

# **MATCH NOTES – FRIDAY, 27 SEPTEMBER 2024**

### [32] Veronika Kudermetova (#39) vs. Xinyu Wang (CHN #50)

Wang leads 1-0

#### Kudermetova:

- In her third China Open, she previously made 3r in 2023 (I. Gauff)
- Posted her best result of the 2024 season so far last week at Seoul with SF (I. eventual champion Haddad Maia)
- Sole career hard court title came in Asia, at 2023 Tokyo
- Owns a 5-11 match record against Top 50 players this season with her most recent win achieved over No.15 Liudmila Samsonova at Seoul last week

### Wang:

- Making 3rd appearance at Beijing, where her previous result was reaching 3r in 2023 (I. Sakkari), which is her equal best result at a WTA 1000 event, along with 3r at Indian Wells 2023 (I. Krejcikova)
- Defeated Kudermetova in straight sets in their only previous meeting in 2r at Miami this season
- Best career result on hard court is SF at Hua Hin 2024; Osaka, Hua Hin in 2023; Prague in 2021
- Best result by China at Beijing was SF by Wang Qiang in 2018, Li Na in 2012 and 2010, Zheng Jie in 2008, Peng Shuai in 2007 2006
- Is currently ranked No.50; this time last year was ranked No.38

## Diane Parry (FRA #53) vs. [2] Jessica Pegula (USA #3)

First meeting

#### Parry:


- Making her main draw debut at China Open
- Has won one of her seven career meetings against Top 10 players, defeating No.2 Barbora Krejcikova at 2022 Roland Garros
- Is playing close to her career high ranking of No.49 which she reached on Apr 08, 2024
- Best result by France at China Open was by Caroline Garcia who won the title in 2017

#### Pegula:

- Featuring in her third China Open, reaching her best result last year with 3r (l. Ostapenko)
- Has won 15 out of her last 17 matches, reaching the final at Toronto (won), Cincinnati (R-Up) and US Open (R-Up)
- Following US Open, she returned to her career high ranking of No.3 for the first time since August 2023
- Since the start of the 2020 season, only two players have claimed 50+ WTA 1000 match wins on hard court Iga Swiatek (61) and Pegula (59)
- Her last defeat against a player ranked outside the Top 50 was to No.168 Emma Raducanu at Eastbourne this year

## Clara Burel (FRA #56) vs. [4] Coco Gauff (USA #6)

Gauff leads 1-0

#### Burel:

- Making China Open debut
- From her seven previous career meetings with Top 10 players, has claimed one win which was over No.5 Jessica Pegula at 2024 Australian Open
- Best result on hard court came at Monastir 2023 with semifinal
- In 2024 so far has a match record of 4-9 against seeded players

#### Gauff:

- Making her second appearance at China Open, reaching SF in her debut last year (I. eventual champion Swiatek)
- Competing in only her second career tournament in China
- Defeated Burel in their only previous meeting in 2r at 2024 Indian Wells
- Has not been defeated by a player outside the Top 50 this year; last defeat against such a player was at 2023 Wimbledon against No.128 Sofia Kenin
- Is fourth among the 2024 match leaders with 41 match wins; Iga Swiatek (57), Aryna Sabalenka (46), Emma Navarro (45) and joint with Elena Rybakina (41)
- Her sole title of 2024 came on hard court at her season opener at Auckland

## [6] Emma Navarro (USA #8) vs. [WC] Shuai Zhang (CHN #595)

First meeting

#### Navarro:


- Making tournament debut
- Has not lost to a player outside the Top 500 since July 2021 when Navarro was ranked No.369
- Lost her opening match of a tournament just once at a hard-court tournament this year at Cincinnati (I. Mirra Andreeva)
- Currently at No.7 on the PIF Race to the WTA Finals Leaderboard
- With 45 match wins so far in 2024, is No.3 on Tour in matches won this year after Iga Swiatek (57) and Aryna Sabalenka (46)

#### Zhang:

- Two-time Beijing quarterfinalist, most recently in 2018
- Snapped a 24-match losing streak with first round win over McCartney Kessler, the second-longest losing streak in the Open Era; losing streak dated back to 2023 Lyon
- Owns eight wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently over No.10 Caroline Garcia at 2022 Tokyo which was also her most recent match against a Top 10 player
- One of two wildcards to reach the second round
- Currently ranked No.595 on PIF WTA Rankings, the lowest-ranked player to play the main draw in the tournament's history

## Naomi Osaka (JPN #73) vs. [21] Yulia Putintseva (KAZ #32)

#### Putintseva leads 3-2

#### Osaka:

- 2019 China Open champion (d. Barty in final) is making her fourth main draw appearance at Beijing
- Has won their two most recent meetings including one this year at BJK Cup qualifiers in April
- Looking to put together back-to-back wins for the first time since reaching quarterfinals at 's-Hertogenbosch this year
- All seven of her career titles have come on hard courts most recently 2021 Australian Open as well as her four additional runner-up finishes; last final reached was 2022 Miami (I. Swiatek)
- Is second on Tour in first serves won percentage (75.1%) and service points won percentage (63.8%)

#### Putintseva:

- Making seventh main draw appearance at Beijing and looking to reach the third round for the first time
- Has dropped opening match of a tournament four times this year most recently last week at Seoul (I. Anisimova in 1r)
- Has reached the quarterfinals of a WTA 1000 tournament four times in career including twice already this year at Miami (I. Azarenka in QF) and Madrid (I. Rybakina in QF)
- Has jumped more than 30 ranking spots so far this year starting the season off at No.63

## CAREER MILESTONES

- · Won second career title at 2023 Tokyo (d. Pegula in F) and finished R-Up at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Alexandrova in F); ended year at No.19 for second straight Top 20 year-end ranking
- · Also in 2023, reached SF at Adelaide 2, Doha, Madrid and Rome; qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai going 1-1 in group play
- In doubles, won titles in 2023 at Dubai with Liudmila Samsonova and Zhuhai with Beatriz Haddad Maia
- Made Top 10 debut in singles on October 24, 2022, following QF run at Guadalajara 1000 and Top 10 debut in doubles on January 31, 2022 ending the year at No.2
- Singles highlights in 2022 were R-Up finishes at Melbourne Summer Set 1 (l. Halep), Dubai (l. Ostapenko) and Istanbul (l. Potapova), and reached maiden Grand Slam QF at Roland Garros (l. Kasatkina)
- Won doubles title at 2022 WTA Finals in Fort Worth with partner Elise Mertens; also won title at Dubai and 's-Hertogenbosch with Mertens as well as Rome with Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova
- Appeared in maiden WTA final at Abu Dhabi in opening event of 2021 (l. Sabalenka) before securing first title at Charleston (d. Kovinic)
- In doubles won title at Istanbul with Elise Mertens and made final at Wimbledon (w/Vesnina) and Indian Wells (w/Rybakina) Scored first win over a Top-3 ranked opponent by upsetting No.3 Karolina Pliskova at 2020 Cincinnati. Other highlights in 2020 included SF run at Hobart and closing out season with backto-back QFs at Ostrava and Linz
- Won 27 main-draw matches during 2019 had previously won six across entire career - to rise over 60 places in the WTA rankings, making Top-100 debut on February 4 and Top-50 debut on September 9
- Singles highlights in 2019 included reaching SF at 's-Hertogenbosch, Hiroshima and Tianjin and 3r at Roland Garros where she defeated No.13 Caroline Wozniacki in 1r - her maiden Grand Slam main draw win and first over a Top-20 opponent)
- Also in 2019, won WTA 125K Series title at Guadalajara (d. Bouzkova in F) and entered Top 50 on Sept 9, 2019
- · Posted first two Top 10 wins of career in final weeks of 2019, over No.10 Belinda Bencic at Wuhan and No.4 Elina Svitolina at Moscow
- Fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at 2019 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Kenin)

- Dramatically improved her ranking across 2023 season, making Top 50 debut in September and hitting No. 32 in October. Posted best result at three of the four Slams, including R16 run at Roland Garros. Also reached semifinals at Hua Hin and Osaka (l. Zhu both times).
  - In doubles, claimed Roland Garros title (w/Hsieh) and runner-up at Hua Hin (w/Zhu) and Merida (w/Wu), with her doubles ranking peaking at No. 18 on September 11, 2023.
- Reached 2r on six occasions in 2022, including at Australian Open (l. Sabalenka). Also won sixth career ITF Circuit title, at W60 event in Tokyo in November
- Made Top 100 debut on November 15, 2021
- Highlight of 2021 was SF at Prague (l. eventual champion Krejcikova). Also advanced to QF at Courmayeur (l. Vekic) and Linz (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Riske)
- In 2020, fell 1r at Shenzhen (l. Muguruza) and Hua Hin (l. Liang)
- Opened 2019 season with maiden Tour-level main draw win at Shenzhen Open (d. F.Xun, l. Sharapova), went on to post two more 2r runs at Nanchang (l. Rybakina) and Tianjin (as qualifier, l. Peterson)
- Lifted maiden WTA doubles title at 2019 Nanchang w/L.Zhu (d. Peng/Zhang in F)
- Won three consecutive ITF titles in 2019, at \$25K ITF/Shenzhen 2-CHN (d. F.Xun in F), \$25K ITF/Hengyang-CHN (d. Z.Sun in F) and \$25K ITF/Tianhin-CHN (d. Jovic in F)
- In 2018, won maiden title of career at \$25K ITF/Nonthaburi 4-THA (d. Wang Xiyu in F)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2018 Australian Open (l. Cornet in 1r)
- Also in 2018, contested qualifying on WTA Tour for the first time at Shenzhen Open and competed in maiden WTA main draw at Guangzhou (l. Khazaniuk)
