Amanda Anisimova (USA #46) vs. Viktoriya Tomova (BUL #54)

Anisimova leads 1-0

Anisimova:

- Making her first Seoul appearance
- Defeated Putintseva in opening match which marked first win for almost a month, since making the F at Toronto (I. Pegula)
- She owns one hard court title, at the WTA 250 in Melbourne in 2022
- One of two Americans to make the 2r here (also Baptiste)

Tomova:

- Also making her Seoul debut
- Owns seven wins over Top 50 players at Tour level, most recently defeating No.26 Noskova at Bad Homburg in the summer
- Has reached one hard court QF in her career, at Hobart 2024
- Won her most recent encounter with an American player, defeating Davis at Cleveland

Ajla Tomljanovic (AUS #122) vs. [3] Beatriz Haddad Maia (BRA #17)

First Meeting

Tomljanovic:

- Reached the final here in 2018 (I. Bertens)
- Bidding to win back-to-back matches today for the first time since run to 2024 Birmingham final (I. Putintseva)
- Currently owns 15 wins over Top 20 players in career

Haddad Maia:

- Also a former finalist here, contesting the title match in 2017 (I. Ostapenko)
- Owns one hard court title in career, winning 2023 Zhuhai
- Unbeaten against Australian players at Tour main draw level (3-0)
- Recently reached the final at Cleveland (I. Kessler in final)

Emma Raducanu (GBR #70) vs. [8] Yue Yuan (CHN #40)**First Meeting***Raducanu:*

- Has reached SF here in 2022 (l. Ostapenko)
- Owns 21 wins in career over Top 50 players including most recent No.48 Peyton Stearns in the previous round
- Aiming to reach her fifth quarterfinal of 2024
- Seeking fifth career 500-level quarterfinal; most recently reached the same stage at Washington DC 2024

Yuan:

- Last year's runner-up at Seoul (l. Pegula in final)
- Only player from China to reach 2r
- Won her first title on hard courts earlier this year at Austin (d. X. Wang)
- Did not face a single breakpoint in the final two sets against Elena-Gabriela Ruse in the previous round

[1] Daria Kasatkina (#13) vs. Hailey Baptiste (USA #105)**First Meeting***Kasatkina:*

- Making debut appearance at Seoul
- Has reached the final at four WTA 500-level tournaments this year (Adelaide, Abu Dhabi, Charleston, and Eastbourne)
- Is the top seed at a tournament for the sixth time in her career
- Last fell to an opponent outside the Top 100 at Toronto 2024 (l. then-No.132 Amanda Anisimova)

Baptiste:

- Dropped just one service game in a straight sets win over Sloane Stephens in the previous round
- Seeking first Tour-level quarterfinal
- Only win against a Top 20 player came against Madison Keys at Washington DC 2019; is 0-7 in matches against Top 20 players since
- Made Top 100 debut earlier this year (peaked at No.96 – March 18, 2024)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Played a small number of tournaments in 2023 before taking a break away from the sport after Madrid in April
- Lifted second career title at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (d. Sasnovich in F) in January 2022
- In 2022, also made SF at Charleston (l. Jabeur) and five further QFs, including at Wimbledon (l. Halep)
- Ended 2021 season with 3r run at Indian Wells to secure her fourth consecutive Top-100 finish. Best results were QF runs at Parma and Bad Homburg
- Opened 2020 with SF showing at Auckland, going on to reach 3r at US Open, Roland Garros and Doha; during Doha run, earned third career Top 10 win over No.7 Svitolina (l. Kuznetsova in 3r due to walkover)
- Finished 2019 ranked No.24 - the youngest of three teenagers in the Top 50 (also Andreescu and Yastremska)
- Posted career best Grand Slam result with SF run at 2019 Roland Garros - first player (man or woman) born in 2000s to advance to this stage of a major. Scored maiden win over a Top 5 player during 2019 Roland Garros, upsetting No.3 and defending champion Halep in QF
- Result boosted her into Top 50 for first time at No.26 on June 10, 2019
- Won maiden title at 2019 Bogotá (d. Sharma in F); at 17y 222d was the youngest American to win a title since S.Williams at 1999 Indian Wells (17y 169d)
- Made Top 100 debut at No.95 on September 17, 2018, after reaching first WTA final at Hiroshima (as qualifier, l. Hsieh)
- Also in 2018, upset No.9 Kvitova to become the joint-youngest player to reach R16 at Indian Wells, along with Majoli, who made SF in 1994 (both aged 16 years, 199 days)
- Played only two ITF tournaments before making WTA main draw debut at 2017 Miami (l. Townsend in 3s), with Grand Slam bow coming at 2017 Roland Garros (l. Nara in 1r)
- Owns six Top 20 wins: No.9 Kvitova (2018 Indian Wells), No.11 Sabalenka (2019 Australian Open), No.11 Sabalenka (2019 Roland Garros), No.3 Halep (2019 Roland Garros), No.7 Svitolina (2020 Doha) and No.19 Riske (2020 Western & Southern Open)
- In juniors, won US Open girls' singles in 2017 (d. Gauff in F) and was R-Up at 2016 Roland Garros; reached No.2 in junior world rankings
- Owns one singles title on ITF Circuit
- Claimed first WTA 125 event at 2023 Chicago (d. Liu in F). Reached second round at 2023 Wimbledon (l. Boulter). Reached career high ranking of No.71 on May 22, 2023.
- Best result of 2022 was QF run at Eastbourne (as LL, l. Giorgi). Also finished R-Up at WTA 125 in Budapest and at W80 ITF Circuit tournament in Oeiras
- Broke into Top 100 for first time on August 8, 2022, following SF run at W80 ITF Circuit event in Grodzisk Mazowiecki, Poland
- Advanced to maiden WTA SFs during 2021 season, first at Bogota (l. Zidasek) and then at Belgrade (as LL, l. eventual champion Badosa)
- On Tour's return in 2020, fell 1r at US Open and Istanbul before reaching SF at \$80k ITF/Cagnes sur Mer-FRA
- In final event before the tour's hiatus, made 2r at Lyon (l. Van Uytvanck)
- Started 2020 with a productive spell on ITF Circuit in Great Britain, finishing R-Up at \$25K Glasgow before winning 16th title at this level at \$25K Sunderland (d. Raducanu in F)
- Made four Tour-level appearances in 2019, highlighted by 2r showing at Osaka (as qualifier, d. Cornet, l. Osaka), while won title at \$80K ITF/Biarritz-FRA (d. Kovinic in F)
- Highlights of 2018 were Grand Slam main-draw debut at Australian Open (l. Gibbs in 1r) and first ever Grand Slam main-draw victory at Wimbledon (as qualifier, d. Smitkova, l. S.Williams). Also made 2r at Istanbul and Hong Kong
- In 2017, reached 2r at Bastad (as qualifier, l. Krunic) and Linz (as qualifier, l. Golubic). Also fell 1r at Gstaad - making her WTA main draw debut - and in qualifying on 12 occasions (including all four majors)
- Maiden Top-50 upset came over No.40 Goerges in 1r at 2017 Bastad (via ret.)
- Made successful comeback from injury in 2016, winning 64 matches and four titles, rising over 300 places in the rankings. Since return has stopped playing doubles to protect injury
- In 2015, missed five months with a leg muscle strain - ended season at No.474
- Member of Bulgarian Billie Jean King Cup Team, 2014-15, 2017-19, 2021-22
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2010 Miami
- On ITF Circuit owns 16 singles titles and 12 doubles titles
- Played first events of career on ITF Circuit in Bulgaria in 2009

- Made professional debut at 2016 US Open qualifying (L. Hozumi in 2r)
