MATCH NOTES - DAY 5 - SATURDAY, MAY 11, 2024

[1] Iga Swiatek (POL #1) vs Yulia Putintseva (KAZ #41)

During Rome, Swiatek will be spending her 102nd and 103rd atop the WTA Rankings; she holds a 3,412 point advantage over No.2 ranked Aryna Sabalenka... Swiatek has won the previous three meetings, all in straight-sets... Swiatek won her 20th career singles title (9th at WTA 1000 level) last week in Madrid; the last time a player won Rome and Madrid in the same year was 2013 (Serena Williams)... Since the format's introduction in 2009, Swiatek (87.5%, 28-4) only trails Serena Williams (88%, 44-6) for winning percentage on clay at WTA-1000 events... In her previous seven WTA-1000 main draws on clay, Swiatek has only been eliminated before the R16 once, losing to Arantxa Rus - Rome R64 2020... Swiatek has won her past 24 matches against opponents ranked outside the WTA Top 10 on clay, with her last such defeat coming to Caroline Garcia - Warsaw QF 2022; of those 24 victories, 19 have come in straight sets... Swiatek (31) is one of two players on the WTA Tour with 30+ match wins so far this year, along with Elena Rybakina (30-5)... Putintseva holds a career winloss record of 4-12 on clay against WTA top 10 opponents, with her last win coming against Qinwen Zheng at 2024 Madrid... Putintseva could become only the second Asian player in the past four decades to defeat the WTA World No.1 on clay after compatriot Elena Rybakina, whose victories both came against Iga Swiatek... Since the start of the 2020 season, Yulia Putintseva is 3-17 against opponents ranked in the WTA Top 10

[3] Coco Gauff (USA #3) vs [LL] J. Cristian (ROU #68)

For the second consecutive tournament, Gauff has a chance to move to WTA World No.2 this week but will need to reach at least the semifinals to have a chance at moving to No.2... With a win, Gauff could surpass Caroline Wozniacki (14) for the outright most WTA-1000 match wins on clay before turning 21, since the format's introduction in 2009... Since losing to Sofia Kenin in the opening round at Wimbledon last year, Coco Gauff has won 16 consecutive matches against opponents ranked outside the Top 50 (with 13 coming in straight sets)... Gauff holds a career win-loss record of 6-1 against lucky losers at WTA events on clay... Since the WTA 1000 introduction in 2009, only four American players could have more WTA-1000 wins on clay than Coco Gauff - Serena Williams (44), Venus Williams (23), Sloane Stephens and Madison Keys (20 each)... Since 2009, only two lucky losers have defeated a Top 5 opponent at a WTA-1000 event, after Madison Keys (Li Na in Madrid 2013) and Beatriz Haddad Maia (Karolina Pliskova in Indian Wells 2021)... Cristian is 0-4 against opponents ranked in the Top 10, with all four of those prior defeats coming on hard court

[10] Daria Kasatkina (#11) vs Naomi Osaka (JPN #173)

Osaka won the only previous meetings against Kasatkina at 2018 Indian Wells final... Kasatkina is 1-4 in 2024 against former Grand Slam Champions - with only win against Sloane Stephens in Indian Wells... Kasatkina lost her last six clay court meetings against former Grand Slam Champions - her last such win was back at the Roland Garros 2018, against Caroline Wozniacki... With a win, Kasatkina could make the R16 at Rome for the 7th time in her career - the sixth time over the last seven years (she lost in R64 in 2021 to Jessica Pegula)... In the previous round against Marta Kostyuk, Osaka claimed her first career victory on clay over an opponent ranked in the WTA's top 20 (previously 0-8 on the surface)... Osaka has claimed consecutive wins at a single WTA event on clay for the first time since 2012 Roland Garros in 2019... With a win, Osaka could win three matches in a single clay court WTA event for the third time in her career after Stuttgart 2017 and Madrid 2019... Only Elena Rybakina (121) has made more aces in WTA-1000 events this season than Osaka (95).

[28] Sorana Cirstea (ROU #32) vs. [6] Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #6)

Cirstea is making seventh appearance at Rome, where her best result is R16 run in 2012... Vondrousova is making fifth appearance at Rome, where her best result was SF run in 2020... Cirstea owns 21 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently over No.8 Marketa Vondrousova at Dubai 2024... Vondrousova best career result on clays is R-Up at Roland Garros and Istanbul 2019... Best result by Romania player at Rome was title run by Simona Halep in 2020... Best result by Czech player at Rome was title run by Karolina Pliskova in 2019

[29] Linda Noskova (CZE #29) vs. [7] Qinwen Zheng (CHN #7)

Noskova is playing this week ranked No.29; she reached a career-high of No.28 earlier this year (week of Feb 11, 2024)... Noskova is the highest ranked teenager... Zheng is making second appearance at Rome, where her best result was QF run in 2023 (I.Kudermetova)... Noskova is making second appearance at Rome... Noskova's best career result on clay came earlier this season at Stuttgart 2024 where she reached R16 (I.Raducanu)... Zheng owns 26 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently No.29 Sorana Cirstea at Stuttgart 2024... Noskova owns six wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.10 Jelena Ostapenko at Stuttgart 2024... Zheng is the only player from China to reach 3r



- After first-round bye, beat Bernarda Pera in second-round opener on Thursday
- Faces No.41 Yulia Putintseva on clay for the first time today; 2nd meeting between the two this season. Is a perfect 6-0 in sets vs. Putintseva
- Has won 8 of her 20 career titles on clay: Madrid in 2024; Roland Garros, Stuttgart in 2023; Roland Garros, Rome, Stuttgart in 2022; Rome in 2021; Roland Garros in 2020
- Trying to become the first three-time champion in Rome since 4-time champion Serena Williams (2002, 2013, 2014, 2016)
- Trying to become the 3rd woman to sweep Madrid and Rome, after Dinara Safina (2009) and Serena Williams (2013)
- Bidding for her 10th career WTA 1000 title. Has won 31% (9/29) of WTA 1000 main draws entered

 the highest percentage of any player sincethe format's introduction in 2009
- Will spend her 102nd and 103rd weeks at No.1 during Rome; this time last year was ranked No.1
- Is No.1 seed this week; has been top seed at 34 tournaments in her career
- During last year's European clay swing, won third Roland Garros, QF at Rome, RUP at Madrid, won second Stuttgart title
- Is currently on a 7-match winning streak after winning Madrid last week
- Has won 31 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.1 on tour for match wins and tied for No.1 in titles (3 - tied with Rybakina)
- Has been involved in 7 three-set matches in 2024, with a 5-2 record
- Winner of today's match will face either Angelique Kerber or Aliaksandra Sasnovich in 4R

- Won her second title in 2024 after defeating Sakkari in the final at WTA 1000 Indian Wells

- Won her first title of the 2024 season after defeating Rybakina at Doha
- Made 3r at Australian Open (l. Noskova)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Won six titles across 2023, including winning fourth Grand Slam title at Roland-Garros (d. Muchova in F) and going undefeated at the WTA Finals in Cancun (d. Pegula in F). Finished season as WTA World No.1 player for second consecutive year.
- In 2022, lifted second and third Grand Slam titles, at Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F) and US Open (d. Jabeur in F)
- Triumph in Paris was the last of six straight titles during 37-match winning streak joint-longest unbeaten run on Tour since 1990
- Won two titles in 2021, at Adelaide and Rome. Other highlights included QF at Roland-Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage)
- Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland-Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, l. Krejcikova/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland-Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland - man or woman - to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since A.Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland-Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland-Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media. Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award
- Ended 2019 season ranked No.61 after a campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Lugano (l. Hercog) and R16 run at Roland-Garros (l. Halep). That year also reached 3r at Toronto (l. Osaka) and made 2r five times (incl. Australian and US Open)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.88 after R-Up finish at 2019 Lugano
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Auckland
- Ended 2018 season ranked No.175 (up from No.690 in 2017), after posting 42-6 record and winning four titles on ITF Circuit
- Member of Poland's Billie Jean King Cup team, 2018-20, 2021-22
- On professional debut, came through qualifying to win title at \$10k ITF/Stockholm-SWE in 2016; owns seven singles titles at this level

- 2023 saw Putintseva reach SF at Guangzhou (l. Linette) and QF at Rabat (l. Riera) and Hobart (l. Blinkova)
- Reached two SFs in 2022, at Istanbul (l. eventual champion Potapova) and Budapest (l. Krunic), while made QF at Toronto (l. Pegula)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was lifting second career title, at Budapest (d. Kalinina in F)
- Also last season was R-Up at Nur-Sultan (l. Van Uytvanck), advanced to SF at Portoroz and made QFs at Charleston [500], Strasbourg and San Jose
- Recorded 300th career win (at all levels) with 1r triumph over Flipkens at 2020 Roland Garros
- Standout results of 2020 were QF runs at US Open (l. Brady) - first Kazakh woman to reach last eight in New York - and Rome (l. Halep)
- Owns one win over a reigning World No.1, upsetting Osaka on grass at 2019 Birmingham
- Won first career title at 2019 Nürnberg (d. Zidansek in F); afterwards rose to No.28 in rankings - one spot off career best No.27 (achieved February 6, 2017)
- Best result of 2018 was QF run at Roland Garros (l. Keys)
- Reached maiden WTA final in 2017 at St Petersburg (l. Mladenovic) after notching two Top 10 wins over No.8 Kuznetsova and No.5 Cibulkova - first over a Top 5 player - (l. Mladenovic in F); first woman from Kazakhstan to reach a WTA final since Shvedova at 2015 Bogotá (l. Pereira)
- Rose to new career-high ranking of No.27 on February 6, 2017 following St Petersburg
- In 2016 became first Kazakh to reach the quarterfinals at Roland Garros - or at any major - since Shvedova in 2012, eventually losing to S.Williams in 3s
- Defeated No.14 V.Williams en route to first Premier-level quarterfinal of career at 2016 Charleston
- First Top 10 win came over No.10 Petkovic at 2015 Nürnberg (via ret.)
- Progressed to maiden WTA SF at 2015 Bastad (l. eventual champion Larsson)
- In 2014, reached first two WTA QFs, first on clay at Bastad (as qualifier, l. Cepelova) and then on hard at Osaka (l. eventual champion Stosur). Between these two results, scored first Top 20 win - over No.14 Pennetta - during run through qualifying to 2r at Montréal
- Made it through to 2r on Grand Slam main draw debut at 2013 Australian Open (d. McHale, l. Suárez Navarro)

- Enjoyed stellar junior career, including winning girls' singles at 2018 Wimbledon (d. Küng in F) and leading Poland to Junior Fed Cup in 2016
- Advanced to 2r on WTA main draw debut at 2012 Copenhagen (as WC, d. Barbat, l. Jankovic)
- On ITF Circuit, winner of six singles titles and six doubles titles




