Naomi Osaka (JPN #197) vs. [15] Liudmila Samsonova (#17)

Osaka leads 1-0

Osaka's best result here was reaching quarterfinals in 2019 while Samsonova made the fourth round in 2023... Osaka won their only previous encounter this year at Indian Wells in straight sets... Samsonova's best career result on clay is reaching semifinals at Stuttgart in 2022 and Palermo in 2019... Osaka's best career result on clay is reaching semifinals at Stuttgart in 2019... Osaka is the only player from Japan to reach 2r in Madrid...

[3] Coco Gauff (USA #3) vs. Arantxa Rus (NED #47)

First meeting

Gauff's best result here came in 2022 reaching 4r (l. Halep)... With a win today, Rus would achieve her best Madrid result after reaching 2r in 2023 (l. Sakkari)... Gauff owns one career clay court title which came at 2021 Parma... Rus' sole career title came on clay at 2023 Hamburg... Gauff reached the doubles final in Madrid last year alongside Jessica Pegula (l. Azarenka/Haddad Maia in F)... Rus is the only player from the Netherlands to feature in the main draw... Gauff has a chance to climb to a career-high ranking of No.2 this week depending on Sabalenka and Rybakina's results... The last time Rus defeated a Top 10 player was in 2012 at Wimbledon over No.5 Samantha Stosur

[1] Iga Swiatek (POL #1) vs. Wang Xiyu (CHN #52)

First meeting

Swiatek is making her third Madrid appearance and reached the final here last season (l. Sabalenka in F)... Swiatek is a seven-time clay court champion (Roland Garros in 2023, 2022 & 2020; Stuttgart in 2023 & 2022; Rome in 2022 & 2021)... Wang's best clay court result is QF at 2022 Budapest... Swiatek is spending her 100th and 101st week ranked at No.1, the ninth most in WTA history... Wang is facing a WTA World No. 1 for the first time... Wang's only previous Top 10 win came against No.3 Sakkari at 2022 US Open... The last time Swiatek was defeated by a player outside the Top 50 was No.76 Elina Svitolina in the quarterfinal at Wimbledon last season

Donna Vekic (CRO #38) vs. [5] Maria Sakkari (GRE #6)

Vekic leads 6-3

Sakkari is making her sixth main draw appearance at Madrid, where her best result was reaching semifinals in 2023 (l. eventual champion Sabalenka)... Vekic is making her fifth main draw appearance at Madrid, where her best result was reaching R16 in 2019 (l. Martic)... Sakkari opened clay season by reaching semifinals at Charleston (l. eventual champion Collins)... Vekic won their most recent meeting in semifinals at Berlin 2023; this will be their first time meeting on clay... Sakkari's best career result on clay is winning the title at Rabat in 2019 (d. Konta in F)

Anna Karolina Schmiedlova (SVK #68) vs. [8] Ons Jabeur (TUN #9)

Jabeur leads 1-0

Jabeur defeated Schmiedlova in their only previous meeting in the 2r at the Australian Open in 2021... Schmiedlova is looking for her best Madrid result, previously reaching 2r once before in 2019... Jabeur lifted the Madrid title in 2022 and is one of two previous Madrid champions in the field, along with Sabalenka (won in 2021 & 2023)... Two of Schmiedlova's three career titles came on clay: 2018 Bogota and 2015 Bucharest... Two of Jabeur's five career titles came on clay court; along with her 2022 Madrid title, she also won 2023 Charleston... Schmiedlova has defeated a Top 10 player once before in her career (No. 8 Roberta Vinci at 2016 Olympics)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Played 2022 Tokyo in September before taking a 15 month break to give birth to daughter Shai in early July 2023.

In 2022 had success at Miami, where she fell to Swiatek in the final, her first final since the 2021 Australian Open. Also reached the semifinals at Melbourne 250 #1 (withdrew before semifinal with Kudermetova w/abdominal injury)

- Won 2021 Australian Open (d. Brady in F) to become first woman since Seles in the early 1990s to win each of her first four Grand Slam finals - is the 16th woman to win four or more majors in the Open Era
- At 2020 US Open, came from a set and a break down to Azarenka and win third Grand Slam title of career
- Also last season was R-Up at Western & Southern Open - withdrew w/left hamstring injury before final against Azarenka
- Won second Grand Slam at Australian Open (d. Kvitova in F); became first Japanese player to reach World No.1 ranking following the tournament
- In addition, won back-to-back titles for first time in her career at Osaka (d. Pavlyuchenkova in F) and Beijing (d. Barty in F); defeated No.1 Barty in Beijing final for second career victory over world No.1 (also beat Halep at 2018 Indian Wells)
- Enjoyed break-out season in 2018, posting a 40-20 record resulting in a No.5 (first Top 10 season), up from No.68 in 2017
- Won the first two titles of her career in 2018, at Indian Wells (d. Kasatkina in F) and debut Grand Slam crown at US Open (d. S.Williams in F)
- En route to the Indian Wells title, defeated five-time major champion Sharapova, and A.Radwanska, Ka.Pliskova and Halep. Only set dropped all fortnight was against Sakkari in R16
- Reached one further final in 2018, at Tokyo [PPO] (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- In reaching R16 at 2018 Australian Open, became youngest Japanese player to reach R16 at a Slam since Sugiyama at 1995 Roland Garros (19y, 342d) and the youngest player from Japan to reach R16 in Melbourne since Date in 1990 (19y, 122d)
- Book-ended 2017 season with QF showings at Auckland and Hong Kong; other highlights included 3r runs at Wimbledon and US Open
- Scored first Top 5 win of career when she defeated No.5 V.Williams at 2017 Hong Kong. Upset win over defending champion and No.6-

- Ended 2023 ranked No.16; reached three finals at Abu Dhabi (l. Bencic in F), Montreal (l. Pegula in F) and Beijing (l. Swiatek)
- Also in 2023, reached SF at Washington DC and qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai going 1-1 in group play
- In doubles in 2023, won title at Dubai w/Veronika Kudermetova
- Lifted three titles in 2022, at Washington DC (d. Kanepi in F), Cleveland (d. Sasnovich in F) and Tokyo (d. Q.Zheng in F) ending year at No.20, her first Top 20 year-end ranking
- Also made SF at Stuttgart, QF at Adelaide 250, R16 at US Open and made Top-20 debut on October 24
- Earned first Top 10 win of career over No.7 Karolina Pliskova at Stuttgart
- Highlight of 2021 was coming through qualifying to lift maiden WTA title at Berlin (d. Bencic in F) and breaking into Top 50 on September 13 finishing the year at No.39, her first year-end Top 100 ranking
- Reached two further SFs in 2021, at Luxembourg and Courmayeur and reached R16 at Wimbledon
- Earned first Top 20 win of career over No.11 Kiki Bertens at 2021 Miami
- In 2020 reached 2r at Brisbane (as qualifier, d.No.24 Stephens, l. No.7 Kvitova) and Palermo (as qualifier, l. Martic), and fell 1r four times (including Australian Open, US Open and Roland Garros)
- Appeared in the first WTA main draws of her career in 2019, highlighted by SF run at Palermo (as LL, l. eventual champion Teichmann), 2r showing at Lausanne (l. Han) and falling 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Vekic)
- Contested qualifying at a WTA event for the first time at 2019 Australian Open
- Made professional debut on ITF circuit in 2013; owns four singles titles on the ITF Circuit

ranked Kerber at 2017 US Open marked first career Top 10 win

- Voted 2016 WTA Newcomer of the Year; highlight was career-first WTA final at Tokyo [PPO] (l. Wozniacki). Also reached QF on three occasions and 3r at Australian Open, Roland Garros and US Open
- Ranked No.406, made WTA main draw debut at 2014 Stanford. As an alternate, won through qualifying (achieving first WTA qualifying wins), and came from match point down to shock No.19 Stosur in 1r of main draw, before losing to No.18 Petkovic in 2r
- Made WTA qualifying debut at Québec City in 2013 (l. Dabrowski)

- Father is from Haiti, mother is from Japan; older sister is Mari (also played tennis)
- Was born in Osaka, Japan, and moved to USA when she was three years old
- Hobbies include fashion, gaming and photography

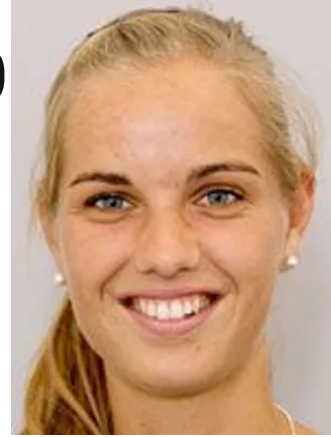

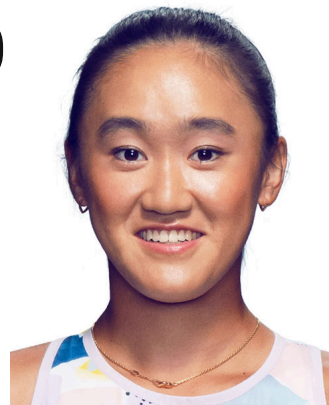

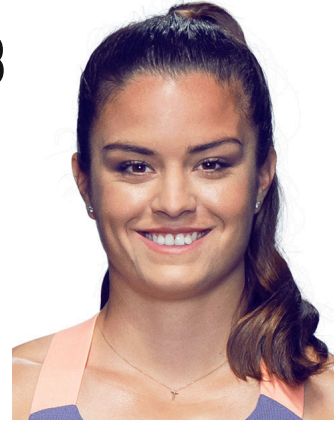
