Krejckova leads 1-0

Krejckova:

- Making debut appearance at Wuhan
- Record against opponents outside Top 100 is 4-1 in 2024, with the only loss coming against No. 122 Rus at US Open
- Owns 18-4 career record against players from United States of America, with record in 2024 standing at 2-0, having defeated Volynets and Collins at Wimbledon en route to title
- Owns 5 singles titles on hard court - San Diego, Dubai in 2023; Ostrava, Tallinn in 2022; Prague in 2021
- Is currently ranked No.10; this time last year was ranked No.18

Baptiste:

- Making debut appearance at Wuhan
- As qualifier, has beaten Yafan Wang and Lamens to reach main draw; has beaten Diane Parry in 1r
- Faces No.10 Barbora Krejckova in 2r today; seeking for first career Top 10 win
- Best career result on hard court is R16 run for five times, most recently at Seoul 2024
- Best result by United States of America at Wuhan was Champion run by Venus Williams in 2015
- Best result by a qualifier at Wuhan was SF run by Maria Sakkari in 2017

[1] **Aryna Sabalenka (#2) vs. Katerina Siniakova (CZE #37)**

Sabalenka leads 1-0

Sabalenka:

- Making 3rd appearance at Wuhan, when she has won both 2018 (d. Kontaveit in F) and 2019 (d. Riske-Amritraj)
- Owns 173 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.24 Madison Keys at Beijing 2024
- 14 out of her 16 singles titles have come on hard court, most recently US Open 2024
- Is No. 1 seed this week; has been top seed at 19 tournaments in her career
- Is currently ranked No.2; this time last year was ranked No.1
- Has won 49 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.2 on tour for match wins after Swiatek (57)

Siniakova:

- Making 5th appearance at Wuhan, where her previous best result was QF run in 2018 (l. Kontaveit)
- Owns 9 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.8 Qinwen Zheng at Berlin 2024

[4] Coco Gauff (USA #4) vs. Viktoriya Tomova (BUL #48)

First meeting

Gauff:

- Making Wuhan tournament debut
- Currently on a 6-match winning streak after capturing her second career WTA 1000 title in Beijing on Sunday
- Has won 47 tour-level matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.3 on tour for match-wins this year, trailing only Iga Swiatek (57) and Aryna Sabalenka (49)
- Is No.1 on tour this season in percentage of return games won (45.8%) and percentage of return points won (48.4%)
- Her two WTA 1000 titles occurred at 2023 Cincinnati and 2024 Beijing
- Looking to become the second player to secure both the Beijing and Wuhan titles in a single year after Caroline Garcia in 2017

Tomova:

- Making Wuhan tournament debut
- Seeking first career Top 10 win; has an 0-9 career win-loss record against Top 10 players (0-1 this year)
- Aiming to win consecutive matches in a WTA 1000 main draw for the first time in her career
- Best career tour-level results on hard court are 2 QF showings this year at Hobart and Seoul
- Is currently ranked No.48, just shy of her career-high ranking of No.46 which she set this July

[5] Zheng Qinwen (CHN #7) vs. [WC] Jaqueline Cristian (ROU #75)

Cristian leads 2-1

Zheng:

- Making 1st main-draw appearance at Wuhan
- In 2019, as a 16-year-old wild card ranked No.697, she lost in the first round of Wuhan qualifying to Grand Slam champion Svetlana Kuznetsova
- Career-best WTA 1000 showing was her run to last week's Beijing SF
- Since Wimbledon, has posted a 20-3 win-loss record including the Olympic gold medal and the Palermo title
- Has won 39 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.6 on tour in match-wins this year
- Tied with Elena Rybakina as this year's ace leader -- they have each hit 336 total aces in 2024

Cristian:

- Making Wuhan tournament debut as a wild card, and ousted Camila Osorio from a set down in the first round
- Earned her first career Top 10 win last week by beating No.10 Barbora Krejčíková in Beijing (was 0-6 vs. Top 10 players before that)
- Best career tour-level result on hard court is her run to the 2021 Linz final
- Best result by a Romanian at Wuhan was Simona Halep's SF showing in 2016
- Best result by a wild card at Wuhan was Wang Qiang's SF result in 2018

Paolini leads 1-0

Yuan:

- Making 1st main-draw appearance at Wuhan; in 2019, lost in 1r of Wuhan qualifying to Jennifer Brady
- 1-7 career record vs. Top 10 players, with her Top 10 win coming over No.8 Zheng Qinwen at 2024 Indian Wells
- Her career-best WTA 1000 result is her trip to the Indian Wells QF earlier this year
- Best career tour-level result on hard court is her run to the title at 2024 Austin; that was part of a 9-match winning streak which also included her Indian Wells QF appearance
- The best result by a Chinese player at Wuhan was Wang Qiang's SF showing in 2018

Paolini:

- Making Wuhan tournament debut
- Has won 1 WTA 1000 title at 2024 Dubai; both of her 2 career WTA singles titles have come on hard court (2021 Portoroz and 2024 Dubai)
- Has won 37 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.8 on tour for match-wins this year
- She is the first Italian to be a Top 10 seed at Wuhan -- the previous highest-seeded Italian player at this event was No.11 Sara Errani in 2014
- The best result by an Italian at Wuhan was Roberta Vinci's SF showing in 2015

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached four finals across 2023, winning first WTA 1000 title at Dubai (d. No.1 Swiatek in F) in addition to San Diego (d. Kenin in F), and finishing R-Up at Birmingham (l. Ostapenko) and Zhengzhou (l. Zheng Qinwen).
- Ended 2022 season in fine form, lifting back-to-back titles at Tallinn (d. Kontaveit) and Ostrava (d. Swiatek). Also completed career doubles Slam by winning US Open w/Siniakova.
- Made strong start to 2022, finishing R-Up at Sydney (l. Badosa) and reaching QF at Australian Open (l. Keys) before missing several months w/arm injury.
- Lifted maiden WTA title at 2021 Strasbourg, followed by sweep of singles and doubles titles at Roland-Garros. Roland Garros was just her fifth Slam main draw in singles; only two women have won a major with fewer main draw appearances to their name.
- Also won Prague title (d. Martincova in F), reached final at Dubai (l. Muguruza) and qualified for WTA Finals in singles for the first time. Recorded best results at US Open (QF) and Wimbledon (R16) last year
- Posted another record-breaking year in doubles across 2021 - in addition to singles title at Roland Garros, won doubles title too in Paris, along with Madrid, Gippssland Trophy, WTA Finals and the gold medal at Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games (all w/Siniakova)
- Enjoyed breakout year in singles in 2020, posting career-high ranking of No.65 (November 16) and making R16 at Roland Garros and reaching second WTA SF at Linz
- Also reached two doubles finals last year, finishing R-Up at Dubai (w/Zheng) and winning Shenzhen (w/Siniakova)
- In Mixed Doubles, defended Australian Open title (w/Pavic), having triumphed in Melbourne a year earlier with w/Ram
- In 2019, advanced to QF at Bucharest in addition to winning four ITF Circuit singles titles on clay in North America and Europe, winning 20 of her 21 matches during this stretch
- Also in 2019, posted second Top 20 doubles season highlighted by titles at Toronto and Linz, and R-Up finish at Indian Wells (all w/Siniakova). Won Australian Open mixed doubles title w/Ram
- In 2018, won first two Grand Slam trophies at Roland Garros (d. Hozumi/ Ninomiya in F) and Wimbledon (d. Melichar/Peschke in F) both w/Siniakova, the first pairing to complete the Roland Garros-Wimbledon double since Kim Clijsters and Ai Sugiyama in 2003; also became
- Won back-to-back main draw matches for the first time at 2023 Guadalajara 1000 reaching R16 (l. Garcia); also in 2023 fell 2r at Charleston and Washington DC, 1r at Miami and QF at WTA 125K Midland
- 2022 season including, 2r at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Inglis), Guadalajara [250] (as qualifier, l. Osorio) and Charleston (l. Cornet); also fell 1r at Indian Wells, Miami and Roland Garros and QF at WTA 125K Montevideo
- In 2021, came through qualifying to reach 2r at 2021 Roland Garros (l. Kenin), also reached 2r at Chicago [500] (as WC, l. Azarenka) and Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur). Fell 1r on three occasions including US Open Won doubles title at 2021 Charleston [250] w/McNally (d. Perez/Sanders in F)
- Played one main draw in 2020 at US Open in Grand Slam main draw debut falling to Kristina Mladenovic in 1r; also contested qualifying at Australian Open and Lexington
- Highlight of 2019 was 2r showing on WTA main draw debut at Washington DC (as WC d. No.17 Keys, l. Mladenovic)
- Also contested qualifying at US Open and on ITF Circuit won \$25k titles at Tucon, Sumter and Plantation
- As a junior reached career-high ranking of No.38 in 2018
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Florida in 2017

- Rose to WTA doubles World No.1 on October 22, 2018
- Highlight of 2017 was R-Up finish in first WTA singles final at Nürnberg (l. Bertens in F). Also made QF as qualifier at Bastad (l. Garcia). Only other tour-level appearances were 1r exits at Bucharest and Québec City
- Contested five WTA main draws in 2016, progressing to 2r at two events: Kuala Lumpur and Prague
- Lifted maiden WTA doubles title at 2015 Québec City (w/Mestach)
- Advanced to first WTA doubles final at 2014 Luxembourg (w/Hradecka, l. Bacsinszky/Barrois)
- Reached 2r on WTA debut as qualifier at 2014 Québec City (l. Hradecka)
- On ITF Circuit, owns 14 singles and 19 doubles titles
- Made professional debut at \$10K ITF/Piestany-SVK in 2010
