- The Hologic WTA Tour returns to clay courts for the 2024 season, with ten Top 20 players lining up for the 52nd • edition of the Credit One Charleston Open, including three also in the Top 10
- Headlining the field is American No.1 Jessica Pegula. After a first-round bye, she will take on the winner of Alize . Cornet versus Amanda Anisimova
- On the other side of the draw, defending champion Ons Jabeur is the No.2 seed. Her first match will be against . the newly crowned Miami champion Danielle Collins or former world No.2 Paula Badosa
- Rounding out the leading guartet of seeds are Indian Wells 2024 Runner-Up Maria Sakkari and 2017 Charleston winner Daria Kasatkina
- Among the wildcards in the field is former World No.1 and Charleston 2011 champion Caroline Wozniacki, who will take on a qualifier in her first match at Charleston since she finished R-Up in 2019 (I. Keys); Clervie

Ngounoue, the youngest player in main draw, is playing her third main draw event with a wildcard; She is meeting a qualifier in first round, looking to her first career main draw win, having failed in opening rounds at US Open 2023 and San Diego 2023

- Three other former Charleston champions are in the draw, Veronika Kudermetova (2021), Madison Keys (2019) and Sloane Stephens (2016)
- One to Watch Emma Navarro. After a stand-out 2023 season, the 22-year-old American continues to make breakthroughs in 2024. She started the season by reaching the SF at Auckland (I. eventual champion Gauff) then went on to claim her maiden WTA singles title at Hobart (d. defending Champion Mertens in F). Back on US soil, she has posted strong overall performances including a SF run at San Diego, her first career WTA-1000 QF showing at Indian Wells and R16 appearance at Miami, accumulating a total of 20 match wins which is the third most among all the WTA players, only second to Swiatek and Rybakina. She broke into Top 20 for the first time in her career on March 18, sitting at No.20.
