2024 ROLAND GARROS

The first national French Championships for women were held in 1897, with foreign competitors eligible to take part from 1925. This year marks the 57th staging of the Open Era (which began in 1968). Of the 128 players in the singles main draw, 104 gain direct entry based on WTA Singles Rankings (week of April 15, 2024). In addition, there are 16 qualifiers who play three rounds of qualifying matches, as well as eight wildcards.

WORLD NO.1

For the ninth major in a row, **Iga Swiatek** enters as WTA World No.1. Swiatek attained the ranking on April 4, 2022, following the retirement of Ashleigh Barty and held the top spot for 75 consecutive weeks. Swiatek's first stay atop the rankings came to an end after the 2023 US Open when Aryna Sabalenka took over the No.1 spot after reaching the final. Swiatek regained the World No.1 ranking on the final day of the 2023 season by winning the title match at the WTA Finals. This fortnight at Roland Garros will mark Swiatek's 105th (week of May 27) and 106th (week of June 3) weeks at No.1 and she will extend her stay at No.1 after Roland Garros, regardless of any results:

ACTIVE GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS

The 2023 season welcomed three new Grand Slam champion: **Aryna Sabalenka** won her maiden Grand Slam singles title at the Australian Open, **Marketa Vondrousova** triumphed at Wimbledon and **Coco Gauff** lifted the US Open crown. There are 19 active Grand Slam champions. Among those in this year's draw at Roland Garros, three players have lifted the trophy previously at Roland Garros: **Iga Swiatek** (2020, 2022-23), **Jelena Ostapenko** (2017) and **Barbora Krejcikova** (2021)

STRONG OFF THE BLOCKS – FIRST-ROUND SUCCESS

Of those players with five or more Grand Slam appearances in this year's Roland Garros draw, here are the players with the best strike rate in the opening round at a Grand Slam:

- **Iga Swiatek (19-1 in 1r, 95.0%):** Swiatek has been defeated in 1r only once in 20 Grand Slam main-draw appearances, at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic). Swiatek is 5-0 in first round matches at Roland Garros.
- **Qinwen Zheng (8-1 in 1r, 88.9%):** Zheng's only first round loss came at 2023 Wimbledon (I. Siniakova).
- **Madison Keys (37-5 in 1r, 88.1%):** Has won seven-straight opening round matches with last loss coming at 2021 US Open (I. Stephens). Keys owns a 9-2 record in opening round matches at Roland Garros with losses coming at 2020 Roland Garros (I. S.Zhang) and 2014 Roland Garros (I. Errani).
- **Elise Mertens (24-4 in 1r, 85.7%):** Mertens fell at the first hurdle three times in her first four Grand Slam main-draw appearances, however, following this she won 18 straight matches at this stage before this run ended at 2022 US Open (I. Begu).
- **Elina Svitolina (34-6 in 1r, 85.0%):** Svitolina has won 30 of her last 31 opening round matches at the Slams – dating back to 2015 Australian Open – with her only loss coming at 2018 Wimbledon (I. Maria). Owns a 10-0 record here in Paris.
- **Coco Gauff (15-3 in 1r, 83.3%):** Only first-round defeats came at 2020 US Open (I. Sevastova), 2022 Australian Open (I. Q.Wang) and 2023 Wimbledon (I. Kenin).
- **Elena Rybakina (15-3 in 1r, 83.3%):** Two of Rybakina's first round exits at Slams came on her first two outings at the majors, at 2019 Roland-Garros (I. Siniakova) and 2019 US Open (I. Muchova). She also suffered an opening round loss at 2022 US Open (I. Burel).
- **Victoria Azarenka (52-11 in 1r, 82.5%):** Four of her 11 first-round exits came in her opening six major appearances. Azarenka is 10-6 in opening round at Roland Garros, the most opening round losses at a Slam (13-3 at Australian Open; 14-1 at Wimbledon; 15-1 at US Open).

ROLAND GARROS WILDCARDS

Eight players received main draw wildcards. These include six Frenchwomen - **Alize Cornet, Fiona Ferro, Elsa Jacquemot, Kristina Mladenovic** and **Jessika Ponchet** - along with Australia's **Ajla Tomljanovic** and the USA's **Sachia Vickery**

In the Open Era, the best result by a wildcard at a Grand Slam was achieved by **Kim Clijsters**, who won the 2009 US Open title.

QUALIFIERS AT GRAND SLAMS & ROLAND GARROS

Sixteen players earned their main draw place by winning through the qualifying rounds this year. Emma Raducanu became the first qualifier, male or female, to win a major title in the Open Era by winning the 2021 US Open. Before that, the deepest run by a qualifier at any Grand Slam was to the semifinals – achieved by Nadia Podoroska at 2020 Roland Garros, Alexandra Stevenson at 1999 Wimbledon and Christine Dorey at the 1978 Australian Open.

A qualifier has reached the quarterfinal stage at Roland Garros 11 times, most recently **Nadia Podoroska** and **Martina Trevisan** in 2020:

GRAND SLAM MAIN DRAW: CONSECUTIVE APPEARANCES

At the 2022 US Open, **Alizé Cornet** set the women's Open Era record for most consecutive Grand Slam main draws, contesting her 63rd straight major, having equaled Ai Sugiyama mark of 62 at Wimbledon that summer. This fortnight at 2024 Roland-Garros will be her 69th consecutive appearance at a Slam, a streak that started at 2007 Australian Open. However this will also be her last tournament, having announced her retirement following her final result in Paris.

Feliciano López holds the men's record with 79 consecutive appearances, which came to an end when he fell in qualifying at 2022 Roland Garros.

- Only five times, in 1933 (**Margaret Scriven**), 2010 (**Francesca Schiavone**), 2017 (**Jelena Ostapenko**), 2020 (**Iga Swiatek**) and 2021 (**Barbora Krejckikova**) has the singles title at Roland Garros not been won by a Top 10 seed
- The players who have won the most Roland Garros singles titles (in the tournament's entire history) are **Chris Evert** (7); **Stefanie Graf** (6); **Margaret Smith Court** (5); **Justine Henin** and **Helen Wills-Moody** (4); and **Hilde Sperling**, **Monica Seles**, **Arantxa Sánchez-Vicario**, **Serena Williams** and **Iga Swiatek** (3)
- USA has won the most titles at Roland Garros (29) ahead of Germany (10), then Australia (9) and Great Britain (8)
- The players who own the most doubles titles are **Martina Navratilova** (7), **Simonne Mathieu**, **Natasha Zvereva** and **Gigi Fernandez** (6 apiece)
- Two years ago, **Barbora Krejckikova** became the first player since **Mary Pierce** in 2000 to sweep the singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros. **Lucie Safarova** also contested both the singles and doubles finals in 2015 (finished runner-up in singles, champion in doubles) and **Coco Gauff** in 2022 (finished runner-up in singles and doubles)
- There are six former or current No.1s in the 2024 main draw: **Victoria Azarenka**, **Karolina Pliskova**, **Iga Swiatek**, **Naomi Osaka**, **Aryna Sabalenka** and **Angelique Kerber**
- Longest match (time): 4 hours, 7 minutes – V.Buisson (FRA) d. N. Van Lottum (FRA) 67 75 62, 1r, 1995
- Longest match (games): 56 games – K Melville (AUS) d. P.Teeguarden (USA) 97 46 1614, 1r, 1972. Since the introduction of the tiebreak in 1973, the record is 46 games, which has happened twice
- A left-handed player has won the singles title 10 times (most recently, **Monica Seles** in 1992)
- The singles title has been won without dropping a set 21 times (most recently, **Iga Swiatek** in 2020)
- Five players have won the title after saving match point: **Osborne DuPont** (1946); **Smith-Court** (1962); **Myskina** (2004); **Henin** (2005) and **Barbora Krejckikova** (2021)
- Only six players have won the Roland-Garros women's singles title after winning the Roland Garros girls' singles title (**Halep**, **Durr**, **Jausovec**, **Mandlikova**, **Capriati** and **Henin**)
- Previous girls' singles winners in this year's main draw are: **Cornet** (2007), **Halep** (2008), **Mladenovic** (2009), **Svitolina** (2010), **Jabeur** (2011), **Kasatkina** (2014), **Badosa** (2015), **Masarova** (2016), **Gauff** (2018), **Fernandez** (2019), **Jacquemot** (2020), **Noskova** (2021)
- Chris Evert has won the most women's singles titles at Roland Garros in the Open Era, winning the event on seven times. Evert is one of two players to have won the event five or more times in that span, along with Steffi Graf (6).
- Chris Evert and Steffi Graf have reached in the most women's singles finals at Roland Garros in the Open Era, appearing in nine finals each over that span.
- Six players in the Open Era have won the women's singles at Roland Garros without dropping a set - Evonne Goolagong (1971), Billie Jean King (1972), Chris Evert (1974), Steffi Graf (1988), Justine Henin (2006-07) and Iga Swiatek (2020).
- Margaret Court holds the best winning percentage in the women's singles at Roland Garros in the Open Era, at 95.2% - min. 10 matches. Among active players, Iga Swiatek (93.3%) holds the highest winning percentage.
- Steffi Graf has appeared in and won the most women's singles matches at Roland Garros in the Open Era, holding a win-loss record of 84-10 at the event. Graf is the only player to have won 75+ matches at the event over that span.

- At 16y 189d, Monica Seles (1990) is the youngest winner of the women's singles at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Only Martina Hingis (16y 117d – Australian Open 1997) is a younger women's singles Grand Slam winner over that span.
- Only two players in the Open Era have won multiple women's singles titles at Roland Garros before the age of 20 – Steffi Graf (1987-88) and Monica Seles (1990, 1991 and 1992)
- Since 2000, only two players have won the women's singles title at Roland Garros as teenagers – Jelena Ostapenko (2017) and Iga Swiatek (2020).
- At 33y 283d, Serena Williams is the oldest winner of the women's singles title at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Williams (2013, 2015) is one of two players in the Open Era to win multiple women's singles titles at the event after turning 30, along with Chris Evert (1985-86).
- A qualifier has never reached the women's singles final at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Nadia Podoroska (2020) has gone the furthest of any qualifier at the event in that span, losing to eventual winner Iga Swiatek in the semi-final.
- Since WTA rankings were first published in 1975, Iga Swiatek (#54, 2020) is the lowest-ranked winner of the women's singles at Roland Garros, and is the only player ranked outside the WTA Top 50 to win the event.
- A wildcard has not reached the women's singles final at Roland Garros in the Open Era. Mary Pierce (2002) has gone the furthest of any wildcard at the event, losing to eventual winner Serena Williams in the quarter-final.
- Iga Swiatek can become the third player in the Open Era to win the women's singles at Roland-Garros for three consecutive years, after Monica Seles (1990-92) and Justine Henin (2005-07). Swiatek could become the first to win a single Grand Slam event for three straight years since Serena Williams (US Open 2012-14).
- Last year, Iga Swiatek claimed a third women's singles title at Roland Garros from five appearances in the main draw at the event. In the Open Era, only Margaret Court (3/4, 75%) holds a better title win rate from main draws entered at the event.
- In the Open Era, the top seed in the women's singles at Roland Garros has lost in the opening round only once, with Angelique Kerber falling to Ekaterina Makarova in 2017.
- Since the WTA-1000 format's introduction in 2009, Iga Swiatek could become only the second player to claim tournament victory at Madrid Open, Italian Open and Roland Garros in a calendar year after Serena Williams (2013).
- In the event Iga Swiatek and Aryna Sabalenka meet in the final, it will be the fifth meeting between the pair as the WTA's #1 and #2, surpassing Martina Navratilova and Chris Evert for the most meetings on the surface in the past 40 years as the WTA's top two-ranked players.
- Aryna Sabalenka could become the first player to claim the Women's Singles titles at the Australian Open and Roland Garros in a calendar year since Serena Williams in 2015.
- Coco Gauff could become the fourth player since 2000 to make multiple Women's Singles finals at Roland Garros before turning 21, along with Kim Clijsters, Ana Ivanovic and Iga Swiatek.
- Either Elena Rybakina or Marketa Vondrousova could become the fifth player since 2000 to win both Wimbledon and Roland Garros along with Ashleigh Barty, Garbine Muguruza, Maria Sharapova and Serena Williams.

- Last year, **Iga Swiatek** won her third Roland Garros title – becoming the eighth woman to win three or more Roland Garros titles
- Two years before, **Barbora Krejcikova** won her first Grand Slam in singles on her fifth main draw appearance at the majors, and she became the first woman since 2000 to sweep the singles and doubles titles at Roland Garros. Having saved a match point en route, she also became the first Czech woman to win Roland Garros since Hana Mandlikova in 1981
- Five years ago, **Simona Halep** became the second woman from Romania (after Virginia Ruzici) to win a Grand Slam singles title when she beat Sloane Stephens in the Roland Garros final
- Ten years ago, **Serena Williams** won her second Roland Garros title, giving her at least two titles at every Grand Slam
- In 2011, **Li Na** won the title at Roland Garros as the No.6 seed, the first Asian to win a Grand Slam singles title
- Twenty years ago, **Justine Henin** claimed her first Roland Garros title over compatriot Kim Clijsters
- In the Open Era, the Top 2 seeds have played in the final 12 times, with the No.2 seed winning seven times (most recently 1995)
- Thirty-three of the Roland Garros women's titles have been won by one of the Top 2 seeds; the top seed has won the title 21 times, and the No.2 seed has won the title 12 times
