MATCH NOTES - DAY 1 - TUESDAY, AUGUST 6, 2024

Shelby Rogers (USA #379) vs. Elina Svitolina (UKR #34)

Fifth meeting between the pair... **Rogers** is looking for her first win since Rome 2024 (d. Pigato in 1r before losing to Zheng in 2r) **Rogers** is competing in just the seventh main draw of her 2024 season... **Rogers'** best result at Toronto came during a 3r run in 2014 (I. Wozniacki)... **Svitolina** is a former champion here, winning the title in 2017 (d. Wozniacki in final)... All four of **Svitolina's** wins over Rogers have come on hard courts... **Svitolina** has won 21 matches on Tour this season

[12] Victoria Azarenka (#19) vs. Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (#29)

Azarenka has won six of their eight meetings, including their most recent clash at 2023 Dubai...Azarenka is making her 12th appearance at the tournament, where she is a three-time semifinalist (2008, 2010 and 2011)...Azarenka has won 26 tour-level matches this season, tied for ninth-best on tour...Pavlyuchenkova is making her 11th main-draw showing at the event and her first appearance since 2021...Nine of Pavlyuchenkova's 12 WTA singles titles have come on hard court...Since the WTA 1000 tier began in 2009, Pavlyuchenkova has contested more WTA 1000 events than any player on tour (this is her 111th), while Azarenka has the most WTA 1000 match-wins on tour (203)

[WC] Bianca Andreescu (CAN #175) vs. Lesia Tsurenko (UKR #85)

2019 Toronto champion **Andreescu** is playing her first hard-court match of the season and first hard-court tournament since Montreal 2023... **Andreescu** shut down her 2023 season after Montreal last summer due to back injury; returned to competition at 2024 Roland Garros... In June, **Andreescu** made first final in two years on the grass at s'-Hertogenbosch... **Andreescu** is coming off Paris 2024 Olympics, where she lost to eventual silver medalist Donna Vekic in Round 2... **Andreescu** became Canada's first Grand Slam singles champion, male or female, at 2019 US Open... **Tsurenko** is 3-0 across all levels against Andreescu, with two losses coming via retirement (2023 Hua Hin, 2018 Billie Jean King Cup)... **Tsurenko** posted best result in her tournament debut in 2015, where she made QF as a qualifier... **Tsurenko** is bidding for her first win since Rome 1R

[Q] Greet Minnen (BEL #74) vs. Sloane Stephens (USA #47)

Stephens was a 2017 semifinalist in Toronto and 2019 finalist in Montreal... **Stephens** won first title in two years on the clay at Rouen in the spring... **Stephens** comes into Toronto having lost 8 of last 10 matches...**Stephens** is one of 14 Americans in the main draw, the most in Toronto since 1992... **Minnen** bidding for her first win over Stephens... **Minnen** came through qualifying with wins over Timea Babos and Destanee Aiava

Tatjana Maria (GER #67) vs. [11] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #20)

Maria is seeking her ninth career win over a Top 20 player and her first since back-to-back Top 20 victories over Maria Sakkari and Jelena Ostapenko at 2022 Wimbledon...**Maria** is the only German in this week's main draw...**Kostyuk** is seeking her first match-win at this event, losing to Zheng Qinwen in her tournament debut last year...**Kostyuk** is one of four Ukrainians in this week's main draw, including 2017 champion Elina Svitolina...**Kostyuk** reached the Olympic quarterfinals last week and held match point against eventual silver medalist Donna Vekic

CAREER MILESTONES

- The 2023 season saw Rogers reach the QF at Abu Dhabi (l. eventual champion Bencic) and the R16 at Charleston (l. Bencic); ended her season early due to injury, with her last match coming at Wimbledon (l. Rybakina in opening round)
- In 2022, finished R-Up at San Jose (l. Kasatkina). Also reached the SF at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Sabalenka) and QF at Adelaide 1 (l. Rybakina)
- Enjoyed most consistent campaign of her career in 2021, reaching QFs at Yarra Valley Classic, Adelaide, Charleston [250] and Indian Wells. Also made R16 at Australian Open and US Open
- Broke into Top 50 for the first time on March 1, 2021, following QF showing at Adelaide
- In 2020 reached SF at Lexington (d. S.Williams in 2r, l. Teichmann) and QF at US Open (d. Kvitova, l. eventual champion Osaka) - marked second career Slam QF appearance (also 2016 Roland Garros)
- In 2019, made return from injury at Charleston where she reached 2r (l. Ostapenko). Also posted 2r showings at Roland Garros and Mallorca and fell 1r six occasions and reached one ITF Circuit final
- Fell 1r in only two tournaments played in 2018 at Australian Open and Indian Wells - injured left knee in loss to Dolehide at Indian Wells, requiring surgery in the summer
- Highlights of 2017 were QFs at Charleston, Hobart and Strasbourg. Also, played all three ties to help USA win its first Fed Cup in 17 years, winning decisive doubles rubber (w/Vandeweghe) in final against Belarus
- In 2017 US Open 2r, d. No.25 seed Gavrilova 7-6(6), 4-6, 7-6(5), in a match that took 3 hours, 33 minutes, setting a record for the longest women's match in US Open history
- Appeared in two WTA singles finals, at 2016 Rio de Janeiro (l. Schiavone) and at 2014 Bad Gastein (d. No.16 Suárez Navarro and No.14 Errani en route, l.Petkovic)
- One-time doubles runner-up, at 2015 Bogotá (w/Falconi)
- Participated in 2014 WTA Finals Rising Stars Invitational in Singapore (along with Diyas, Puig and Zheng)
- Broke into Top 100 for first time on August 11, 2014
- Won first WTA level match at 2013 Strasbourg (d. Domachowska)
- Winner of five singles titles and two doubles titles on ITF Circuit, where she made

- Returned to the Tour in April 2023, following birth of daughter Skaï. Won Strasbourg (d. Blinkova) for a second time (also in 2020) before achieving Grand Slam results of QF at Roland Garros (l. Sabalenka) and SF at Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)
- 2022 season reached 3r at Australian Open (l. Azarenka) and QF at Monterrey (l. Osorio), before going on maternity leave in spring
- Highlight of 2021 was lifting 16th career title at Chicago [250]. Also made SF at Miami, Stuttgart and the Olympics (won bronze medal)
- Won her 14th and 15th titles in 2020, firstly at Monterrey (d. Bouzkova in F) and then Strasbourg (d. Rybakina in F)
- Contested her 30th consecutive major at 2020 Australian Open (streak broke by skipping 2020 US Open). Is a two-time semifinalist at Grand Slam level, at 2019 Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Halep) and 2019 US Open (l. S.Williams). Became the first woman from Ukraine to reach a major SF; on the men's, Medvedev made that stage at Roland Garros in 1993 (SF) and 1999 (R-Up)
- Highlight of 2019 was reaching the title match as defending champion at the Shiseido WTA Finals (l. Barty)
- In 2018, won 13th and most prestigious career title at 2018 WTA Finals (d. Stephens in F), after going 3-0 during round robin stage. Ended year ranked No.4. Also won titles at Rome (as defending champion, d. No.1 Halep in F), Dubai (as defending champion, d. Kasatkina in F) and Brisbane (d. Sasnovich in F)
- Enjoyed standout 2017, finishing year at No.6, winning a tour-leading five titles and posting second-most wins (53, behind Wozniacki with 60). Season culminated by qualifying for WTA Finals in Singapore, becoming first Ukrainian woman to qualify for the season-ending tournament in singles (fell at round robin stage with 1-2 record)
- In 2017, became first player to win three Premier 5 titles in a single season (Dubai, Rome, Toronto), since such tournaments were introduced in 2009
- One of five players to make Top 10 debut in 2017, after winning Dubai in February (also Ostapenko, Garcia, Mladenovic and Vandeweghe). Peaked in rankings at No.3 on September 11, 2017
- On four occasions could have reached World No.1 - at 2017 US Open, then needed to win 2017 Beijing (fell QF), then needed to triumph at 2017

- End to 2016 season also saw her reach first SF at Premier Mandatory level at Beijing (l. A.Radwanska) Qualified for 2016 WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai for the second time (l. Kvitova in F)
- Reached three finals in 2016, winning Kuala Lumpur (d. Bouchard in F) and R-Up at New Haven (l. A.Radwanska) and Zhuhai (l. Kvitova)
- Other 2016 season highlight was QF at Rio Olympics
- Owns two career doubles titles: 2014 Istanbul (w/Doi) and 2015 Istanbul (w/Gavrilova)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2012 Baku (lost in 1r but went on to win title there in both 2013 and 2014)
- Ukrainian Fed Cup Team, 2012-15, 2017, 2020
- Played first ITF Circuit events of career in 2008
- Junior highlights include winning 2010 Roland Garros girls' title at age 15 (d. Jabeur in F)






