

[32] Veronika Kudermetova (#39) vs. [2] Jessica Pegula (USA #3)

Kudermetova leads 2-0

Kudermetova:

- In her third China Open, she previously made 3r in 2023 (I. Gauff)
- Rematch of the 2023 Tokyo final, which Kudermetova won 7-5, 6-1 to improve to 2-0 against the American
- Made her first semifinal of the season last week in Seoul (I. eventual champion Haddad Maia)
- Bidding for her first Top 5 win since beating Pegula in Tokyo. Has lost her last three matches vs. Top 5 opposition

Pegula:

- Entered Beijing at No.5 on PIF Race to the WTA Finals Leaderboard; WTA Finals runner-up last year (I. Swiatek), bidding to qualify for third consecutive year.
- Entered the summer hard-court season at No.20 on PIF Race to the WTA Finals and proceeded to win 16 of her last 18 matches. Both losses have come to No.2 Aryna Sabalenka in the finals of Cincinnati and US Open.
- Has made the final or better at four of her last six tournaments (excluding Olympics), including first Grand Slam final earlier this month at US Open
- Despite missing Middle East swing due to injury, owns 25 hard court wins this season; fourth on tour behind Sabalenka (31), Navarro (30) and Swiatek (29)
- Has won 135 tour-level matches on hard court since the start of 2020 season, trailing only Iga Swiatek (147) (incl. Olympics and team events)

[WC] Shuai Zhang (CHN #595) vs. Greet Minnen (BEL #94)

First meeting

Zhang:


- Two-time Beijing quarterfinalist, most recently in 2018
- With first round win over McCartney Kessler, she broke a 24-match losing streak second longest in the Open Era
- With her second round win over No.6 seed Emma Navarro, she earned her first Top 10 win since 2022 Tokyo and posted back-to-back wins for the first time since 2023 Australian Open
- Only WC to reach 3r; best result by a WC at Beijing were SF runs by Wang Qiang in 2018 and Peng Shuai in 2006
- Currently ranked No.595 on PIF WTA Rankings she becomes the lowest-ranked player to reach China Open third round (record previously held by No.415 Xu Yifan in 2007)

Minnen:

- Making debut at Beijing
- Has not defeated a player from China before in two previous career meetings
- Achieved her equal best career hard court result in China at Guangzhou last season with semifinal
- Looking to win three main draw matches in a row for the first time since that run at Guangzhou
- One of two players from Belgium to reach the third round along with Elise Mertens
- With a win today would become the first player from Belgium to reach R16 at China Open

[26] Katie Boulter (GBR #34) vs. [4] Coco Gauff (USA #6)

Tied 1-1

Boulter:

- Making third appearance at Beijing, where she is into the third round for the first time
- Bidding for her fourth Top 10 victory today and first since defeating Jessica Pegula at United Cup in January
- Has lost last two matchups with Top 10 players
- Won first hard-court title earlier this year at San Diego (d. Kostyuk)

Gauff:

- Making second China Open appearance after reaching semifinals here last year
- Owns 6-1 record against British players winning the most recent meeting between the two at 2023 Montreal
- Enters Beijing at No.6 on PIF Race to the WTA Finals behind Jessica Pegula and ahead of Emma Navarro; bidding to qualify for third consecutive WTA Finals
- Announced split with coach Brad Gilbert after US Open. Has added Matt Daly to team to coach alongside long-time coach Jean-Christophe Faurel
- Victory today would be her 47th WTA 1000 hard court win, moving her ahead of Caroline Wozniacki for the most WTA 1000 hard court wins before turning 21 since the format was introduced in 2009
- Entering Beijing, leads tour in Return Games Won (48.4%) and fourth in first-serve points won (71.3%)

[15] Paula Badosa (ESP #19) vs. [Q] Rebecca Sramkova (SVK #61)

Badosa leads 1-0

Badosa:


- Making main draw debut at Beijing
- Her 2r victory over Tomova this week was 20th hard-court match-win of the season
- Has won her last 10 matches against players outside the Top 50, last loss came to No.93 Jessica Bouzas Maneiro at Madrid earlier this year
- One of two Spanish women into the third round (also Cristina Bucsa); best result by a Spanish woman at Beijing was Garbiñe Muguruza's run to the title in 2015
- This season, ranks No.3 on tour in percentage of break points saved (63.7%) and No.9 in total aces (227)

Sramkova:

- Making Beijing tournament debut, as a qualifier
- Currently on a 9-match winning streak (including qualifying matches) after beating Top 50 players Kalinina and Alexandrova in main draw
- Has gone 13-1 this month (including qualifying matches) by making first WTA final in Monastir and winning first WTA title at Hua Hin #2
- Owns two wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.18 Karolina Muchova at 2023 Warsaw
- Currently ranked a career-high No.61; was ranked No.136 just 2 weeks ago
- Contesting just her third WTA 1000 main draw of career (all this year)

Katie Volynets (USA #60) vs. Naomi Osaka (JPN #73)

First meeting

Volynets:

- Making main draw debut at Beijing
- Facing a player from Japan for the first time at Tour-level
- Looking to win three main draw match wins in a row for the first time since reaching SF at 2023 Austin
- Best result by a player from USA at Beijing was Serena Williams who claimed the title in 2004 and 2013
- Achieved her best Tour-level result of the 2024 season so far in Asia at Hua Hin with quarterfinal run (I. Wang Yafan)
- At No.60, is playing close to her career high ranking of No.56 achieved on July 29, 2024

Osaka:

- 2019 China Open champion (d. Barty in F) is making her fourth main draw appearance at Beijing, she is the only former champion in the draw
- All seven of her career titles have come on hard court most recently 2021 Australian Open as well as her four additional runner-up finishes; last final reached was 2022 Miami (I. Swiatek)
- Has not won against a player from the United States yet this year, falling to Danielle Collins at Abu Dhabi, Emma Navarro at Wimbledon as well as Ashlyn Krueger in qualifying at Cincinnati
- With her 2r win here in Beijing over Yulia Putintseva, has won consecutive matches for the first time since reaching quarterfinals at 's-Hertogenbosch this year

CAREER MILESTONES

- Won second career title at 2023 Tokyo (d. Pegula in F) and finished R-Up at 2023 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Alexandrova in F); ended year at No.19 for second straight Top 20 year-end ranking
- Also in 2023, reached SF at Adelaide 2, Doha, Madrid and Rome; qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai going 1-1 in group play
- In doubles, won titles in 2023 at Dubai with Liudmila Samsonova and Zhuhai with Beatriz Haddad Maia
- Made Top 10 debut in singles on October 24, 2022, following QF run at Guadalajara 1000 and Top 10 debut in doubles on January 31, 2022 ending the year at No.2
- Singles highlights in 2022 were R-Up finishes at Melbourne Summer Set 1 (l. Halep), Dubai (l. Ostapenko) and Istanbul (l. Potapova), and reached maiden Grand Slam QF at Roland Garros (l. Kasatkina)
- Won doubles title at 2022 WTA Finals in Fort Worth with partner Elise Mertens; also won title at Dubai and 's-Hertogenbosch with Mertens as well as Rome with Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova
- Appeared in maiden WTA final at Abu Dhabi in opening event of 2021 (l. Sabalenka) before securing first title at Charleston (d. Kovinic)
- In doubles won title at Istanbul with Elise
 Mertens and made final at Wimbledon
 (w/Vesnina) and Indian Wells (w/Rybakina)
 Scored first win over a Top-3 ranked opponent
 by upsetting No.3 Karolina Pliskova at 2020
 Cincinnati. Other highlights in 2020 included SF
 run at Hobart and closing out season with backto-back QFs at Ostrava and Linz
- Won 27 main-draw matches during 2019 had previously won six across entire career - to rise over 60 places in the WTA rankings, making Top-100 debut on February 4 and Top-50 debut on September 9
- Singles highlights in 2019 included reaching SF at 's-Hertogenbosch, Hiroshima and Tianjin and 3r at Roland Garros where she defeated No.13 Caroline Wozniacki in 1r - her maiden Grand Slam main draw win and first over a Top-20 opponent)
- Also in 2019, won WTA 125K Series title at Guadalajara (d. Bouzkova in F) and entered Top 50 on Sept 9, 2019
- Posted first two Top 10 wins of career in final weeks of 2019, over No.10 Belinda Bencic at Wuhan and No.4 Elina Svitolina at Moscow
- Fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at 2019 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Kenin)

- Won two titles in 2023, her second WTA 1000 tournament at Montreal and also WTA 250 Seoul. Also finished R-Up at Doha, Tokyo and at the WTA Finals in Cancun.
 - In doubles ascended to No.1 ranking (co-ranked with Coco Gauff) after 2023 US Open.
- Achieved career-high No. 3 in October 2022 after defeating four Grand Slam champions at Guadalajara, en route to ending three-year wait for second WTA title (d. Sakkari in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Fort Worth in both singles and doubles (w/Gauff), thus becoming the first Americans to debut in singles and doubles at the season-ending showpiece since Davenport in 1994
- Reached QF at three of the four majors in 2022, breaking into Top 10 after doing so at Roland Garros (June 6, 2022)
- One of seven players to win 40 or more matches in 2022, alongside Swiatek, Jabeur, Garcia, Sakkari, Kasatkina and Bencic
- In 2021, reached the QF or better on seven occasions, including at the Australian Open
- Broke into Top 20 on November 1, 2021
- Began 2020 with runner-up finish at Auckland (l. S.Williams), other standout results were a QF at Western & Southern Open (as qualifier, l. Mertens) and a 3r showing at US Open (l. Kvitova)
- On the doubles court in 2020, reached QFs of Roland-Garros (w/Muhammad) and Cincinnati (w/Rogers)
- Won her first WTA title at 2019 Washington DC (d. Giorgi in F)
- Also in 2019, fell 1r on main draw debut at Roland-Garros (l. eventual champion Barty) and Wimbledon (l. Buzarnescu) and Miami (as a qualifier, l. Konta)
- Broke into Top 100 for the first time on February 4, 2019 following back-to-back R-Up finishes at WTA 125K Series event at Newport Beach and W100 ITF Circuit tournament in Midland-MI, USA
- Highlights of 2018 included finishing R-up as a qualifier at Quebec City (l. Parmentier in F), recording SF finish at Houston WTA 125K Series tournament (l. S.Peng) and reaching QF or better at 10 ITF events
- Did not play between January and August 2017 after undergoing hip surgery. Primarily played at ITF Circuit events for the rest of the year, winning two doubles titles with Townsend
- Played a mixture of WTA and ITF Circuit events in 2016 with highlight coming at Washington DC,

- Won career first WTA doubles title at 2019
 Wuhan with Yingying Duan (d.
 Mertens/Sabalenka in F); also in 2019 was R-Up
 at Charleston (w/Khromacheva) and Lugano
 (w/Voskoboeva)
- Posted maiden career WTA QF runs in 2018, first at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. eventual champion Krunic) and then Gstaad (l. Bouchard)
