MATCH NOTES - DAY 2 - WEDNESDAY, APRIL 24, 2024

[Q] Jessica Bouzas Maniero (ESP #93) vs. Paula Badosa (ESP #101)

Bouzas Maniero making her Madrid main draw debut after falling in qualifying 2021, 2022 and 2023... **Badosa** making her sixth main draw appearance at Madrid where her best performance was reaching semifinals in 2021 as a wildcard... **Bouzas Maniero** playing just her fourth career WTA main draw and second on clay... **Badosa** retired from her most recent match in Stuttgart with a left thigh injury... **Bouzas Maniero** owns one win at this level defeating Olivia Gadecki at 2023 United Cup; looking for first main draw win in a WTA event

[Q] Sara Errani (ITA #100) vs. [WC] Caroline Wozniacki (DEN #117)

Both players appearing in their 11th Madrid main draw: **Wozniacki** finished runner-up on her debut in 2009 falling to Dinara Safina in the final and **Errani's** best performance here was semifinal run in 2013 losing to Serena Williams... **Wozniacki** won their most recent meeting at 2018 Istanbul and their only two previous meetings on clay... **Errani's** sole win between the two came at 2008 Portoroz... **Wozniacki** playing here for the first time since 2019... **Errani** has had success on clay already this year starting her season reaching semifinals at Bogota a few weeks ago

Naomi Osaka (JPN #197) vs. [LL] Greet Minnen (BEL #69)

Osaka's best result here was reaching quarterfinals in 2019 while **Minnen** retired in her first-round match in only appearance in 2022... **Osaka's** best career result on clay was reaching semifinals at 2019 Stuttgart... **Minnen** owns just one WTA main draw match win on the surface also coming at 2019 Stuttgart when she beat Dominika Cibulkova in the first round, has gone 0-7 on clay since then

[WC] Emma Raducanu (GBR #221) vs. [Q] Maria Lourdes Carle (ARG #82)

Raducanu making second appearance at Madrid where she reached third round in 2022... **Carle** making Madrid debut this week in just her second WTA main draw of the year after falling in first round at Miami as a qualifier in first career WTA 1000 main draw appearance... **Raducanu** opened her clay season this year reaching quarterfinals at Stuttgart last week... **Carle** owns just one WTA main draw win beating Eva Lys on clay at 2022 Hamburg; however is coming off WTA 125K title run at La Bisbal d'Emporda and owns 13 ITF titles, nine of which came on clay

Mirra Andreeva (#43) vs. Taylor Townsend (USA #58)

Andreeva reached Round of 16 last year here on debut as a wildcard ranked No.194 and beating Top 20 players No.14 Beatriz Haddad Maia and No.19 Magda Linette en route before falling to eventual champion Aryna Sabalenka; since then has jumped over 150 ranking spots making Top 50 debut in October... **Townsend** making main draw debut in singles but made semifinals in doubles here last year... **Andreeva** coming off first career clay court quarterfinal appearance last week in Rouen... **Townsend** has had three Top 50 wins this year, most recently No.15 Ekaterina Alexandrova at Charleston



CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2023, won one ITF W60 in Rome. Earned a spot at Grand Slam qualifying for the first time at 2023 US Open (l. Babos) and 2023 Roland Garros (l. Ferro).
- Earned first ITF title at Madrid \$15K in 2020 on clay.
- Made professional debut in January 2018 at \$15K ITF/Hammamet 2, Tunisia.
- 2023 was a difficult season for Badosa; while she made the SF at Adelaide #2, reached backto-back QF at Charleston and Stuttgart and an additional QF at Rome, she withdrew from Roland Garros with a back injury. Her last match of the year was at Wimbledon, where she fell in the R64. She ended her season afterwards due to continuing injury
- In 2022, Badosa rose to career-high ranking of No.2 (April 25), won one title, at Sydney and advanced to SF at Indian Wells, Stuttgart and San Jose
- Captured the first two WTA singles titles of her career in 2021 at Belgrade (d. Konjuh in F) and Indian Wells (d. Azarenka in F
- Qualified for AKRON WTA Finals Guadalajara, where she advanced to the SF stage
- Broke into the WTA Top 20 on October 18, 2021 after winning the Indian Wells title and reached the Top 10 on November 8, 2021
- Nominated for 2021 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year (won by Krejcikova), as voted on by members of the media
- In 2021 also advanced to SF at Madrid, Charleston and Lyon and QFs at Roland-Garros, Cincinnati and Olympics
- At 2020 Roland Garros, upset former finalist Stephens and 2017 champion Ostapenko en route to reaching R16 for the first time at a major. That year also reached SF at Istanbul (l. Bouchard)
- Campaign in 2019 highlighted by SF run at Palermo (l. Bertens) and QF showing at Seoul (l. Y.Wang); also fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Birrell)
- Finished 2018 inside Top 200 for the first time (at No.143); picked up three ITF titles at \$25k ITF/Glasgow-UK, ITF/\$25k Les Franqueses del Valles - FRA and ITF/\$60k Valencia-ESP
- Fell in qualifying at 2018 Wimbledon, Madrid and US Open
- Claimed third title on ITF Circuit in 2017 at ITF/\$25k El Espinar; Fell 1r at Miami and in qualifying at Madrid
- In 2016, fell 1r at Miami, Madrid and Mallorca and in qualifying at Rio de Janeiro
- As wildcard, made breakthrough on WTA Tour with 3r run at 2015 Miami Open (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- Came through qualifying at 2015 Madrid, fell 1r to Errani via ret. w/left leg injury
- Continued at ITF Circuit level during 2013-2014 before playing second WTA qualifying draw at 2015 Antwerp, where she advanced to 2r (l. Bodarenko)

- Ended 2018 just outside Top 100 (at No.108) after a campaign in which she reached QF at Rabat (l. Mertens); reached 3r at Charleston and captured won one WTA 125K Series singles title and 27th career doubles title -- at Auckland (w/Schoofs)
- Ended 2017 season ranked No.143 (previous year-end finish outside the Top 100 came in 2006 at No.171). Missed around two months of 2017 season (August to October) due to an antidoping violation; departed tour following 2017 Washington DC, returning with SF run at Tianjin in October (l. Sabalenka)
- Following return to competition at end of 2017, won ITF \$60k-Suzhou-CHN and reached SF at ITF \$100k-Dubai-UAE (l. Bencic)
- Posted ninth successive Top 50 season in 2016, highlighted by winning ninth (and biggest) WTA singles title of career at Premier-level Dubai (d. Strycova in F) - owns 9-10 record overall in finals, and reached at least one final every year between 2011-2016
- Was previously 0-4 in Premier-level singles finals, finishing runner-up at 2014 Rome, 2014 Paris [Indoors], 2013 Dubai and 2013 Paris [Indoors]
- Represented Italy in doubles w/Vinci at 2016 Rio Olympics (l. Safarova/Strycova in QF); the team of Errani/Vinci reunited in Montréal for the first time since playing Fed Cup in February 2015

- After 3-year hiatus, returned to Tour at 2023 Montreal reaching 2r (l. Vondrousova). Played 1r of Cincinnati (l. Gracheva) and ended her season at US Open, reaching 4r (l. eventual champion, Gauff).
- Initially retired at 29 years old in 2020, played last tournament at Australian Open 2020 (l. Jabeur in 3r)
- Ended 2019 ranked No.38 her first non-Top 20 finish since 2007 - having announced rheumatoid arthritis diagnosis at WTA Finals in October 2018
- Season highlight in 2019 was reaching final at Charleston (l. Keys) and SF at Beijing where she was the defending champion (l. Osaka)
- Until 2019, had won at least one title in 11 straight seasons (since 2008), including six titles in both 2010 and 2011

- Highlight of 2018 was winning her first Grand Slam title (d. 

• Played 2022 Tokyo in September before taking a 15 month break to give birth to daughter Shai in early July 2023.

In 2022 had success at Miami, where she fell to Swiatek in the final, her first final since the 2021 Australian Open. Also reached the semifinals at Melbourne 250 #1 (withdrew before semifinal with Kudermetova w/abdominal injury)

- Won 2021 Australian Open (d. Brady in F) to become first woman since Seles in the early 1990s to win each of her first four Grand Slam finals - is the 16th woman to win four or more majors in the Open Era
- At 2020 US Open, came from a set and a break down to Azarenka and win third Grand Slam title of career
- Also last season was R-Up at Western & Southern Open - withdrew w/left hamstring injury before final against Azarenka
- Won second Grand Slam at Australian Open (d. Kvitova in F); became first Japanese player to reach World No.1 ranking following the tournament
- In addition, won back-to-back titles for first time in her career at Osaka (d. Pavlyuchenkova in F) and Beijing (d. Barty in F); defeated No.1 Barty in Beijing final for second career victory over world No.1 (also beat Halep at 2018 Indian Wells)
- Enjoyed break-out season in 2018, posting a 40-20 record resulting in a No.5 (first Top 10 season), up from No.68 in 2017
- Won the first two titles of her career in 2018, at Indian Wells (d. Kasatkina in F) and debut Grand Slam crown at US Open (d. S.Williams in F)
- En route to the Indian Wells title, defeated fivetime major champion Sharapova, and A.Radwanska, Ka.Pliskova and Halep. Only set dropped all fortnight was against Sakkari in R16




