals – achieved by Nadia Podoroska at 2020 Roland Garros, Alexandra Stevenson at 1999 Wimbledon and Christine Dorey at the 1978 Australian Open.

ANNIVERSARY QUEENS

Among other notable anniversaries, the 2023 edition of Wimbledon marks 15 years since **Venus Williams** captured her fifth and most recent Wimbledon title by defeating her sister Serena Williams in the final. Since then, Venus Williams has reached further two finals (2009 & 2017) and returns to Wimbledon this year following her absence in 2022.

This year will also mark the final professional appearance of former World No.2 Anett Kontaveit, as she will be ending her career as a professional tennis player due to lumbar disc degeneration diagnosis. Kontaveit has made 8 previous main draw appearances at Wimbledon, with her best runs being 3r showings in 2017-19.

YEAR	CHAMPION
5 years ago – 2018	Angelique Kerber became the first German to win the Wimbledon title since Steffi Graf in 1996, on her way to the title she only lost one set at the tournament. This was her third major singles title.
10 years ago – 2013	Marion Bartoli lifted her first and only major title without losing a set or facing a tie break. By winning her maiden major title in her 47 th appearance, she broke the previous women's record of 45 (Jana Novotna, 1998) for most appearances in majors before lifting a title. The following month, Bartoli, retired from professional tennis, making this her final major appearance.
15 years ago – 2008	Zheng Jie became the first Chinese player to reach the semifinals at a singles major, while also becoming the first wild card to reach the singles semifinals. Her 3r win against Ana Ivanovic also made her the lowest-ranked player (No. 133) to defeat a reigning World No.1 at that time.
20 years ago – 2003	Defending champion, Serena Williams , lifted her second Wimbledon singles title (sixth major singles title overall) by defeating her sister Venus Williams in a rematch of the previous year's final. Venus Williams went on to lift the Wimbledon title five years later in 2008, in a repeat final against her sister Serena Williams.
25 years ago – 1998	Jana Novotna won her first and only Grand Slam title by defeating Nathalie Tauziat in the final, the win came in following two previous runner-up finishes (1993 & 1997). This also marked the first time in the Open Era that neither of the Wimbledon finalists had won a major previously, first time this had happened at any major since the 1980 Australian Open.
30 years ago – 1993	Two-time defending champion, Steffi Graf defeated Jana Novotna in the final to win the her fifth Wimbledon singles title and 13 th major title overall.
35 years ago – 1988	On her third step to winning the calendar Golden Slam, a feat no one else has completed, Steffi Graf lifted her first Wimbledon singles title. She would go on to win 22 slams, the most in the Open Era until Serena Williams surpassed her in 2017. This year also marked the last match Chris Evert and Martina Navratilova faces each other in a major, with Navratilova extending her lead in head-to head rivalry at majors to 14-8.
40 years ago – 1983	Defending champion Martina Navratilova defeated Andrea Jaeger in the final securing her fourth Wimbledon singles title and sixth major singles title overall. While Billie Jean King became the major oldest semifinalist in the Open Era at 39 years, 7 months and 9 days young.
45 years ago – 1978	Martina Navratilova lifted her first of nine Wimbledon titles. Till this day, Navratilova holds the most titles at Wimbledon in the Open Era. Having won her first doubles title at Wimbledon in 1976 (w/ Evert), she also holds the same record in doubles having secured 7 titles in her career.
50 years ago – 1973	On the eve of Wimbledon Championships, June 21, 1973, Billie Jean King founded the Women's Tennis Association at London's Gloucester Hotel. King went on to lift her fifth title at Wimbledon that year, by defeating Chris Evert in the final, as well as the doubles title (w/ Casals) and the mixed doubles (w/ Davidson).

WIMBLEDON MISCELLANY

- Five players have won the singles title after **saving match point**: Blanche Hillyard (1889), Suzanne Lenglen (1919), Helen Wills-Moody (1935), Venus Williams (2005) and Serena Williams (2009)
- Only 12 **nations** are represented on the Wimbledon women's singles roll of honor. British and American women have won 91 of the 122 championships to date. The other nations are Australia, Brazil, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Russia, Spain, Switzerland and Romania
- In 2023, there will be **five moms** competing for the title – Viktoria Azarenka, Tatjana Maria, Barbora Strycova, Elina Svitolina, Yanina Wickmayer.
- In 2004, Maria Sharapova became the **first woman not seeded in the Top 8** to win the Wimbledon singles title since seeding began in 1927. She has since been joined by Venus Williams (2005—No.14 and 2007—No.23), Marion Bartoli (2013—No.15), Garbiñe Muguruza (2017—No.14), Angelique Kerber (2018 – No.11) and Elena Rybakina (2022 – No. 17)
- Just five players have won the Wimbledon women's singles title **after winning the Wimbledon girls' singles title** (Haydon-Jones, Susman, Hingis, Mauresmo and Barty). Former girls' singles winners in the 2023 Wimbledon field are: Belinda Bencic (2013), Jelena Ostapenko (2014), Anastasia Potapova (2016), Claire Liu (2017) and Iga Swiatek (2018).
- The player with the **most women's doubles titles** is Elizabeth Ryan, who won 12 between 1914 and 1934
- Serena Williams was the last player to **win both the singles and doubles titles** in the same year, in 2016
- Ann Jones (1969), Martina Navratilova (nine times), Petra Kvitova (twice) and Angelique Kerber (2018) are the only four **left-handers** to win the Wimbledon women's singles title in the Open Era.
