MATCH NOTES - DAY 1 - MONDAY JULY 1, 2024

[2] Coco Gauff (USA #2) vs. Caroline Dolehide (USA #51)

Gauff leads 2-0

Five years after her debut as a 15-year-old, returns to Wimbledon seeded No.2 at a Slam for the first time... Swiatek and Gauff have the youngest combined age of a Top-seeded duo at Wimbledon since Serena Williams and Kim Clijsters in 2003... Gauff is the youngest Top 2 seed at Wimbledon since Maria Sharapova in 2007... Gauff owns a 16-3 record in Slam first rounds... Gauff is the reigning US Open champion and only player to make the SF or better at the last three Slams... Gauff has made a grass-court semifinal in each of the last three seasons... Gauff has won all four sets played against Dolehide... Making her third main draw appearance at Wimbledon, Dolehide is bidding to win her first main draw match here... Dolehide posted her best grass court result two weeks ago by making QF at Birmingham as a lucky loser... Dolehide 0-7 vs. Top 10 opposition in her career, bidding for her best win by ranking today

[3] Aryna Sabalenka (#3) vs. Emina Bektas (USA #107)

First meeting

Sabalenka is a two-time semifinalist (2021, 2023) and making her sixth main-draw appearance at Wimbledon... Sabalenka has won her last 15 Slam first rounds, with an overall record of 20-5... Sabalenka is bidding to become the 1st woman to win Australian Open and Wimbledon in the same year after since Serena Williams in 2015... Sabalenka has won 34 Slam matches over the last two seasons, the most on tour... Sabalenka has not lost to a player ranked outside the Top 100 since Rome 2023 (I. No.134 Kenin)... In only grass-court tournament of the year, Sabalenka retired with right shoulder injury vs. Kalinskaya in Berlin... Sabalenka is currently ranked No.2 on the PIF Race to the WTA Finals Leaderboard behind Iga Swiatek... Bektas is making her second Wimbledon appearance and 5th overall at a Slam... Bektas is bidding to win her first set and match at a major today... Bektas is facing a Top 10 opponent for the first time... Best career win for Bektas came on grass vs. No.36 Zhang Shuai at 2023 Birmingham

[7] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #7) vs. Sara Sorribes Tormo (ESP #55)

Tied 1-1

Paolini won most recent meeting at 2023 Palermo; only other meeting came nine years ago on ITF Circuit (on clay, won by Sorribes Tormo)... Paolini is 0-3 in opening round at Wimbledon, while Sorribes Tormo is 4-2... Paolini notched her first career main draw grass court win last week at Eastbourne en route to SF... With a season highlighted by winning a WTA 1000 title at Dubai and finishing as runner-up at Roland Garros, Paolini became the fifth Italian to crack the WTA Top 10 (on June 11)... Since start of 2019, Italian women are 4-17 at Wimbledon with Cocciaretto accounting for 3 of the 4 wins... Sorribes Tormo is making her 27th Grand Slam appearance having advanced past the second round twice... Sorribes Tormo is facing a Top 10 ranked opponent for the 19th time in her career; she is 1-17 vs. Top 10 with lone win coming over No.1 Ashleigh Barty at 2021 Olympics... Since 2000, the Roland Garros runner-up has lost in the opening round of Wimbledon five times: 2004 – Dementieva; 2010 – Stosur; 2018 – Stephens; 2019 – Vondrousova; and 2023 – Muchova

Martina Trevisan (ITA #89) vs. [12] Madison Keys (USA #13)

First meeting

Trevisan is making her 4th appearance at Wimbledon having lost in the opening round in her three previous appearances (2021, 2022, 2023); she is seeking her first career main draw win on grass... Playing in her 17th Grand Slam main draw, Trevisan has advanced past the second round twice - both at Roland Garros - 2020 (QF) and 2022 (SF)... Trevisan has six career Top 20 wins... A two-time Wimbledon quarterfinalist (2015, 2023), Keys owns a 38-5 record in opening round of Slams, including a 9-0 mark at Wimbledon... Keys enters Wimbledon on the back of reaching SF at Eastbourne (w/d prior to match vs. Fernandez)

[16] Victoria Azarenka (#16) vs. Sloane Stephens (USA #50)

Azarenka leads 5-4

Tenth meeting, and first on grass... Both are entered in ladies doubles, with Azarenka teaming up with Paula Badosa and Stephens partnering with Ashlyn Kreuger... Azarenka has the most Wimbledon appearances of any player in the draw with 16 including 2024... Azarenka has never won a grass court tournament, with her best result coming during a finalist run at Eastbourne 2010 (I. Makarova)... Stephens has not won against Azarenka since 2019... Among players in this year's main draw, only Angelique Kerber (38) has won more matches at Wimbledon than Azarenka (36)... In her last 12 Grand Slam appearances, Azarenka has only lost in the 1r once (at 2023 Roland Garros, I. Andreescu)

[LL] Renata Zarazua (#98) vs. [WC] Emma Raducanu (GBR #135)

First meeting

Raducanu is 7-1 in opening rounds of Grand Slams, while Alexandrova holds a 19-10 record in opening rounds (3-3 at Wimbledon)... Four former Grand Slam Champions (Kerber, Raducanu, Wozniacki and Osaka) will appear in a Women's Singles Major main draw thanks to wild cards for the first time in the Open Era... Raducanu enters Wimbledon after advancing to SF at Eastbourne, a run that included her first career win over a Top 10 ranked opponent (d. No.5 Pegula)... Ann Jones (1969) and Virginia Wade (1977) are the only two players from Great Britain to reach the Women's Singles final at Wimbledon

Diane Parry (FRA #53) vs. [WC] Naomi Osaka (JPN #113)

First meeting

Parry is making her third appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result came in 2022 with a 3r exit to eventual runner-up Ons Jabeur... Parry reached her best result on grass this year with a semifinal showing at Nottingham (I. eventual runner-up Karolina Pliskova)... Osaka returns to Wimbledon for the first time in five years, and looking for her first win since 2018... Wimbledon is the Grand Slam where Osaka has the fewest match wins (4)... Osaka recently reached the quarterfinals at 's-Hertogenbosch (I. Andreescu)... Osaka is fourth on Tour in Aces in 2024, with 186 struck

[WC] Heather Watson (GBR #199) vs. Greet Minnen (BEL #80)

First meeting

Watson is making her 14th appearance at Wimbledon, posting her best result in 2022 with 4r (I. Niemeier); also her best result across all Slams... Watson is among seven British players in the main draw singles... Watson has a 6-7 match record in 1r Wimbledon matches... Minnen is playing at Wimbledon for a fourth time and reached 2r in 2023 (I. Zheng)... Minnen equalled her best career grass court result at 's-Hertogenbosch this month with QF (also reached QF at 2019 's-Hertogenbosch); also her best result of 2024 season so far... Minnen's best result across all Slams was achieved at US Open where she reached 3r in 2023 and 2021

- One of 18 players from United States of Americato in the main draw
- Owns 7-11 career record against players from United States of America, with record in 2024 standing at 1-3
- Last American champion at Wimbledon was Serena Williams in 2016. Six American women have lifted the Venus Rosewater Dish in the Open Era: Serena Williams, Venus Williams, Lindsay Davenport, Martina Navratilova, Chris Evert and Billie Jean King
- Is currently ranked No.51; this time last year was ranked No.100
- During last year's grass swing reached 1r at Wimbledon
- Bidding for her 10th main draw Tour level win of the season today
- Winner of today's match will face either Olga Danilovic or Anca Todoni in the second round

- Only player to have made the SF or better at thelast three Slams
- Owns a 16-3 record in 1r at Grand Slams. At 84.2%, owns the eighth-best strike rate among active players (min. 6 MD appearances). Only 1r defeats came at 2020 US Open (l. Sevastova),2022 Australian Open (l. Q.Wang) and 2023 Wimbledon (l. Kenin)
- Is currently ranked No.2; this time last year was ranked No.7
- Faces No.51 Caroline Dolehide in 1r today; haswon all 4 previous sets contested
- Owns 28-12 career record against players from United States of America, with record in 2024 standing at 5-2; losses came to Jessica Pegula (Berlin) and Madison Keys (Madrid)
- Best career result on grass is SF which she has reached 3 times: Berlin in 2024 (l. Pegula); Eastbourne in 2023 (l. Keys); Berlin in 2022 (l.Jabeur)
- Seeded No.2 at a Grand Slam for the 1st time in her career; youngest woman to be seeded in the Top 2 at Wimbledon since Maria Sharapova(2007)
- No.1 Swiatek and No.2 Gauff are the youngest Top 2 seeds at Wimbledon in combined age (43years and 141 day son Monday, July 1st) since 2003 (Serena Williams and Kim Clijsters)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Outstanding result of 2023 was achieving R-Up at WTA 1000 Guadalajara (l. Sakkari). Also reached QF at Monterrey (as qualifier, l. Zhu) and 3r at Charleston (l. eventual champion, Jabeur) with results shooting her up the ranking, first breaking into Top 100 and then closing out season in Top 50.
- In doubles in 2023, achieved Grand Slam results of SF at Wimbledon (w/Zhang) and QF at Australian Open (w/Kalinskaya).
- In 2022 at Tour level, made 2r twice, while fell 1r four times and in qualifying on seven occasions (including at all four Grand Slams). In doubles, won Nottingham (w/Niculescu) and reached SF at US Open (w/Sanders)
- At Tour level in 2021, made 2r twice, while fell 1r four times and in qualifying on seven occasions (including at all four Grand Slams)
- Won maiden WTA doubles title at 2021
 Monterrey (w/Muhammad, d. Watson/Zheng in
 F). Last year, also finished R-Up at Nottingham
 (w/Sanders) and Chicago [500] (w/Vandeweghe),
 and made SF at US Open (w/Sanders)
- Triumphed at W60 ITF Circuit events in 2019 at first Concord and then Charleston
- Reached doubles SF at 2019 US Open (w/King)
- Highlight of 2017 season was reaching first tourlevel QF at Québec City (as qualifier, l. eventual champion Van Uytvanck). Achieved then careerbest ranking of No.137 following the tournament (September 18, 2017)
- Also in 2017 reached 2r at Stanford (as qualifier, l. Keys) and won second and third ITF Circuit titles of career, at \$60k ITF/Winnipeg-CAN and \$25k ITF/Surprise, AZ-USA
- Fell in qualifying at US Open and WTA events in Indian Wells, Nottingham, Cincinnati, Linz and Luxembourg
- Highlight of 2016 season was coming through qualifying to win maiden ITF Circuit title at \$10k ITF/Buffalo, NY-USA on clay (d. Herring in F).
 Also won doubles at same tournament w/Neel
- Owns six singles and nine doubles titles on ITF Circuit
- Made professional debut at \$10k ITF/Hilton Head Island 2, SC-USA (lost in qualifying)

- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Swiatek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top-10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Q.Wang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF

CAREER MILESTONES

- Played 2022 Tokyo in September before taking a 15 month break to give birth to daughter Shai in early July 2023
 - In 2022 had success at Miami, where she fell to Swiatek in the final, her first final since the 2021 Australian Open. Also reached the semifinals at Melbourne 250 #1 (withdrew before semifinal with Kudermetova w/abdominal injury)
- Won 2021 Australian Open (d. Brady in F) to become first woman since Seles in the early 1990s to win each of her first four Grand Slam finals - is the 16th woman to win four or more majors in the Open Era

- Won the first two titles of her career in 2018, at Indian Wells (d. Kasatkina in F) and debut Grand Slam crown at US Open (d. S.Williams in F)
- En route to the Indian Wells title, defeated fivetime major champion Sharapova, and A.Radwanska, Ka.Pliskova and Halep. Only set dropped all fortnight was against Sakkari in R16
- Reached one further final in 2018, at Tokyo [PPO] (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- In reaching R16 at 2018 Australian Open, became youngest Japanese player to reach R16 at a Slam since Sugiyama at 1995 Roland Garros (19y, 342d) and the youngest player from Japan to reach R16 in Melbourne since Date in 1990 (197, 122d)
- Book-ended 2017 season with QF showings at Auckland and Hong Kong; other highlights included 3r runs at Wimbledon and US Open
- Scored first Top 5 win of career when she defeated No.5 V.Williams at 2017 Hong Kong.

- First notable 2022 performance was 3r run at Roland Garros (l. Stephens) beating defending champion Krejcikova in 1r
- In the 2022 grass season, made SF at Gaiba 125 and 3r at Wimbledon (l. Jabeur)
- Series of impressive performances in 2022 started from QF at Palermo (l. Camelia Begu) followed by SF at Granby (l. Kasatkina), QF at Portoroz (l. Lena Friedsam), and QF at Monastir before 1r exits at Cluj Napoca, Rouen 125, and W80 Poitiers

- In 2023 reached semifinal at Guangzhou (l. Wang Xiyu); reached two WTA 125 finals, at Saint Malo (l. Stephens, but won doubles title w/Schoofs) and Kozerki (l. Yastremska); matched previous best Grand Slam result with 3r run at US Open (as qualifier, l. Kasatkina); on ITF Circuit, won two singles titles and three doubles titles (all w/Wickmayer)
- Strongest 2022 results were making second round twice, at Wimbledon (l. Zheng) and Bad Homburg (l. Lisicki)
- Advanced to maiden WTA SF at 2021 Prague (l. Martincova); also made QF at Lyon (l. Golubic)
- Reached 2r on Grand Slam main draw debut at 2020 Australian Open (as qualifier, d. Sasnovich, l. Rybakina)
- Scored first Top 50 win over No.33 Cibulkova during 2r showing at 2019 Stuttgart
- Advanced to QF on WTA main draw debut at 2019 Hobart (d. Kozlova and Linette, l. Cornet)
- Won first WTA title in doubles at 2018
 Luxembourg (w/Van Uytvanck, d. Lapko/Minella in F)
- Captured four ITF Circuit singles in 2018 at Solarino, Antalya, Oldenzaal and Santarem
- Jumped 578 ranking spots from start of 2018 to the end - from No.926 to No.348
- Lifted one ITF Circuit singles title in 2016, at \$10K ITF/Sharm El Sheikh-EGY
- Notched first two ITF singles titles in 2015, at \$15K ITF/Petange-LUX and \$10K ITF/Antalya 28-TUR
- Played first professional event at \$10K
 ITF/Maaseik-BEL, reaching the final (unranked, l. No.3 seed Arcangioli)
- In juniors, was R-Up in doubles (w/Hobgarski) at 2015 Australian Open (l. Kolodziejova/Vondrousova)

- 2023 season highlighted by SF run at Nottingham – qualified but lost to eventual champion Boulter in SF. Also had QF runs at Hua Hin (l. Wang Xinyu) and Warsaw (l. Wickmayer).

- At 2021 Birmingham became only the third British woman to make SF at the tournament (l. eventual champion Jabeur)

- Won mixed doubles title at Wimbledon in 2016 (w/Kontinen, d. Farah/Groenefeld in F) and finished R-Up in 2017 (w/Kontinen, l. Hingis/Murray)
- Represented Great Britain at 2016 Rio Olympics, reaching 2r in singles (l. Svitolina), 2r in doubles (w/ Konta, l. H.Chan/Y.Chan) and QF in mixed doubles (w/A.Murray, l. Bopanna/Mirza)
- Hit career-high singles ranking of No.38 on January 19, 2015 after title run at Hobart
- Two Top-10 wins of her career came over against No.8 A.Radwanska (2015 Indian Wells) and No.9 Cibulkova (2017 Eastbourne)
- Struggled throughout 2014 season with a right rib injury and missed two months in 2013 due to glandular fever (Miami to Roland Garros)
- Enjoyed a breakthrough 2012 season, winning Osaka to become first British woman to win a WTA singles title since Sara Gomer in 1988
- Broke into Top 100 on June 6, 2011 and made Top 50 debut on October 15, 2012
- Made WTA main draw debut as a wildcard at 2010 Miami and recorded first main draw match win at 2010 Eastbourne
- Played first professional event on ITF Circuit at 2009 ITF/Jersey-GBR
- Member of Great Britain Billie Jean King Cup Team, 2011-22 and Great Britain Olympic Team, 2012, 2016
- Won US Open junior singles title in 2009 (d. Buchina in F)
