Swiatek leads 2-0

During Rome, Swiatek will be spending her 102nd and 103rd atop the WTA Rankings; she holds a 3,412 point advantage over No.2 ranked Aryna Sabalenka... This is Pera's third career meeting against the reigning WTA World No.1... Pera owns two career Top 10 wins, including a win over No.2 ranked Anett Kontaveit on clay at 2022 Hamburg... Last week, Swiatek won her 20th career singles title at Madrid (9th at WTA 1000)... Swiatek's last loss on clay to a qualifier came at 2020 Rome (I. Rus); Swiatek lost to a qualifier (Kalinskaya) in Dubai earlier this year – her first loss to a qualifier since 2020 Rome... Swiatek's last loss to a player ranked No.77 or lower came at 2021 Miami (I. No.338 ranked Konjuh); she has won 45-straight vs. players ranked No.77 or lower

Frech is making second appearance at Rome, where she previously reached 2r in 2023 (I. Keys)... Gauff has won 29 of her last 31 matches against players outside the Top 30, dating back to 2023 Wimbledon... A win for Frech today would mark first her Top 10 victory (0-12 vs. Top 10)

Osaka is making fifth appearance at Rome, where her best result is QF run in 2019 (I. Bertens)... Kostyuk is making fourth appearance at Rome, where her previous and best result was making 3r in 2023 (I. Badosa)... Kostyuk's best result on clay came earlier this season at Stuttgart where she was R-Up (I. Rybakina)... Osaka owns 7-4 record against players from Ukraine, with a record in 2024 standing at 1-0 (d .Svitolina in Miami)... Best result by Ukrainian player at Rome was title runs by Elina Svitolina in 2017 and 2018... This time last year Kostyuk was ranked No.40; she is playing this week at a career-high ranking of No.20

CAREER MILESTONES

- Breakthrough year in 2023, achieving runner-up twice; Adelaide 1 (as qualifier, l. Sabalenka) and Prague (l. Hibino). Also reached quarterfinals at Lyon (l. Osorio) and 3r at Indian Wells (l. Gauff) and Cincinnati (as qualifier, l. Gauff). Broke into Top 40 on October 9, 2023.
- Made Top-100 debut on August 1, 2022, following SF run at Prague (l. eventual champion Bouzkova); overtook Gauff at the youngest player in Top 100
- Also reached 2r at Tallinn (as qualifier, l. Haddad Maia) and fell 1r at both Roland Garros (as qualifier, l. Raducanu) and US Open (as qualifier, l. Bouzkova). On ITF Circuit, lifted fifth and sixth titles at this level, winning W60 tournament in Croissy-Beaubourg, France and W100 event in Versmold, Germany
- Finished 2021 campaign with 38-9 win-loss record, winning four ITF Circuit titles, including at W60 event in Prerov, Czech Republic
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2020 Prague
- On ITF Circuit, owns six titles in singles and one in doubles
- As a junior, won 2021 girls' singles at Roland Garros.

- Made Grand Slam main draw debut in 2023 reaching 2r at Australian Open (l. Gracheva) and 1r at US Open (l. Kontaveit); also reached QF at Warsaw (l. Siegemund) and Monastir (l. Burel).
- In 2020, only outing at a WTA event was exit in qualifying at Hua Hin, while best result on ITF Circuit was QF run at \$25K ITF/Figueira de Foz-POR in September
- In 2019, lost three meetings with Top-100 ranked opponents, No.70 Zidansek (7-5 6-3 at 2019 Rome qualifying), No.98 Maria (6-4 6-4 at 2019 \$80K ITF/Poitiers-FRA) and No.19 Rybakina (6-1 6-3 at Abu Dhabi)
- Won second and most recent career ITF Circuit title at \$15K ITF/Monastir-TUN at the end of 2019
- Rose to ranking of No.390 by end of 2019
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Rome
- Posted 45-27 win-loss record in 2018, reaching two ITF Circuit finals and ending campaign ranked No.407 – her first year-end finish inside Top 500
- Opened 2016 season by lifting first ITF Circuit title at \$25K ITF/Hammamet-TUN

- Played first matches of career on ITF Circuit in Italy in 2014

IGA SWIATEK BERNARDA PERA

CAREER MILESTONES

- Won six titles across 2023, including winning fourth Grand Slam title at Roland-Garros (d. Muchova in F) and going undefeated at the WTA Finals in Cancun (d. Pegula in F). Finished season as WTA World No.1 player for second consecutive year.
- In 2022, lifted second and third Grand Slam titles, at Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F) and US Open (d. Jabeur in F)
- Triumph in Paris was the last of six straight titles during 37-match winning streak - jointlongest unbeaten run on Tour since 1990
- Won two titles in 2021, at Adelaide and Rome.
 Other highlights included QF at Roland-Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage)
- Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland-Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, I. Krejcikova/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland-Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland man or woman to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since A.Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland-Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland-Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media.
 Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award
- Ended 2019 season ranked No.61 after a campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Lugano (l. Hercog) and R16 run at Roland-Garros (l. Halep). That year also reached 3r at Toronto (l. Osaka) and made 2r five times (incl. Australian and US Open)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.88 after R-Up finish at 2019 Lugano
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Auckland
- Ended 2018 season ranked No.175 (up from No.690 in 2017), after posting 42-6 record and winning four titles on ITF Circuit
