

Karolina Pliskova (CZE #45) vs. Viktoriya Tomova (BUL #48)

First meeting between the pair...**Pliskova** is making her tenth appearance at Cincinnati, where she returns as a former champion having won the title in 2016 (d. Kerber in F)...**Pliskova** owns 194 wins over Top 50 players, most recently over No.10 Ons Jabeur at Nottingham 2024...Owns 11 titles on hard courts, most recently at Cluj-Napoca in 2024... **Tomova** is making her debut appearance at Cincinnati...**Tomova** owns 7 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently over No.26 Linda Noskova at Bad Homburg 2024... Best career result on hard court is QF run at Hobart 2024 (l. eventual champion Emma Navarro)...The winner of this match faces the winner of No.11 seed Emma Navarro vs. Mirra Andreeva in the second round...

Elise Mertens (BEL #35) vs. [15] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #20)

Kostyuk won their most recent encounter at the Australian Open earlier this season, while **Mertens** claimed their first meeting at 2022 Indian Wells...**Mertens** is making her seventh appearance here, where her best result was SF run in 2020 (I. eventual runner-up Naomi Osaka); she also reached the QF in 2018 (I. Kvitova) and R16 in 2022 (I. eventual champion Garcia)... Best result by Belgian player at Cincinnati was title run by Kim Clijsters in 2010...**Mertens** owns 6 titles in hard courts, most recently at 2023 Monastir...Owns 21 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.17 Elina Svitolina at Charleston 2024...**Kostyuk** is making her third appearance at Cincinnati, where her best result has been reaching the second round in 2022 (I. Pegula)...**Kostyuk** owns 35 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently over No.7 Qinwen Zheng at Stuttgart 2024... She recently reached her career high ranking of No.16 on June,17 2024...

[LL] Elina Avanesyan (ARM #58) vs. [WC] Bianca Andreescu (CAN#175)

Avanesyan is making her tournament debut at Cincinnati... This is her first time facing a Canadian player...She owns 3-1 record against wildcards, with a record in 2024 standing at 2-1...Best career result on hard court is R16 run at Cluj-Napoca and Auckland, both in 2024... **Avanesyan** recently reached her career high ranking of No.58 on July 29, 2024...**Andreescu** is making her second appearance at Cincinnati, where her previous result was reaching the second round in 2021 (I. Muchova)...**Andreescu** owns three titles on hard court at the US Open, Toronto, and Indian Wells, all in 2019... Best result by a wildcard at Cincinnati was the title run by Maria Sharapova in 2011...Today's winner will face No.8 seed Jelena Ostapenko in the next round...

[16] Donna Vekic (CRO #21) vs. [Q] Ashlyn Krueger (USA #82)

Vekic is making her 6th appearance at Cincinnati, where her previous best result was reaching 3r in 2023 (I. Jabuer) and 2019 (I. V. Williams)...Is playing her first tournament after winning the Silver Medal in women's singles for Croatia at the Paris Olympics...3 out of her 4 career singles titles on hard court at Monterrey 2023, Courmayeur 2021 and Kuala Lumpur 2014...Only player from Croatia in this year's field...Is currently ranked No.21; this time last year was ranked No.22, having achieved peak rank No. 19 in Nov 2019... **Krueger** is making her tournament debut at Cincinnati 2024...As qualifier, has beaten Uchijima and Osaka to make the main draw; best result by a qualifier at Cincinnati was the Champion run by Caroline Garcia in 2022...Owns 4 wins in her career over Top 50 players, most recently No.16 Ekaterina Alexandrova at Madrid

Elina Svitolina (UKR #34) vs. [Q] Yafan Wang (CHN #72)

Svitolina is making her 8th appearance at Cincinnati, where her best result was SF run in 2015 (I. S. Williams), which is also Ukraine's best result at Cincinnati...Owns 5 singles titles at WTA-1000 events at Rome 2017-2018, Toronto 2017, Dubai 2017-2018...Owns 11 singles titles on hard court, most recently Chicago 250 in 2021...One of 4 players from Ukraine in the starting field (along with Kostyuk, Yastremska, Kalinina)...**Wang** is making 2nd appearance at Cincinnati, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2019 (as qualifier, I. Ka. Pliskova)...Her best result at a WTA-1000 event was R16 run at Miami 2018 (as qualifier, I. Kerber)...Owns 15 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.44 Karolina Pliskova at Washington DC 2024...Her sole career singles title has come on hard court at Acapulco 2019...One of 5 players from China in the starting field (along with Xinyu Wang, Zhang, Yuan, Zheng), first time for China...Best result by China at Cincinnati was Champion run by Na Li in 2012

Katie Boulter (GBR #33) vs. Magda Linette (POL #43)

Boulter is making her debut appearance at Cincinnati while **Linette** is making her fifth appearance...**Boulter** and **Linette** are facing each other for the first time in their careers...**Boulter** owns one hard court title: San Diego 2024 (d. Kostyuk in the final)... **Boulter** achieved her peak rank of #27 this year after her title run in San Diego...**Boulter** has a record of 15-6 on hard this year...Linette has a record of 4-10 on hard court this year...her peak rank of #19 was achieved in 2023...**Linette** has two hard court titles: Hua Hin 2020 and the Bronx in 2019....she also reached the semifinal at the Australian Open in 2023 (I. eventual champion Sabalenka)....**Linette** is looking to make it past 1r at Cincinnati for the first time in her career since her tournament debut in 2017....

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2023, made only quarterfinals which she reached three times; Australian Open (l. Linette), Dubai (withdrew from match against Swiatek w/viral illness) and Stuttgart (l. Swiatek). Ended her 2023 season at Guadalajara due to left wrist injury.
- Best results of 2022 were SF runs at Strasbourg (l. Juvan) and Toronto (l. Haddad Maia) and QF showings at Berlin (l. Gauff) and US Open (l. Sabalenka). Was first time she failed to reach a Tour-level final since 2012
- Reached three finals across 2021, at Rome (l. Swiatek), her second Slam final at Wimbledon (l. Barty) and Montreal (l. Giorgi)
- Ended 2021 season by qualifying for WTA Finals for the fifth consecutive year - only four active players have qualified more than her
- Made Olympic debut, reaching R16 at Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games (l. Giorgi)
- Lifted a WTA-leading four titles across the 2019 season (tied with Barty) - triumphed at Brisbane, Rome, Eastbourne and Zhengzhou. Dropped 19 games across five matches during Eastbourne title win (d. Kerber in F) - most economic title run in 2019
- Also reached first Premier Mandatory final at 2019 Miami, losing to Barty in straight sets, and produced best Australian Open performance of career, reaching SF (l. eventual champion Osaka in 3s); saved four match points to beat S.Williams in OF
- Lost to twin sister Kr.Pliskova in 2r at Birmingham, in what was their first career maindraw encounter
- Helped the Czech Republic lift Billie Jean King Cup in 2015-16 and 2018
- Claimed No.1 ranking on July 17, 2017 despite making 2r exit at Wimbledon (l. Rybarikova). Was the first Czech woman to achieve the No.1 ranking since the computer rankings were introduced in 1975 (Martina Navratilova became No.1 on July 10, 1978 while representing USA)
- Is a Grand Slam finalist, reaching the title match at 2016 US Open (l. Kerber) and also 2021 Wimbledon (l. Barty)
- Made Top-10 debut after 2015 Stanford R-Up finish; was first time in WTA history that three Czech women ranked inside Top 10 at the same time (also Kvitova and Safarova)
- Scored first Top-20 win of her career over No.16 Petrova in 1r at 2013 Wimbledon
- Won first career WTA title at 2013 Kuala Lumpur (d. Mattek-Sands in F)

- Claimed first WTA 125 event at 2023 Chicago (d. Liu in F). Reached second round at 2023 Wimbledon (l. Boulter). Reached career high ranking of No.71 on May 22, 2023.
- Best result of 2022 was QF run at Eastbourne (as LL, l. Giorgi). Also finished R-Up at WTA 125 in Budapest and at W80 ITF Circuit tournament in Oeiras
- Broke into Top 100 for first time on August 8, 2022, following SF run at W80 ITF Circuit event in Grodzisk Mazowiecki, Poland
- Advanced to maiden WTA SFs during 2021 season, first at Bogota (l. Zidansek) and then at Belgrade (as LL, l. eventual champion Badosa)
- On Tour's return in 2020, fell 1r at US Open and Istanbul before reaching SF at \$80k ITF/Cagnes sur Mer-FRA
- In final event before the tour's hiatus, made 2r at Lyon (l. Van Uytvanck)
- Started 2020 with a productive spell on ITF Circuit in Great Britain, finishing R-Up at \$25K Glasgow before winning 16th title at this level at \$25K Sunderland (d. Raducanu in F)
- Made four Tour-level appearances in 2019, highlighted by 2r showing at Osaka (as qualifier, d. Cornet, l. Osaka), while won title at \$80K ITF/Biarritz-FRA (d. Kovinic in F)
- Highlights of 2018 were Grand Slam main-draw debut at Australian Open (l. Gibbs in 1r) and first ever Grand Slam main-draw victory at Wimbledon (as qualifier, d. Smitkova, l. S.Williams). Also made 2r at Istanbul and Hong Kong
- In 2017, reached 2r at Bastad (as qualifier, l. Krunic) and Linz (as qualifier, l. Golubic). Also fell 1r at Gstaad - making her WTA main draw debut - and in qualifying on 12 occasions (including all four majors)
- Maiden Top-50 upset came over No.40 Goerges in 1r at 2017 Bastad (via ret.)
- Made successful comeback from injury in 2016, winning 64 matches and four titles, rising over 300 places in the rankings. Since return has stopped playing doubles to protect injury
- In 2015, missed five months with a leg muscle strain ended season at No.474
- Member of Bulgarian Billie Jean King Cup Team, 2014-15, 2017-19, 2021-22
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2010 Miami
- On ITF Circuit owns 16 singles titles and 12 doubles titles
- Played first events of career on ITF Circuit in Bulgaria in 2009

- At 2013 Linz, with sister Kristyna, became first set of twins to ever win a tour-level doubles title
- Reached first WTA QF as WC at 2008 Prague (l. Azarenka)
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in 2006

- Formerly worked with Sascha Bajin; fitness coach is Martin Nosko and Ivan Trebaticka; trains at and plays for Sparta Praha tennis club
- Married Michal Hrdlicka after 2018 Wimbledon
- Away from the court, enjoys fresh-water fishing, as well as contributing to her foundation which benefits various causes, including pediatric oncology and children battling cancer in her native Czech Republic
- Enjoys listening to Czech pop music and watching movies (favorites is Public Enemies). Favorite author is Paulo Coelho

- Coached by her father, Konstantin Tomov; previously coached by Mihail Kanev
- Mother Eleonora works at the airport, father, Konstantin, owns a currency bureau
- Comes from a sporting family; grandfather played football for Bulgarian national team and also Levski and CSKA Sofia, while older brother Ivan was a top junior footballer
- Started playing tennis aged six
- Favorite surface is hard
- Best friend on tour is Harriet Dart
- Admires Simona Halep's game
- Speaks Bulgarian, English, Croatian and a little Russian.






