[4] Coco Gauff (USA #4) vs. [13] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #17)

Gauff leads 2-1

Gauff:

- Making Wuhan debut this year
- Currently on a seven-match win streak after title run at Beijing last week where she earned her second career WTA 1000 title (also 2023 Cincinnati)
- Leads Tour in Return Points Won (48.5%) and Return Games Won (46.1%)
- Has gone 5-8 against Top 20 opponents this season
- Won the only two hard court matches between these two at 2022 Adelaide 250 and 2024 Australian Open

Kostyuk:

- Also making Wuhan debut this week
- Won their most recent meeting at Stuttgart earlier this year
- Career best result at a WTA 1000 was semifinal run at Indian Wells this season
- Owns 5-4 record against Top 10 players this year however only one of those wins has come on hard courts (all others were on clay)
- Has gone 8-5 against American opposition this year

Xinyu Wang (CHN #51) vs. [2] Jessica Pegula (USA #3)

Wang leads 1-0

Wang:

- Making main draw debut at Wuhan; contested qualifying in 2019
- With a win would reach first career WTA 1000 quarterfinal; run here this week ties career best also reaching Round of 16 at Beijing last year
- Owns 1-7 record against Top 10 players with sole win coming earlier this year when she beat today's opponent then ranked No.5 at Wimbledon
- Looking to notch three consecutive match wins for the first time since run to Round of 16 at Wimbledon

Pegula:

- Making second appearance at Wuhan, where she fell first round in 2019 then ranked No.76
- Owns three career WTA 1000 titles: 2022 Guadalajara, 2023 Montreal and 2024 Toronto
- Has gone 21-4 against players outside the Top 50 this year with only two losses on hard courts
- Five of her six career titles have come on hard courts including one this year at Toronto and one in Asia at 2023 Seoul

[5] Qinwen Zheng (CHN #7) vs. Leylah Fernandez (CAN #28)

Fernandez leads 2-0

Zheng:

- Making debut main draw appearance at Wuhan after contesting qualifying in 2019 as a 16-year-old wild card ranked No.697
- Since Wimbledon, has won 19 of 21 matches against players outside the Top 20
- Earned career best result at a WTA 1000 event by reaching the Beijing semifinals last week; before that was 0-4 in WTA 1000 quarterfinal matches
- Just one of her four career titles have come on hard courts at 2023 Zhengzhou
- Leads Tour in aces (345) and first serve points won (75.7%)

Fernandez:

- Making debut appearance at Wuhan
- Looking to tie best career result at a WTA 1000 event also advancing to quarterfinals at Doha and Cincinnati this year as well as Guadalajara in 2023
- Owns 9-0 career record against players from China and is 3-0 this year
- Has gone 2-6 against Top 10 players this year including a win against today's opponent at Doha
- Is the first Canadian player to reach this stage at Wuhan since Eugenie Bouchard's runner-up run in 2014

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#2) vs. Yulia Putintseva (KAZ #35)

Putintseva leads 1-0

Sabalenka:

- Holds 13-0 record at Wuhan winning the title in both previous appearances: 2018 (d. Kontaveit in F) and 2019 (d. Riske-Amritraj in F)
- Has gone 33-8 against players outside the Top 20 this year with most recent loss just last week to No.49 Karolina Muchova in the Beijing quarterfinals
- 14 of her 16 singles titles have come on hard courts including three this year at Australian Open, Cincinnati and US Open
- Leads Tour in hard court match wins this year at 34; Emma Navarro (30) is the only other player with at least 30 hard court wins while Coco Gauff could earn her 30th hard court win of the year today
- Second on Tour in Service Games Won (80.2%), Service Points Won (63.6%) and Second Serve Points Won (51.3%); trails only No.1 Iga Swiatek in all three categories

Putintseva:

- Making fourth main draw appearance at Wuhan where she is into the third round for the first time
- Owns 3-4 record against Top 10 players this year with wins over No.1 Iga Swiatek at Wimbledon, No.2 Coco Gauff at Cincinnati and No.8 Qinwen Zheng at Madrid
- Looking to reach fifth career WTA 1000 quarterfinal and third of the year after doing so at Miami and Madrid
- With a win, would tie best result by a Kazakh player at Wuhan after Elena Rybakina's quarterfinal run in 2019

[9] Beatriz Haddad Maia (BRA #12) vs. Magdalena Frech (POL #27)

Haddad Maia leads 3-0

Haddad Maia:

- Making debut appearance at Wuhan where she is the first Brazilian woman to reach the Round of 16
- Beat today's opponent earlier this year in opening round at Wimbledon
- Has gone 29-15 against players outside the Top 20 this year
- Two of her four career singles titles have come on hard courts both in Asia: Seoul in 2024 and Zhuhai in 2023

Frech:

- Making debut main draw appearance at Wuhan
- Currently sitting at a career-high ranking of No.27
- Looking to reach first career quarterfinal at a WTA 1000 event; run here ties previous best also reaching Round of 16 at Dubai and Beijing, both this year
- Beat No.8 Emma Navarro in previous round for first Top 10 win of career, was previously 0-15
- Has gone 4-8 against Top 20 players in 2024 earning first wins of career this season
- Looking to tie best result by a Polish player here by reaching the quarterfinals, also done by Agnieszka Radwanska in 2016

- During last year's Asian swing reached SF at Beijing - so far this year, won title at Beijing
- Has won 48 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.3 on Tour for match-wins this year, trailing only Iga Swiatek (57) and Aryna Sabalenka (50)
- Leads Tour in Return Points Won (48.5%) and Return Games Won (46.1%)
- Contesting her 36th WTA 1000 main draw of career this week; her two WTA 1000 titles occurred at 2023 Cincinnati and 2024 Beijing

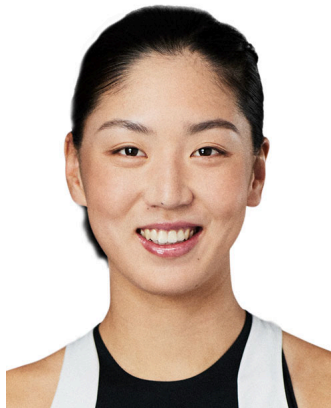
CAREER MILESTONES

- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Swiatek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top-10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Q.Wang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result - during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF
- At 15y 214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y 177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15y 144d, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Hingis won Hamburg at 14y 219d)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut defeating V.Williams in 1r (l. eventual champion Halep) - followed with 3r showing at US Open (as WC, l. Osaka)
- Made WTA main draw debut as a wildcard at 2019 Miami where she earned her first WTA main draw win over good friend McNally (l. Kasatkina in 2r)
- Made professional debut in May 2018 as a qualifier into the \$25K ITF/Osprey, FL-USA
- In 2023, won maiden singles title at Austin (d. Gracheva) and doubles title at Birmingham (w/Krejčíková).
- Reached QF at two WTA 500 events; Adelaide 1 (l. Jabeur) and Washington (l. Samsonova). Achieved a peak singles ranking of No. 32 on August 7, 2023 and No. 27 in doubles on May 8, 2023
- Best result of 2022 was SF showing at Granby (l. Saville). Also made 3r at Australian Open and Eastbourne
- Highlights of second half of 2021 were QF at Chicago [250] (l. Gracheva) and SF at Cluj-Napoca (l. Halep); broke into Top 50 on November 1, 2021, after Cluj-Napoca
- On clay, enjoyed career-best R16 run at Roland Garros (l. Swiatek) and advanced to SF at Istanbul (l. eventual champion Cirstea)
- Opened 2021 by reaching first career WTA SF, at Abu Dhabi (l. Kudermetova)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.97 on November 2, 2020, after reaching back-to-back finals on ITF Circuit in US
- Made 3r at 2020 US Open (l. eventual champion Osaka in 3s)
- In February 2020, picked up third ITF singles title of career, at a \$60k event in Cairo
- Season highlight in 2019 was reaching first WTA QF, at Strasbourg (l. Garcia)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut at 2018 Australian Open and reached 3r, having received a WC into the qualifying event by virtue of winning the junior title there in 2017 (d. Masarova in F). Was first player born in 2002 to play in a Grand Slam main draw. Was also youngest player to reach the 3r at a major since 1997 US Open when Mirjana Lucic-Baroni (15 years, 182 days) reached this stage
- Scored two Top 50 wins in 2018, over No.27 Peng (Australian Open), No.26 Gavrilova (Fed Cup)
- Won first ITF Circuit title of career at \$25k ITF/Dunakeszi-HUN in 2017 (d. Pera in F)
- Played first WTA qualifying at 2017 Mallorca (l. Kalinskaya in 1r)
- Ukrainian Fed Cup Team 2018-20
- Won 2017 Australian Open girls' singles title (d. Masarova in F) and ITF Junior Masters event in Chengdu, China in October 2017; rose as high as No.3 in junior rankings in June 2017
- Played first professional event at \$10k ITF/Kharkiv-UKR in August 2016 (fell in 1r)

- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team in 2022
- Former Junior World No.1 (July 2018); won 2018 Roland-Garros girls' title (d. McNally in F) and 2018 US Open doubles title (w/McNally), while finished R-Up at 2017 US Open girls' event (L. Anisimova) becoming the youngest girls' singles finalist in tournament history at 13-years-old

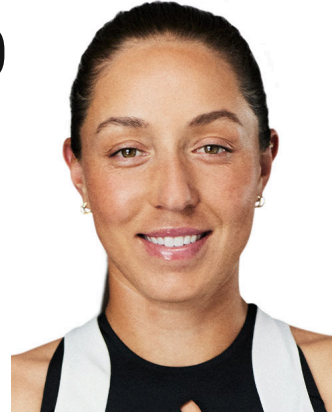
- Coached by Jean Christophe Faurel and Matt Daly
 - Father, Corey, played basketball at Georgia State; mother, Candi, excelled in gymnastics before competing in a track and field at Florida State University
 - Previously worked with Diego Moyano
 - Started playing tennis at six
 - Favorite surface is hard, describes her playing style as aggressive as possible with a big serve; depends on her quickness and athleticism to keep her in any point - describes herself as a "fighter"

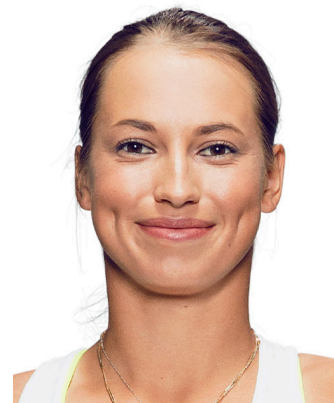
