MATCH NOTES – WEDNESDAY, 25 SEPTEMBER 2024

Sofia Kenin (USA #168) vs. Anna Bogdan (ROU #120)

Kenin:

- One of 15 Americans in the draw, the most in the tournament's history
- Australian Open champion in 2020, 4 of 5 WTA titles have been won on hard court
- Fell out of the Top 100 this week for the first time since July 2023
- Best Beijing result came in the third round in 2019

Bogdan:

- Making tournament debut
- Reached career-best result earlier this year by making the final at Cluj-Napoca
- Currently ranked No.120 on the PIF WTA Rankings, her lowest ranking since December 2019
- Sole win over Kenin came in Montreal qualifying in 2018
- Has lost from match point up three times this season

Amanda Anisimova (USA #43) v. Xinyu Wang (CHN #50)

Anisimova:

- Making 2nd main draw appearance at Beijing and looking for her first 2r after previously falling to Brady in 1r in 2019; played qualifying in 2018

- Best result at a WTA 1000 event was R-Up at Indian Wells 2024 (I. Pegula in F)

- Last time she lost against a Chinese opponent on Chinese soil was in the qualifying draw in Wuhan 2018, versus Yafan Wang (6-4 3-6 6-2)

- Best career result on hard court is champion at Melbourne 250 #2 in 2022

- Has won 14 WTA main draw matches in 2024: she only had more in 2022 (33) and 2013 (23) in a single season so far in her career

Wang:

- Making 3rd appearance at Beijing, where her previous result was reaching 3r in 2023 (I. Sakkari), which is her equal best result at a WTA 1000 event, along with 3r at Indian Wells 2023 (I. Krejcikova)

- Best career result on hard court is SF at Hua Hin 2024; Osaka, Hua Hin in 2023; Prague in 2021

- Only Liudmila Samsonova and Caroline Garcia (16 each) made more successful dropshots than Wang (11) at the China Open 2023

- Best result by China at Beijing was SF by Wang Qiang in 2018, Li Na in 2012 and 2010, Zheng Jie in 2008, Peng Shuai in 2007 - 2006

- Is currently ranked No.50; this time last year was ranked No.38

First meeting





Lucia Bronzetti (ITA #77) vs. Naomi Osaka (JPN #73)

Bronzetti:

- Making main draw debut at Beijing, having played qualifying in 2023 (I. Krueger)

- Best result at WTA-1000 event was R16 at Miami in 2022 (I. Saville)

- Owns 1-1 career record against players from Japan, having defeated Uchijima at Guangzhou 2023 and lost to today's opponent Osaka at Roland Garros 2024 in their only previous meeting

- One of four players from Italy in this year's main draw (along with Paolini, Cocciaretto and Trevisan)

- Best result by Italy at Beijing was SF by Flavia Pennetta in 2011

Osaka:

- 2019 China Open champion (d. Barty in F) is making her 4th main draw appearance at Beijing (5th overall)

- Owns a second WTA 1000 title at 2018 Indian Wells

- In her fourth main draw appearance, she has only previously failed to make it past the opening round once before (I. Kerber in 2017)

- Owns 6-1 career record against players from Italy, with the only loss coming against Trevisan at Rouen 2024

- Is yet to drop a single set against Italian opponents at WTA 1000 events: defeating Sara Errani in Miami 2016 (6-1 6-3) and in Indian Wells 2024 (6-3 6-1), and Elisabetta Cocciaretto in Miami this season (6-3 6-4).

- Last time she lost in the opening match at a WTA 1000 event was Cincinnati 2022 against Shuai Zhang

- All of her seven career singles titles have come on hard court - Australian Open 2021; US Open 2020; Beijing, Osaka, Australian Open in 2019; US Open, Indian Wells in 2018

- Only Elena Rybakina (141), Aryna Sabalenka (123) and Karolina Pliskova (114) have made more aces than Osaka (105, 6.2 on average per match) at WTA 1000 events this season

[WC] Shuai Zhang (CHN #595) vs. McCartney Kessler (USA #65) First meeting *Zhang:*

- Two-time Beijing quarterfinalist, most recently in 2018

- One of 14 Chinese players in the draw, the most in the tournament's history
- Bidding for her first singles win since Lyon 2023
- Has lost last 24 singles matches, the second-longest losing streak in the Open Era

- Currently ranked No.595 on PIF WTA Rankings, the lowest-ranked player to play the main draw in the tournament's history

Kessler:

- Making tournament debut and playing her second career WTA 1000 main draw

- Has faced a player from China once before at Tour-level in the main draw, defeating Wang Xinyu in the 2r at Cleveland this season

- Made Top 100 debut in August and reached career-high No.63 on the PIF WTA Rankings after winning maiden WTA title at Cleveland (d. Haddad Maia)

Osaka leads 1-0





Qiang Wang (CHN #403) vs. [Q] Alycia Parks (USA #128)

First meeting

Wang:

- In her seventh China Open main draw, she posted her best result in 2018 by reaching SF (I. eventual champion Wozniacki)

- After taking 2023 away from the sport, she had played only three Tour-level main draw matches so far in 2024 and looking for her first win today (fell in 1r at Hua Hin, Wimbledon and US Open)

- Is currently ranked No.403, but reached a career high ranking of No.12 on Sept 09, 2019

- Both her hard court titles were won on home ground: Guangzhou and Nanchang in 2018

- Owns the most recent best result by China at Beijing with SF in 2018 (Beijing semifinalists from China also include Li Na in 2012 and 2010, Zheng Jie in 2008 and Peng Shuai in 2007 – 2006)

Parks:

- Appearing at Beijing for a second time, previously making 1r in 2023 (I. eventual Runner-Up Samsonova)

- First time facing a player from China this season

- Claimed two WTA 125 titles this season at Warsaw and Gaiba, but has won only two Tour-level main draw matches so far this year; both achieved at Australian Open

- Best result by a qualifier at Beijing was SF by Monica Niculescu in 2011

- Owns one hard court title at Lyon in 2023

CAREER MILESTONES

- Strongest result of 2023 was runner-up at San Diego (l. Krejcikova). Also reached SF at Hobart (l. Cocciaretto) and Guadalajara (l. Dolehide). As a qualifier, posted her best Wimbledon result with 3r (l. Svitolina). Moved 202 positions up the ranking from her 2022 year-end position (from No. 235 to No.33).
- Best results of 2022 were QF at Adelaide (l. eventual champion Barty) and Cleveland (l. Pera). Missed clay and grass swings w/right ankle injury
- Missed second half of 2021 season due to ongoing foot injury and then testing positive for COVID-19
- In opening half of the 2021 campaign, standout results were QFs at Abu Dhabi and Yarra Valley Classic, and a R16 showing at Roland Garros
- Ended 2020 at career high of No.4 which she first hit on March 9, 2020 and came away with the 2020 WTA Player of the Year Award
- In last tournament of the season, finished R-Up at Roland Garros (l. Swiatek) for her first final appearance on clay
- Reached R16 at US Open and was one of only two players (also Kvitova) to reach second week of all three Slams in 2020
- Lifted fifth WTA singles title at Lyon (d. Friedsam in F) becoming the first player in 2020 to win a second title
- Won maiden major at 2020 Australian Open (d. Muguruza in F) to become the youngest champion (21y, 80d) in Melbourne since Sharapova (20y, 283d) in 2008. Defeated No.1 Barty and home favorite in SF for third career win over a reigning World No.1
- Australian Open run helped her break into the Top 10 for the first time at No.7 on February 3, 2020
- Won 2019 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year aware after winning three WTA titles at Hobart (d. Schmiedlova in F), Mallorca (d. Bencic in F) and Guangzhou (d. Stosur in F)
- Finished 2019 at No.14 as US No.2 (behind No.9 S.Williams) and leader in hard court wins (38tied w/Barty)
- Registered back-to-back SF runs at Toronto (l. eventual champion Andreescu) and Cincinnati (l. eventual champion Keys), subsequently leading to Top 20 debut at No.20 on August 19, 2019
- During this run, defeated No.1 Barty (Toronto) and No.1 Osaka (Cincinnati) to become first player since October 2001 to defeat World No.1s in consecutive weeks (Davenport); also became

- In 2023, reached QF at Cluj Napoca and Lausanne; also won titles at WTA 125 events Isai and Parma
- Advanced to maiden WTA singles final at 2022 Warsaw (l. Garcia)
- Last season, also reached SF at Portoroz (l. Rybakina) and Parma (l. eventual champion Sherif); broke into Top 50 on Cotober 3, 2022
- Closed out 2021 campaign by finishing R-Up at WTA 125K Series event at Limoges
- On clay last year, progressed to 3r at Roland Garros (l. Badosa, having held 1MP) and QF at Istanbul (l. Kudermetova)
- Best results in 2020 were QF run at Prague (l. Kr.Pliskova via ret.) and 2r showing at Roland Garros (l. Kenin in 3s)
- Ended 2019 by lifting 13th career singles titles on the ITF Circuit at \$100k ITF/Dubai-UAE
- Finished 2018 ranked No.71 to record first Top 100 finish of career; season highlights included 3r run at Australian Open (l. Keys) and SF runs at Monterrey (l. Muguruza) and Bogota (l. Schmeidlova)
- In 2017, reached SF at Bucharest and made 2r three times, including at Wimbledon, US Open
- Made first WTA SF at 2016 Florianopolis (upset former No.1 Jankovic in 2r, l. Babos)
- Also made Grand Slam debut in 2016 at US Open, reaching 2r (as qualifier, l. Niculescu)
- Owns three Top 20 wins in career, defeating No.17 Sevastova (2017 Bucharest), No.18 Vesnina (2017 New Haven) and No.11 Mladenovic (2018 Australian Open) Transition from juniors to pro circuit was

initially hampered by a series of injuries, notably quadriceps muscle rupture and a ski accident; more recently, problems with left Achilles tendon began in December 2015

- Winner of 14 singles titles and one doubles title on ITF Circuit
- Played first senior tournament at \$25k/ITF Bucharest in 2007 and first WTA main draw at 2014 Bad Gasten (l. Ka.Pliskova in 2r)

youngest American to defeat reigning No.1 in eight years (after McHale)

- Advanced to R16 at 2019 Roland Garros (d. S.Williams, l. eventual champion Barty) became first American to defeat Serena at the majors since Stephens at 2013 Australian Open QF
- Also won maiden doubles titles in 2019 at Auckland (w/Bouchard) and Beijing (w/Mattek-Sands)
- Broke into the Top 100 on March 19, 2018 and Top 50 on October 8, 2018
- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team from 2018-20
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2015 US Open as a wildcard (l. Duque-Mariño in 1r)
- Owns four ITF singles titles and two doubles titles
- Played first matches of career on ITF Circuit in 2013, climbing to No.2 in ITF World Junior Rankings
- Represented the USA at the 2014 Youth Olympic Games and competed at the 2016 ITF Junior Masters, both held in China







- Played last tournament of 2022 at Tokyo in September and took the 2023 season away from tennis
- Started 2022 strongly, advancing to 3r at Australian Open (l. Keys), followed by SF at Guadalajara (l. Bouzkova) and QF at Monterrey (l. eventual champion Fernandez). Also reached SF at Prague in July (as qualifier, l. Potapova)
- Best result in 2021 was R-Up finish at Parma (l. Gauff). Also reached 3r at Phillip Island Trophy and 2r on six occasions

- Year highlighted by upsetting 23-time Grand Slam champion S.Williams en route to reach R16 for the first time at Australian Open (l. Jabeur)
- Due to various concerns with the pandemic and waist injury (lumbar disc herniation), did not play again following 1r exit at Doha

- Her US Open run made her just the fifth Chinese woman to reach a Grand Slam QF (after Li Na, Zheng Jie, Peng Shuai and Zhang Shuai)
- Her new career-high ranking of No.12 following New York result made her the second highest ranked Chinese singles player in history (after No.2 Li Na)
- Additionally posted best result at Wimbledon by advancing to 3r and also reached second Premier Mandatory QF at Miami
- Enjoyed breakout 2018 campaign with careerbest year-end finish at No.20 and 37 main draw match wins (including four Top 10 victories), her first season of 30 or more wins in career
