MATCH NOTES – DAY 1 - OCTOBER 6, 2024

[9] Beatriz Haddad Maia (BRA #12) vs. Madison Keys (USA #20)

Keys leads 2-1

Fernandez leads 1-0

Haddad Maia:

- Making debut appearance at Wuhan
- Won fourth career title and first of the season last month at Seoul (d. Kasatkina)
- Has gone 4-8 against Top 20 players this year however has won her last two against No.15 Anna Kalinskaya at US Open and No.13 Daria Kasatkina in the Seoul final
- Career best WTA 1000 result was Runner-Up run at 2022 Toronto (I. Halep)
- Two of four WTA titles have come on Asian hard courts: Seoul in 2024 and Zhuhai in 2023

Keys:

- Making sixth appearance at Wuhan with best result in quarterfinal run in 2016
- Won their two most recent appearances both this year at Rome and just last week in Beijing
- Holds 8-5 record against Top 20 players so far this year
- Owns one WTA 1000 title at 2019 Cincinnati and reached two further finals at 2016 Rome and 2016 Montreal

Leylah Fernandez (CAN #28) vs. [12] Diana Shnaider (#16)

Fernandez:

- Making debut appearance at Wuhan
- Won their first and only meeting earlier this year at Cincinnati in straight sets
- A win today would notch 100th career WTA main draw win
- Looking to snap a four-match losing streak since reaching the Cincinnati quarterfinals
- Own 14 wins in career over Top 20 players and is 5-8 against Top 20 players this year most recently beating today's opponent and No.4 Elena Rybakina during run in Cincinnati

- Only player from Canada in the draw; best result by a Canadian player at Wuhan was Eugenie Bouchard's R-Up finish in 2014

Shnaider:

- Making Wuhan Open debut
- Won first three WTA titles this season, all on different surfaces; only Iga Swiatek (5) has won more titles in 2024 - Has won 19 of her last 20 matches against players outside the Top 20 with sole loss in that time to today's opponent
- at Cincinnati
- Has not lost the opening match of a tournament since 's-Hertogenbosch when she was ranked No.48
- Is currently at a career-high No.16 on PIF WTA Rankings; this time last year was ranked No.66





Yue Yuan (CHN #41) vs. [LL] Clara Burel (FRA #55)

First meeting

Yuan:

- Making main draw debut at Wuhan; contested qualifying in 2019

- Earned best result at a WTA 1000 event earlier this year with run to quarterfinals at Indian Wells defeating No.8 Qinwen Zheng and No.12 Daria Kasatkina en route (I. Gauff)

- Before this season had won only one WTA 1000 match in career at 2023 Beijing defeating No.29 Elise Mertens in first round

- Is 2-0 against French opponents in WTA main draw action with two wins this year over Varvara Gracheva

Burel:

- Making debut appearance at Wuhan as a Lucky Loser, has been a Lucky Loser only one other time in career falling first round at 2021 Chicago

- Since the start of 2022, has gone 3-1 against Chinese players (3-4 total record) and is 1-0 this year beating Xiyu Wang at Indian Wells

- Has reached the second round of a WTA 1000 event just three times in career at 2022 Miami, 2024 Indian Wells and just last week at Beijing

- Best career result on hard courts was run to semifinals last year in Monastir

Xinyu Wang (CHN #51) vs. Caroline Dolehide (USA #101)

First meeting

Wang:

- Making debut appearance at Wuhan

- Best result at WTA 1000 events was reaching the third round at Beijing 2023 (I. Sakkari) and Indian Wells 2023 (I. Krejcikova)

- Record against opponents outside Top 100 is 5-2 in 2024 with losses to No.108 Diana Shanider at Hua Hin and No.119 Masarova at Hua Hin 2

- One of five players from China in the starting field (along with Shuai Zhang, Qinwen Zheng, Xiyu Wang and Yue Yuan)

- Best result by China at Wuhan was semifinal run by Qiang Wang in 2018

Dolehide:

- Making debut appearance at Wuhan
- Best result at WTA 1000 events was reaching the third round at Indian Wells in 2024 (I. Yuan) and 2018 (I. Halep)
- Owns 10 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.11 Danielle Collins at US Open 2024
- Has lost six of her last seven matches (win over Collins was sole win since reaching semifinals at Washington DC)
- Best career result on hard court was Runner-Up run at Guadalajara 2023
- One of 11 players from the United States in the starting field





Elise Mertens (BEL #30) vs. [15] Donna Vekic (CRO #18)

First Meeting

Mertens:

- Making fourth appearance at Wuhan, where her best result was reaching 2r in 2019 (I. Kenin) and 2017 (Vesnina) - Looking for her third Top 20 win of the season after defeating No.14 Madison Keys at US Open and No.3 Coco Gauff at Indian Wells

- Owns 6-0 career record against players from Croatia

- Owns six singles titles on hard courts at Monastir 2023-2022; Melbourne 500 Gippsland Trophy in 2021; Doha in 2019; Hobart 2018-2017

- Is currently ranked No.29; this time last year was ranked No.41

Vekic:

- Making fifth appearance at Wuhan, where she has advanced past the first round only once in 2018 when she beat CoCo Vandeweghe via ret; looking to win a fully completed match at Wuhan for first time in career

- Owns 80 wins in career over Top 50 players (4-7 in 2024)
- Has won 12 of her last 14 matches against players outside the Top 20
- Since June has dropped opening match of a tournament just once at Cincinnati (after 1r bye, I. Krueger)

- Three out of her four career singles titles have come on hard court at Monterrey 2023, Courmayeur 2021 and Kuala Lumpur 2014

- Is currently ranked at a career high of No.18

CAREER MILESTONES

- Broke into Top 10 in June 2023 after a strong clay season with SF at Roland Garros and QF at Rome and Stuttgart; ended year at No.11
- Also in 2023, won third career title at WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai (d. Q.Zheng) and reached SF at Abu Dhabi and QF at Adelaide 2, Doha and San Diego
- In doubles, won titles at Madrid w/Victoria Azarenka (d. Gauff/Pegula) and WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai w/Veronika Kudermetova (d. Kato/Sutjiadi)
- 2022 season highlighted by a stellar sequence of results on grass, when she became the first woman ever to win Nottingham and Birmingham back-to-back, her first career WTA titles
- Broke into the Top 20 following her run to the first WTA 1000 final at 2022 Toronto (l. Halep); also in 2022 advanced to SF at Monterrey and Eastbourne and three further QFs
- Also in 2022, won two titles at WTA 125K events in Saint Malo and Paris
- Won third doubles title at 2022 Nottingham w/Shuai Zhang (d. Dolehide/Niculescu), also reached final at Australian Open w/Anhelina Danilina (Krejcikova/Siniakova) and Guadalajara 1000 w/Danilina (l. Hunter/Stefani); earned spot at WTA Finals Fort Worth in doubles with Danilina going 1-2 in group play
- In 2021, peaked at No.80 in rankings; highlights where R16 at Indian Wells and falling 1r at Chicago 500; also played qualifying at Wimbledon and US Open and won five ITF Circuit titles in 2021
- Posted best win-by-ranking of career in 2021, defeating No.3 Karolina Pliskova during run to R16 as LL at Indian Wells. Played only on ITF Circuit in 2020 winning four titles and reaching one other final
- Highlights of 2019 were SF at Bogota and QF at Acapulco (both as qualifier); earned first Top 10 win of career over No.4 Sloane Stephens at Acapulco
- Ended 2018 at No.184, with season highlight reaching 3r at Miami (l. Ostapenko). Also made 2r at Hobart, Australian Open and Acapulco.
- Posted first Top 100 season in 2017, finishing at No.65
- Broke into Top 100 following first Grand Slam main draw appearance at 2017 Roland Garros, earning spot as a qualifier Reached first WTA singles final at 2017 Seoul while ranked No.71 (l. No.10 Ostapenko)
- Other 2017 highlights include QF at Prague (as qualifier) and first Grand Slam main draw win at

- In 2023, won seventh career title at Eastbourne (d. Kasatkina in F), reached SF at US Open and reached four QFs including Wimbledon; also qualified for WTA Elite Trophy in Zhuhai (0-2 in group play)
- At 2022 Adelaide, won first title in over two years (d. Riske in F), followed by SF run at Australian Open - best Slam showing since 2018
- Other highlights in 2022 were SF at Cincinnati and two further QF runs, including at Indian Wells
- In Grand Slam play, 2021 season was highlighted by R16 run at Wimbledon (l. Golubic). Finished campaign inside Top 100 for ninth successive year, but outside Top 20 for first time since 2014
- Ended 2020 ranked No.16, with best result being R-Up finish at Brisbane (l. Ka. Pliskova)
- Lifted biggest title of career during 2019 season at WTA 1000 Cincinnati (d. Kuznetsova in F); afterwards returned to Top 10 for first time since week of June 25, 2018
- Also won title at Charleston (d. Wozniacki) and reached QF at 2019 Roland Garros (l. Barty), one of three Americans to make last eight (also Anisimova and Stephens) - the first time since 2004 (Capriati, S.Williams and V.Williams) Reached three SFs in 2018 at Charleston, Roland Garros and US Open
- Reached first Grand Slam final in 2017 at US Open, losing to Sloane Stephens in 10th all-American final in the Open Era. At 22, became the youngest Flushing Meadows finalist since 19-year-old Caroline Wozniacki lost to Kim Clijsters in 2009 Also in 2017, won third WTA title at Stanford (d. Vandeweghe)
- Enjoyed first Top-10 year-end finish in 2016 (at No.8), was youngest player in Top 20; won second title at Birmingham (d. Strycova) and reached final at Rome (l. S.Williams) and Montreal (l. Halep)
- Broke into Top 10 on June 20 as first American to make Top-10 debut since S.Williams in 1999
- Made WTA Finals debut at Singapore in 2016, going 1-2 in round-robin play
- Represented USA at 2016 Rio Olympics, reaching SF (l. Bronze medal match to Petra Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2015, 2018-19; went 1-1 in round-robin stage on all three appearances, with best result SF run in 2018 (withdrew before match vs. Muguruza w/left knee injury)
- Advanced to maiden major SF at 2015 Australian Open (l. eventual champion S.Williams); broke

Wimbledon; defeated No.19 Sam Stosur en route to Prague QF, the first Top 20 win of career

- In doubles, won second title at Bogota w/Nadia Podoroska (d. Cepede Royg/Linette)
- Played three WTA main draws in 2016 at Rio de Janeiro, Miami and Florianopolis falling in 1r in each appearance; also played qualifying at Roland Garros and US Open
- In 2015, reached first QF of career at Rio de Janeiro while ranked No.234 losing to No.16 Sara Errani, the first Top 20 match of career; result propelled her into Top 200 for first time in career
- Also in 2015, reached 2r at Bogota and played qualifying at Charleston, Roland Garros, Nottingham and Wimbledon
- Won first WTA doubles title at 2015 Bogota w/Paula Cristina Goncalves (d. Falconi/Rogers)
- In July 2015, suffered a shoulder injury at the Pan American Games in Toronto, was forced to have surgery and miss remainder of season
- Played two WTA events in 2014 at Rio de Janeiro and Florianopolis; falling in 1r at both events as a WC
- Won first WTA match at 2013 Florianopolis as WC (d. Hsu, l. Czink)
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2012 Québec City (l. El Tabakh)
- Owns 17 ITF Circuit singles titles; made professional debut on ITF circuit in 2010





Later in the year, won third career Grand Slam doubles title, at Wimbledon w/Hsieh
- Won the most matches on Tour in 2020, going 34-13 across the season and finishing as R-Up at both Prague (l. Halep) and Linz (l. Sabalenka)
- Earned her milestone 200th career main draw win with victory over Kalinina in 1r at 2020 Linz
- Singles highlights in 2019 were winning biggest title of career at Doha (d. No.3 Halep in final) and advancing to QF at US Open for the first time (l. eventual champion Andreescu in 3s)
- Enjoyed standout season in doubles in 2019 won maiden major doubles title at US Open w/Sabalenka (d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Garcia) and runner-up at Berlin (l. Kvitova). Results brought ranking back into Top 20 for first time since 2019 and qualification for Zhuhai Elite Trophy.
- 2022's highlight was R-Up finish at San Diego (as qualifier, l. Swiatek). Elsewhere, made QF at Birmingham and Tallinn
- Lifted third WTA title of her career at Courmayeur in October 2021 (d. Tauson in F)
- Underwent knee surgery at start of 2021, but experienced some setbacks since her return to Tour last summer, tearing plantar fascia and suffering from knee and foot injuries in spring 2022
- Contested the first match of the WTA Tour's resumption following the hiatus, defeating Rus in the 1r at 2020 Palermo
- Ended 2019 ranked No.19 for career-best yearend finish (up from No.34 in 2018), having cracked the Top 20 for the first time on October 21, 2019
- Produced career best Grand Slam result at 2019 US Open, where she reached QF (l. Bencic)
- Also in 2019, finished R-Up at St. Petersburg (l. Bertens); en route to final, posted best win of career by ranking and third over a Top 5 opponent with defeat of No.2 Kvitova in QF, bettering victories over No.4 Stephens at 2018 Wimbledon and No.4 Garcia at 2018 Tokyo [PPO]
- Also made final at Nottingham (l. Garcia in third set tie-break) and ended 2019 by qualifying for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai (fell RR)
- Ended 2018 at then-career-high ranking of No.34, after registering 31 tour-level wins. Campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Washington, DC (l. Kuznetsova after holding 4mp) - her first finals appearance since winning 2017 Nottingham - and made SF showings at Nottingham and Tokyo [PPO], and reached Grand Slam R16 for first time at Wimbledon (l. Goerges)
- Enjoyed a resurgent year in 2017, breaking the Top 50 on July 24 and finishing campaign ranked No.54. Grass court season saw her lift a second WTA singles title of career, at Nottingham (d. No.8 Konta in final) - prior to this run had not posted back-to-back main draw wins since September 2015 (R-Up at Tashkent)

- Won first WTA title of any kind in doubles at 2016 Auckland (w/Mestach)
- Played first Tour-level event of career at 2015 Antwerp (fell in qualifying)
- Played first events of career on ITF Circuit in Belgium in 2010; owns 11 singles and 14 doubles titles on ITF Circuit

winning her fifth and most recent title at this level at \$100k ITF/Sharm El Sheikh-EGY

- Highlights in 2015 included reaching final at Tashkent (l. Hibino) and QF at Baku
- Ranked No.95, lifted maiden WTA singles title at 2014 Kuala Lumpur (d. No.10 Cibulkova in final); aged 17 y 10 m, became youngest player to win a WTA singles title since 2006 Bangkok (Vania King)
- Reached first WTA career final at 2012 Tashkent (l. Begu) on her WTA main draw debut, and in doing so became youngest WTA finalist since 15year-old Paszek won Portoroz in 2005
- Broke into Top 100 (at No.93) on January 28, 2013 Has won five ITF Circuit singles and one doubles title
- Member of Croatian Fed Cup Team, 2012-15, 2017, 2019
