MATCH NOTES QUARTERFINALS (TOP HALF) TUESDAY, MAY 14, 2024

[1] Iga Swiatek (POL #1) vs. [18] Madison Keys (USA #16)

Swiatek leads 3-1

Keys is making her 10th main draw appearance at Rome, and is through to her second QF here, and first since R-Up finish in 2016 (I. S.Williams)... **Keys** owns a 1-6 record against the reigning WTA World No.1, defeating Swiatek at 2022 Cincinnati... Defeats came to Swiatek at 2024 Madrid along with S.Williams (three times), Kerber (2016 WTA Finals in Singapore) and Barty (2018 Rome)... During Rome, **Swiatek** will be spending her 102nd and 103rd atop the WTA Rankings; she holds a 3,412 point advantage over No.2 ranked Aryna Sabalenka... **Swiatek** won her 20th career singles title (and 9th at WTA 1000 level) a fortnight ago in Madrid; the last time a player won Rome and Madrid in the same year was 2013 (Serena Williams)... **Swiatek** is through to her fourth consecutive Rome QFs (won the title in 2021-22 and made last eight in 2023)... All eight quarterfinalists are ranked inside WTA Top 25 for the first time at Rome since 2004... Across all WTA 1000 tournaments it is the 14th time that all eight quarterfinalists are ranked inside the Top 25, and the first time on clay at a WTA 1000 event...

[3] Coco Gauff (USA #3) vs. [7] Zheng Qinwen (CHN #7)

First meeting

Zheng is through to her second Rome QF, having made this stage last year (I. Kudermetova)... Zheng is bidding to reach the SF of a WTA 1000 event for the first time (also made QF at 2022 Toronto)... Zheng's maiden singles title came on clay at 2023 Palermo... Zheng is currently ranked at a career-high No.7 (first achieved in Jan 2024); this time last year was ranked No.21... Gauff is the fourth American to register 10+ wins at the Italian Open before turning 21 in the Open Era along with Chris Evert, Serena Williams and Venus Williams... Following her R16 comeback win over Badosa, Gauff has equaled Caroline Wozniacki (60) for the most wins in WTA-1000 events before turning 21 since the format was introduced in 2009... Gauff has now has reached the quarterfinal at WTA 1000 tournaments 13 times, the most at the level among players before turning 21...

- Making 5th main draw appearance at ROME, where she is a two-time champion, lifting the title in 2021 (d. Ka.Pliskova in F) and 2022 (d. Jabeur in F)
- Overall is through to her fourth Rome QF, having reached this stage last year as well (l. Rybkaina via ret.)
- Has beaten Bernarda Pera, Yulia Putintseva and Angelique Kerber to extend winning streak to nine matches, having also won Madrid (six wins) prior to Rome
- Faces No.16 Madison Keys in QF today in a rematch of the Madrid SF, which Swiatek won in straight sets and dropped only four games
- Undefeated aginst players from USA in 2024 (6-0), with last loss to a USA woman coming to Gauff at 2023 Cincinnati
- Is an 8 time clay court champion (among 20 titles overall): MADRID in 2024; ROLAND GARROS, STUTTGART in 2023; ROLAND GARROS, ROME, STUTTGART in 2022; ROME in 2021; ROLAND GARROS in 2020
- Is No. 1 seed this week; has been top seed at 34 tournaments in her career
- · Only player from Poland to reach QF
- During last year's EUROPEAN CLAY swing won Stuttgart and Roland-Garros, reached QF at ROME, and was R-UP at MADRID
- Has won 28 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.2 on tour for match wins, behind Elena Rybakina

- Having made the SF in Madrid, it marks the first time she's made back to back QFs since Wimbledon and Washington DC in summer 2023
- Owns ten match wins in 2024 seven of which have come at Madrid and Rome
- Faces No.1 Iga Swiatek in QF today; owns a 1-6 record against the reigning WTA World No.1, defeating Swiatek at 2022 Cincinnati...
- Defeats came to Swiatek at 2024 Madrid along with S.Williams (three times), Kerber (2016 WTA Finals) and Barty (2018 Rome)
- Owns 8-8 career record against players from Poland, with record in 2024 standing at 0-1
- Owns one clay court title, at CHARLESTON in 2019

CAREER MILESTONES

- Won six titles across 2023, including winning fourth Grand Slam title at Roland-Garros (d. Muchova in F) and going undefeated at the WTA Finals in Cancun (d. Pegula in F). Finished season as WTA World No.1 player for second consecutive year.
- In 2022, lifted second and third Grand Slam titles, at Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F) and US Open (d. Jabeur in F)
- Triumph in Paris was the last of six straight titles during 37-match winning streak - jointlongest unbeaten run on Tour since 1990
- Won two titles in 2021, at Adelaide and Rome.
 Other highlights included QF at Roland-Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage)
- Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland-Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, l. Krejcikova/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland-Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland man or woman to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since A.Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland-Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland-Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media. Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award
- Ended 2019 season ranked No.61 after a campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Lugano (l. Hercog) and R16 run at Roland-Garros (l. Halep). That year also reached 3r at Toronto (l. Osaka) and made 2r five times (incl. Australian and US Open)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.88 after R-Up finish at 2019 Lugano
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Auckland
- Ended 2018 season ranked No.175 (up from No.690 in 2017), after posting 42-6 record and winning four titles on ITF Circuit
- Member of Poland's Billie Jean King Cup team, 2018-20, 2021-22
- On professional debut, came through qualifying to win title at \$10k ITF/Stockholm-SWE in 2016; owns seven singles titles at this level

- In 2023, won seventh career title at Eastbourne (d. Kasatkina in F), reached SF at US Open and reached four QFs including Wimbledon; also qualified for WTA Elite Trophy in Zhuhai (0-2 in group play)
- At 2022 Adelaide, won first title in over two years (d. Riske in F), followed by SF run at Australian Open - best Slam showing since 2018
- Other highlights in 2022 were SF at Cincinnati and two further QF runs, including at Indian Wells
- In Grand Slam play, 2021 season was highlighted by R16 run at Wimbledon (l. Golubic). Finished campaign inside Top 100 for ninth successive year, but outside Top 20 for first time since 2014
- Ended 2020 ranked No.16, with best result being R-Up finish at Brisbane (l. Ka. Pliskova)
- Lifted biggest title of career during 2019 season at WTA 1000 Cincinnati (d. Kuznetsova in F); afterwards returned to Top 10 for first time since week of June 25, 2018
- Also won title at Charleston (d. Wozniacki) and reached QF at 2019 Roland Garros (l. Barty), one of three Americans to make last eight (also Anisimova and Stephens) - the first time since 2004 (Capriati, S.Williams and V.Williams) Reached three SFs in 2018 at Charleston, Roland Garros and US Open
- Reached first Grand Slam final in 2017 at US Open, losing to Sloane Stephens in 10th all-American final in the Open Era. At 22, became the youngest Flushing Meadows finalist since 19-year-old Caroline Wozniacki lost to Kim Clijsters in 2009 Also in 2017, won third WTA title at Stanford (d. Vandeweghe)
- Enjoyed first Top-10 year-end finish in 2016 (at No.8), was youngest player in Top 20; won second title at Birmingham (d. Strycova) and reached final at Rome (l. S.Williams) and Montreal (l. Halep)
- Broke into Top 10 on June 20 as first American to make Top-10 debut since S.Williams in 1999
- Made WTA Finals debut at Singapore in 2016, going 1-2 in round-robin play
- Represented USA at 2016 Rio Olympics, reaching SF (l. Bronze medal match to Petra Kvitova)
- Qualified for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai in 2015, 2018-19; went 1-1 in round-robin stage on all three appearances, with best result SF run in 2018 (withdrew before match vs. Muguruza w/left knee injury)
- Advanced to maiden major SF at 2015 Australian Open (l. eventual champion S.Williams); broke

 Enjoyed stellar junior career, including winning girls' singles at 2018 Wimbledon (d. Küng in F) and leading Poland to Junior Fed Cup in 2016

- into Top 20 following conclusion of tournament, on February 2
- Also in 2015, reached second career title at Charleston (l. Kerber) and reached QF at Wimbledon
- Won first career title at 2014 Eastbourne (d. No.9 Kerber in F); was second-youngest player to win a WTA title in 2014, (after Vekic at Kuala Lumpur); also, youngest American to win a title since Vania King in October 2006 (17y 254d at Bangkok)
- Broke into Top 100 at beginning of 2013 season and finished the year No.39; highlights were SF at Osaka, QFs at Sydney, Charleston and Birmingham and 3r at Australian Open and Wimbledon
- Earned first Top 20 win over No.17 Lucie Safarova while ranked No.135 at 2013 Sydney; then earned first Top 10 win over No.5 Na Li as LL at Madrid
- In 2012, reached 2r at Miami and played main draw at Australian Open, Memphis and Cincinnati; also won two titles on ITF circuit
- Earned first Grand Slam win at 2011 US Open (d. Craybas, l. Safarova in 2r), also played main draw at Miami and contested qualifying at Indian Wells
- Won first title on ITF circuit at 2010 \$10k/ITF Cleveland, OH, USA; also contested qualifying at US Open in 2010 Member of USA's Billie Jean King Cup team in 2014, 2016, 2018-19, 2022
- Made professional debut in 2009 and Tour-level debut at 2009 Ponte Vedra Beach (as WC, d. Kudryavtseva, l. No.10 Nadia Petrova); was seventh youngest player to win a WTA main draw match at 14y 48d and youngest since Hingis in 1994

- Coached by Tomasz Wiktorowski. previously worked with Piotr Sierzputowski
- Father is former Olympic rower Tomasz Swiatek, who competed in the men's quadruple sculls event at the 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul
- In summer 2022 organised 'Iga Swiatek and friends for Ukraine' event in Krakow, which featured a mixed doubles match between Agnieszka Radwanska, Sergiy Stakhovsky, Polish junior Martyn Pawelski and herself, and was attended by Poland's First Lady, Agata Kornhauser-Duda, Elina Svitolina and Andriy Shevchenko. The occasion was watched by almost 15,000 people live and a further one million on television, raising more than half a million Euros for Ukrainian children and teenagers affected by the war
- Started playing tennis because her older sister was playing and wanted to beat her
- Enjoys rock music, including AC/DC and Pink Floyd
- Includes PZU, On, Tecnifibre, Rolex and Xiaomi in her endorsement portfolio

- Mother is Christine; siblings are Sydney,
 Montana and Hunter. Was introduced to tennis
