Jodie Burrage (GBR #96) vs. [2] Aryna Sabalenka (#2)

First meeting

Burrage did not face a break point in her opening round match against No.38 Anna Blinkova... **Burrage** is 1 of 3 British women through to second round, most British women through to second round at the US Open since 1987... In total across in the Men's and Women's singles fields, one of seven British players to win their opening match, going a collective 7-0 in the first round of the US Open ... **Burrage** is looking for her second Top 10 win today having previously defeated No.4 Paula Badosa at 2023 Eastbourne... In her 4th Grand Slam main draw appearance, **Burrage** is seeking her first trip to the third round... **Sabalenka** is 13-4 in R64 at Slams; has not lost in the second round of a Grand Slam in three years (US Open 2020 – I. Azarenka)... With her win in the first round, **Sabalenka** is 16-5 at the US Open, her most wins at any Slam... With 27 winners in her victory over Zanevska, **Sabalenka** now has 596 winners at Grand Slams in 2023, the most of any women's singles player... **Sabalenka** has a chance to overtake Swiatek as World No.1; will need to at least equal Swiatek's result to move to No.1

Patricia Maria Tig (ROU #700) vs. [3] Jessica Pegula (USA #3)

First meeting

Pegula is looking to reach the US Open third round for the third year in a row... **Pegula** is 10-2 in Slam second rounds... **Pegula** has lost only two matches this American hard-court summer: swing to Sakkari (Washington DC SF) and to Bouzkova (Cincinnati, 3r) ... **Pegula** is making her 20th Grand Slam appearance; she is a six-time quarterfinalist at Slams, including the 2022 US Open... **Tig** has faced only one Top 10 opponent (I. Osaka at Roland Garros 2021)... **Tig** is playing her first US Open in three years, where she made the 2r... **Tig** is one of 10 mothers in the main draw, giving birth to daughter Sofia in 2018; earned a spot in main draw via special ranking (No.65)

[5] Ons Jabeur (TUN #5) vs. Linda Noskova (CZE #41)

Noskova leads 1-0

Noskova won the pair's only prior meeting this year in the semifinals at Adelaide #1, where **Jabeur** was the No.1 seed... **Noskova** could become the first Czech player to appear in the second round of the US Open before turning 19 since Nicole Vaidisova in 2007... **Noskova** at age 18 is one of two teenagers left in contention for the US Open title, along with 19-year old Coco Gauff (already through to 3r)... **Noskova** is looking for her first-ever appearance in a third round of a Slam... **Jabeur** has made the US Open third round four years in a row... **Jabeur** won her 12th Grand Slam match of 2023, equaling the most she's won in a single season (12 in 2022)... **Jabeur** has reached the finals of three of the last five Slams (Wimbledon 2022, US Open 2022, Wimbledon 2023)

Martina Trevisan (ITA #58) vs. [9] Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #9)

First meeting

With her victory over Yulia Putintseva, **Trevisan** became the first player in the Open Era to win a Women's Singles Grand Slam main draw match with a 0-6 7-6 7-6 scoreline... **Trevisan** has equaled her best result at the US Open by reaching the second round ... **Trevisan** is looking to reach her first third round at a Slam outside of Roland Garros... **Trevisan** is seeking her 4th Top 10 win and 2nd of the year (also defeated No.6 Sakkari at United Cup)... **Vondrousova** is playing her first Slam since winning Wimbledon in July... **Vondrousova** is 16-0 this season against lower-ranked players... **Vondrousova** has more wins this season (33) than in any other in her career since 2017... Playing in her 5th US Open, **Vondrousova** has advanced past the second round once (2018, R16)

Sofia Kenin (USA #101) vs. [13] Daria Kasatkina (#14)

Kenin leads 2-1

Kenin leads their head-to-head by two wins to one, though **Kasatkina** won their most recent matchup at Sydney 2022... **Kenin** is looking to reach the US Open third round for the fifth time, after reaching the same stage four years in a row from 2017-2020... **Kasatkina** has won multiple matches in nine of her last 12 tournaments... **Kasatkina** is first on Tour in first serve percentage, with 78.1%... **Kasatkina** is making 9th appearance at US Open, with her best result being a R16 finish in 2017

[17] Madison Keys (USA #17) vs. [LL] Yanina Wickmayer (BEL #85)

First meeting

Keys has a 28-8 record in the second round of Slams; she has won her last seven second round matches at the US Open ... **Keys** reached her only Slam final at the US Open in 2017 (l. Stephens)... **Keys** has not lost to a Lucky Loser since falling to Timea Babos at Birmingham 2014... **Wickmayer** was forced to retire in the third round of qualifying, but reached the main draw as a Lucky Loser... **Wickmayer** is one of 10 mothers in the singles main draw at the US Open – she gave birth to daughter Luana in 2021... **Wickmayer** has won three ITF titles in 2023, including two W100-level titles at Trnava and Surbiton... This is **Wickmayer's** 13th appearance at the US Open, having reached the SF in her second appearance in 2009 – her best result at a Slam and only... **Wickmayer** is seeking her first Top 20 win since 2016 Birmingham (d. No.19 Johanna Konta)

Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (#98) vs. [26] Elina Svitolina (UKR #26)

Pavlyuchenkova leads 3-2

Pavlyuchenkova leads their head-to-head 3-2, with **Svitolina** winning their most recent matchup at Rome 2020... **Pavlyuchenkova** is 5-5 in second round matches at the US Open... **Pavlyuchenkova** is making her 14th main draw appearance at the US Open with best result being a QF run in 2011... **Pavlyuchenkova** has won her last four meetings against Top 30 opponents; prior to her 4-match win streak vs. Top 30, had lost 10-straight... **Svitolina** is 10-2 at Grand Slams in 2023... **Svitolina** hit 22 winners to only four unforced errors in her opening round match against Friedsam... **Svitolina** has reached at least the third round each of her last six tries at the US Open

Petra Martic (CRO #37) vs. [31] Marie Bouzkova (CZE #31)

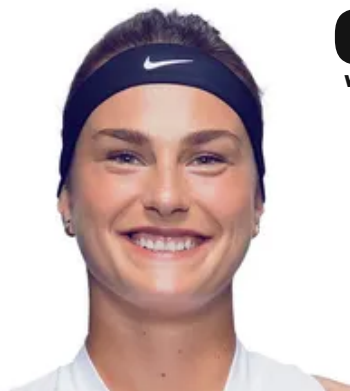
Bouzkova leads 1-0

Bouzkova won their only match played at Monterrey 2022... **Bouzkova** won just her second career singles match at the US Open in the first round... **Bouzkova** joins five other Czech players in the 2r: Vondrousova, Muchova, Kvitova, Pliskova, and Noskova... **Martic** looks to reach the third round of the US Open for the fourth time, after 2019, 2020, and 2022... **Martic** lost 13 of her last 16 matches with Top 50 players before defeating Tatjana Maria in the previous round

[Q] Greet Minnen (BEL #97) vs. [Q] Sachia Vickery (USA #204)

First meeting

With her victory over Venus Williams, **Minnen** won her fourth Tour-level main draw match since the start of 2022 season... **Minnen** is making her 13th Grand Slam main draw appearance; this is her 7th time reaching the main draw through qualifying – 6 as qualifier, once as lucky loser... **Minnen** is aiming to make the third round of a Slam for only the second time in her career (reached that stage at US Open 2021 as a Lucky Loser)... **Minnen** recently reached the final of Kozerki 125, losing to Yastremska... **Vickery** is looking for her first-ever third round Slam appearance, going 0-5 in second round at Slams... **Vickery's** defeat of Donna Vekic in the first round was her first Top 30 win since 2018 Monterrey (d. No.17 Magdalena Rybarikova)... Out of **Vickery's** four matches at US Open this year, three have gone to deciding sets... Last American to reach to reach third round as a qualifier was Taylor Townsend in 2019 (R16)

PLAYER NOTES

- Making her sixth main draw appearance at the US Open, where she is a two-time semifinalist, reaching this stage in 2021 (l. Fernandez) and 2022 (l. Swiatek)
- Can become the WTA World No.1 for the first time in her career this fortnight if she equals Swiatek's results
- US Open Doubles Champion here in 2019 w/Mertens
- Overall this is her 23rd Grand Slam main draw appearance, winning her first Major title earlier this year at the Australian Open (d. Rybakina in F)
- At Wimbledon has made the SFs twice (2022 and 2023) and also made the last four at Roland-Garros in 2023
- Opened 2023 US Open campaign with comfortable win over Zanevska - has now won 13 1r Slam matches in a row, last falling at that stage at 2020 Australian Open (l. Suarez Navarro)
- Bidding to reach her 11th consecutive Slam 3r today. Last 2r loss at a Slam came here in New York in 2020 (l. Azarenka)
- Faces No.96 Burrage today - has never lost to GBR opposition, winning all main draw encounters (Boulter at 2023 Wimbledon and 2019 Australian Open, and Konta at 2018 Cincinnati)
- Loss today would be worst by ranking since 2023 Rome (l. No.134 Kenin). At Slam level, would be worst loss since 2022 Australian Open (l. No.115 Kanepi)
- Is an 11-time hard court champion: Australian Open, Adelaide in 2023; Abu Dhabi in 2021; Linz, Ostrava, Doha in 2020; Zhuhai, Wuhan, Shenzhen in 2019; Wuhan, New Haven in 2018
- Is currently ranked No.2; this time last year was ranked No.6
- Has won 45 matches so far in 2023; she is ranked No.2 on tour for match wins, behind Iga Swiatek
- Has been involved in 12 three-set matches in 2023

PLAYER NOTES

- Making main draw debut appearance at US Open (had previously fallen in qualifying in 2021 and 2022)
- This is her fourth Grand Slam main draw appearance, and first outside of Wimbledon, with best result there being 2r in 2023
- Scored second Grand Slam win of career over Blinkova on Tuesday (first came over McNally at 2023 Wimbledon)
- All three British women in the main draw have progressed to the US Open 2r (also Boulter and Miyazaki) - the most since 1987
- Faces No.2 Aryna Sabalenka in 2r today; owns 1 win in career over Top 10 players, defeating No.4 Paula Badosa at Eastbourne 2022
- This is her third time facing Top 10 opposition, losing to No.7 Gauff (2023 Eastbourne) and No.10 Kasatkina (2023 Wimbledon)
- The last British woman to defeat the No.1 or No.2 player in the world was Konta at 2017 Wimbledon (d. No.2 Halep)
- Looking to emulate Emma Raducanu's run to the title here in 2021
- Today's winner will face either Ka.Pliskova or Burel in 3r
- Is currently ranked No.96; this time last year was ranked No.141
- Has won 8 matches so far in 2023
- Has been involved in 5 three-set matches in 2023

CAREER MILESTONES

- Highlight of last season was R-Up finish at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (l. Garcia in F); upset No.1 Swiatek, No.2 Jabeur and No.3 Pegula en route to final - only the fourth woman in history to beat the No.1, No.2 and No.3 at the same tournament
- Lifted two titles during 2021 campaign, at Abu Dhabi and Madrid, while was R-Up at Stuttgart. Also reached a further three SFs, including at Wimbledon and US Open
- Rose to career-high No.2 in rankings on August 23, 2021
- In doubles, lifted second major at 2021 Australian Open (w/Mertens, d. Krejckova/Siniakova in F)
- Won final nine matches of 2020 to end the year with back-to-back titles - at Ostrava (d. Azarenka in F) and Linz (d. Mertens in F) - and ranked at No.10
- Having also taken home the silverware at Doha (d. Kvitova in F), was one of two players (also Halep) to lift three singles titles during disrupted 2020 season
- Ended as World No.11 for the second straight year in 2019 after capturing three WTA singles titles at Shenzhen (d. Riske in F), Wuhan (d. Riske in F) and Zhuhai (d. Bertens in F)
- Made Top-10 debut on January 28, 2019 following 3^r run at 2019 Australian Open
- Ended 2019 at No.2 in WTA doubles rankings after capturing first Grand Slam doubles trophy at US Open (w/Mertens, d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Earlier in the season, the pair claimed the 'Sunshine Double' by winning back-to-back titles at Indian Wells (d. Krejckova/Siniakova in F) and Miami (d. Stosur/ Zhang in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Shenzhen in doubles (w/Mertens), going 1-2 in the round-robin stage
- Enjoyed breakthrough season in 2018, lifting two titles, at New Haven (d. Suárez Navarro in F) and Wuhan (d. Kontaveit in F), winning 46 matches and finishing at No.11 in the rankings
- Also in 2018, was R-Up at Lugano (l. Mertens) and Eastbourne (l. Wozniacki), made SF at Cincinnati, reached five QFs and produced a career-best Grand Slam run to R16 at US Open
- Entered Top 50 on April 16, 2018, after Lugano run, and Top 20 on August 27 of the same year, following New Haven title
- Broke into Top 100 at No.76 on October 16, 2017 after reaching first Tour-level final at Tianjin (l. Sharapova). Also in 2017 made SF at Tashkent (l. Babos) and lifting WTA 125k Series title at Mumbai (d. Jakupovic)
- Last year, finished R-Up at \$25k ITF/Montemor-o-Novo-POR and \$15k ITF/Monastir-TUN. On WTA Tour, fell in qualifying at Linz
- Reached career-high ranking of No.233 on June 17, 2019
- Finished 2019 inside Top 300 for the first time after posting 36-20 win-loss record. Won title at \$25k ITF/Jerusalem-ISR and reached two further finals on ITF Circuit
- Won first ITF Circuit singles title at \$15k Dublin-IRL in 2017
- Debut in WTA qualifying came at 2016 Birmingham
- Owns four singles and five doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on the ITF Circuit in Great Britain in 2014

- Made Grand Slam main draw debut 2017 Wimbledon, falling in 2r (as qualifier, d. Khromacheva, l. Witthoeft)
- Fell 1r on main draw debut at 2017 Dubai (as qualifier, l. Ka.Bondarenko)
- Member of Belarus Billie Jean King Cup team that lost to USA in 2017 final - scored first Top-20 win of career with defeat of No.13 Stephens during final in Minsk
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2016 Rabat
- Lifted first three ITF Circuit titles in 2015, including a 13-match win streak towards the year's end, bringing back-to-back trophies in Antalya, Turkey
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Minsk in 2012

OTHER INFORMATION

- Currently working with former hitting partner Anton Dubrov; previously coached by Dmitry Tursunov and Didi Kindlmann
 - Started playing tennis when she was 6 by an accident when her father Sergey drove by the tennis courts and decided to give it a try
 - Has a sweet tooth and considers something sweet as a perfect present; loves her grandmother's cooking, and looks forward to her pancakes when she is away from home
 - Has a tiger tattoo on her left arm, which earned her the nickname "The Tiger"
 - She spends her time off with family, catching up with friends, or reading; her favorite book is "The Count of Monte Cristo"
- Currently coached by Craig Veal
 - Parents are Chris and Yvonne, has three brothers, Zach, Ben, and Seb. Mum used to play and that's how she got into tennis
 - Started playing tennis at the age of five; favorite surface is grass and favorite shot is down-the-line backhand

- Missed second half of 2021 season due to ongoing foot injury and then testing positive for COVID-19

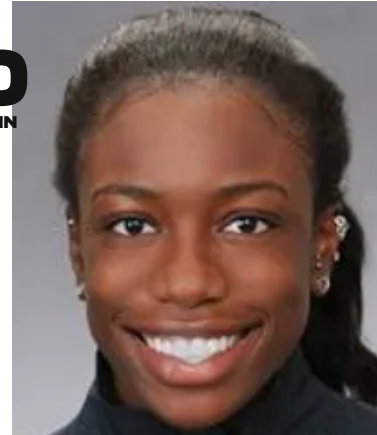
