Osaka leads 1-0

Jabeur is looking to even the head-to-head against **Osaka** with a win today; this is their first meeting in three years and their second on hard court...**Jabeur** is making her third appearance at Toronto, where her previous result was reaching the second round in 2022 (I. Qinwen Zheng)...her best result at Toronto was her own Quarter-Finalist run in 2021...**Osaka** is making her 5th appearance at Toronto, where her best result was reaching QF stage in 2019 (I. eventual runner-up Serena Williams)... **Osaka** owns seven hard court titles: Australian Open 2021, US Open 2020, Beijing, Osaka, Australian Open in 2019, US Open, Indian Wells in 2018... **Osaka** is looking for her eight hard court win of the season

Shuai Zhang (CHN #685) vs. [15] Leylah Fernandez (CAN #25)

Fernandez leads 1-0

Zhang is making her ninth appearance at the tournament, where her previous result was reaching the first round in 2023...**Zhang** is looking for her 60th win over a Top 50 player with a win today...**Zhang** is looking to even the head-to-head against **Fernandez**...this is their first meeting on hard court; the two have previously only faced on clay...**Fernandez** is making 5th appearance at Toronto...**Fernandez** is looking for her eighth win on hard court this season

[3] Jessica Pegula (USA #6) vs. Karolina Pliskova (CZE #45)

Pegula leads 4-1

No. 3 seed **Pegula** is making her fourth appearance at Toronto, where she has won the title (Montreal) in 2023 (d. Samsonova in F); she also reached SF in 2022 and 2021... At WTA-1000 events, she has also reached final at Madrid 2022 (l. Jabeur in F)...Owns 4 career singles titles on hard court - Seoul, Montreal in 2023; Guadalajara in 2022; Washington DC in 2019...Is playing today's opponent **Karolina Pliskova** for the sixth time, having won 4 of their previous 5 meetings...**Karolina Pliskova** is making her tenth appearance at the tournament, where her previous best result was R-Up in 2021 (in Montreal, I. Giorgi in F)... Owns 11 singles titles on hard court, most recently at Cluj-Napoca 2024

Paula Badosa (ESP #40) vs. Clara Tauson (DEN #62)

Badosa is making third appearance at Toronto, where her previous result was reaching 2r in 2022 (I. Putintseva) and in 2021 (in Montreal, I. Marino)...Best result at a WTA-1000 event was Champion run at Indian Wells 2021...Owns 1-1 career record against players from Denmark (0-0 in 2024), both against today's opponent Tauson - won at Doha 2022, lost at Lyon 2021... **Badosa** owns 3 career singles titles on hard court, most recently last week at Washington DC 2024, Sydney 2022 and Indian Wells 2021...**Tauson** is making her tournament debut here...Best result at a WTA-1000 event was 3r run at Indian Wells 2022 (I. eventual champion Swiatek)...With a win today would be her third Top 50 win of 2024 season, having defeated No. 11 Ostapenko at Roland Garros 2024 and No. 50 Dolehide at Miami 2024...Owns 2 singles titles on hard court at Luxembourg and Lyon in 2021
