- The Hologic WTA Tour returns to Rome. This will be the 80th edition of the Italian Open, and the 55th edition since the tournament became open to professional players in 1969. The tournament was not held in 1986.
- The singles main draw contains 96 players, including eight wild cards and 12 qualifiers. There will be 32 seeded players, all with first-round byes. The doubles main draw will have 32 teams, including three wild-card pairings.
- Chris Evert has won the most titles at the Italian Open, winning on five occasions. Conchita Martinez, Gabriela Sabatini and Serena Williams are the next best, winning the event on four occasions respectively.

- Serena Williams (44) has the most women's singles match wins at the Italian Open in the Open Era, with Conchita Martinez (43) registering the next most over that span.
- Serena Williams and Conchita Martinez (53 each) are the only two players in the Open Era to appear in 50+ women's singles matches at the Italian Open.
- Sara Errani will be making her 16th main draw appearance at the tournament, the most among those in the draw
- Chris Evert has made the most women's singles finals of any player in the Open Era at the Italian Open, holding a 5-2 record out of seven appearances. Gabriela Sabatini has made the next most over that span, holding a 4-2 record from six finals.
- At 16y 152d, Tracy Austin (1979) is the youngest player in the Open Era to win the women's singles at the Italian Open. Austin is one of seven U-18 players to win the event, along with Andrea Temesvari (1983), Manuela Maleeva (1984), Steffi Graf (1987), Gabriela Sabatini (1988), Monica Seles (1990) and Martina Hingis (1998).
- At 34y 230d, Serena Williams (2016) is the oldest player in the Open Era to win the women's singles at the Italian Open. Williams is the only player in that span to win the event after turning 30, doing so on three occasions – 2013, 2014 and 2016.
- Martina Navratilova has appeared in the most finals at the Italian Open without winning the event, losing in four respective finals 1974, 1975, 1990, 1994.
- Conchita Martinez is the only player male or female to win the Italian Open on four consecutive occasions in the history of the event, doing so between 1993 and 1996.
- Among players with 10+ women's singles matches at the event, Chris Evert holds the best winning percentage at 92.3%. Martina Hingis and Iga Swiatek (87.5%) share the next-best winning percentage in that span.
- Alize Cornet is the only qualifier to reach the women's singles final of the Italian Open in the Open Era, losing to Jelena Jankovic in the 2008 final. A wild card or lucky loser has not achieved this feat.
- Mary Pierce (1995) and Serena Williams (2010) are the only wild cards to reach the women's singles semifinal of the Italian Open in the Open Era, though the two were also seeded second and first in respective years.
- Iga Swiatek has won 31% (9/29) of WTA-1000 main draws entered the highest percentage of any player since the format's introduction in 2009.
- Iga Swiatek could become only the third player to win the Madrid and Italian Open in a single season after Dinara Safina (2009) and Serena Williams (2013), since the inauguration of the women's single event in Madrid in 2009.
- Since 2000, Elena Rybakina could become the sixth player to achieve back-to-back women's singles titles at the Italian Open after Amelie Mauresmo (2004-05), Jelena Jankovic (2007-08), Maria Sharapova (2011-12), Serena Williams (2013-14) and Iga Swiatek (2021-22).
- Since the format's introduction in 2009, Victoria Azarenka (200) is the only player to achieve 200 WTA-1000 match victories.
- Elena Rybakina (2023) and Simona Halep (2020) are the only two players to win women's singles finals at the Italian Open via retirement.




A SNAPSHOT OF 2024 SO FAR

- Rybakina (Brisbane, Abu Dhabi, Stuttgart) and Iga Swiatek (Doha, Indian Wells, Madrid) lead the Tour with three titles this year.
- Swiatek continues her reign atop the WTA Rankings. The weeks of Rome marks 102nd and 103rd week as WTA World No.1.
- Five times this year the No.1 seed and No.2 seed met head-to-head in a tournament final. During the entire 2023 season the No.1 seed and No.2 seed met in four finals.
- Qinwen Zheng made her Top 10 debut after the Australian Open (on Monday, January 29). She is the first Chinese woman to crack the Top 10 since Li Na (February 1, 2010).
- Five players made their Top 100 debut in 2024: Renata Zarazua (Jan 8), Maria Timofeeva (Jan 29), Brenda Fruhvirtova (Jan 29), Arina Rodionova (Feb 5), Erika Andreeva (Feb 19), Maria Lourdes Carle (Mar 4) and Hailey Baptiste (Mar 18), Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (Apr 15), Julia Riera (Apr 22)
