 Krejckikova won both their previous meetings on hard court, most recently in the semifinal at 2022 Ostrava

Barbora Krejckikova:

Krejckikova is bidding for her second Grand Slam final after winning Roland Garros in 2021 (d. Pavlyuchenkova in F)

Krejckikova is competing in her second Grand Slam semifinal (after Roland Garros 2021) and first SF at Wimbledon (previous best result was R16 in 2021)

Krejckikova could become the third player to defeat Elena Rybakina at each of their first three WTA main draw meetings, after Aryna Sabalenka and Liudmila Samsonova

Krejckikova is facing a Top 10 player for only the second time in 2024 after she was defeated by No.2 Aryna Sabalenka in the quarterfinal at Australian Open

Krejckikova is making her fourth main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching R16 in 2021 (l. eventual champion Barty)

Three players (Barbora Krejckikova, Jasmine Paolini and Donna Vekic) have made the Women’s Singles semi-finals at Wimbledon after having turned 28 for the fourth time in the Open Era (1994, 2016 and 2018)

In the previous round against Jelena Ostapenko, Krejckikova won her first career grass court match against a former Grand Slam champion - she is 5-2 in Grand Slam main draws against former Major champions across surfaces

Krejčíková is the seventh Czech player to reach the semifinals at Wimbledon in the Open Era after Jana Novotná, Petra Kvitová, Lucie Šafářová, Barbora Strýcová, Karolína Plíšková and Markéta Vondroušová, equalling Australia; only the United States of America have more (21) in the Open Era

Krejčíková is looking to become the fifth Czech player to reach the final at the Wimbledon in the Open Era after Jana Novotná, Petra Kvitová, Karolína Plíšková and Markéta Vondroušová - only the United States of America (nine) and Australia (five) have more in the Open Era

Krejčíková is the player with the most Grand Slam main draw appearances between her first two Major semifinals (13, Roland Garros 2021 and Wimbledon 2024) since Sloane Stephens (18 between the US Open 2013 and Wimbledon 2021)

Krejčíková could become the player with the most Grand Slam main draw appearances between her first two Major finals (13, Roland Garros 2021 and Wimbledon 2024) since Karolína Plíšková (18 between US Open 2016 and Wimbledon 2021)

Krejčíková has won a career total of 11 main draw matches at Wimbledon - she only has more at the Australian Open (13) and in Dubai (12)

Krejčíková has won 5+ matches in a row for the first time since March 2023 (eight between Dubai and Indian Wells) and for the first time in her career on grass

Krejčíková reached a career-high ranking of No.2 in 2022; has also spent 19 weeks in her career at No.1 in the doubles ranking

Elena Rybakina:

Rybakina is looking to become the sixth player in the Open Era to make the final in two or more of her first four Ladies' Singles main draw appearances at the Championships after Billie Jean King, Chris Evert, Evonne Goolagong, Margaret Court and Steffi Graf

Rybakina won in straight sets her both previous Grand Slam semifinals (Wimbledon 2022 vs. Simona Halep and Australian Open 2023 vs. Victoria Azarenka)

Rybakina is the only female or male player to represent Kazakhstan and reach a Grand Slam SF in the Open Era (Wimbledon 2022- WON, Australian Open 2023 – R-Up)

Rybakina is the only player remaining in the draw to have reached a Wimbledon final

Only seven players in the Open Era have won all their first three Grand Slam semifinals: Margaret Court, Evonne Goolagong, Mary Pierce, Svetlana Kuznetsova, Garbine Muguruza, Naomi Osaka and the last to do so Ons Jabeur

Rybakina is the player with the joint-most wins (19) after her first 21 matches in Ladies' Singles at Wimbledon in the Open Era, level with Maria Sharapova, Billie Jean King and Chris Evert

Only Monica Seles (AO 21 and RG 20), Margaret Court (US 20, RG 20 and AO 20) and Chris Evert (RG 20) have won more from their first 21 matches in a single Grand Slam event than Rybakina at Wimbledon (19) in the Open Era

Rybakina is the player with the joint-most WTA-level semifinals reached in 2024 (seven), equalling Iga Swiatek (excluding the United Cup)

Rybakina is the player with the joint-most WTA level finals made so far in 2024 (five, level with Iga Swiatek - excluding the United Cup)

Rybakina could become the second player in 2024 to reach WTA level finals on each surface, after Daria Kasatkina

Rybakina could become the youngest player to make her second Ladies' Singles final at Wimbledon since Garbine Muguruza (2015 and 2017)

Rybakina is the player with the most aces served at the Championships 2024 in Ladies' Singles (31, level with Lulu Sun)

Only Ons Jabeur (83.0%, 74/89) has a higher first serve points won percentage than Rybakina at the Championships in 2024 (82.0%, 129/158)

Only Ann Jones and Steffi Graf have a higher winning percentage than Rybakina at Wimbledon in the Ladies' Singles in the Open Era...

Donna Vekic (CRO #37) vs. [7] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #7)

Paolini leads 2-1

Paolini defeated Vekic in their most recent meeting in 1r at 2023 Montreal and today is their first meeting on grass

Two players will face each other in Wimbledon's semifinal after having both turned 28 for the first time since 2019 (Serena Williams and Barbora Strycova)

Donna Vekic:

Vekic has reached her first Grand Slam semifinal at her 43rd Major main draw appearance: in the Open Era, only Barbora Strycova (53), Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (52), Elena Likhovtseva (46) and Roberta Vinci (44) have made their first SF after more Major appearances

Vekic could reach her first Grand Slam final at her 43rd Major main draw appearance: in the Open Era, only Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova (52), Flavia Pennetta (49) and Roberta Vinci (44) have made their first final after more Major appearances

Vekic's best career result across all Grand Slams prior to 2024 Wimbledon was QF at the 2019 US Open and 2023 Australian Open

Vekic is the third Croatian player in the Open Era to make a Grand Slam semifinal after Iva Majoli (Roland Garros 1997) and Mirjana Lucic (Wimbledon 1999 and Australian Open 2017)

Vekic could become the second Croatian player in the Open Era to make a Grand Slam final after Iva Majoli at Roland Garros 1997 - when she eventually won the title in the final against Martina Hingis

Since 2013, when she made her first WTA level grass court semi-final, only Angelique Kerber (nine) has reached more SFs than Vekic on this surface (seven, level with Karolina Pliskova)

Since 2013, when she made her first WTA level grass court final, only Karolina Pliskova (seven) and Angelique Kerber (six) have reached more finals than Vekic on this surface (five)

After having reached the final in Bad Homburg (I. Shnaider), Vekic could make back-to-back finals in WTA tournament appearances for the first time in her career

Vekic could become the fifth player in the last 10 years to make two WTA grass court finals in a single year (Bad Homburg and Wimbledon) after Belinda Bencic (2015), Karolina Pliskova (2016), Ons Jabeur (2022) and Beatriz Haddad Maia (2022)

Vekic is the player with the most WTA main draw grass court wins in 2024 with a record of 10-3

Vekic has won five consecutive WTA main draw matches for the first time since February 2023, when she won the title in Monterrey - she could win 6+ matches in a row for the second time in her career after having won seven in a row between the United Cup and the Australian Open 2023

Vekic has made three WTA level semifinals in 2024 (Linz, Bad Homburg and Wimbledon), only in 2019 did she have more in a single calendar year (five)

Vekic has won one grass-court title (2017 Nottingham) and reached four other grass-court finals in her career, including a runner-up showing recently at Bad Homburg

Vekic is 1-3 against Top 10 players so far this year with her only win against No.2 Aryna Sabalenka at Dubai

Only Lulu Sun (189) has made more winners than Vekic at Wimbledon so far this year (143)

Jasmine Paolini:

Paolini is the first Italian woman to reach the Wimbledon semifinals in the Open Era; Italian women had previously gone 0-4 in Wimbledon quarterfinals

Paolini had not made a Slam QF before this season and is through to her second straight Grand Slam SF appearance this year (I. Swiatek in Roland Garros final)

Paolini is the first player to reach the final at Roland Garros and the semifinals at the Championships in the same year since Serena Williams in 2016

In the previous 25 years, only four players have made the final at Roland Garros and Wimbledon the same season: Steffi Graf (1999), Serena Williams (2002, 2015 and 2016), Venus Williams (2002) and Justine Henin (2006)

Paolini could become the first Italian player in the Open Era to reach Grand Slam finals at two different majors (Roland Garros and Wimbledon)

Paolini has won seven matches on grass this season but was winless at tour-level on the surface prior to 2024

Paolini is playing at a career-high No.7 after making maiden Grand Slam final at Roland Garros this season

By reaching the semifinal, Paolini will make her Top 5 debut in the PIF WTA Rankings after Wimbledon; the last Italian ranked in the Top 5 was Sara Errani the weeks of August 23, 2013

Since WTA rankings were published in 1975, the highest rank achieved by an Italian woman is No.4 by Francesca Schiavone

Paolini made her first grass semifinal last week at Eastbourne (l. eventual champion Kasatkina)

Paolini is the player with the most Grand Slam main draw wins in 2024 (14)

Paolini is the oldest player to reach her first semifinals in two different Grand Slams during the same season since Betty Stove in 1977

Paolini reached the semifinals in three consecutive WTA main draw appearances (Roland Garros, Eastbourne and Wimbledon) for the second time in her career after having done so in 2022 (Portoroz, Parma and Cluj-Napoca)

Paolini is the first player since Angelique Kerber to reach the semifinals in Eastbourne and Wimbledon in the same season (she lost to Wozniacki in SF in Eastbourne and eventually won the title at the Championships in 2018)

- Faces No.4 Elena Rybakina in SF today; owns 11 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently No.1 Iga Swiatek in the final at Dubai 2023
- Owns 4-1 career record against players from Kazakhstan
- Has never lost to Rybakina
- Record in WTA SF matches stands at 12-1
- Best career singles result on grass is runner-up, which she achieved at Birmingham 2023 (l. Ostapenko in final)
- Only player from Czech Republic to reach SF
- Best results by Czech players at Wimbledon were Champion runs by Marketa Vondrousova in 2023, Petra Kvitova in 2014 and 2011, and Jana Novotna in 1998
- Last time a player from Czech Republic reached SF at Wimbledon was 2023 (Vondrousova)
- Is currently ranked No.32; this time last year was ranked No.11
- During last year's European grass swing was runner-up at Birmingham and reached 2r at Wimbledon
- Has won 12 matches so far in 2024

- Is the only former champion remaining in the draw
- Has beaten Elena-Gabriela Ruse, Laura Siegemund, Caroline Wozniacki, Anna Kalinskaya (via retirement) and Elina Svitolina so far this week to reach her first SF since Madrid 2024 (l. Sabalenka)
- This is her second final in three years at Wimbledon
