## MATCH NOTES – MONDAY, 30 SEPTEMBER 2024

[18] Madison Keys (USA #24) vs. [13] Beatrice Haddad Maia (BRA #12)

Series tied at 1-1

### Keys:

- Making seventh main draw appearance at Beijing, where her best result was SF in 2016 (l. Konta)
- Best result at WTA-1000 events was champion run at Cincinnati 2019 (d. Kuznetsova)
- After 1r bye, has beaten Sara Sorribes Tormo to reach 3r
- Owns 64 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.19 Marta Kostyuk at Wimbledon 2024
- Owns 2-1 career record against players from Brazil, having played today's opponent Haddad Maia twice - won at Rome 2024 while lost at Zhuhai 2023
- Three of her eight career titles have come on hard courts: Adelaide 250 in 2022, Cincinnati in 2019, Stanford in 2017

### Haddad Maia:

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, where her previous result was reaching 1r in 2023 (l. Paolini)
- After 1r bye, has beaten Sijia Wei to reach 3r
- Owns 53 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.44 Veronika Kudermetova at Seoul 2024
- Owns two singles titles on hard court at Seoul 2024 and Zhuhai 2023
- Only player from Brazil to reach 3r
- Is currently ranked No.12; this time last year was ranked No.18

Nadia Podoroska (ARG #66) v. Qinwen Zheng (CHN #7)

Zheng leads 1-0

### Podoroska:

- Has beaten Yufei Ren and Dayana Yastremska to reach 3r, equaling her previous best result at a WTA-1000 event (3r at Indian Wells 2024)
- Seeking first Top 10 win since she defeated No.8 Serena Williams at Rome 2021
- Seeking first career QF at WTA-1000 events
- Best career result on hard court is SF run at Ningbo 2023 and Chennai 2022
- Only player from Argentina in main draw

### Zheng:

- After 1r bye, has beaten Kamilla Rakhimova in opening match to score her first win at Beijing
- Owns 1-0 career record against players from Argentina, having played and defeated today's opponent Podoroska at US Open 2023
- Best career result on hard court is lifting the title at Zhengzhou in 2023 (d. Krejčíková in F)
- One of 2 players from China to reach 3r (along with Shuai Zhang)
- Is currently ranked No.7; this time last year was ranked No.23

### [1] Aryna Sabalenka (#2) v. Ashlyn Krueger (USA #68)

First meeting

#### **Sabalenka:**

- After 1r bye, has beaten Mananchaya Sawangkaew to reach 3r
- Record against opponents outside Top 50 stands at 18-1 in 2024 season, with the only loss coming against No.132 Anisimova at Toronto 2024
- Owns 55-17 career record against players from United States of America (11-2 in 2024), playing today's opponent Krueger for the first time
- 14 of her 16 career titles have come on hard courts: US Open, Cincinnati, Australian Open in 2024; Australian, Adelaide #1 in 2023; Abu Dhabi in 2021; Linz, Ostrava, Doha in 2020; Zhuhai, Wuhan, Shenzhen in 2019; Wuhan, New Haven in 2018
- Is No. 1 seed this week; has been top seed at 18 tournaments in her career and won the tournament as top seed just twice at 2018 Shenzhen and 2020 Linz
- Has won 47 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.2 on tour for match wins, behind Iga Swiatek (57)

#### **Krueger:**

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, where her previous result was 1r in 2023 (as qualifier, l. Jabeur)
- Best result at a WTA-1000 event was R16 run at Toronto 2024 (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Has beaten Yafan Wang and Lulu Sun to reach 3r
- Faces No.2 Aryna Sabalenka in 3r today, seeking first career Top 10 win, having failed in all of her four previous meetings against such opponents
- Her sole career singles title has come one hard court at Osaka 2023

### [3] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #5) vs. [31] Magda Linette (POL #45)

Tied 1-1

#### **Paolini:**

- Making her second appearance at China Open after reaching 3r here last season (l. Sabalenka)
- First player from Italy to feature as a Top 3-seeded player at a WTA 1000 event since Flavia Pennetta at 2015 Beijing
- In the past 10 years, Sara Errani in 2015 (48) is the only Italian player with more main-draw match-wins in a single season than Paolini this year (37)
- Only Iga Swiatek (45), Aryna Sabalenka (38) and Coco Gauff (32) have won more Grand Slam and WTA 1000 main-draw matches in 2024 than Paolini (30)
- Won her first WTA 1000 title earlier this year in Dubai

#### **Linette:**

- Making 4th main-draw appearance at Beijing; she also reached 3r last year (l. to compatriot Swiatek)
- Seeking consecutive wins for the first time since losing to Paolini at the Paris Olympics
- Has 4-26 career record against Top 10 players (0-4 this year); all four of her Top 10 wins have occurred at Grand Slam events
- 2 of her 3 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court (2019 Bronx and 2020 Hua Hin)

**First meeting**

#### **Andreeva:**

- Making 2nd appearance at Beijing, where she reached the 3r last year as a qualifier (l. Rybakina)
- Defeated Irina-Camelia Begu in 2r for her 10th win in her last 13 matches
- Owns 11 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.5 Jasmine Paolini at 2024 Cincinnati
- Contesting her 8th career WTA 1000 main draw; she is already a 2-time WTA 1000 quarterfinalist (Madrid and Cincinnati this year)
- Ranks No.1 on tour this season in percentage of first-serve return points won (42.6%)

#### **Vekic:**

- Making 5th main-draw appearance at Beijing, where her career-best result is making R16 in 2018 (l. Sevastova)
- Defeated Viktorija Golubic in 2r for her 17th win in her last 22 matches
- Owns 34 wins in career over Top 25 players, most recently victories over No.2 Coco Gauff and No.19 Marta Kostyuk en route to silver medal at 2024 Paris Olympics
- 3 of her 4 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court (2014 Kuala Lumpur, 2021 Courmayeur and 2023 Monterrey)
- Ranks No.9 on tour in total aces this year (231)

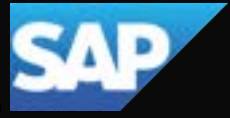

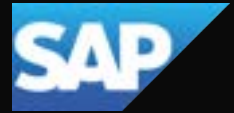

## CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2023, won seventh career title at Eastbourne (d. Kasatkina in F), reached SF at US Open and reached four QFs including Wimbledon; also qualified for WTA Elite Trophy in Zhuhai (0-2 in group play)
- At 2022 Adelaide, won first title in over two years (d. Riske in F), followed by SF run at Australian Open - best Slam showing since 2018
- Other highlights in 2022 were SF at Cincinnati and two further QF runs, including at Indian Wells
- In Grand Slam play, 2021 season was highlighted by R16 run at Wimbledon (l. Golubic). Finished campaign inside Top 100 for ninth successive year, but outside Top 20 for first time since 2014
- Ended 2020 ranked No.16, with best result being R-Up finish at Brisbane (l. Ka. Pliskova)
- Lifted biggest title of career during 2019 season at WTA 1000 Cincinnati (d. Kuznetsova in F); afterwards returned to Top 10 for first time since week of June 25, 2018
- Also won title at Charleston (d. Wozniacki) and reached QF at 2019 Roland Garros (l. Barty), one of three Americans to make last eight (also Anisimova and Stephens) - the first time since 2004 (Capriati, S.Williams and V.Williams) Reached three SFs in 2018 at Charleston, Roland Garros and US Open
- Reached first Grand Slam final in 2017 at US Open, losing to Sloane Stephens in 10th all-American final in the Open Era. At 22, became the youngest Flushing Meadows finalist since 19-year-old Caroline Wozniacki lost to Kim Clijsters in 2009 Also in 2017, won third WTA title at Stanford (d. Vandeweghe)
- Enjoyed first Top-10 year-end finish in 2016 (at No.8), was youngest player in Top 20; won second title at Birmingham (d. Strycova) and reached final at Rome (l. S.Williams) and Montreal (l. Halep)
- Broke into Top 10 on June 20 as first American to make Top-10 debut since S.Williams in 1999
- Made WTA Finals debut at Singapore in 2016, going 1-2 in round-robin play
- Represented USA at 2016 Rio Olympics, reaching SF (l. Bronze medal match to Petra Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2015, 2018-19; went 1-1 in round-robin stage on all three appearances, with best result SF run in 2018 (withdrew before match vs. Muguruza w/left knee injury)
- Advanced to maiden major SF at 2015 Australian Open (l. eventual champion S.Williams); broke
- Broke into Top 10 in June 2023 after a strong clay season with SF at Roland Garros and QF at Rome and Stuttgart; ended year at No.11
- Also in 2023, won third career title at WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai (d. Q.Zheng) and reached SF at Abu Dhabi and QF at Adelaide 2, Doha and San Diego
- In doubles, won titles at Madrid w/Victoria Azarenka (d. Gauff/Pegula) and WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai w/Veronika Kudermetova (d. Kato/Sutjiadi)
- 2022 season highlighted by a stellar sequence of results on grass, when she became the first woman ever to win Nottingham and Birmingham back-to-back, her first career WTA titles
- Broke into the Top 20 following her run to the first WTA 1000 final at 2022 Toronto (l. Halep); also in 2022 advanced to SF at Monterrey and Eastbourne and three further QFs
- Also in 2022, won two titles at WTA 125K events in Saint Malo and Paris
- Won third doubles title at 2022 Nottingham w/Shuai Zhang (d. Dolehide/Niculescu), also reached final at Australian Open w/Anhelina Danilina (Krejcikova/Siniakova) and Guadalajara 1000 w/Danilina (l. Hunter/Stefani); earned spot at WTA Finals Fort Worth in doubles with Danilina going 1-2 in group play
- In 2021, peaked at No.80 in rankings; highlights where R16 at Indian Wells and falling 1r at Chicago 500; also played qualifying at Wimbledon and US Open and won five ITF Circuit titles in 2021
- Posted best win-by-ranking of career in 2021, defeating No.3 Karolina Pliskova during run to R16 as LL at Indian Wells. Played only on ITF Circuit in 2020 winning four titles and reaching one other final
- Highlights of 2019 were SF at Bogota and QF at Acapulco (both as qualifier); earned first Top 10 win of career over No.4 Sloane Stephens at Acapulco
- Ended 2018 at No.184, with season highlight reaching 3r at Miami (l. Ostapenko). Also made 2r at Hobart, Australian Open and Acapulco.
- Posted first Top 100 season in 2017, finishing at No.65
- Broke into Top 100 following first Grand Slam main draw appearance at 2017 Roland Garros, earning spot as a qualifier Reached first WTA singles final at 2017 Seoul while ranked No.71 (l. No.10 Ostapenko)
- Other 2017 highlights include QF at Prague (as qualifier) and first Grand Slam main draw win at

into Top 20 following conclusion of tournament, on February 2

- Also in 2015, reached second career title at Charleston (l. Kerber) and reached QF at Wimbledon
