PLAYER NOTES

- Making Iasi debut as No.1 seed; first time in career as the top seed at a WTA event (best previous seeding was No.5 at Rouen earlier this year)
- Has defeated Noma Noha Akugue, Aliaksandra Sasnovich and Lea Boskovic so far this week to reach second SF of career after doing so at Roland Garros earlier this year (l. Paolini in SF)
- Faces No.148 Olga Danilovic in SF today looking for first career final
- Owns 4-2 record against players outside the Top 100 this year with losses to No.131 Katie Volynets at Indian Wells and No.126 Paula Badosa at Rome; a loss today would be worst by-ranking since falling to No.155 Anna Bondar at 2023 Lausanne
- Playing first career match on any level against a player from Serbia
- Is currently ranked No.32; this time last year was ranked No.64
- So far on clay this year, reached SF at Roland Garros, QF at Madrid and Rouen and fell 1r at Rome
- Is currently on a three-match winning streak; longest winning streak of her career was five matches during run to Roland Garros SF

PLAYER NOTES

- Previously played Iasi when it was a 125K in 2022, reaching 2r
- Has beaten No.4 seed Anna Blinkova, Anca Todoni and No.8 seed Anna Bondar who she fell to last week in Budapest - into first SF since run to final at 2022 Lausanne (l. Martin in F)
- Faces No.32 Mirra Andreeva in SF today looking to reach third final of career all on clay: won title at the 2018 Moscow River Cup as a 17-year-old lucky loser (d. Potapova) and finished runner-up at 2022 Lausanne (l. Martic)
- With a win today, would be third lowest ranked player to reach a final this year and fifth ranked outside Top 100: also No.108 Diana Shnaider at Hua Hin (WON), No.134 Aliaksandra Sasnovich at Budapest (R-Up), No.190 Ajla Tomljanovic at Birmingham (R-Up) and No.228 Bianca Andreescu at 's-Hertogenbosch (R-Up)
- Has defeated a No.1 seed at a Tour-level event just once in career during run to Moscow title beating No.10 Julia Goerges in QF
- Owns seven wins in career over Top 50 players six of which have come on clay including three this year: No.44 Clara Burel in Madrid as well as No.10 Danielle Collins and No.40 Donna Vekic at Roland Garros
- Owns 6-9 career record against seeded players, with a record in 2024 standing at 3-4
- Record in WTA SF matches stands at 2-0
- Is currently ranked No.148; this time last year was ranked No.105
- So far on clay this year, reached R16 at Roland Garros as a qualifier (her career-best Grand Slam result), 2r at Madrid, 1r at Budapest and contested qualifying at Rome

CAREER MILESTONES

- Opened 2023 season in April by winning 13 matches straight to claim back-to-back ITF titles in Switzerland; as WC, advanced to R16 at Madrid with wins over Fernandez, Haddad Maia and Linette (l. Sabalenka); subsequently made debut at Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Gauff in 3r), Wimbledon (as qualifier, l. Keys in R16) and US Open (l. eventual champion Gauff in 2r)
- Also in 2023 reached R16 at Beijing (l. Rybakina), leading to Top 50 debut (started season just inside Top 300); voted WTA Newcomer of the Year
- In 2022, posted 39-9 win-loss record on ITF Circuit, winning first four titles at this level
- Fell 1r on WTA main-draw debut at 2022 Monastir (as WC, l. Potapova)
- Made professional debut at W15 ITF Circuit event at Sharm El-Sheikh in February 2022
- Owns six ITF Circuit singles titles
- As a junior, finished R-Up at 2023 Australian Open (l. Korneeva)
- In 2023 posted best Grand Slam result with 3r at Roland Garros as a qualifier (l. Jabeur); her ranking climbed back into Top 100 for the first time since 2018 with a title run at WTA 125 Bastad (d. Navarro) and SF finish at WTA 125 Gaiba (l. Maria); ended 2023 after US Open.
- 2022 highlighted by run through qualifying to final at Lausanne (l. Martic); also won doubles title (w/Mladenovic)
- Best results in 2021 were QF showings at Budapest (as qualifier, l. Galfi) and Palermo (l. Zhang). Also made 2r at Australian Open and US Open
- Standout singles result in 2020 was QF run at WTA 125K Series event at Indian Wells. Also fell 1r at Istanbul and in qualifying at Australian Open and Roland Garros
- Won fifth ITF Circuit title at \$60k ITF/Montreux-SUI in September 2019
- Fell in final round of qualifying at Wimbledon in 2019
- Made Top-100 debut on October 1, 2018, and climbed to a career-high ranking of No.96 the following week (October 8, 2018)
- Fourth-youngest player in the 2018 year-end Top 150 (behind Kostyuk, Anisimova and Potapova)
- As a lucky loser at 2018 Moscow [River Cup], became the first player born in 2000s to win a WTA singles title when she overcame fellow teenager Potapova in three-set final
- Won WTA doubles title at 2018 Tashkent (w/Zidasek, d. Begu/Olaru in F)
- Made her Billie Jean King Cup debut in February 2018, winning all three singles matches - including 6-2 6-4 upset of No.15 Sevastova - in Group I of the Euro/Africa Zone
- Her performances representing Serbia in the Billie Jean King Cup earned her the Heart Award and a cheque of USD\$1,000, which she donated to University Children's Hospital in Belgrade
- In just her second tournament in the senior ranks won title at \$10k ITF/Antalya-TUR. Overall, owns five singles and one doubles title on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut on ITF Circuit in Serbia in 2015
- Won girls' doubles titles at 2016 Roland Garros (w/Arias Manjón), 2017 Wimbledon (w/Juvan) and 2017 US Open (w/Kostyuk)

- Working on a trial basis with Conchita Martinez
- Sister Erika, 18, is also a professional player
- Originally from Krasnoyarsk and began playing aged six, but moved to Sochi and then Cannes, France, with sister to set up training base with coaches Jean-René Lisnard and Jean-Christophe Faurel
- Favorite surface is clay
- Represented by IMG

- Currently coached by Roberto Ortega. Previous coach is Salvador Navarro. Mentored by Pepo Clavet.
- Father is Serbian former basketball player Predrag Danilovic, while her mother, Svetlana (née Radosevic), is a sports reporter for Radio Television of Serbia
- Won all three matches on Fed Cup debut in 2018, earning the Fed Cup Heart Award and a cheque of \$1,000, which she chose to donate to University Children's Hospital in Belgrade
- Started playing tennis aged six. Favorite surface is hard
- Away from the court, loves running and in 2019 collaborated on the NikeShield Technology clothing line in Serbia
