[8] Emma Navarro (USA #15) vs. [LL] Taylor Townsend (USA #71) Townsend leads 1-0

Five American women into the quarterfinals, the most at a WTA 1000 event since the format's inception in 2009 and most at any WTA event since Stanford 2001... This is the duo's first tour-level meeting after Townsend defeated Navarro in straight sets at ITF 100K in Charleston in 2019... Only the current Top 4 have made more QFs than **Navarro** in 2024 (7): Elena Rybakina (11), Iga Swiatek (9), Aryna Sabalenka and Coco Gauff (8 each)... **Navarro** is bidding to make her 1st WTA 1000 semifinal... **Navarro** has a chance to move into the Top 8 on the PIF Race to the WTA Finals Leaderboard with a victory today... Also has a chance to make her Top 10 debut on the PIF WTA Rankings with a title this week... **Townsend** is the first Lucky Loser to make the quarterfinals of a WTA 1000 since the format's inception... **Townsend** has dropped just 9 games en route to her first WTA quarterfinal... Among players to win three matches to reach the Canadian Open QFs in the Open Era, only Caroline Wozniacki in 2014 (six) dropped fewer games... Win over Jelena Ostapenko in the Round of 16 was Townsend's 2nd Top 20 win of the year... **Townsend** is bidding to become the first lucky loser to make a WTA semifinal this season... Has a chance to move into the Top 50 of the PIF WTA Rankings for the first time with a win today

Amanda Anisimova (USA #132) vs. [2] Aryna Sabalenka (#3) Anisimova leads 4-2

Anisimova holds a win-loss record of 4-2 head-to-head against Sabalenka at WTA level, with Sabalenka winning their last meeting on hard court – a straight-sets victory en route to the title at this year's Australian Open (R16)... **Anisimova** (34) and Sabalenka (31.9) are first and second respectively for winners per match at WTA-1000 events in 2024... **Anisimova** (#139) could become the lowest-ranked player to reach a Women's Singles SF at the Canadian Open since Sloane Stephens (#934) in 2017... **Anisimova** (#139) could become the lowest-ranked player to reach a WTA-1000 SF since Svetlana Kuznetsova (#153), who went on to reach the final in Cincinnati in 2019... **Anisimova** could reach a maiden WTA-1000 SF, and her first overall at a WTA event since Charleston in 2022... After defeating Daria Kasatkina and Anna Kalinskaya, **Anisimova** could claim three WTA top 20 wins at a single WTA event for the first time in her career... **Sabalenka** (10) is currently one of only two players to reach 10+ WTA-1000 semi-finals since the start of the 2020 season, along with Iga Swiatek (16)... Currently level on 89, **Sabalenka** could surpass Coco Gauff and secure the outright second-most WTA match wins - including the Olympics and BJK Cup – since the start of the 2023 season. Iga Swiatek (120) holds the most... **Sabalenka** could reach sixth WTA SF of 2024 and her fourth on hard court after Brisbane, the Australian Open and Washington, she will have only reached more WTA event SFs in a season in 2023 (10)... **Sabalenka** holds a win-loss record of 12-2 at WTA-1000 events against opponents ranked outside the WTA's top 100, with her last defeat coming to Sofia Kenin in Rome (R64) last year

[3] Jessica Pegula (USA #6) vs. Peyton Stearns (USA #53) Pegula leads 1-0

Defending champion **Pegula** is now 14-2 at the Canadian Open (87.5%), only Monica Seles has a higher winning percentage at the event (91.2%)... The Canadian Open is the tournament at which **Pegula** has won the most matches, one more than Miami and Australian Open... **Pegula** could become the 4th player in the Open Era to make 4+ consecutive SFs at the Canadian Open after Seles, Sabatini and Halep... **Pegula** is bidding to make her first WTA 1000 semifinal since winning Montreal last year... **Stearns** is playing in her first WTA 1000 quarterfinal... Last two matches **Stearns'** played against Keys and Azarenka, ended in injury retirements... **Stearns** won her maiden WTA title this year on the clay in Rabat... **Stearns** is bidding to make her first WTA hard-court semifinal and third overall... **Stearns** holds a 0-6 record against Top 10 opponents, but last three losses went to three sets... **Stearns** is coached by Tom Hill, who previously coached Maria Sakkari... Played collegiate tennis at the University of Texas

[14] Diana Shnaider (#24) vs. [6] Liudmila Samsonova (#13)

Shnaider leads 1-0

Shnaider has made her first career QF in a WTA-1000 event... **Shnaider** could become the third left-handed player to reach the semi-finals in Toronto this Century after Monica Seles in 2001 and Beatriz Haddad Maia in 2022... **Shnaider** is looking to become the youngest semi-finalist at the Canadian Open since Bianca Andreescu in 2019... **Shnaider** is the player with the most matches won since June 2024 (18) - including the Olympic Games... After having defeated Coco Gauff in the Round of 16, **Shnaider** is looking to win two matches in a row against top-15 opponents for the first time in her professional career... **Shnaider** is the player with the most winners here at Toronto 2024 (79)... **Samsonova** has eight match wins at the Canadian Open, equaling her career-high for main draw victories at a single WTA event (level with Washington)... **Samsonova** has reached back-to-back quarter-finals at Rogers Cup, the fourth event where she makes consecutive QFs in WTA tournaments after Washington (2022-2023), Abu Dhabi (2023-2024) and s'Hertogenbosch (2023-2024)... Rogers Cup could become the third WTA level tournament where **Samsonova** has reached multiple semi-finals after Washington (2022-2023) and Abu Dhabi (2023-2024)... **Samsonova** is yet to concede a single game on serve at the Canadian Open 2024 (18 games won on serve out of 18)... After having won in straight sets her first two WTA-1000 quarter-finals (Montréal 2023 vs Belinda Bencic and Beijing 2023 vs Jelena Ostapenko), **Samsonova** could become the fourth player since the format was introduced in 2009 to win her first three such QFs without losing a set after Iga Swiatek, Maria Sharapova and Venus Williams... **Samsonova** (s-Hertogenbosch, Strasbourg and Abu Dhabi) and **Shnaider** (Budapest, Bad Homburg and Hua Hin) are looking to reach their respective fourth semi-final of the season

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2023 was a stand-out year, achieving a career best with semifinal at WTA 500 San Diego (l. Kenin) and ending season with a ranking of No. 32. Also reached two quarterfinals on clay; Strasbourg (l. Blinkova) and Palermo (l. eventual champion Zheng) and one semifinal on grass; Bad Homburg (l. Siniakova).
- In 2022, posted 31-18 win-loss record. At Tour-level, made 2r at Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur), fell 1r at Monterrey (as WC, l. Zacarias) and Indian Wells (as WC, l. Anisimova), and contested qualifying at San Diego
- Elsewhere in 2022, reached three ITF Circuit finals, including lifting second career title at this level at W60 tournament in Liepaja, Latvia, while made SF at WTA 125K Series event in Vancouver
- Broke into Top 200 for the first time on March 7, 2022
- Lifted maiden ITF Circuit title at W25 event in Orlando in November 2021
- Won the NCAA division 1 women's singles title in May 2021 to earn a WC into US Open, where she fell 1r (l. McHale)
- In 2021, reached 2r at both Charleston [500] and Charleston [250]
- Fell 1r at 2020 Monterrey (l. Stephens)
- Only other events in 2020 came on ITF Circuit, ending year ranked No.463
- Owns three ITF Circuit titles in singles and one in doubles
- Fell 2r on professional debut at \$10k Charleston, SC-USA (l. Di Lorenzo) in 2015
- Began her collegiate career by winning her first 14 NCAA singles matches and moving up to a No.6 ITA ranking
- Ended 2019 at No.3 in ITF Junior rankings, following a season that included a R-Up finish at Roland Garros (l. Fernandez), a SF run at Wimbledon and victory at the Adidas Easter Bowl
- Also R-Up in girls' doubles at 2019 Australian Open w/Beck
- Reached third round at 2023 US Open for the second time in her career and first since becoming a mother (l. Muchova). Also in 2023 advanced to R16 at Guadalajara (l. Arango in 3r).
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2022 US Open (w/McNally, l. Krejčíková/Siniakova)
- Last season in singles, made 2r at San Jose (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Kasatkina) and fell 1r at Roland Garros, Cincinnati and US Open. Won 11th and 12th ITF Circuit titles of her career in 2022, at W100 Charleston and W80 Tyler
- Returned from maternity leave in April 2022 with QF runs at ITF Circuit clay-court tournaments in Palm Harbor and Charlottesville
- Enjoyed doubles success in 2020, advancing to SF at US Open and winning titles at both Auckland and WTA 125K Series event in Indian Wells (all w/Muhammad)
- In 2019, produced best singles performance at a major by reaching R16 at US Open (as qualifier, l. Andreescu); in 2r saved 1MP to upset No.4 seed Halep
- Posted best year-end finish at No.74 in 2018, up from No.105 in 2017; reached career-high No.61 ranking on July 16, 2018
- First broke into the Top 100 the week of January 19, 2015 at No.99
- Highlights of 2018 were winning her ninth ITF singles title at \$25k ITF/Sumter, SC-USA (d. Lim in F)
- Advanced to 3r to 2017 Miami after coming through qualifying. Upset No.30 Vinci in 2r before losing to No.7 Kuznetsova
- Reached 3r at 2014 Roland Garros (l. Suárez Navarro); at 18 years, one month was the youngest woman to reach 3r in Paris since 2009 (Pavlyuchenkova)
- Made WTA main draw debut as wildcard at 2013 Indian Wells; in first match posted career first Top-100 win over No.57 Hradecka
- Advanced to first WTA doubles final at 2013 Washington DC (w/Bouchard)
- Won the junior singles and doubles titles at 2012 Australian Open; became first American to hold year-end No.1 junior world ranking since Gretchen Rush in 1982
- Turned professional at end of 2012 season

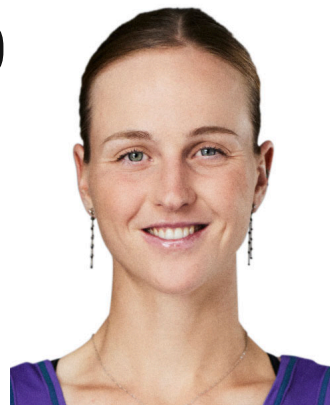
