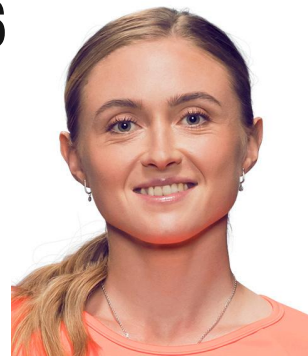

CAREER MILESTONES

- In 2023, reached R16 at Roland Garros (l. Gauff); also reached the final of the WTA 125 Parma (l. Bogdan)
- Best result in 2022 was QF at Guadalajara in February (l. Q.Wang). Also reached 2r five times, including at Roland-Garros (l. Kovinic), Wimbledon (l. Frech) and US Open (l. Zhang)
- During second half of 2021, reached QF at Cluj-Napoca (l. Krunic) and Tenerife (l. Cornet) and won WTA 125K Series title at Belgrade to return to Top 100
- In 2021 also made back-to-back QFs at Guadalajara (l. Bouzkova) and Monterrey (l. Sorribes Tormo)
- Best result of 2020 was 3r run at Roland Garros (d. V.Williams and No.14 Azarenka, l. Podoroska)
- Finished 2019 ranked No.138, having ended season after 1r exit at Wimbledon (l. Puig) in order to undergo knee surgery
- Had been enjoying return to form until Wimbledon, having finished R-Up at Hobart (l. Kenin) and scoring a Top-20 win at Madrid over Mertens
- Season highlight in 2017 was lifting third career title, at Bogotá (d. Arruabarrena in F) and QF at Hiroshima and Tashkent
- Struggled throughout 2016 and 2017, posting a total of only six main draw match wins and finishing both years outside Top 100
- First career Top-10 upset came over No.8 Vinci at 2016 Rio Olympics
- Won her first two WTA singles titles in 2015, first at Katowice in April (d. Giorgi in F) and the second in July at Bucharest (d. Errani in F). Also reached final at Rio de Janeiro (l. Errani)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy in Zhuhai at end of 2015 season as an alternate - posted a win over Vinci in round robin
- Surpassed \$1 million career prize money mark during 3r run at 2015 US Open (l. Kvitova)
- Scored first four Top-20 wins of her career in 2015, over No.20 Errani (Budapest), No.15 A.Radwanska (Cincinnati), No.11 Wozniacki (Wuhan) and No.15 Vinci (Zhuhai)
- Made 2r on her Grand Slam main draw debut at 2013 Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Hampton)
- Reached 2r on WTA main draw debut at 2013 Katowice (l. Martic); defeated No.33 Cornet in career-first main draw match
- Winner of 12 singles titles on ITF Circuit
- Played first events of career on ITF Circuit in 2010 and turned professional in 2011
- Member of Slovak Billie Jean King Cup team, 2012, 2014-19, 2021-22
- 2023 Grand Slam results include 1r run at Roland Garros (l. Tauson) and US Open (l. Linette), as well as 2r runs at Australian Open (l. Pegula) and Wimbledon (l. Kvitova)
- 2023 Tour highlights include a SF run at s'Hertogenbosch (l. Alexandrova) and QF at Nanchang (l. Fernandez).
- Highlights in 2022 were R-Up finishes at Melbourne Summer Set 2 (l. Anisimova) and Cleveland (l. Samsonova)
- Also made QF at St. Petersburg, Berlin and Hamburg, helping her post career-high ranking of No.29 on September 19, 2022
- Best results in 2021 were runs to QFs at Belgrade and Cleveland and R16 at Indian Wells
- Reached first WTA QF in 18 months at 2020 Palermo (as qualifier, l. Martic); also advanced to this stage at Istanbul (l. Martincova) and Linz (l. Krejčíková)
- Made 3r at 2020 US Open—defeating No.19 Vondrousova in 2r was her first Top-20 win in over a year
- Recorded 20th Grand Slam main draw win after defeating Friedsam in the 1r at 2020 Roland Garros
- Made strong start to 2019 season by recording maiden Top-5 victory over No.4 Svitolina en route to a QF finish at Brisbane (l. Vekic) followed by an SF appearance at Sydney (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kvitova) and 3r run at Australian Open (l. Pavlyuchenkova)
- Reached first Grand Slam SF in doubles at 2019 US Open (w/Kuzmova, l. Azarenka/Barty)
- In 2018, reached second career WTA final and first at a Premier tournament at Brisbane, as a qualifier - defeated No.11 Mladenovic and No.16 Sevastova en route to final (l. No.6 Svitolina)
- Also in 2018 made SF at Moscow [River Cup] and first Grand Slam R16 at Wimbledon
- First broke into Top 50 on January 29
- Played all three ties during Belarus' run to its first Fed Cup final in 2017 - posted 5-1 record, including win over No.13 Stephens in final
- Highlight of 2016 was run through qualifying to QF at Tokyo [PPO]; defeated No.6 Ka.Pliskova en route for maiden Top-10 win
- Reached maiden WTA final at 2015 Seoul (as qualifier, l. Begu)
- Made Top-100 debut on September 8, 2015 (after US Open; rose from No.120 to No.97)
- In 2014 season won 11th and most recent singles title on ITF Circuit. Also owns seven ITF Circuit doubles titles

- Finished R-Up to Beck in girls' final at 2012 Roland Garros

- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2013 Brussels; made WTA main draw debut at 2014 US Open
- Played first event of career at 2009 ITF/Minsk 2-BLR

- Began playing at age 7 when parents introduced her to the sport (didn't like her first lesson but grew to love it); decided she wanted to take it more seriously when she became the Under 12 No.1 in Slovakia
- Favorite shot is crosscourt backhand; favorite surface is hard; favorite tournament is Roland Garros
- Best memory is finishing runner-up to Annika Beck in French Open junior final in 2012
- Enjoys biology, painting, photography and reading
- Self-described as quiet and shy.

- Mother is Natalia; younger sister is Polina
- Started playing at age 9; introduced to sport by father
- Favorite shot is backhand down the line; favorite surface is indoor hardcourt; favorite tournaments are US Open and Stuttgart
