- 17 different women have won the singles title at Miami. Aside from Serena Williams who has won a record eight singles titles, followed by Stefanie Graf (5), Venus Williams (3) and Victoria Azarenka (3)
- The title has been won 11 times by the current WTA No.1 ranked player and 31 times by a player who held the No.1 ranking at some point during their career. Of the former champions at Miami, only five have not held the No.1 ranking: Gabriela Sabatini (1989), Svetlana Kuznetsova (2006), Agnieszka Radwanska (2012), Johanna Konta (2017), Sloane Stephens (2018) and Petra Kvitova (2023)
- The final has featured the Top 2 seeds seven times (1985, 1986, 1988, 1989, 1993, 2001, 2014) with the top seed winning six of those finals; the No.1 seed has won the final 14 times overall
- An American has won the singles title 14 times, with the last of these coming in 2018 (Stephens)
- No player has more match wins at the Miami Open than Serena Williams, winning 76 matches while 57 of those have come in straight sets, which is also the most in women's singles history.
- At 16y 113d, Monica Seles (1990) remains the youngest winner of the women's singles at the Miami Open, since the event's inauguration in 1985. Seles (1990-91) is one of four players to win the event before turning 18 along with Steffi Graf (1987), Martina Hingis (1997) and Venus Williams (1998).
- At 33y 190d, Serena Williams (2015) remains the oldest winner of the women's singles at the Miami Open, since the event's inauguration in 1985. Williams is one of only two players to win the event after turning 33, along with last year's winner, Petra Kvitova.
- Steffi Graf (1987) and Martina Hingis (2000) have dropped the least games on the way to tournament victory, dropping 21 games each over the course of respective tournaments.
- Receiving a wild card, Simona Halep will be making her return to the WTA Tour at this year's Miami Open. At 75.8% this decade, only one active player has a better win percentage at WTA-1000 events than Halep over that span – Iga Swiatek (81.9%).
- With Petra Kvitova's withdrawal, it is the third consecutive year the defending champion at the Miami Open has not competed at the event, after Ashleigh Barty (2022) and Iga Swiatek (2023).
- Venus Williams will be making her 85th main draw match appearance at the Miami Open, equaling her sister Serena for the most at the event, since its inception in 1985.
- This year's Miami Open will have the highest number of former Grand Slam winners in the WTA-1000 main draw – the highest in a single main draw since the format was introduced in 2009.
- Iga Swiatek can become only the fourth female or male player to achieve the Sunshine Double on multiple occasions along with Steffi Graf, Roger Federer and Novak Djokovic. If she manages it, Swiatek would be the youngest of the four to achieve the feat at 22y 304d.
- Qinwen Zheng could become the third Asian player to reach the Australian Open and Miami Open final in the same season after Li Na (2014) and Elena Rybakina (2023), since the latter tournament's inception in 1985.

ABOUT WTA 1000 LEVEL

The WTA 1000 level was introduced in 2009 – originally as Premier Mandatory and Premier 5. Miami is the 130th staging of a WTA 1000 overall and the 101st hardcourt WTA 1000.

Since the level was introduced, 44 different players have won a WTA 1000 titles led by Serena Williams (13), Victoria Azarenka (10), Simona Halep (9), Petra Kvitova (9), Maria Sharapova (8) and Iga Swiatek (8).

SUNSHINE DOUBLES – INDIAN WELLS & MIAMI

On Sunday, Iga Swiatek was crowned Indian Wells champion and will now attempt to become just the second women to win Miami in the same year twice in her career. The only other player to do so has been Steffi Graf (1994, 1996), while Kim Clijsters (2005), Victoria Azarenka (2016) and Iga Swiatek (2022) are the four players to complete the Indian Wells-Miami sweep:
