TOURNAMENT TALKING POINTS

- This year's event will be the 22nd edition, dating back to the inaugural tournament in 2001.
- The Khalifa International Tennis & Squash Complex also hosted the WTA Finals for three years (2008-10).
- In 2024 the WTA expanded to 10 WTA 1000 tournaments, up from nine in 2023, with both Doha and Dubai becoming 1000 events every year instead of alternating.

- Since the Qatar Open's inauguration in 2001, five players share the record for the most tournament titles, having each won the event twice - Anastasia Myskina, Maria Sharapova, Victoria Azarenka, Petra Kvitova and Iga Swiatek.
- Azarenka is the only player to win the Qatar Open twice when classified a WTA 1000.
- Iga Swiatek can become the first player to win a WTA event three years in a row since Serena Williams, who won the Miami Open on three consecutive occasions between 2013 and 2015.
- With 22 victories at the event, Petra Kvitova holds the most match wins at the Qatar Open since the tournament's inauguration in 2001.
- Victoria Azarenka is three wins away to become only the third player to achieve 150 WTA-1000 match
 wins on hard court after Agnieszka Radwanska (156) and Caroline Wozniacki (152), since the format
 was introduced in 2009. Azarenka currently holds a record of 147-49 on the surface at WTA-1000 events.
- A qualifier or lucky loser has never reached the final of the Qatar Open, with Jessica Pegula reaching the semi-final as a qualifier in 2021, losing to eventual winner Petra Kvitova. Caroline Garcia is the only qualifier or lucky loser to reach the final or win a WTA-1000 event, defeating Kvitova in Cincinnati 2022.
- At 30 years and 363 days, Petra Kvitova (2021) is the only player aged 30 or over to win the Qatar Open, since the tournament's inauguration in 2001. Serena Williams (2013) is the oldest to reach the final at the event, losing to Victoria Azarenka at the age of 31 years and 144 days.
- At 17 years and 313 days, Maria Sharapova (2005) is the only teenager to win the Qatar Open since 2001. She is one of three teenagers to reach the final, along with Kuznetsova (2004) and Ostapenko (2016).
- Caroline Garcia will be making her 80th main draw appearance at a WTA-1000 event, becoming the fifth player born after 1990 to achieve the feat after Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova, Caroline Wozniacki, Alize Cornet and Simona Halep.
- In her opening match at this year's Qatar Open, Elena Rybakina will be appearing in her 75th WTA-1000 match. In the event of victory, only six players will have claimed more wins from their opening 75 WTA-1000 matches than Rybakina (53) since 2009 Serena Williams (63), Maria Sharapova (60), Caroline Wozniacki (59), Iga Swiatek (58), Ashleigh Barty and Victoria Azarenka (55 each).
- Elena Rybakina finished 2023 with a record of 27-5 at WTA 1000 events. Level with Iga Swiatek for the year in 2023, only Serena Williams in 2013 (36) and Victoria Azarenka in 2012 (28) had more wins in a single season at WTA-1000 level.
- At WTA 1000 level events, Azarenka owns a Tour-leading 191 wins at WTA 1000s followed by Halep (186), Kvitova (180), Wozniacki (177) and A.Radwanska (175) as the only players with 150+ wins at WTA 1000 level.

- Jelena Ostapenko became the first two-time title winner in 2024 capturing titles at Adelaide and Linz.
- Four times this year the No.1 seed and No.2 seed met head-to-head in a tournament final. During the entire 2023 season the No.1 seed and No.2 seed met in four finals. The last time the No.1 seed and No.2 seed met more than four times in tournament finals in a season was 2013 (9 times).
- Qinwen Zheng made her Top 10 debut after the Australian Open (on Monday, January 29). She is the first Chinese woman to crack the Top 10 since Li Na (February 1, 2010).
- Four players have made their Top 100 debut this year Renata Zarazua (Jan 8), Maria Timofeeva (Jan 29), Brenda Fruhvirtova (Jan 29) and Arina Rodionova (AUS).
