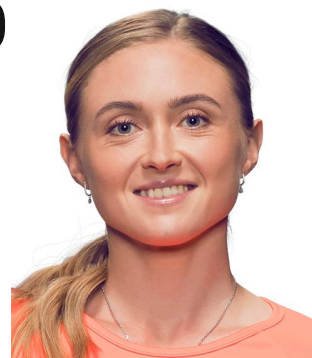

- Becomes the second Dutch woman to reach the QF stage this year at a Tour-level event (along with Arantxa Rus)
- Bidding to become the first Dutch woman to reach the SF this year and first since Rus won the title at 2023 Hamburg

- Is currently ranked No.137; this time last year was ranked No.273; projected to reach a career-high ranking on Monday after the tournament (previously No.131)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Last season on ITF Circuit, won W25 title at Telavi, Georgia. Also reached three further finals and finished year with 46-26 win-loss record
- Won first ITF Circuit title at W15 tournament in Alkmaar, Netherlands in 2019
- Overall has won four titles in singles and 14 in doubles
- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event in Breda, Netherlands in 2015
- 2023 Grand Slam results include 1r run at Roland Garros (l. Tauson) and US Open (l. Linette), as well as 2r runs at Australian Open (l. Pegula) and Wimbledon (l. Kvitova)
- 2023 Tour highlights include a SF run at s'Hertogenbosch (l. Alexandrova) and QF at Nanchang (l. Fernandez).
- Highlights in 2022 were R-Up finishes at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (l. Anisimova) and Cleveland (l. Samsonova)
- Also made QF at St. Petersburg, Berlin and Hamburg, helping her post career-high ranking of No.29 on September 19, 2022
- Best results in 2021 were runs to QFs at Belgrade and Cleveland and R16 at Indian Wells
- Reached first WTA QF in 18 months at 2020 Palermo (as qualifier, l. Martic); also advanced to this stage at Istanbul (l. Martincova) and Linz (l. Krejčíková)
- Made 3r at 2020 US Open—defeating No.19 Vondrousova in 2r was her first Top-20 win in over a year
- Recorded 20th Grand Slam main draw win after defeating Friedsam in the 1r at 2020 Roland Garros
- Made strong start to 2019 season by recording maiden Top-5 victory over No.4 Svitolina en route to a QF finish at Brisbane (l. Vekic) followed by an SF appearance at Sydney (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kvitova) and 3r run at Australian Open (l. Pavlyuchenkova)
- Reached first Grand Slam SF in doubles at 2019 US Open (w/Kuzmova, l. Azarenka/Barty)
- In 2018, reached second career WTA final and first at a Premier tournament at Brisbane, as a qualifier - defeated No.11 Mladenovic and No.16 Sevastova en route to final (l. No.6 Svitolina)
- Also in 2018 made SF at Moscow [River Cup] and first Grand Slam R16 at Wimbledon
- First broke into Top 50 on January 29
- Played all three ties during Belarus' run to its first Fed Cup final in 2017 - posted 5-1 record, including win over No.13 Stephens in final
- Highlight of 2016 was run through qualifying to QF at Tokyo [PPO]; defeated No.6 Ka.Pliskova en route for maiden Top-10 win
- Reached maiden WTA final at 2015 Seoul (as qualifier, l. Begu)
- Made Top-100 debut on September 8, 2015 (after US Open; rose from No.120 to No.97)
- In 2014 season won 11th and most recent singles title on ITF Circuit. Also owns seven ITF Circuit doubles titles

- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2013 Brussels; made WTA main draw debut at 2014 US Open
- Played first event of career at 2009 ITF/Minsk 2-BLR

CAREER MILESTONES

- During a breakthrough 2023 season, reached a new career-high ranking of No.63 and was nominated for the WTA Newcomer of the Year Award.
- Advanced to the R16 at Roland Garros 2023 (L. Muchova), her best Grand Slam performance to date. Also reached three Tour-level quarterfinals at Berlin (L. Vekic), Budapest (L. Podoroska), and Lausanne (L. eventual champion Cocciaretto).
- Reached maiden WTA QF at 2022 Bogota (L. Osorio). In 2022, also reached 2r at Palermo (L. Bronzetti) and fell 1r on four occasions (including US Open)
- In 2021, posted 47-19 win-loss record, reaching seven finals on ITF Circuit.
- Lifted maiden ITF Circuit title at a W25 event in Shymkent, Kazakhstan in September 2019
- Owns five titles in singles and nine in doubles on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Russia in 2017
- In 2023, reached R16 at Roland Garros (L. Gauff); also reached the final of the WTA 125 Parma (L. Bogdan)
- Best result in 2022 was QF at Guadalajara in February (L. Q.Wang). Also reached 2r five times, including at Roland-Garros (L. Kovinic), Wimbledon (L. Frech) and US Open (L. Zhang)
