MATCH NOTES - QUARTERFINALS - OCTOBER 11, 2024

[4] Coco Gauff (USA #4) vs. Magda Linette (POL #45)

Gauff leads 1-0

Gauff:

- Making Wuhan debut this year
- Currently on an eight-match win streak after title run at Beijing last week where she earned her second career WTA 1000 title (also 2023 Cincinnati)
- Won the only meeting between these two at 2021 US Open
- Leads Tour in Return Points Won (48.5%) and Return Games Won (46.3%)
- Holds 43-7 record against players outside the Top 20 this year; a loss today would be worst by-ranking loss of the season
- Has gone 7-2 in quarterfinal matches this year

Linette:

- Making second main draw appearance at Wuhan where she reached third round in 2017 as a qualifier
- Win over No.8 seed Daria Kasatkina in previous round earned spot in first career WTA 1000 quarterfinal
- Has gone 1-4 against Top 10 players this year earning her first of the season over No.5 Jasmine Paolini at Beijing last week; owns five career wins against Top 10 players
- Has yet to earn a win over an American player this year with 0-7 record
- Looking to advance to third WTA semifinal of the year

Ekaterina Alexandrova (#33) vs. Xinyu Wang (CHN #51)

Series tied 1-1

Alexandrova:

- Making second appearance at Wuhan, where she fell first round in 2019
- Looking to tie career best result at a WTA 1000 event also advancing to semifinals at 2022 Madrid and 2024 Miami
- Has gone 5-0 in WTA quarterfinal matches this year most recently at Monterrey
- Before this week had lost most recent two matches against players outside the Top 50 to No.163 Polina Kudermetova at Seoul and No.61 Rebecca Sramkova at Beijing
- Has hit 22 aces this week, more than any other player

Wang:

- Making main draw debut at Wuhan; contested qualifying in 2019
- Beat No.3 Jessica Pegula in previous round for best career win by-ranking and first career WTA 1000 quarterfinal
- Won her only other quarterfinal match this year at Hua Hin 1
- Looking to tie best career result on hard courts by reaching the semifinals
- With Qinwen Zheng, looking to tie best result by a Chinese player at Wuhan by matching Qiang Wang's semifinal run in 2018

Zheng leads 2-0

Zheng:

- Making main draw debut at Wuhan after contesting qualifying in 2019 as a 16-year-old wild card ranked No.697
- Has gone 2-5 against Top 10 players this year with wins over No.7 Marketa Vondrousova at United Cup and No.1 Iga Swiatek at the Olympics
- Looking to tie career best result at a WTA 1000 event by reaching the semifinals, doing so for the first time last week in Beijing; before that was 0-4 in WTA 1000 quarterfinal matches
- Owns 7-0 career record against Italian players with two previous wins over today's opponent in the 2023 Palermo final and in the semifinals at 2023 Zhengzhou
- Leads Tour in aces (350) and first serve points won (75.6%)

Paolini:

- Making debut appearance at Wuhan where she is into the quarterfinals for the first time since runner-up run at Wimbledon
- Won first career WTA 1000 title earlier this year at Dubai
- Owns five wins in career over Top 10 players with 2-2 record this year notching wins over No.9 Ons Jabeur at Stuttgart and No.4 Elena Rybakina at Roland Garros
- Has gone 4-1 in quarterfinal matches this year falling at this stage only at Stuttgart
- Looking to tie best result by an Italian player by reaching semifinals also done by Roberta Vinci in 2015

[1] Aryna Sabalenka (#2) vs. Magdalena Frech (POL #27)

First meeting

Sabalenka:

- Holds 14-0 record at Wuhan winning the title in both previous appearances: 2018 (d. Kontaveit in F) and 2019 (d. Riske-Amritraj in F); owns six career WTA 1000 titles including one this year at Cincinnati
- Has gone 34-8 against players outside the Top 20 this year with most recent loss just last week to No.49 Karolina Muchova in the Beijing quarterfinals
- 14 of her 16 singles titles have come on hard courts including three this year at Australian Open, Cincinnati and US Open
- Holds 7-5 record in quarterfinal matches this year going 5-2 in hard court quarterfinal matches this season
- Leads Tour in hard court match wins this year at 35; Emma Navarro and Coco Gauff both have 30 and are the only other players with at least 30 hard court wins

Frech:

- Making debut main draw appearance at Wuhan
- Currently sitting at a career-high ranking of No.27
- Beat No.8 Emma Navarro in second round for first Top 10 win of career, was previously 0-15
- Then defeated No.12 Beatriz Haddad Maia in previous round to reach first career quarterfinal at a WTA 1000 event
- Record in WTA quarterfinal matches stands at 2-5; looking to reach third career semifinal with both other appearances coming this year in runner-up finish at Prague and title run at Guadalajara

- Owns 4-11 career record against players from Poland, with record in 2024 standing at 2-2
- Record in WTA QF matches stands at 23-16 with 7-2 record this year; only lost at this stage at Dubai and Stuttgart
- Seven of her eight career WTA singles titles have come on hard court, most recently Beijing last week
- · Only player from United States to reach QF
- Best result by an American player at Wuhan was title run by Venus Williams in 2015
- Is currently ranked No.4; this time last year was ranked No.3
- Has won 49 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.3 on Tour for match-wins this year, trailing only Iga Swiatek (57) and Aryna Sabalenka (51)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Swiatek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top-10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Q.Wang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in OF
- At 15y 214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y 177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15y 144d, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Hingis won Hamburg at 14y 219d)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut defeating V.Williams in 1r (l. eventual champion Halep) - followed with 3r showing at US Open (as WC, l. Osaka)
- Made WTA main draw debut as a wildcard at 2019 Miami where she earned her first WTA main draw win over good friend McNally (l. Kasatkina in 2r)
- Made professional debut in May 2018 as a qualifier into the \$25K ITF/Osprey, FL-USA

- Opened 2023 by going 3-1 in singles for Poland in the City Final in Sydney at inaugural United Cup (l. Keys), then achieved best Grand Slam result with SF at Australian Open (l. eventual champion Sabalenka). Broke into Top 20 for first time reaching No. 19 on March 20, 2023.
- Reached final at Guangzhou (l. Wang Xiyu) and ended 2023 by qualifying for Zhuhai Elite Trophy (0-2 in group stage).
- 2022 season highlight was R-Up finish at Chennai (l. Fruhvirtova). Also won two doubles titles, at Charleston (w/Klepac) and Eastbourne (w/Krunic)
- Posted seventh successive Top 100 season in 2021, finishing at No.57 after starting her season at Miami in March, due to a knee injury
- Reached two semifinals in 2021, at Strasbourg (l. Cirstea) and Cleveland (l. Begu)
- Matched previous best results at Grand Slams in 2021 with 3r runs at Roland Garros (d. World No.1 Barty via ret. in 2r; l. Jabeur) and Wimbledon (d. No.5 Svitolina in 2r for best win of career in a completed match, before falling to Badosa)
- Won second WTA singles title at Hua Hin in 2020 (d. Kung in F), rising to new career-high ranking of No.33 (on February 17)
- Posted best result at US Open by advancing to 3r (l. Kontaveit); now has reached this stage at all four Grand Slams
- Winner of 2020 WTA Shot of the Year; became the third Polish woman to win this award (after A.Radwanska and Swiatek)
- Her 2019 campaign was highlighted by lifting maiden WTA title at the Bronx and finished R-Up at Seoul (l. Muchova); broke into Top 50 on September 9, 2019
- Season highlights in 2018 included QF run at Washington DC (l. Vekic); win over No.17 Osaka in 2r was first Top 20 victory - previous careerbest win came over No.21 Gavrilova at 2017 Tokyo [PPO]
- Posted first career victories at 2018 Australian Open during 3r run (d. Brady in 1r and No.22 seed Kasatkina in 2r, l. Allertova)
- Highlight of 2017 campaign was SF at Kuala Lumpur (l. Hibino). Also made QF at Bogotá and reached 3r at major for first time at Roland Garros
- In 2016 enjoyed run to first Premier-level quarterfinal of career at Tokyo [PPO] (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Wozniacki); also advanced to QF at Katowice (l. Parmentier)
- Reached maiden WTA singles final at 2015 Tokyo [Japan Open] (l. Wickmayer)

- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team in 2022
- Former Junior World No.1 (July 2018); won 2018
 Roland-Garros girls' title (d. McNally in F) and
 2018 US Open doubles title (w/McNally), while
 finished R-Up at 2017 US Open girls' event (l.
 Anisimova) becoming the youngest girls' singles
 finalist in tournament history at 13-years-old
- Broke into Top 100 on June 15, 2015
- Played first two WTA main draws in 2013: 2r at Strasbourg (l. Cornet) and SF at Baku (l. Peer)
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Poland in 2007; owns 12 singles titles and eight doubles titles on ITF Circuit

CAREER MILESTONES

- Earned 2023 WTA Most Improved Player of year ending the season at No.15 and inside the Top 20 for the first time
- Won maiden WTA titles in 2023 at Palermo (d. Paolini in F) and Zhengzhou (d. Krejcikova in F); also reached final at WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai (l. Haddad Maia), SF at Abu Dhabi and first career Grand Slam QF at US Open (l. Sabalenka)
- Broke into Top 20 for the first time on May 22, 2023
- Won WTA Newcomer of the Year in 2022; reached first WTA final at Tokyo (l. Samsonova) and also made SF at Melbourne Summer Set 1, as qualifier), QF at Toronto and R16 at Roland Garros
- Broke into Top 50 at No.46 after run to fourth round in Paris that year
- Scored first Top 20 win over No.19 Simona Halep at 2022 Roland Garros then earned two Top 10 wins over No.5 Ons Jabeur at Toronto and No.4 Paula Badosa at Tokyo
- Broke into Top 100 on January 31, 2022, following run through qualifying to 2r at Australian Open
- Also won title at WTA 125K event in Valencia in June 2022
- Ended 2021 at No.143, her first Top 150 finish
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut in 2021 at Palermo (as qualifier, l. Cristian)
- Made further main draw appearances in 2021 at Moscow (as qualifier, l. Tsurenko in 1r) and Courmayeur (as qualifier, l. Vekic in 1r); also contested qualifying in Strasbourg
- Made WTA debut in 2019, appearing in qualifying at Miami, Tianjin and Wuhan
- Made ITF debut in 2018; gone on to amass nine ITF singles titles with 9-0 record in finals

- Finished 2023 by breaking into Top 30 for first time, achieving No. 29 on Oct 23, 2023 after becoming runner-up at Monastir (l. Mertens).
 Also achieved runner-up at Palermo and SF at Zhengzhou (l. Zheng both times) as well as QFs at Lyon (l. Garcia) and Cincinnati as a qualifier (l. eventual champion Gauff). Enjoyed two Top 10 wins (No.10 Garcia and No.4 Rybakina).
- In 2022, finished R-Up at Cluj-Napoca (l. Blinkova), while made back-to-back SF at Palermo (l. Bronzetti) and Warsaw (l. eventual champion Garcia)

- Strong season finish also brought SF run at Courmayeur(l. eventual champion Vekic) and QF effort at Linz (l. Halep); posted best win of season over No.18 Mertens en route to 3r at Indian Wells (l. Pegula)
- Also in 2021 won the WTA 125K event in Bol, Croatia (d. Rus in F) and was R-Up at the same level in Saint Malo (l. Golubic) Captured first WTA doubles title in 2021, at Hamburg(w/Teichmann)
- In 2021, for first time in career, contested the full suite of all four Grand Slam events; reached 2r at Roland Garros and USOpen, equalling best previous Slam result
- In 2020, reached 2r four times at WTA tournaments, including Roland Garros (l. Kvitova)
- Highlights of 2019 included QF showings at Guangzhou and Palermo, a SF run at the WTA 125K Series event at Karlsruhe, lifting seventh, eighth and ninth ITF Circuit titles of her career, at \$60KBrescia-ITA, \$25K ITF/Curtiba-BRA and \$100K ITF/Tokyo-JPN, and qualifying for maiden Grand Slam main draw at Roland Garros (l. Kasatkina in 1r)
- Ended 2018 ranked No.180, with season highlight a maiden WTA singles QF at Prague (d. No.15 Kasatkina, l. Zhang)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2017 Bastad (l. Suarez Navarro in 1r) and also fell 1r at Guangzhou and in qualifying a further three times
- Part of Italy's Billie Jean King Cup team 2017-19
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2015 Rome

- Owns nine singles and one doubles title on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Italy in 2011
