MATCH NOTES – THURSDAY, 26 SEPTEMBER 2024

Camila Osorio (COL #59) vs. Ajla Tomljanovic (AUS #107)

Osorio leads 1-0

Osorio:

- Making China Open debut
- Has a 1-1 record against players from Australian so far this season, defeating Tomljanovic in 1r at Monterrey
- Prior to Beijing, became the first player from Colombia to reach a WTA 500 semifinal at Guadalajara (defeated by Australian player Olivia Gadecki in SF)
- Has reached two career hard-court finals finishing Runner-Up at 2022 Monterrey and 2021 Tenerife

Tomljanovic:

- Competing in her second China Open main draw after making 2r in 2019 (l. Riske Amritraj)
- One of three players from Australia in the main draw, along with qualifiers Arina Rodionova and Kimberly Birrell; the last time three Australian players made Beijing 1r was 2017
- Has won nine Tour-level main draw matches so far in 2024 with her best result achieved on grass at Birmingham with R-Up (l. Putintseva in F)

Yafan Wang (CHN #58) vs. Ashlyn Krueger (USA #68)

Krueger leads 1-0

Wang:

- From four previous China Open main draw appearances, has made 2r on two occasions: in 2019 (l. Svitolina) and 2016 (l. Kvitova)
- Owns a 2-2 match record against players from the United States so far in 2024, most recently defeated by Coco Gauff in 2r at Toronto
- Her sole career title came on hard court at Acapulco in 2019

Krueger:

- Making her second China Open appearance after reaching 1r as a qualifier in 2023 (l. Jabeur)
- Reached a career high ranking of No.51 earlier this month after a run of strong results across Toronto (R16), Cincinnati (3r) and US Open (3r)
- Defeated today's opponent Wang in their only previous meeting at Nottingham this year
- Owns one career title which came on hard court during last season's Asian swing at Osaka

Viktorija Golubic (SUI #96) v. Xiyu Wang (CHN #95)

Golubic leads 2-1

Golubic:

- Making China Open debut
- Faced today's opponent in most recent Tour-level main draw match at Hua Hin 2 last week (Wang won the match, 7-5 6-1)
- Is the first player from Switzerland to play China Open since 2019 (Belinda Bencic and Jil Teichmann)

- This is her second WTA1000 appearance over the last two seasons after having lost in 2r at 2023 Miami (I. Samsonova)

Wang:

- Making third appearance at Beijing, where she previously played 1r as a wild card in 2023 (I. Kvitova) and 2019 (I. Siniakova)
- Sole career title came on hard court in China at Guangzhou last season
- Third main draw meeting at China Open between players from China and Switzerland after Martina Hingis vs. Sun Tiantian and Martina Hingis vs. Peng Shuai, both in 2007 and both won by Hingis
- Could become the first Chinese left-handed player to secure a main draw win at China Open since the inception of the event in 2004
- Won two of her last eight WTA 1000 main draw matches, defeating Anna Karolina Schmiedlova in Miami and Ana Bogdan in Madrid this season

[Q] Elena-Gabriela Ruse (ROU #93) vs. [WC] Sijia Wei (CHN #140)

First meeting

Ruse:

- Making main draw debut at Beijing, having played qualifying in 2023 (I. Krueger)
- Best result at WTA1000 event was R16 at Miami in 2022 (I. Saville)
- Best career result on hard courts is R-Up at Cluj-Napoca in 2023
- Earned spot in main draw through qualifying beating two other players from China en route
- Has won her last 16 matches against players outside the Top 100 (including qualifying); last and only loss of 2024 came to No.301 Emma Raducanu at Auckland

Wei:

- Making Beijing debut in third ever WTA main draw this week looking for first career WTA main draw win
- So far on Tour, fell 1r at 2023 Nanchang and 2024 Hua Hin 2
- Also looking for first ever Top 100 win on any level

Anna Blinkova (#78) vs. Karolina Muchova (CZE #49)

First meeting

Blinkova:

- Third main draw appearance at the China Open reaching 2r last year for best result
- First WTA main draw meeting against Karolina Muchova
- Looking to snap an eight-match losing streak going back to Bad Homburg, the second longest losing streak of her career (highest is nine matches)
- Is 7-7 this year against Top 50 players
- Best result at a WTA 1000 event came earlier this year reaching 3r at Indian Wells (beat No.5 Jessica Pegula in 2r)

Muchova:

- Making second appearance at Beijing falling 12 in 2019 (I. Keys)
- Sole career title came on hard courts at Seoul in 2019 (d. Linette in F); has also reached one other final on the surface finishing R-Up at 2023 Cincinnati (I. Gauff)
- Missed rest of 2023 season post-US Open due to injury; playing Asian swing for first time since 2019

CAREER MILESTONES

- Made SF run at 2023 Lyon (l. Garcia). Advanced to R16 at Rome (l. Haddad Maia) for the first time at a WTA 1000 after notching first Top 5 win (over Garcia).

Also in 2023 reached the QF at Palermo (l. Sherif) and Nanchang (l. Bouzkova). Earned first Top 5 victory at 2023 Rome against Carolina Garcia.

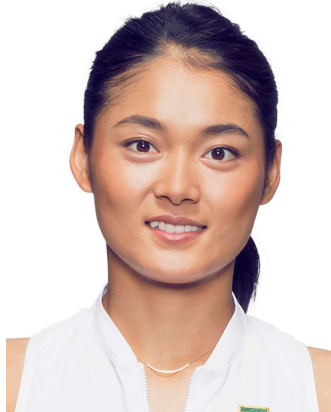
- In spring of 2022, made QF at Guadalajara 250 (l. Kalinskaya), R-Up run at Monterrey (l. Fernandez), and SF at Bogota (l. Pigossi) in title defense campaign
- Biggest win of 2022 season came against No.19 Ekaterina Alexandrova in 1r at Guadalajara late in the season
- Won maiden WTA title on home soil, at 2021 Bogotá (d. Zidansek in F); at No.180 was the lowest-ranked WTA title winner since No.299 Gasparyan triumphed at 2018 Tashkent
- In 2021, also finished R-Up in final event at Tenerife (l. Li), reached SF at Charleston [250] and Belgrade, and battled through qualifying to reach 3r at Wimbledon
- Made Top-100 debut on May 24, 2021, following run through qualifying to SF at Belgrade
- Finished 2020 ranked at No.186 - the same position she ended 2019 campaign, too. Best results were SF at \$25k ITF/Saint-Malo- FRA., while contested qualifying at Australian Open and Roland Garros
- In 2019 won second and third career ITF Circuit titles, both at \$25k Guayaquil-ECU
- Won first ITF Circuit singles title at \$15k Cucuta-COL
- Colombian Billie Jean King Cup Team 2016-17, 2019
- Fell 1r on WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bogotá (as WC, l. Blinkova)
- Made professional debut in qualifying at 2016 Bogotá (l. Perrin in 3s)
- On the ITF Junior Circuit rose to No.1 in September 2019, shortly after winning US Open girls' singles title (d. Yepifanova in F)

- Began the 2023 season in August after undergoing minor knee surgery in January. Pulled out of her 2r match at US Open before ending the season on a high note winning Florianopolis WTA 125 (d. Capurro Taborda).
- Best performances of 2022 produced at Wimbledon and US Open with QF. Also reached QF at Istanbul, Rabat, Nottingham and Cincinnati.
- Produced Grand Slam breakthrough at 2021 Wimbledon, advancing to QF (l. eventual champion Barty)
- Other singles highlights last season were runs to R16 at Indian Wells and 3r at both US Open and Charleston
- Equaled best result at home Slam by advancing to 2r at 2020 Australian Open (l. Muguruza)
- Ended 2019 season by representing Australia in Perth final of Billie Jean King Cup vs. France - went 1-1 in singles (d. Parmentier, l. Mladenovic) as visitors prevailed 3-2
- Posted career-high ranking of No.39 on April 1, 2019 (following 3r run at Miami 3r)
- Four-time WTA singles finalist, most recently finishing runner-up at 2019 Hua Hin (l. Yastremska). Earlier finals came at 2015 Pattaya City (l. Hantuchova), 2018 Rabat (l. Mertens) and 2018 Seoul (l. Bertens)
- Posted two Top 10 wins in 2019, her first for almost five years, defeating No.10 Sabalenka (Miami) and No.8 Bertens (Zhengzhou). Other Top 10 defeat, and best win of career, came over No.3 A.Radwanska at 2014 Roland Garros
- Reached first Premier-level SF of career at 2019 Zhengzhou (l. eventual champion Ka.Pliskova)
- Underwent shoulder surgery in February 2016 and was sidelined for rest of season; returned at 2017 Acapulco, more than 12 months later
- Made Top 50 debut in 2015, rising as high as No.47 (week of February 23)
- Best Grand Slam result to date is R16 run at 2014 Roland Garros (d. No.32 seed Vesnina in 2r and No.3 seed A.Radwanska in 3r, l. Suárez Navarro)
- Announced in 2014 she would switch nationalities and start representing Australia (first did so at 2014 US Open)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of four singles titles and three doubles titles
- Made pro debut on ITF Circuit in Croatia in 2007 and WTA main draw debut at 2009 Indian Wells (as WC, l. 1r)
- As a junior, achieved career-high ranking of No.4, won Australian Open junior doubles title in 2009

(w/McHale), and was a member of Croatia's victorious junior Fed Cup team in 2009

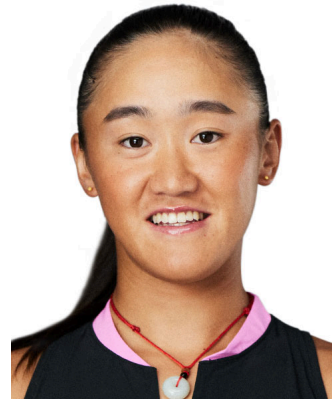

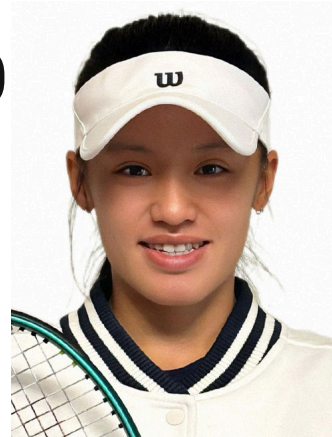
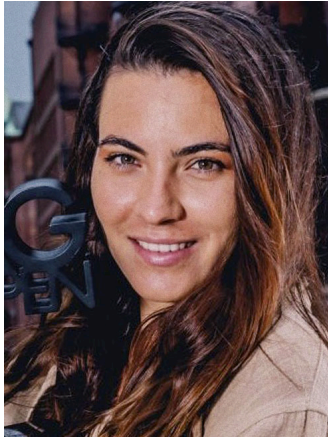
