Taylor Townsend (USA #71) vs. [4] Jelena Ostapenko (LAT #11)

Ostapenko leads 1-0

Townsend is making her debut appearance at Rogers Cup...Has beaten Dayana Yastremska and Marina Stakusic to reach 3r, which has equaled her previous best result at a WTA-1000 event (3r at Guadalajara 2023)...**Townsend** owns 0-1 career record against players from Latvia, having played and lost to today's opponent Ostapenko at US Open 2018...Her previous best career result on hard court is reaching the R16 run 11 times, most recently at Washington DC 2024...**Ostapenko** is making her eight appearance at Rogers Cup, where her previous best result was R16 run in 2019 (I. Bouzkova)...Previous best result at a WTA-1000 event was title run at Dubai 2022 (d. V. Kudermetova)...With a win would be her first QF at Rogers Cup... **Ostapenko** owns 5 singles titles on hard court at Linz, Adelaide in 2024; Dubai in 2022; Luxembourg in 2019; Seoul in 2017

[3] Jessica Pegula (USA #6) vs. Ashlyn Krueger (USA #82)

Pegula leads 2-0

Pegula is making her fourth appearance here, where she has won (Montreal) in 2023 (d. Samsonova in F); also reached SF in 2022 (l. eventual champion Halep) and 2021 (l. eventual champion Giorgi)....At WTA-1000 events, has also reached final at Madrid 2022 (l. Jabeur in F)...After 1r bye, Pegula defeated Karolina Pliskova to reach the 3r...Owns 31-13 career record against fellow players from United States of America (5-0 in 2024), having played today's opponent Krueger twice and won at Wimbledon 2024 and Seoul 2023...Owns 4 career singles titles on hard court - Seoul, Montreal in 2023; Guadalajara in 2022; Washington DC in 2019...Krueger is making her tournament debut here...As qualifier, has beaten Hon and Zhao to make main draw; has beaten Elisabetta Cocciaretto and Leylah Fernandez to reach 3r... With a win today would be her first career QF at WTA-1000 events... Krueger faces No.6 Jessica Pegula in 3r today; with a win today would be her first career Top 10 win, having failed all of her previous three meetings against Top 10 opponents - I. today's opponent Pegula twice at Wimbledon 2024 (No.5) and Seoul 2023 (No.4), and No.7 at Beijing 2023

[1] Coco Gauff (USA #2) vs. [14] Diana Shnaider (#24)

First Meeting

Gauff is making her fourth appearance at Rogers Cup, where her best result is a QF run in all three previous appearances (2023, 2022, 2021)... Gauff owns 81 career wins over Top 50 players, most recently No.20 Alexandrova at Berlin 2024... She owns 45-55 career record against seeded players, with a record of 9-9 in 2024... One of the 7 players from the USA through to the 3r at Toronto; it's the first time since 1988 that 7 players from the USA are through to the 3r at the tournament... All of Gauff's previous losses at the tournament have been against eventual champions... Shnaider is yet to secure a win against a Top 10 player, with her career record standing at 0-3... She owns 7-2 win record against players from the United States of America, with a 3-2 record in 2024... Shnaider holds a 13-12 career record against seeded players, with a record of 6-5 in 2024... Shnaider holds 1-1 record against the No.1 seed (d. Linette at Hua Hin 2024, I. Jabeur at Ningbo in 2023)...

Katie Boulter (GBR #33) vs. [2] Aryna Sabalenka (#3)

Sabalenka leads 3-0

The pair are set to face each other for the 4th time on the Hologic WTA Tour, having previously met at Australian Open in 2019, Wimbledon in 2021 and Beijing in 2023...The pairs' last two encounters were 2h+ matches with their Wimbledon encounter going to three sets, and at Beijing both sets going to 7...With a 3r run, **Boulter** has made her best showing to date at Rogers cup...**Boulter** holds 3 career wins over Top 10 players, most recently against No.5 Pegula at United Cup in 2024...**Sabalenka** holds all three wins against Boulter, two of which were on hard court...**Sabalenka** holds a 6-0 record against players from Great Britain, with a 1-0 lead this season...

[8] Emma Navarro (USA #15) vs. [11] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #20)

First meeting

Navarro is making her tournament debut here...Best result at a WTA-1000 event was QF run at Indian Wells 2024 (I. Sakkari)...Her sole career singles title has come on hard court at Hobart 2024...Navarro is currently ranked at her career best No.15 (achieved on July 15, 2024); this time last year was ranked No.54...Has won 36 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.5 on tour for match wins, behind Iga Swiatek (50), Elena Rybakina (40), Coco Gauff (38), Danielle Collins (38)...Kostyuk is making her second appearance at Rogers Cup, where her previous result was 1r in 2023 (I. Zheng)...Best result at a WTA-1000 event was SF run at Indian Wells 2024 (I. eventual champion Swiatek)... Kostyuk owns 9 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.7 Qinwen Zheng at Stuttgart 2024...Owns 14-9 career record against players from United States of America (6-2 in 2024); is playing today's opponent Navarro for the first time...Her sole career singles title has come on hard court at Austin 2023...Best result by Ukraine at Rogers cup was title run by Elina Svitolina in 2017

Elise Mertens (BEL #35) vs. [6] Liudmila Samsonova (#13)

Samsonova leads 1-0

Samsonova holds a win of their only previous encounter on the Hologic WTA Tour at Washington DC in 2022...

Samsonova is making her third appearance at the Rogers Cup, where she was Runner-up in 2023 (I. Pegula in F) ... She holds 50 wins in her career against Top 50 players... Samsonova holds 5-3 career record against players from Belgium, with a 2-0 record in 2024... Samsonova owns three hard court titles in Tokyo, Cleveland, Washington DC (all in 2022)...

Mertens is making her sixth appearance at Rogers Cup, where her best result has been reaching the QF stage in 2018 (in Montreal, I. Svitolina)... Mertens beat Volynets and Osaka to reach the 3r at Toronto this week... Mertens owns 21 career wins against Top 20 players, most recently defeating Svitolina at Charleston in 2024... She holds a 45-79 career record against seeds, with a 1-7 record this season...



CAREER MILESTONES

- Reached third round at 2023 US Open for the second time in her career and first since becoming a mother (l. Muchova). Also in 2023 advanced to R16 at Guadalajara (l. Arango in 3r).
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2022 US Open (w/McNally, l. Krejcikova/Siniakova)
- Last season in singles, made 2r at San Jose (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kasatkina) and fell 1r at Roland Garros, Cincinnati and US Open. Won 11th and 12th ITF Circuit titles of her career in 2022, at W100 Charleston and W80 Tyler
- Returned from maternity leave in April 2022 with QF runs at ITF Circuit clay-court tournaments in Palm Harbor and Charlottesville
- Enjoyed doubles success in 2020, advancing to SF at US Open and winning titles at both Auckland and WTA 125K Series event in Indian Wells (all w/Muhammad)
- In 2019, produced best singles performance at a major by reaching R16 at US Open (as qualifier, l. Andreescu); in 2r saved 1MP to upset No.4 seed Halep
- Posted best year-end finish at No.74 in 2018, up from No.105 in 2017; reached career-high No.61 ranking on July 16, 2018
- First broke into the Top 100 the week of January 19, 2015 at No.99
- Highlights of 2018 were winning her ninth ITF singles title at \$25k ITF/Sumter, SC-USA (d. Lim in F)
- Advanced to 3r to 2017 Miami after coming through qualifying. Upset No.30 Vinci in 2r before losing to No.7 Kuznetsova
- Reached 3r at 2014 Roland Garros (l. Suárez Navarro); at 18 years, one month was the youngest woman to reach 3r in Paris since 2009 (Pavlyuchenkova)
- Made WTA main draw debut as wildcard at 2013 Indian Wells; in first match posted career first Top-100 win over No.57 Hradecka
- Advanced to first WTA doubles final at 2013 Washington DC (w/Bouchard)
- Won the junior singles and doubles titles at 2012 Australian Open; became first American to hold year-end No.1 junior world ranking since Gretchen Rush in 1982
- · Turned professional at end of 2012 season

- Won sixth career title at 2023 Birmingham (d. Krejcikova in F) and reached SF at Rome; in doubles achieved R-Up at Doha (w/L.Kichenok)
- At 2022 Dubai, lifted fifth career singles title (d. Kudermetova in F); finished R-Up at Eastbourne (l. Kvitova) and Seoul (l. Alexandrova) as well as SF at St. Petersburg and Doha
- Won two doubles titles in 2022 at Birmingham and Cincinnati (both w/L.Kichenok); qualified for WTA Finals reaching SF Lifted first grass court title at 2021 Eastbourne (as WC, d. Kontaveit in F)
- In 2021, also finished R-Up at Luxembourg (l. Tauson), made SF at Indian Wells (l. Azarenka), reached QF at Rome and represented Latvia at the Tokyo Olympics (l. Vesnina in 1r)
- Won doubles title at 2021 Moscow (w/Siniakova)
- Highlights of 2020 season included three Top 10 wins and reaching QF at Strasbourg
- Finished R-Up in doubles w/Dabrowski at 2020 Doha (l. Hsieh/Strycova)
- 2019 season saw her capture third career title at Luxembourg (d. Goerges in F) right after finishing R-Up at Linz (l. Gauff)
- Also R-Up in mixed doubles at 2019 Wimbledon w/Lindstedt
- 2018 campaign highlighted by finishing R-Up at Miami (l. Stephens); beat No.9 Petra Kvitova and No.4 Elina Svitolina to register multiple Top 10 wins in the same tournament for the first time
- Reached SF at 2018 Wimbledon (l. eventual champion Kerber) to become first Latvian woman to reach final four at All England Club
- Achieved career-high ranking of No.5 on March 19, 2018
- In doubles won title at 2018 Doha (w/Dabrowski)
- Enjoyed career-best season in 2017, finishing the year in the Top 10 for the first time (at No.7); was No.44 at end of 2016 (first Top 50 finish) and No.79 at end of 2015 (first Top 100 finish)
- Champion at 2017 Roland Garros (d. Halep in F) becoming first woman to win first tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Barbara Jordan at 1979 Australian Open. Also became the first unseeded player to lift the trophy in the Open Era and the first Latvian player to reach the championship match at a Grand Slam
- Followed up title run with QF appearance at 2017 Wimbledon; also won title at Seoul (d. Haddad Maia in F) and reached final at Charleston (l. Kasatkina)
- Qualified for debut WTA Finals in 2017 went 1-2 in group stage

- Made Top 10 debut at No.10 on September 11, 2017
- In doubles, won first and second career titles in 2017, at St. Petersburg (w/Rosolska) and Stuttgart (w/Atawo) Breakthrough result of 2016 season was reaching final at Doha launching her into Top 50 at No.40 (l. Suárez Navarro); also in 2016 reached SF at Katowice and QF at Birmingham and Florianopolis ending year at No.44
- Ended 2015 at No.79 for first Top 100 finish (up from No.308 in 2014). Having leapt 229 spots, was second highest year-end rankings jump, after Kasatkina who went from No.370 to No.72 (298 spots)
- Highlights of 2014 were reaching first career WTA final at Quebec City (l. Beck) and 2r at Wimbledon and US Open
- Scored first Top 10 win over No.9 Carla Suárez Navarro in 1r at 2015 Wimbledon
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2014 Tashkent as WC advancing to 2r (l. Pervak)
- Played qualifying at Moscow in 2012
- Member of Latvian Billie Jean King Cup team in 2013-2022
- Began professional career playing ITF in 2012 winning first career title at \$10k/ITF Stockholm, SWE; owns seven career ITF titles


