MATCH NOTES - DAY 2 - MONDAY, FEBRUARY 12, 2024

[Q] Magdalena Frech (POL #52) vs Victoria Azarenka (#33)

First meeting

Azarenka is a two-time Doha champion winning the title in 2012 and 2013; along with Iga Swiatek, is one of two multi-time champions in the Doha... Frech is making her debut main draw appearance at Doha after coming through qualifying... Azarenka has not fallen in the first round of the tournament yet this year... Frech has six career wins over Top 50 players including one already this year

Naomi Osaka (JPN #727) vs [15] Caroline Garcia (FRA #21)

Tied 1-1

Garcia won when the two met earlier in the opening round at Australian Open... Both players fell in first round last week in Abu Dhabi... Osaka looking for first Top 50 win since 2022 Miami... Garcia player her 10th main draw in Doha where she has reached the quarterfinals twice including last year... Osaka playing Doha for just the second time and first since 2018, before she became a Grand Slam champion... Garcia is making her 80th WTA 1000 appearance, including three title runs, while Osaka is making her 35th WTA 1000 appearance with two titles to her credit

[1] Iga Swiatek (POL #1) vs. Sorana Cirstea (ROU #26)

Swiatek leads 2-0

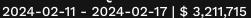
Swiatek returns to Doha as the two-time defending champion winning in 2022 and 2023... Cirstea has yet to take a set and is 0-3 against World No.1's including today's opponent at 2023 Indian Wells... Swiatek has won 20 of her last 22 matches against players outside the Top 20... This is the 9th time the WTA World No.1 is competing at the tournament; the World No.1 has advanced to the SF in all eight previous appearances, going on to win the title four times... Since the introduction of the WTA 1000 level, only Serena Williams (26), Caroline Wozniacki (13), Simona Halep (12) and Victoria Azarenka (11) have been the No.1 seed more than Swiatek (10)... Swiatek is trying to become the first player to win three consecutive times at a WTA-level event since Serena Williams (Miami, 2013-15)... Cirstea is making 76th WTA 1000 main draw appearance, highlighted by a runner-up finish at 2013 Toronto... Cirstea is 0-3 vs. World No.1s with losses to Serena Williams (2013 Roland Garros and 2013 Toronto) and Swiatek (2023 Indian Wells)

[6] Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #8) vs. [Q] Greet Minnen (BEL #75) Vondrousova leads 2-0 Vondrousova is making her 27th main draw appearance at a WTA 1000 with a semifinal finish at 2020 Rome standing as her best result... This time last year, Vondrousova was ranked No.74... Minnen is making her Doha

main draw debut; this is her third WTA 1000 main draw appearance (also at 2022 Miami and 2022 Madrid)... Minnen has one career Top 10 win defeating No.10 Garbiñe Muguruza at 2022 Wimbledon... Minnen is seeking first Tour-level win vs. a player from Czech Republic (previously 0-8)



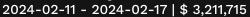

- Has gone 4-1 against players outside the Top 50 this year; sole loss came to No.93 Dayana Yastremska at Australian Open

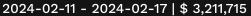

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2023 reached back-to-back QF on grass at Nottingham (l. Burrage) and Birmingham (l. eventual champion Ostapenko); advanced to 3r at Miami (l. Gracheva) and posted 2r efforts at Indian Wells, Madrid, Rome, Guadalajara and Hong Kong; at the Slams, best results were 2r at Roland Garros (l. Rakhimova) and US Open (l. Muchova); ended season on career-high ranking of No.63 after winning a 100k ITF event in Spain (d. Errani in F)
- Highlight of 2022 season was 3r run at Wimbledon - best career result at a major. Also made 2r on nine occasions
- Broke into Top 100 on October 18, 2021, following run through qualifying to 2r at Indian Wells
- Advanced to 2r three more times last season and won titles at WTA 125K Series event in Concord and W60 Prague ITF Circuit event
- Campaign in 2020 was highlighted by maiden WTA QF, at Prague (as LL, l. eventual champion Halep) - first back-to-back main draw wins at a WTA event
- Only other WTA main draw appearance in 2020 was 1r exit at Lyon (as qualifier, l. Tomova); also won her fourth career singles title on ITF Circuit, at \$25K Bendigo-AUS and contested qualifying at Australian Open, Dubai and Doha
- Appeared in six WTA main draws in 2019, falling 1r at Dubai (l. Kasatkina), Charleston (l.Buzarnescu), Lugano (l. Peterson), Nottingham (l. Mladenovic), US Open (l. Siegemund) and Guangzhou (l. Stojanovic)
- In 2018, made 2r at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l.Stephens), Rabat (l. Fett), Nottingham (l.Jakupovic) and San Jose (l.Tomljanovic). Also fell 1r at six other tour-level events, including qualifying for Grand Slam debut at Australian Open
- Achieved career high singles ranking of No.115 after 2018 Roland Garros run (July 2, 2018)
- Won two of her four ITF singles titles in 2017, at \$25k ITF/Leipzig-GER and \$25k ITF/Braunschweig-GER - both on clay
- Played first WTA qualifying event at home tournament in Katowice in 2013, falling to Raluca. Made WTA main draw debut at Katowice the following year (as wildcard, l. Meusburger in 1r)

- Opened 2023, with QF at Adelaide 1 (l. Noskova) before reaching semifinal at Australian Open (l. Rybakina). Made 4r at Wimbledon (l. Svitolina) and 2r at US Open before earning a QF finish at Guadalajara (l. Garcia)
- Standout result in 2022 was SF in last tournament of her season, at Guadalajara (l. eventual champion Pegula). Also reached QFs at Washington DC and Adelaide, while made R16 at Australian Open and US Open
- Best result in 2021 came in final event when she finished R-Up at Indian Wells (l. Badosa on third set tie-break). Also made SFs at Doha and Bad Homburg
- One of five players to reach three or more finals in 2020, lifting one trophy at the Western & Southern Open - her first title since 2016. Finished year ranked No.13 - her best seasonend ranking since 2013 (No.2)
- Advanced to her fifth career Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, which helped her return to the Top 20 for the first time since March 2017
- Winner of the 2020 WTA Comeback Player of the Year Award, as voted on by members of the international media
- Last tournament of 2019 was the US Open, where she fell to Sabalenka in 1r; also reached the doubles final w/Barty (l. Mertens/Sabalenka)
- Highlight of 2019 was 37th singles final at Monterrey (l. Muguruza in F via ret. w/leg injury).
 On February 2, 2019 returned to Top 50 for first time following the birth of her child, Leo
- Made return to tennis in June 2017 following birth of first child in December 2016, reaching 2r of comeback event at Mallorca (d. Ozaki, l. Konjuh)
- Ended 2016 ranked No.13, despite missing second half of season after going on maternity leave (announced pregnancy mid-July). Lifted three titles, at Brisbane and 'Sunshine Double' of Indian Wells and Miami - third woman to achieve feat after Graf in 1994 and 1996 and Clijsters in 2005
- Posted 26-3 record for first six months of 2016 with losses coming at the Australian Open (QF, l. Kerber), Rome (2r, l. Begu) and Roland Garros (ret. vs. Knapp w/right knee injury)
- Limited to total of 23 events over 2014-15 seasons due to variety of injuries
- Posted five consecutive Top-10 finishes between 2009 and 2013, qualifying for the WTA Finals on each occasion (l. Kvitova in 2011 final in Istanbul)

- Ascended to World No.1 after 2012 Australian
 Open and held top spot for a total of 51 weeks
- Began 2012 with 26-match win streak best start since Hingis went 37-0 in 1997. Went on to win Tour-leading 69 matches in 2012, season highlighted by six titles, finishing as WTA's yearend No.1
- Belarusian Fed Cup Team, 2005, 2007, 2009-11, 2015-16, 2019; Belarusian Olympic Team, 2008, 2012
- Won two medals for Belarus at 2012 Olympics bronze in singles and mixed doubles gold (w/Mirnyi)
- Made her Top 100 debut on July 10, 2006 (No.99) and Top 50 debut on May 14, 2007 (No.49)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2005 Kolkata
- ITF Junior World Champion for 2005 reached first tour-level semifinal at Guangzhou the same year

- In reaching R16 at 2018 Australian Open, became youngest Japanese player to reach R16 at a Slam since Sugiyama at 1995 Roland Garros (19y, 342d) and the youngest player from Japan to reach R16 in Melbourne since Date in 1990 (197, 122d)
- Book-ended 2017 season with QF showings at Auckland and Hong Kong; other highlights included 3r runs at Wimbledon and US Open

- Opened 2023 well with two R-Up performances on hard court at Lyon (l. Parks) and Monterrey (l. Vekic), as well as QFs at Adelaide and Doha. - Ranked No.406, made WTA main draw debut at 2014 Stanford. As an alternate, won through qualifying (achieving first WTA qualifying wins), and came from match point down to shock No.19 Stosur in 1r of main draw, before losing to No.18 Petkovic in 2r
- Made WTA qualifying debut at Québec City in 2013 (l. Dabrowski)

- In 2018, won sixth career title at Tianjin; also made SF at Stuttgart and Madrid

- Represented France at 2016 Rio Olympics in singles and doubles
- Played 2015 WTA Finals Rising Stars Invitational in Singapore (l. Osaka in F)
- Made professional debut at 13 on ITF Circuit in France in 2007
- In juniors, singles runner-up at 2011 US Open (l. Min) and reached SF at the other three Slams

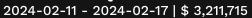
