MATCH NOTES – DAY 7 - OCTOBER 13, 2024

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#2) vs. [5] Qinwen Zheng (CHN #7)

Sabalenka leads 3-0

- Rematch of January's Australian Open final and last month's US Open quarterfinal, both won by Sabalenka
- First time two Top 10 players will face off in a WTA final in China since the 2019 WTA Finals in Shenzhen (Barty d. Svitolina)
- First meeting between Sabalenka and Zheng outside of the Grand Slams
- Sabalenka has won all six sets previously contested

Sabalenka:

- Two-time champion in 2018 and 2019 and holds an undefeated 16-0 record in Wuhan
- Leads Tour in hard court wins this season, with 37
- 14 of her 16 singles titles have come on hard courts, including three this year at the Australian Open, Cincinnati, and US Open
- Bidding to win 17th career WTA title and fourth of the season
- Entering today's final tied with Petra Kvitova for the most wins in Wuhan (16) since the inception of the tournament in 2014
- Playing her 6th WTA final in China, tied with Alison Riske and Jelena Jankovic for the most in the Open Era
- Playing her 4th WTA 1000 final of the season, tied with Iga Swiatek for the most this season
- Having won Cincinnati in August, bidding to win multiple WTA 1000 titles in a season for the first time in her career
- Playing her 7th WTA final of the season, the most of any player (excluding team events & BJK Cup) and the most she has made in a single season eclipsing her previous best of six in 2023
- Across both tours this year, only Jannik Sinner (8) has made more tour-level finals than Sabalenka
- Owns a five-match win streak against Top 10 opponents, the longest streak of her career; a win today would tie her with Iga Swiatek (9) for the most Top 10 wins this season
- Bidding to win an Open Era record 5th WTA title on Chinese soil; currently tied with Agnieszka Radwanska with four: 2018 and 2019 Wuhan, 2019 Zhuhai, 2019 Shenzhen
- Has qualified for the WTA Finals Riyadh for the fourth consecutive year

Zheng:

- Born in Shiyan in Hubei province and moved to Wuhan as a child to go to school and train
- Making her main-draw debut at her home tournament; as a 16-year-old, received a qualifying wild card in 2019 and lost in the first round to Svetlana Kuznetsova
- First Chinese player to reach the final of Wuhan and first to reach the final at a WTA 1000 on Chinese soil
- Second Chinese player to reach the final of a WTA 1000 event after Li Na (2012 Rome, 2012 Montréal, 2012 Cincinnati, and 2014 Miami) and bidding to become the first to win a WTA 1000 title since Li won 2012 Cincinnati
- Bidding to win first WTA 1000 title, fifth career WTA title overall, and third of the season after Palermo and Olympics
- Has won 24 matches since Wimbledon, the most of any player on tour (Sabalenka has won 23)
- Made first WTA 1000 semifinal last week in Beijing (I. Muchova)
- Bidding for second Top 5 win of the season after defeating No.1 Iga Swiatek in the Olympic semifinals
- Became China's first gold medalist in singles at the Paris 2024 Olympics by defeating Croatia's Donna Vekic in the gold medal match
- Leads the tour with 368 aces this season; has served 32 aces en route to the final, the highest tally of the tournament
- Has won her last 10 three-set matches and leads the tour in three-set wins (19-3) and win percentage in deciding sets (86.4%)
- The Top 7 players on the PIF Race to the WTA Finals at the end of the regular season will automatically qualify for the WTA Finals Riyadh. Zheng entered the Asian swing at No.9 on the Race Leaderboard and will rise to No.7 on Monday, overtaking Emma Navarro. She is trying to become the first Chinese player to qualify for the WTA Finals since Li Na in 2013

PLAYER NOTES

- Two-time defending champion sporting an undefeated 16-0 record in Wuhan; won the title in both 2018 (d. Kontaveit in F) and 2019 (d. Riske-Amritraj in F)
- Her 16 wins tied Petra Kvitova for the most main-draw wins at Wuhan since the tournament's inception in 2014
- Has beaten Katerina Siniakova, Yulia Putintseva, Magdalena Frech and Coco Gauff so far this week to reach her first final since winning US Open last month
- 1st player in tournament history to make 3 finals
- Has now won 19 of last 20 matches with title runs at Cincinnati and US Open and QF performance at Beijing
- Faces No.7 Qinwen Zheng for 3rd time and 2nd time this year; has won all 6 sets previously played; first meeting outside the Slams
- Bidding for 2nd Top 10 win of the week after beating No.4 Coco Gauff in SF; owns 37 career wins over Top 10 players, including last 6
- Owns 17-2 career record against players from China, with record in 2024 standing at 4-0
- Bidding to win 17th WTA title and 4th of 2024; record in WTA finals stands at 16-14
- Has won 14 of her 16 WTA titles on hard court, including 3 this season: US Open, Cincinnati, Australian Open
- Is No.1 seed this week; has been top seed at 19 tournaments in her career, winning the title onlytwice at 2019 Shenzhen and 2020 Linz
- Is currently No.2 on PIF WTA Rankings; this time last year was ranked No.1
- During last year's Asia swing reached QF at Beijing
- Has won 53 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.1 on tour for match wins
- Tour leader in hard-court wins in 2024 with 37

- Making 1st appearance at home tournament; born in Shiyan in Hubei province
- Has beaten Jaqueline Cristian, Leylah Fernandez, Jasmine Paolini and Xinyu Wang so far this week to reach her first final since winning gold at Paris 2024 Olympics
- 1st Chinese player to make Wuhan final; bested Wang in first all-Chinese WTA 1000 semifinal on Saturday
- 2nd Chinese player to reach a WTA 1000 final after Li Na (Rome 2012, Montréal 2012, Cincinnati 2012 and Miami 2014)
- Trying to become 1st Chinese player to win a WTA 1000 title since Li Na at Cincinnati 2012
- Has won 24 of last 27 matches since Wimbledon, with losses coming to Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (Cincinnati R16), Aryna Sabalenka (US Open QF) and Karolina Muchova (Beijing SF)
- Faces No.2 Aryna Sabalenka in a final for 2nd time this year (also Australian Open); bidding for 2nd Top 5 win of 2024 after beating No.1 Iga Swiatek at Olympics SF
- Owns 8 career wins over Top 10 players; bidding for 2nd Top 10 win of the week after defeating No.6 Jasmine Paolini in QF
- Record in WTA finals stands at 4-2; last loss came to Aryna Sabalenka at 2024 Australian Open
- Bidding to win second career hard-court title after Zhengzhou 2023; 3 of 4 tour-level titles have come on clay
- Previous best result by China at Wuhan was SF run by Qiang Wang in 2018
- Is currently No.7 on PIF WTA Rankings; this time last year was ranked No.24
- Entered the week at No.8 on PIF Race to the WTA Finals; will overtake Emma Navarro and rise to No.7 on Monday
- During last year's Asian swing reached RUP at Zhuhai, Won at Zhengzhou, 1r at Beijing; also won gold for China at Asian Games

CAREER MILESTONES

- Outstanding 2023 saw her win debut Grand Slam title at Australian Open (d. Rybakina in F), reach second Major final at US Open (l. Gauff in F) and become the WTA World No.1 player for the first time in career (after US Open). In addition won titles at Adelaide and Madrid.
- Highlight of 2022 season was R-Up finish at WTA Finals in Fort Worth (l. Garcia in F); upset No.1 Swiatek, No.2 Jabeur and No.3 Pegula en route to final - only the fourth woman in history to beat the No.1, No.2 and No.3 at the same tournament
- Lifted two titles during 2021 campaign, at Abu Dhabi and Madrid, while was R-Up at Stuttgart. Also reached a further three SFs, including at Wimbledon and US Open
- Rose to career-high No.2 in rankings on August 23, 2021
- In doubles, lifted second major at 2021 Australian Open (w/Mertens, d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F)
- Won final nine matches of 2020 to end the year with back-to-back titles - at Ostrava (d. Azarenka in F) and Linz (d. Mertens in F) - and ranked at No.10
- Having also taken home the silverware at Doha (d. Kvitova in F), was one of two players (also Halep) to lift three singles titles during disrupted 2020 season
- Ended as World No.11 for the second straight year in 2019 after capturing three WTA singles titles at Shenzhen (d. Riske in F), Wuhan (d. Riske in F) and Zhuhai (d. Bertens in F)
- Made Top-10 debut on January 28, 2019 following 3r run at 2019 Australian Open
- Ended 2019 at No.2 in WTA doubles rankings after capturing first Grand Slam doubles trophy at US Open (w/Mertens, d. Azarenka/Barty in F). Earlier in the season, the pair claimed the 'Sunshine Double' by winning back-to-back titles at Indian Wells (d. Krejcikova/Siniakova in F) and Miami (d. Stosur/ Zhang in F)
- Qualified for WTA Finals Shenzhen in doubles (w/Mertens), going 1-2 in the round-robin stage
- Enjoyed breakthrough season in 2018, lifting two titles, at New Haven (d. Suárez Navarro in F) and Wuhan (d. Kontaveit in F), winning 46 matches and finishing at No.11 in the rankings
- Also in 2018, was R-Up at Lugano (l. Mertens) and Eastbourne (l. Wozniacki), made SF at Cincinnati, reached five QFs and produced a career-best Grand Slam run to R16 at US Open
- Entered Top 50 on April 16, 2018, after Lugano run, and Top 20 on August 27 of the same year,

- Earned 2023 WTA Most Improved Player of year ending the season at No.15 and inside the Top 20 for the first time
- Won maiden WTA titles in 2023 at Palermo (d. Paolini in F) and Zhengzhou (d. Krejcikova in F); also reached final at WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai (l. Haddad Maia), SF at Abu Dhabi and first career Grand Slam QF at US Open (l. Sabalenka)
- Broke into Top 20 for the first time on May 22, 2023
- Won WTA Newcomer of the Year in 2022; reached first WTA final at Tokyo (l. Samsonova) and also made SF at Melbourne Summer Set 1, as qualifier), QF at Toronto and R16 at Roland Garros
- Broke into Top 50 at No.46 after run to fourth round in Paris that year
- Scored first Top 20 win over No.19 Simona Halep at 2022 Roland Garros then earned two Top 10 wins over No.5 Ons Jabeur at Toronto and No.4 Paula Badosa at Tokyo
- Broke into Top 100 on January 31, 2022, following run through qualifying to 2r at Australian Open
- Also won title at WTA 125K event in Valencia in June 2022
- Ended 2021 at No.143, her first Top 150 finish
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut in 2021 at Palermo (as qualifier, l. Cristian)
- Made further main draw appearances in 2021 at Moscow (as qualifier, l. Tsurenko in 1r) and Courmayeur (as qualifier, l. Vekic in 1r); also contested qualifying in Strasbourg
- Made WTA debut in 2019, appearing in qualifying at Miami, Tianjin and Wuhan
- Made ITF debut in 2018; gone on to amass nine ITF singles titles with 9-0 record in finals

- Broke into Top 100 at No.76 on October 16, 2017 after reaching first Tour-level final at Tianjin (l. Sharapova). Also in 2017 made SF at Tashkent (l. Babos) and lifting WTA 125k Series title at Mumbai (d. Jakupovic)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut 2017 Wimbledon, falling in 2r (as qualifier, d. Khromacheva, l. Witthoeft)
- Fell 1r on main draw debut at 2017 Dubai (as qualifier, l. Ka.Bondarenko)
- Member of Belarus Billie Jean King Cup team that lost to USA in 2017 final - scored first Top-20 win of career with defeat of No.13 Stephens during final in Minsk
- WTA qualifying debut came at 2016 Rabat
- Lifted first three ITF Circuit titles in 2015, including a 13-match win streak towards the year's end, bringing back-to-back trophies in Antalya, Turkey
- Made debut on ITF Circuit in Minsk in 2012
