[11] Emma Navarro (USA #13) vs. Mirra Andreeva (#24)

First meeting

A semifinalist in Toronto last week, **Navarro** moved into the Top 8 (at No.7, from No.11) of the PIF Race to WTA Finals Leaderboard... **Navarro** enters this week with a career-high ranking of No.13... **Navarro** has won 18 matches vs. Tpo 50 opponents, including 15 Top 50 wins this year... **Andreeva** is making her debut appearance at Cincinnati...**Andreeva** owns 9 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.2 Aryna Sabalenka at Roland Garros 2024 and is 9-8 vs Top 20 players in her career... **Andreeva** recently won silver medal at the Paris Olympics in doubles with partner Diana Shnaider

[1] Iga Swiatek (POL #1) vs. [Q] Varvara Gracheva (FRA #62)

Swiatek leads 1-0

This Is **Swiatek's** third consecutive year as the top seed here in Cincinnati (6th appearance at tournament), where her previous result best was reaching SF in 2023... **Swiatek** owns 10 singles titles at WTA-1000 events, tied for second most (Azarenka also 10; behind only Serena Williams, 13)... **Swiatek** won bronze medal for Poland at Paris Olympics...in 2024, owns 20-0 record against opponents ranked outside the Top 50... Currently ranked WTA World No.1, **Swiatek** is currently spending her 116th week atop the WTA Rankings, including 36 consecutive weeks (as of August 12, 2024)... **Swiatek** has won 50 matches so far in 2024, leading the Tour in match wins... **Gracheva** faces a WTA World No.1 for second time; she owns 4 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.7 Maria Sakkari at Roland Garros 2024

[WC] Peyton Stearns (USA #46) vs. Paula Badosa (ESP #37)

First meeting

Stearns owns 7 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.14 Madison Keys at Toronto 2024... **Stearns** just achieved her career best at a WTA 1000 as a Quarter-Finalist in Toronto... **Badosa** is making her 3rd appearance at Cincinnati, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2022... **Badosa** recently won her first title in two years at Washington DC and has won three hard court titles in her career... **Badosa** is playing her 30th career WTA 1000, winning the title at 2021 Indian Wells and reaching the SF twice – 2021 Madrid and 2022 Indian Wells... **Stearns** is making her 12th WTA 1000 appearance; she reached her first WTA 1000 QF last week in Toronto... With a win today **Stearns** would equal her season win total from last season

[LL] Lucia Bronzetti (ITA #68) vs. [14] Victoria Azarenka (#19)

First meeting

Azarenka is the only player with 200+ wins at the WTA 1000 level with 205 match wins; next most wins at this level is 186 by Simona Halep... **Azarenka** is making her 96th WTA 1000 appearance and has won 10 titles at this level, tied for second most, including twice at this tournament – 2013 and 2020 (staged in NYC)... **Azarenka** is one of four players with 20+ match wins at the Cincinnati tournament along with Jelena Jankovic (24), Serena Williams (23) and Simona Halep (23)... **Bronzetti** is making her 13th appearance at a WTA 1000 tournament; she is yet to reach the QF stage at this level

[WC] Caroline Wozniacki (DEN #84) vs. Anhelina Kalinina (UKR #52) Kalinina leads 2-0

Wozniacki has won 182 matches at the WTA 1000 level, behind only Azarenka (205) and Halep (186)... **Wozniacki** is making her 12th main draw appearance in Cincinnati, tied for most at the tournament (along with Stephens and Kvitova)... **Wozniacki** made her WTA debut at 2005 Cincinnati, just after turning 15 years old (lost in opening match to top-seed Patty Schnyder)... **Kalinina** is making her 23rd appearance at a WTA 1000 tournament; she has twice reached the QF stage at this level, both times on clay – 2023 Rome (R-Up) and 2022 Madrid (QF)

Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (#28) vs. [17] Beatriz Haddad Maia (BRA #23) Pavlyuchenkova leads 3-0 Pavlyuchenkova is making her 112th appearance at a WTA 1000, the most appearances at the level since it was introduced in 2009... Pavlyuchenkova is making 11th appearance at Cincinnati (13th overall), where her previous best result was SF run in 2010... Pavlyuchenkova owns 9 singles titles on hard court, most recently at Hong Kong 2017... Haddad Maia is making 4th appearance at Cincinnati... Haddad Maia is making her 29th WTA 1000 appearance; her best result at a WTA-1000 event was R-Up at Toronto 2022 (I. Halep in F)

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2023 was a stand-out year, achieving a career best with semifinal at WTA 500 San Diego (l. Kenin) and ending season with a ranking of No. 32. Also reached two quarterfinals on clay; Strasbourg (l. Blinkova) and Palermo (l. eventual champion Zheng) and one semifinal on grass; Bad Homburg (l. Siniakova).
- In 2022, posted 31-18 win-loss record. At Tour-level, made 2r at Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur), fell 1r at Monterrey (as WC, l. Zacarias) and Indian Wells (as WC, l. Anisimova), and contested qualifying at San Diego
- Elsewhere in 2022, reached three ITF Circuit finals, including lifting second career title at this level at W60 tournament in Liepaja, Latvia, while made SF at WTA 125K Series event in Vancouver
- Broke into Top 200 for the first time on March 7, 2022
- Lifted maiden ITF Circuit title at W25 event in Orlando in November 2021
- Won the NCAA division 1 women's singles title in May 2021 to earn a WC into US Open, where she fell 1r (l. McHale)
- In 2021, reached 2r at both Charleston [500] and Charleston [250]
- Fell 1r at 2020 Monterrey (l. Stephens)
- Only other events in 2020 came on ITF Circuit, ending year ranked No.463
- Owns three ITF Circuit titles in singles and one in doubles
- Fell 2r on professional debut at \$10k Charleston, SC-USA (l. Di Lorenzo) in 2015
- Began her collegiate career by winning her first 14 NCAA singles matches and moving up to a No.6 ITA ranking
- Ended 2019 at No.3 in ITF Junior rankings, following a season that included a R-Up finish at Roland Garros (l. Fernandez), a SF run at Wimbledon and victory at the Adidas Easter Bowl
- Also R-Up in girls' doubles at 2019 Australian Open w/Beck

- Opened 2023 season in April by winning 13 matches straight to claim back-to-back ITF titles in Switzerland; as WC, advanced to R16 at Madrid with wins over Fernandez, Haddad Maia and Linette (l. Sabalenka); subsequently made debut at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Gauff in 3r), Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. Keys in R16) and US Open (l. eventual champion Gauff in 2r)
- Also in 2023 reached R16 at Beijing (l. Rybakina), leading to Top 50 debut (started season just inside Top 300); voted WTA Newcomer of the Year
- In 2022, posted 39-9 win-loss record on ITF Circuit, winning first four titles at this level
- Fell 1r on WTA main-draw debut at 2022 Monastir (as WC, l. Potapova)
- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event at Sharm El-Sheikh in February 2022
- Owns six ITF Circuit singles titles
- As a junior, finished R-Up at 2023 Australian Open (l. Korneeva)
