MATCH NOTES - DAY 1 - TUESDAY, APRIL 23, 2024

[WC] Brenda Fruhvirtova (CZE #106) vs. Arantxa Rus (NED #47)

First Meeting

Fruhvirtova is aiming for just her second Top 50 win (also defeated Blinkova at 2024 Auckland)... Fruhvirtova has won 15 titles on the ITF tour since 2022; 14 of those 15 titles came on clay, most recently at W40 Guadalajara... Fruhvirtova made her Top 100 debut earlier this year, reaching as high as No.94 on March 4... Rus has reached three quarterfinals this year, all at the 250-level: Rouen, Cluj-Napoca, and Hobart ...Rus' win at Rouen over No.1 seed Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova was her best win-by-ranking since 2012 Wimbledon ...Rus has lost two of her most recent three meetings with players ranked outside the Top 100

Nadia Podoroska (ARG #66) vs. Katerina Siniakova (CZE #40)

Podoroska leads 1-0

Podoroska recently claimed the WTA 125 at San Luis Potosi, defeating Fran Jones in the final... **Podoroska** is looking for her first Tour-level win on clay after opening round losses at Bogota (I. Pigossi) and Rouen (I. Andreeva)... **Siniakova** won the doubles title at 2021 Madrid with partner Barbora Krejcikova... **Siniakova** is aiming to reach the second round in singles at Madrid for the third time in six attempts; she has never reached the third round here... **Siniakova** suffered an injury at Miami in 2023 causing her to miss almost the entire clay season last year

Irina-Camelia Begu (ROU #128) vs. [WC] Linda Fruhvirtova (CZE #146)

Begu leads 1-0

Begu is playing in her first Tour-level match since 2023; she recently reached the final at WTA 125 Antalya, where she fell to Bouzas Maneiro in the final... **Begu** reached the quarterfinals here three times, including last year, where she fell to Maria Sakkari... **Begu** previously defeated **Fruhvirtova** when the latter was just 14 years old, in a matchup at W100 Cairo... **Fruhvirtova** is looking for just her second Tour-level win of 2024, with her previous victory coming at Hua Hin (d. Tikhonova)... **Fruhvirtova** will celebrate her 19th birthday on May 1st

Xiyu Wang (CHN #52) vs. Anna Bogdan (ROU #64)

Wang leads 2-0

Wang is competing in her first Tour-level match on clay this year... Wang reached the third round at Madrid last year before falling to then-No.12 Barbora Krejcikova... Wang defeated Bogdan on clay in both of their previous meetings at WTA 125 Valencia and Budapest, both in 2022... Bogdan scored a Top 20 victory over Elina Svitolina on clay at the Billie Jean King Cup qualifying rounds... Bogdan is aiming to reach the second round at Madrid for just the second time in her career, after reaching the stage last year

CAREER MILESTONES

- Made 1r on Grand Slam debut at 2023 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Sasnovich). Also reached 1r at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Rybakina).
- Posted 50-9 win-loss record last season, winning eight ITF Circuit tournaments in 2022
- Suffered 1r defeat on WTA debut at Guadalajara [250] (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Stephens)
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Tunisia in January 2022
- Enjoyed successful junior career, reaching No.4 in ITF rankings
- In 2023 won first career singles title at Hamburg (d. Akugue in F). Won two WTA 125 singles titles

 at La Bisbal D'Emporda in June and
 Contrexeville in July. Broke into Top 50 for first time in career in August reaching No.41.
- Highlight of 2022 season was QF at Rabat (l. Trevisan). Also won 28th, 29th and 30th career titles on ITF Circuit
- Best Tour-level results in 2021 were QF runs at Strasbourg (l. Niemeier) and Tenerife (l. Giorgi). Also finished R-Up at WTA 125K Series claycourt events in Bol and Belgrade, while won three ITF Circuit titles, most recently at W80 Valencia, Spain in September
- Advanced to career first Tour-level SF at 2020 at Monterrey (l. eventual champion Svitolina)
- Took No.9 S.Williams to three sets at 2020 Western & Southern Open, falling to the American in just under three hours
- Across entire career, best wins, in terms of ranking, were over No.2 Clijsters at 2011 Roland Garros and No.5 Stosur at 2012 Wimbledon
- Made 2r showing at 2020 Australian Open (d. Linette - her first Grand Slam main draw win since 3r run at 2012 US Open - l. Keys)
- After Australian Open (February 3), returned to Top 80 for the first time since March 2013; career-high ranking is No.61 (August 13, 2012)
- Broke into Top 100 in doubles in 2020, reaching a career high of No.81 (November 16)
- In 2019, won 10 singles titles on ITF circuit and ended the year ranked No.103. In total, played 98 matches in 2019 (including qualifying and ITF level tournaments)
- Made first Grand Slam main draw appearances since 2013 with 1r exits at 2018 Roland Garros (l. Stephens), Wimbledon (l. S.Williams) and US Open (l. Cibulkova)
- Returned to Top 100 on June 11, 2018 after Roland Garros
- Best result to date at the majors has come at Roland Garros where she reached R16 in 2012 and 3r in 2011 (d. No.2 Clijsters in 2r, for careerbest win). Also reached 3r at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ended 2017 ranked No.160 (up from No.174 in 2016). Season highlights in 2017 included reaching QF on home soil at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Vikhlyantseva) and finishing R-Up at WTA 125K Series event at Taipei (l. Bencic). On ITF Circuit, won 13th and 14th career titles at \$25K ITF/Middelburg-NED and \$25K ITF/Hua Hin-THA
- In doubles, won first career WTA title at 2017
 Bastad (w/Lemoine, d. Irigoyen/Krejcikova in F)

- Five-time WTA singles quarterfinalist, at 2008 Guangzhou, 2010 Estoril, 2013 Bad Gastein, 2017 's-Hertogenbosch and 2018 Istanbul
- Played first two WTA main draws at 2007 and 2008 's-Hertogenbosch (fell 1r both times)
- Cracked Top 100 on April 4, 2011 and finished season at No.84; duly reached career-high ranking of No.61 on August 13, 2012 and finished that year at No.68 - her second Top 100 finish
- Struggled with results from 2013, at one point losing 17 matches in a row at WTA level before reaching QF at Bad Gastein. Dropped to No.160 by end of 2013 and was ranked outside Top 200 at end of 2014 and 2015
- Played full seasons in 2015 and 2016 (clawed way back into Top 200 by season's end, at No.174) but was absent from Grand Slam action altogether during these two years
- Member of Dutch Fed Cup Team, 2010-11, 2013-18, 2020; nominated for a Fed Cup Heart Award in 2015 when she helped Netherlands progress to World Group for first time since 1998
- Former world No.1-ranked junior and 2008
 Australian Open girls' singles champion and R-Up in doubles (w/Kerkhove)

- Born in Prague, but has been training at the Mouratoglou Tennis Academy in Southern France since 2017
- · Sister Linda is a also a professional player
- Coached by Julian Alonso and trains in Barcelona; also works with Dutch Tennis Federation

- Favorite shots are backhand and serve; favorite surface is clay
