- Making second appearance at Budapest, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2023 (l. Timofeeva)
- Has defeated Fanny Stollar, Ella Seidel and Eva Lys so far this week to reach her first final since winning Bad Homburg earlier this year
- Faces No.134 Aliaksandra Sasnovich in F today
- Has now reached four singles finals winning two titles this year - Bad Homburg and Hua Hin while finishing as runner-up at 2023 Ningbo
- Shnaider has the chance to become the first player to win titles on grass, hard, and clay courts in a season since 2022 (Caroline Garcia)
- Record in WTA F matches stands at 2-1
- Previous best career result on clay was SF run at Hamburg in 2023
- Is No. 1 seed this week for the first time in her career
- Is currently ranked No.28; this time last year was ranked No.110
- Playing her 26th career main draw, has won her first two career titles this year - Bad Homburg and Hua Hin
- Has won 19 matches so far in 2024
- Has been involved in 11 three-set matches in 2024

- Faces No.28 Diana Shnaider in F today; owns 54 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.49 Viktoriya Tomova at Budapest 2024
- Owns 41-72 career record against seeds, with a record in 2024 standing at 2-1
- Record in WTA F matches stands at 0-4
- Previous best career result on clay was SF run at Moscow International in 2018
- Lowest ranked player (No.246) to reach F at Budapest was Maria Timofeeva in 2023
- Is currently ranked No.134; this time last year was ranked No.64
- Is now a five-time finalist, finishing as runnerup at 2015 Seoul, 2018 Brisbane, 2022 Melbourne 250 and 2022 Cleveland
- Has won 6 matches so far in 2024
- Has been involved in 3 three-set matches in 2024

CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached 2r on Grand Slam debut at 2023
 Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Sakkari in 3s)
 and Roland Garros 2023 (l. Haddad Maia)
- Won WTA 125K Series title in Montevideo, Uruguay last November to end 2022 just outside Top 100
- Overall win-loss record in 2022 was 56-17; reached four ITF Circuit finals, highlighted by a 15-match, three tournament winning streak, culminating with a W60 title in Istanbul
- Last season only Tour-level outing was qualifying exit at St. Petersburg
- Won first ITF Circuit tournament at W15 event in Antalya in late 2021
- · Made WTA qualifying debut at 2021 Moscow
- Owns four titles in singles and three in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Played first senior matches on ITF Circuit towards end of 2020
- As junior, made SF at Roland Garros in 2021 and US Open in 2022. Also won girls' doubles at three of the four majors and reached No.2 in the ITF rankings

- 2023 Grand Slam results include 1r run at Roland Garros (l. Tauson) and US Open (l. Linette), as well as 2r runs at Australian Open (l. Pegula) and Wimbledon (l. Kvitova)
- 2023 Tour highlights include a SF run at s'Hertogenbosch (l. Alexandrova) and QF at Nanchang (l. Fernandez).
- Highlights in 2022 were R-Up finishes at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (l. Anisimova) and Cleveland (l. Samsonova)
- Also made QF at St. Petersburg, Berlin and Hamburg, helping her post career-high ranking of No.29 on September 19, 2022
- Best results in 2021 were runs to QFs at Belgrade and Cleveland and R16 at Indian Wells
- Reached first WTA QF in 18 months at 2020
 Palermo (as qualifier, l. Martic); also advanced
 to this stage at Istanbul (l. Martincova) and Linz
 (l. Krejcikova)
- Made 3r at 2020 US Open-defeating No.19 Vondrousova in 2r was her first Top-20 win in over a year
- Recorded 20th Grand Slam main draw win after defeating Friedsam in the 1r at 2020 Roland Garros
- Made strong start to 2019 season by recording maiden Top-5 victory over No.4 Svitolina en route to a QF finish at Brisbane (l. Vekic) followed by an SF appearance at Sydney (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kvitova) and 3r run at Australian Open (l. Pavlyuchenkova)
- Reached first Grand Slam SF in doubles at 2019 US Open (w/Kuzmova, l. Azarenka/Barty)
- In 2018, reached second career WTA final and first at a Premier tournament at Brisbane, as a qualifier - defeated No.11 Mladenovic and No.16 Sevastova en route to final (l. No.6 Svitolina)
- Also in 2018 made SF at Moscow [River Cup] and first Grand Slam R16 at Wimbledon
- First broke into Top 50 on January 29
- Played all three ties during Belarus' run to its first Fed Cup final in 2017 - posted 5-1 record, including win over No.13 Stephens in final
- Highlight of 2016 was run through qualifying to QF at Tokyo [PPO]; defeated No.6 Ka.Pliskova en route for maiden Top-10 win
- Reached maiden WTA final at 2015 Seoul (as qualifier, l. Begu)
- Made Top-100 debut on September 8, 2015 (after US Open; rose from No.120 to No.97)
- In 2014 season won 11th and most recent singles title on ITF Circuit. Also owns seven ITF Circuit doubles titles

- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2013 Brussels; made WTA main draw debut at 2014 US Open
- Played first event of career at 2009 ITF/Minsk 2-BLR

- Started playing tennis in Tolyatti (Kasatkina's hometown), 40 kilometres from her home in Zhigulevsk and parents
- Moved to Moscow aged nine and is now studying at North Carolina State where she is majoring in exploratory studies

- Currently coached by Dzmitry Klimenko
- Mother is Natalia; younger sister is Polina
- Started playing at age 9; introduced to sport by father
