MATCH NOTES – SATURDAY, 28 SEPTEMBER 2024

[3] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #5) vs. Clara Tauson (DEN #72)

First meeting

Paolini:

- Second appearance at China Open after reaching 3r here last season (I. Sabalenka)
- First time facing a player from Denmark
- One of two players from Italy to reach the 2r along with Cocciaretto
- First player from Italy to feature as a Top 3 seeded player at a WTA 1000 event since Flavia Pennetta at 2015 Beijing
- In the past 10 years, Sara Errani in 2015 (48) is the only Italian player with more main draw matches in a single season than Paolini (36 in 2024)
- Only Iga Swiatek (45), Aryna Sabalenka (38) and Coco Gauff (31) have won more Grand Slam and WTA 1000 main draw matches in 2024 than Paolini (29)

Tauson:

- Making China Open debut
- This is her eighth meeting with a Top 10 player, she owns one win against No.7 Anett Kontaveit at 2022 Australian Open; is 0-2 against Top 10 players this year
- Only player from Denmark in main draw
- Has never won consecutive matches at WTA 1000 events; she owns five career WTA 1000 main draw match wins
- Owns two hard court titles, both in 2021: Luxembourg and Lyon

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#2) vs. [Q] Mananchaya Sawangkaew (THA #187)

First meeting

Sabalenka:

- Appearing at China Open for a fourth time, previously making QF in 2023 (I. Rybakina) and 2018 (I. Wang Qiang)
- Facing a player from Thailand for the first time in her career
- Is second only to Iga Swiatek (57) in number of match wins so far in 2024 with 46
- Iga Swiatek (30) is the only player with more WTA 1000 match wins in 2024 than Sabalenka (20)
- Currently on a 12-match winning streak after claiming the US Open title; her second Grand Slam title of the year after Australian Open
- Is 9-1 against players outside the Top 100 this year, only loss to No.132 Amanda Anisimova at Toronto; a loss today would be worst by-ranking since 2019
- In 14 tournaments played this year, has lost her opening match just once at Dubai
- Has won seven of her last eight WTA 1000 matches against qualifiers, with only loss to Caroline Garica at 2022 Cincinnati over that span
- Has won four WTA titles in China this century; the joint most with Agnieszka Radwanska

Sawangkaew:

- Making China Open debut
- Only player from Thailand in the main draw
- Played her first Tour-level main draw match in the week prior to Beijing at Hua Hin 2 (I. eventual champion Sramkova)
- Her 1r win here over Zarina Diyas was the first Tour-level main draw match of career
- The highest ranked player she has ever faced was No.89 Linda Fruhvirtova at ITF 100K Takasaki last season (Sawangkaew won that match)
- Best result by Thailand at China Open was R16 by Tamarine Tanasugarn in 2008 and 2004

[LL] Kamilla Rakhimova (#71) vs. [5] Qinwen Zheng (CHN #7)

First meeting

Rakhimova:

- Making main draw debut at Beijing as a Lucky Loser has been an LL five other times in career with best result as LL reaching 3r at 2021 US Open
- Win over Kimberly Birrell in 1r was first career WTA 1000 main draw victory
- Looking to earn first career win over Top 10 player has gone 0-2 so far this year against Top 10 opponents losing to No.3 Aryna Sabalenka at Washington DC and No.1 Iga Swiatek at US Open
- Playing first Tour-level match against a player from China

Zheng:

- Making second appearance at Beijing, where she fell 1r in 2023 (I. Rybakina) looking for first career win here
- Owns one hard court title at Zhengzhou 2023 (d. Krejcikova in F)
- Has lost opening match of a tournament three times this year with two at WTA 1000 events: Indian Wells (after 1r bye, I. Yuan), Madrid (after 1r bye, I. Putintseva) and Wimbledon (I. Sun)
- Is currently ranked No.7; this time last year was ranked No.23
- Leads Tour in first serves won percentage (75.3%) and second on Tour in aces (308)
- Won the Gold Medal in women's singles for China at the Paris Olympics this summer

[30] Yue Yuan (CHN #41) vs. Karolina Muchova (CZE #49)

First meeting

Yuan:

- Looking to reach the third round here in Beijing for the first time, made second round on debut here last year as a wildcard
- Won sole career title on hardcourts at Austin earlier this year defeating compatriot Xiyu Wang in the final
- Reached first career WTA final during Asian swing last year at Seoul (I. Pegula in final)
- This is her first time in career receiving a bye at a WTA event

Muchova:

- Making second appearance at Beijing falling 12 in 2019 (I. Keys)
- Playing Beijing for the first time since 2019; missed rest of 2023 season post-US Open due to injury; playing Asian swing for first time since 2019
- Sole career title came on hard courts at Seoul in 2019 (d. Linette in F); has also reached one other final on the surface finishing R-Up at 2023 Cincinnati (I. Gauff)
- Lost her only match against a Chinese player this year falling to Qinwen Zheng in the Palermo final

[18] Madison Keys (USA #24) vs. [Q] Sara Sorribes Tormo (ESP #104) Sorribes Tormo leads 1-0

Keys:

- Making seventh appearance at Beijing, where her best result was reaching SF in 2016 (I. Konta)
- Has lost opening match of a tournament twice this year at Charleston (after 1r bye, I. Cristian) and Toronto (after 1r bye, I. Stearns)
- Has won her last nine matches against qualifiers (3-0 so far this year), last loss came to Kayla Day at 2023 Roland Garros
- Loss to Day at 2023 Roland Garros was also last loss to a player outside the Top 100, has gone 10-0 since then

Sorribes Tormo:

- Making second appearance at Beijing, where she is into the second round for the first time
- Defeated Xinyu Gao in a first-round match that lasted four hours, 15 minutes the fourth longest match in the Open Era
- Has gone 4-11 against Top 50 opponents this year with last win at Rome
- Won their previous match against Keys at 2018 Madrid

Viktorija Golubic (SUI #96) vs. [16] Donna Vekic (CRO #20)

Golubic leads 1-0

Golubic:

- Making China Open debut
- Won only previous encounter against Vekic at Nottingham 2023 in straight sets
- Owns seven wins in career over Top 20 players going 1-1 this year with a win over No.17 Veronika Kudermetova at Australian Open 2024 and losing to No.6 Jessica Pegula at the Olympics
- Has reached three hard court finals in career at 2021 Monterrey, 2021 Lyon and 2016 Linz, finishing runner-up at all three events

Vekic:

- Making fifth appearance at Beijing, where her best result was reaching R16 in 2018 (I. Sevastova)
- Has yet to reach QFs of a WTA 1000 event in career
- Has won 12 of her last 13 matches with players outside the Top 50; a loss today would be worst by-ranking since falling to No.125 Olga Danilovic at 2024 Roland Garros
- Three of her four WTA titles have come on hard courts at Monterrey in 2023; Courmayeur in 2021; Kuala Lumpur in 2014

CAREER MILESTONES

- Finished 2023 by breaking into Top 30 for first time, achieving No. 29 on Oct 23, 2023 after becoming runner-up at Monastir (l. Mertens). Also achieved runner-up at Palermo and SF at Zhengzhou (l. Zheng both times) as well as QFs at Lyon (l. Garcia) and Cincinnati as a qualifier (l. eventual champion Gauff). Enjoyed two Top 10 wins (No.10 Garcia and No.4 Rybakina).
- In 2022, finished R-Up at Cluj-Napoca (l. Blinkova), while made back-to-back SF at Palermo (l. Bronzetti) and Warsaw (l. eventual champion Garcia)
- Also reached QF at Lyon (l. Yastremska), Portoroz (l. eventual champion Siniakova) and Parma (l. Kovinic)
- · Broke into Top 50 on January 31, 2021
- Posted near-Top 50 season finish in 2021 after capturing first WTA singles title of career at Portoroz (d. Riske in F)
- Strong season finish also brought SF run at Courmayeur(l. eventual champion Vekic) and QF effort at Linz (l. Halep); posted best win of season over No.18 Mertens en route to 3r at Indian Wells (l. Pegula)
- Also in 2021 won the WTA 125K event in Bol, Croatia (d. Rus in F) and was R-Up at the same level in Saint Malo (l. Golubic) Captured first WTA doubles title in 2021, at Hamburg(w/Teichmann)
- In 2021, for first time in career, contested the full suite of all four Grand Slam events; reached 2r at Roland Garros and USOpen, equalling best previous Slam result
- In 2020, reached 2r four times at WTA tournaments, including Roland Garros (l. Kvitova)
- Highlights of 2019 included QF showings at Guangzhou and Palermo, a SF run at the WTA 125K Series event at Karlsruhe, lifting seventh, eighth and ninth ITF Circuit titles of her career, at \$60KBrescia-ITA, \$25K ITF/Curtiba-BRA and \$100K ITF/Tokyo-JPN, and qualifying for maiden Grand Slam main draw at Roland Garros (l. Kasatkina in 1r)
- Ended 2018 ranked No.180, with season highlight a maiden WTA singles QF at Prague (d. No.15 Kasatkina, l. Zhang)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bastad (l. Suarez Navarro in 1r) and also fell 1r at Guangzhou and in qualifying a further three times
- Part of Italy's Billie Jean King Cup team 2017-19
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2015 Rome

- In 2023 matched her career best Grand Slam result at Roland Garros where she reached the 3r as a qualifier (l.Avanesyan); contested qualifying at Wimbledon (l. Q3 Hruncakova) and at US Open (l. Q2 Stearns).
- Best tour result in 2023 was reaching the QF's at Linz (l. Martic)
- In 2023 season, won the ITF \$60K Altenkirschen (d. Minnen in f) and further reached the final at ITF \$40K (l. Hontama)
- Ended her 2023 season ranked at No.85
- Back injury restricted her to just 11 WTA maindraw outings in 2022, with best result a QF showing at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (l. Sasnovich). Also finished R-Up in her last event of the year at WTA 125K Series event in Limoges and won one ITF Circuit title at W25 Selva Gardener
- Came through qualifying to win maiden WTA title in Lyon in March 2021; in final, beat fellow qualifier Golubic - last time two qualifiers met in a WTA final was at 2017 Tokyo [Japan Open], when Diyas beat Kato
- Won over 40 matches in 2020 (all levels) to finish inside Top 50
- Ended 2020 season ranked No.152 (up from No.267 at the end of 2019) after posting 30-7 win-loss record. Best results were 2r at Roland Garros (as qualifier, d.No.25 Brady, l. Collins) and lifting two titles on ITF Circuit
- Made Tour-level debut (main draw and qualifying) with 1r exit at 2019 Lugano (as wildcard qualifier, l. Rodina)
- Lifted four ITF Circuit singles titles in 2019
- Won maiden ITF Circuit title in just her second tournament, at \$15k ITF/Stockholm-SWE in 2017
- Reached SF on professional debut at \$15k ITF/Antalya-TUR in 2017
- On ITF Junior Circuit has lifted nine singles titles, including at 2019 Australian Open (d. Fernandez in F). In 2019 she became the first Dane to top the junior world rankings

- Owns nine singles and one doubles title on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Italy in 2011

- Ended 2019 ranked No.19 for career-best yearend finish (up from No.34 in 2018), having cracked the Top 20 for the first time on October 21, 2019
- Produced career best Grand Slam result at 2019 US Open, where she reached QF (l. Bencic)
- Also in 2019, finished R-Up at St. Petersburg (l. Bertens); en route to final, posted best win of career by ranking and third over a Top 5 opponent with defeat of No.2 Kvitova in QF, bettering victories over No.4 Stephens at 2018 Wimbledon and No.4 Garcia at 2018 Tokyo [PPO]
- Also made final at Nottingham (l. Garcia in third set tie-break) and ended 2019 by qualifying for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai (fell RR)
- Ended 2018 at then-career-high ranking of No.34, after registering 31 tour-level wins.
 Campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Washington, DC (l. Kuznetsova after holding 4mp) - her first finals appearance since winning 2017 Nottingham - and made SF showings at Nottingham and Tokyo [PPO], and reached Grand Slam R16 for first time at Wimbledon (l. Goerges)
- Enjoyed a resurgent year in 2017, breaking the Top 50 on July 24 and finishing campaign ranked No.54. Grass court season saw her lift a second WTA singles title of career, at Nottingham (d. No.8 Konta in final) - prior to this run had not posted back-to-back main draw wins since September 2015 (R-Up at Tashkent)

- Prior to 2016 had contested two tour-level events, having come through qualifying on both occasions: 2013 Bad Gastein (d. Bertens, l. Hlavackova), 2014 Shenzhen (d. Wozniack, l. Beck)
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2010 Budapest, and main draw debut at 2013 Bad Gastein
- Debut on ITF Circuit came at \$10k ITF/Budapest-HUN in 2008

- winning her fifth and most recent title at this level at \$100k ITF/Sharm El Sheikh-EGY
- Highlights in 2015 included reaching final at Tashkent (l. Hibino) and QF at Baku
- Ranked No.95, lifted maiden WTA singles title at 2014 Kuala Lumpur (d. No.10 Cibulkova in final); aged 17 y 10 m, became youngest player to win a WTA singles title since 2006 Bangkok (Vania King)
- Reached first WTA career final at 2012 Tashkent (l. Begu) on her WTA main draw debut, and in doing so became youngest WTA finalist since 15year-old Paszek won Portoroz in 2005
- Broke into Top 100 (at No.93) on January 28, 2013 Has won five ITF Circuit singles and one doubles title
- Member of Croatian Fed Cup Team, 2012-15, 2017, 2019
