MATCH NOTES - DAY 5 - FRIDAY, APRIL 26, 2024

Lucia Bronzetti (ITA #46) vs. [4] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #4)

First meeting

Bronzetti is making 2nd appearance at Madrid... Bronzetti is bidding for her first Top 10 win of career (0-5 vs. Top 10); the highest ranked opponent she has defeated is No.12 Barbora Krejcikova (2023 US Open)... The highest ranked opponent Bronzetti has defeated on clay is No.35 Sloane Stephens (2023 Rabat), en route to her first career clay-court title... Bronzetti is 1 of 3 Italian women in the draw along with Jasmine Paolini and Sara Errani, the first time 3 players from Italy reached 2r at Madrid since 2016... Bronzetti is playing on a career-high ranking, first achieved April 8, 2024...

Rybakina is playing 9th tournament of the season; has lost before the quarterfinal stage just once this year (Australian Open 2R, I. Blinkova)... Rybakina leads the Tour in singles titles (3), finals (5), match wins (26) and aces (207)... Has made the final or better at 4 of last 5 tournaments: Stuttgart (Win), Miami (I. Collins), Doha (I. Swiatek), Abu Dhabi (Win)... Rybakina owns 3 career clay-court titles, most recently last week at Stuttgart; also won Rome 2023 and Bucharest 2019... Rybakina is currently ranked No.4 and has a chance to move to No.2 this week, depending on other results... Rybakina has won 12 consecutive three-set matches, including 11 consecutive deciding sets... Rybakina enters Madrid at No.2 on the Race to the WTA Finals Leaderboard behind Iga Swiatek

Magda Linette (POL #48) vs. [2] Aryna Sabalenka (#2)

Sabalenka leads 3-0

Linette is making 3rd appearance at Madrid... Linette is coming off first final of the season last week in Rouen (I. Stephens), her career-best result on clay... Linette owns 4 wins in career over Top 10 players, with 2 coming on clay - both at Roland Garros - 2021 (d. No.1 Barty) and 2022 (d. No.6 Jabeur)... Linette has been involved in 11 three-set matches in 2024. After losing first 7 three-set matches of the season, has now won 3 of her last 4

A two-time and defending champion (2021, 2023), Sabalenka is making her 6th appearance at Madrid and is bidding to become second three-time Madrid champion after Petra Kvitova (2011, 2015, 2018)... Sabalenka has won last 16 matches vs. opponents ranked outside the Top 40... Since winning the Australian Open has won back-to-back macthes at a tournament once and owns a 4-4 match record... Sabalenka has owned the No.2 ranking spot since January 30, 2023; Coco Gauff and Elena Rybakina will challenge her for the No.2 spot... Sabalenka Enters Madrid sitting at No.3 on the Race to the WTA Finals Leaderboard behind Iga Swiatek and Elena Rybakina

[13] Danielle Collins (USA #15) vs. [Q] Olga Danilovic (#122)

First meeting

Collins best result here was reaching second round in 2022 and 2019... Collins opened clay season by lifting the title in Charleston and is currently on a career best 13 match win streak... Collins is tied for third most match wins (22); only Rybakina (26) and Swiatek (25) have more wins...Danilovic is making her tournament main draw debut... Danilovic defeated Clara Burel in the opening round, her first main draw match win at a WTA 1000 tournament... For Danilovic, this is her 24th career appearance in a Tour-level main draw; of her 24 main draw appearances, 13 have come as a qualifier (an additional one as a lucky loser)... Danilovic best career result on clay is winning the Moscow International title in 2018, where she recorded her only career Top 15 win (d. No.10 Julia Goerges)

[6] Qinwen Zheng (CHN #8) vs. Yulia Putintseva (KAZ #50)

Putintseva leads 1-0

Zheng best career result on clay is title run at Palermo in 2023 (d. Paolini in F)... Li Na reached the semifinals in 2011, the best result by a Chinese woman in Madrid... Putintseva is making her seventh main draw appearance at Madrid, where her best result was reaching R16 in 2019... Putintseva won their only encounter has 2023 Roland Garro in three sets... Putintseva has won two titles on clay court at Budapest in 2021 and Nurnberg in 2019... Putintseva owns 10 career Top 10 wins, including 3 on clay; she has lost her last six meetings vs. Top 10 opponents

[7] Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #7) vs. Shelby Rogers (USA #352) Rogers leads1-0

With a win, Vondrousova would notch her career-best result here in Madrid; her best result at a WTA 1000 came at 2020 Rome (SF)... Vondrousova best on clay is runner-up at 2019 Roland Garros and 2019 Istanbul... Rogers is making fourth main draw appearance at Madrid,, where her best result was reaching the third round in 2023... Rogers owns 7 wins in career over Top 10 players with one coming on clay (d. No.9 Danielle Collins at 2022 Roland Garros)... Best result by player from Czech Republic at Madrid was title runs by Petra Kvitova in 2018, 2015, 2011... Rogers earned entry into the main draw via her Special Ranking (of No.51)... With a win, Rogers would be the lowest ranked player to reach the R32 in Madrid

- In 2023 captured first WTA singles title of career at Rabat (d. Stephens in SF and Grabher in F); R-Up at Bad Homburg (l. Siniakova after receiving SF walkover from Swiatek); quarterfinalist at Guangzhou, Ningbo and Monastir; achieved best Grand Slam result of career to date in reaching 3r at US Open (l. Zheng Qinwen).
- At start of 2023 season, helped Italy advance to finals of United Cup against United States (l. Keys)
- Made first career singles final appearance at 2022 Palermo (l. Begu in F)
- In 2022, also made SF at Rabat (l. Trevisan), R16 at Miami (as LL, l. Saville) and 2r at 2022 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Barty), on Grand Slam main-draw debut
- In 2021, posted 49-23 record (across all levels), reaching five ITF Circuit titles, including at W60 in Bellinzona, Switzerland
- Reached back-to-back WTA QFs in summer of 2021, first at Lausanne (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Zidansek) and then Palermo (l. Ruse). Also made QF at Portoroz (as qualifier, l. Putintseva)
- First contested Grand Slam qualifying at 2021 US Open, falling at first hurdle
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2021 Rome
- Owns five singles and two doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Won maiden ITF Circuit title at W10 Sion, Switzerland in 2016
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in 2013

- Reached second Grand Slam final at 2023
 Australian Open (l. Sabalenka in 3s); made Top 10 debut following tournament (January 30,
 2023). Also in 2023 won first two WTA 1000 title
 at Indian Wells and Rome and finished R-Up at
 Miami. Qualified for first WTA Finals, going 1-2 in
 Group Stage.
- Lifted maiden major at 2022 Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F)
- In 2022 also finished R-Up at Adelaide (l. Barty) and Portoroz (l. Siniakova)
- Best result of 2021 were SFs at Eastbourne, Olympics and Chicago [500], and QFs at Abu Dhabi, Roland Garros, San Jose and Ostrava
- Opened 2020 season by reaching the championship match at four of her first five tournaments, including a title run at Hobart (d. Zhang in F)
- Made first final appearance at a Premier-level tournament with R-Up finish at St. Petersburg (l. Bertens); was rewarded with Top 20 debut at No.19 following run in Russia (February 17, 2020)
- First win over a Top-5 ranked opponent came over No.3 Ka.Pliskova during R-Up finish at 2020 Dubai
- Won back-to-back Slam matches for the first time during 3r showing at 2020 Australian Open (I. Barty)
- Won maiden WTA singles title at 2019 Bucharest (d. Tig in F), breaking into Top 100 for the first time in the following week's rankings at No.65 (July 22, 2019)
- Also in 2019, went on to make Top 50 debut on September 16, 2019, after reaching second career final at Nanchang (l. Peterson), produced SF appearances at Luxembourg and 's-Hertogenbosch, and made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2019 Roland Garros, falling 1r (as qualifier, l. Siniakova)
- Finished 2019 campaign with 57-21 win-loss record (across all levels) to end season at No.37, up from 2018's final ranking of No.191. On the ITF Circuit in 2019, lifted silverware on three occasions: back-to-back at \$25k Moscow-RUS and \$25k Kazan-RUS, and at \$60k ITF/Launceston-AUS
- Highlights of 2018 included reaching maiden WTA QF at St. Petersburg (l. Goerges) and clinching title at \$15k ITF/Kazan-RUS
- First Top 10 win came over No.7 Garcia at 2018 St. Petersburg
- Made WTA qualifying and main draw debut at 2017 Moscow (as qualifier, l. Begu in 1r)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Following injury issues in second half of 2022, bounced back in 2023 for best-ever season, winning debut Slam title at Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F - becoming the first unseeded player in the open era to claim the Wimbledon title), making Top 10 debut and qualifying for first WTA Finals.
- Best result of 2022 season was SF run at Dubai (withdrew prior to match vs. w/right adductor injury). Missed most of second half of the season due to left wrist injury, returning in October to play a few ITF Circuit events and Billie Jean King Cup Finals
- Finished 2021 with SF runs at Luxembourg, Chicago [500] and Moscow
- Won silver medal in singles at Olympics in Tokyo (l. Bencic)
- Opened 2021 campaign with SF at Yarra Valley Classic before R16 showing at Australian Open
- Highlights of 2020 include defeating No.6 Svitolina to reach SFs at Rome (l. Ka.Pliskova) as well as a QF run to kick off the season at Adelaide (l. No.1 Barty)
- Enjoyed break-out season in 2019, reaching three finals across the year and posting careerhigh ranking of No.14 on July 1, 2019
- Finished R-Up at Budapest (l. Van Uytvanck) and Istanbul (l. Martic) before reaching championship match at Roland Garros (l. Barty); did not drop a set en route to final in Paris
- Ranked No.38, was joint-third lowest-ranked woman to reach Roland Garros final, and aged 19, was first teenager to reach title match there since Ivanovic in 2007
- Posted first win of career over a Top 2 player in 2019, defeating No.2 Halep at Indian Wells and then Rome
- Forced to end 2019 season down early due to left wrist injury - did not play again following 1r exit at Wimbledon
- In doubles, has reached SF at 2019 Australian Open (w/Strycova) and QF at 2017 Wimbledon (w/Bellis)
- At 2018 US Open, became the first teenager to reach the last 16 at Flushing Meadows since 2016 (Konjuh, QF - 18) and the youngest Czech player to advance to this stage in New York since 2005 (Vaidisova, R16 - 16)
- Was the biggest ranking mover on tour in 2017, moving from No.376 to No.67 (309 places)
- Made WTA breakthrough by winning International-level title at 2017 Biel/Bienne (d. Kontaveit in F), in just her second WTA main draw. At No.233, was the lowest-ranked title

- The 2023 season saw Rogers reach the QF at Abu Dhabi (l. eventual champion Bencic) and the R16 at Charleston (l. Bencic); ended her season early due to injury, with her last match coming at Wimbledon (l. Rybakina in opening round)
- In 2022, finished R-Up at San Jose (I. Kasatkina). Also reached the SF at 's-Hertogenbosch (I. Sabalenka) and QF at Adelaide 1 (I. Rybakina)
- Enjoyed most consistent campaign of her career in 2021, reaching QFs at Yarra Valley Classic, Adelaide, Charleston [250] and Indian Wells. Also made R16 at Australian Open and US Open
- Broke into Top 50 for the first time on March 1, 2021, following QF showing at Adelaide
- In 2020 reached SF at Lexington (d. S.Williams in 2r, l. Teichmann) and QF at US Open (d. Kvitova, l. eventual champion Osaka) - marked second career Slam QF appearance (also 2016 Roland Garros)
- In 2019, made return from injury at Charleston where she reached 2r (l. Ostapenko). Also posted 2r showings at Roland Garros and Mallorca and fell 1r six occasions and reached one ITF Circuit final
- Fell 1r in only two tournaments played in 2018 at Australian Open and Indian Wells - injured left knee in loss to Dolehide at Indian Wells, requiring surgery in the summer
- Highlights of 2017 were QFs at Charleston, Hobart and Strasbourg. Also, played all three ties to help USA win its first Fed Cup in 17 years, winning decisive doubles rubber (w/Vandeweghe) in final against Belarus
- In 2017 US Open 2r, d. No.25 seed Gavrilova 7-6(6), 4-6, 7-6(5), in a match that took 3 hours, 33 minutes, setting a record for the longest women's match in US Open history
- Appeared in two WTA singles finals, at 2016 Rio de Janeiro (l. Schiavone) and at 2014 Bad Gastein (d. No.16 Suárez Navarro and No.14 Errani en route, l.Petkovic)
- One-time doubles runner-up, at 2015 Bogotá (w/Falconi)
- Participated in 2014 WTA Finals Rising Stars Invitational in Singapore (along with Diyas, Puig and Zheng)
- Broke into Top 100 for first time on August 11, 2014
- Won first WTA level match at 2013 Strasbourg (d. Domachowska)
- Winner of five singles titles and two doubles titles on ITF Circuit, where she made professional debut in United States in 2009, aged 16

- winner in 2017 and aged 17 years, 293 days was the youngest since Konjuh (17 years, 169 days) at 2015 Nottingham
- Advanced to 2r on tour-level debut at 2016 Prague - as wildcard
- Made professional debut at 2014 \$100k
 ITF/Prague-CZE (d. Suk, l. Brengle in 2r); on ITF
 Circuit, winner of seven singles and four doubles
 titles
- In juniors won doubles at Australian Open and Roland Garros in 2015 (both w/Kolodziejova). In singles, was semifinalist at both Roland Garros and Wimbledon and rose to No.1 on ITF junior rankings in 2015
