Naomi Osaka (JPN #173) vs. Clara Burel (FRA #45)

First Meeting

Osaka is playing at Rome for the first time since 2019, where she reached the quarterfinals... Osaka has won four of her last seven matchups with Top 50 players... Osaka is looking for her second win on clay in 2024...Burel is one spot off her career-high ranking of No.44...Burel recently reached the quarterfinals on clay at WTA 125 Saint Malo...Burel achieved her best career result on clay two Tour-level finals at Lausanne (2021 and 2023)

Sofia Kenin (USA #58) vs. Lucia Bronzetti (ITA #48)

Kenin leads 1-0

Kenin is making 5th appearance at Rome (6th overall), where her previous best result was R16 run in 2019 (l. eventual champion Ka. Pliskova)...Kenin's best result at a WTA-1000 event was SF run at Toronto 2019 (l. eventual champion Andreescu) and Cincinnati 2019 (l. eventual champion Keys)...With a win today would be Kenin's first Top 50 of 2024 season, having lost all of her previous three meetings ... Played today's opponent Bronzetti once and won at Adelaide #1 in 2021...Bronzetti is making 3rd appearance at Rome (4th overall)...with a win today would be Bronzetti's first win at Rome, having failed both of her opening matches in 2022 (l. Osorio) and 2023 (l. Kovinic), also competed in qualifying in 2021...Bronzetti's sole career singles title has come on clay at Rabat 2023

[WC] Sara Errani (ITA #93) vs. Amanda Anisimova (USA #237)

Errani leads 1-0

Errani is making 16th appearance at Rome (21st overall) with a wildcard, where her best result was R-Up in 2014 (l. S. Williams in F) which is also Italy's best result at Rome; has also made SF in 2013 (l. Azarenka)...Is playing today's opponent Anisimova for first time on WTA tour-level events, though they have met at Indian Wells 125K in 2018 when Errani won...7 out of Errani's 9 career singles titles have come on clay court - Rio De Janeiro 2015; Acapulco 2013; Palermo, Budapest, Barcelona, Acapulco in 2012; Palermo 2008...Anisimova is making 5th appearance at Rome, where her previous best result was reaching QF in 2022 (l. Sabalenka), which is also her best run at WTA 1000 events, along with QF run at Madrid 2022 (l. Alexandrova)...Anisimova owns 3-0 career record against players from Italy ...Anisimova has won all of her 13 meetings against a wildcard

Donna Vekic (CRO #37) vs. Lesia Tsurenko (UKR #44)

Tsurenko leads 2-1

Vekic is returning to Rome after reaching the 3r here last year (l. Swiatek)...Vekic is looking for her second win on clay in 2024 (d. Siegemund at Madrid)...Vekic lost two battles with her opponent today in 2023 (Indian Wells and Zhengzhou)...Tsurenko has not gone past the third round at a tournament in 2024 since Doha...Tsurenko reached the third round at Rome last year, defeating Elina Svitolina and Bernada Pera en route...Tsurenko's sole win on clay this year came at the Billie Jean King Cup qualifiers, where she defeated Ana Bogdan 2-1

CAREER MILESTONES

- Played 2022 Tokyo in September before taking a 15 month break to give birth to daughter Shai in early July 2023.

In 2022 had success at Miami, where she fell to Swiatek in the final, her first final since the 2021 Australian Open. Also reached the semifinals at Melbourne 250 #1 (withdrew before semifinal with Kudermetova w/abdominal injury)

- Won 2021 Australian Open (d. Brady in F) to become first woman since Seles in the early 1990s to win each of her first four Grand Slam finals - is the 16th woman to win four or more majors in the Open Era
- At 2020 US Open, came from a set and a break down to Azarenka and win third Grand Slam title of career
- Also last season was R-Up at Western & Southern Open - withdrew w/left hamstring injury before final against Azarenka
- Won second Grand Slam at Australian Open (d. Kvitova in F); became first Japanese player to reach World No.1 ranking following the tournament
- In addition, won back-to-back titles for first time in her career at Osaka (d. Pavlyuchenkova in F) and Beijing (d. Barty in F); defeated No.1 Barty in Beijing final for second career victory over world No.1 (also beat Halep at 2018 Indian Wells)
- Enjoyed break-out season in 2018, posting a 40-20 record resulting in a No.5 (first Top 10 season), up from No.68 in 2017
- Won the first two titles of her career in 2018, at Indian Wells (d. Kasatkina in F) and debut Grand Slam crown at US Open (d. S.Williams in F)
- En route to the Indian Wells title, defeated five-time major champion Sharapova, and A.Radwanska, Ka.Pliskova and Halep. Only set dropped all fortnight was against Sakkari in R16
- Reached one further final in 2018, at Tokyo [PPO] (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- In reaching R16 at 2018 Australian Open, became youngest Japanese player to reach R16 at a Slam since Sugiyama at 1995 Roland Garros (19y, 342d) and the youngest player from Japan to reach R16 in Melbourne since Date in 1990 (19y, 122d)
- Book-ended 2017 season with QF showings at Auckland and Hong Kong; other highlights included 3r runs at Wimbledon and US Open
- Scored first Top 5 win of career when she defeated No.5 V.Williams at 2017 Hong Kong. Upset win over defending champion and No.6-

- In 2023, finished R-Up at Lausanne for second time in career (l. Cocciaretto); advanced to SF at Strasbourg (l. Svitolina) and Monastir (l. Mertens) and QF at Palermo (l. Sorribes Tormo); reached 3r at US Open for second year in a row (l. Sabalenka); ended season by capturing first WTA 125 title at Angers (d. Paquet in F), afterwards setting new ranking high of No.51
- Highlight of 2022 season was run through qualifying to 3r at US Open (l. Sabalenka)
- Reached maiden WTA final at 2021 Lausanne (l. Zidansek)
- Also in 2021, advanced to QF at Lyon and made 2r three times (including at Wimbledon). Won second and third ITF Circuit title of her career, on home soil in France at \$60k ITF/Saint-Gaudens and \$25k ITF/Cherbourg-en-Cotentin
- Made 3r at 2020 Roland Garros (as WC, d. Rus and Juvan, l. Zhang); at 19 years and six months old, was the youngest Frenchwoman to reach the third round on home soil since an 18-year-old Cornet did so in 2008
- Won first tour-level match during 2r showing at 2020 Strasbourg (as WC, d. Bondarenko, l. Zhang)
- Made Grand Slam main draw debut during 2019 season, falling 1r at Australian Open (as WC, l. No.23 Suarez Navarro). Also in 2019 finished R-Up at \$15k ITF/Monastir-TUN
- In May 2019 she underwent wrist surgery that ended her season
- In terms of ranking, best career win came over No.67 Rus at 2020 Roland Garros
- Highlight of 2018 season was R-Up finish at \$25k ITF/Clermont-Ferrand-FRA. Also contested qualifying at Roland Garros
- Owns one ITF Circuit singles title
- Selected as an alternate in the French Fed Cup team for the 2018 first round tie against Belgium
- Made debut on tour with qualifying exit at \$25k ITF/Saint-Malo-FRA
- Enjoyed a stellar junior career reaching two Slam finals (Australian and US Opens in 2018), winning a silver medal at the 2018 Youth Olympics in Buenos Aires and rising to World No.1 on October 29, 2018

ranked Kerber at 2017 US Open marked first career Top 10 win

- Voted 2016 WTA Newcomer of the Year; highlight was career-first WTA final at Tokyo [PPO] (l. Wozniacki). Also reached QF on three occasions and 3r at Australian Open, Roland Garros and US Open
- Ranked No.406, made WTA main draw debut at 2014 Stanford. As an alternate, won through qualifying (achieving first WTA qualifying wins), and came from match point down to shock No.19 Stosur in 1r of main draw, before losing to No.18 Petkovic in 2r
- Made WTA qualifying debut at Québec City in 2013 (l. Dabrowski)

- Father is from Haiti, mother is from Japan; older sister is Mari (also played tennis)
- Was born in Osaka, Japan, and moved to USA when she was three years old
- Hobbies include fashion, gaming and photography

- Currently coached by Victor Prezelin; Started working with previous coach Alexia Dechaume in summer of 2019; also works with Thierry Champion
- Mother is Stephanie, father is Vincent and sisters are Lola and Jade
- Started playing tennis aged six; favorite surface is hard and favorite shot is forehand
- Away from the court likes listening to all types music, spending time with family and friends
