MATCH NOTES – DAY 2 – TUESDAY JULY 2, 2024

[1] Iga Swiatek (POL #1) vs. Sofia Kenin (USA #49)

Swiatek leads 2-0

Swiatek won both previous meetings at Australian Open 2024 and Roland Garros 2020 (in F)... This match is the only first round match-up between two Grand Slam champions at Wimbledon 2024... Kenin owns one Grand Slam singles title at Australian Open 2020 (d. Muguruza in final), while Swiatek has five Grand Slam singles title at Roland Garros 2020, 2022-2024 and US Open 2022... Kenin has never lost an opening match at Wimbledon (4-0) while Swiatek's sole loss in 1r out of her 21 Grand Slam main draw appearances came at 2019 Wimbledon (I. Golubic)... Kenin has faced the world No.1 eight times in her career, with 3 wins over Barty at Australian Open 2020 (in SF, en route to title), Osaka at Cincinnati 2019 and Barty at Toronto 2019... The week of July 1 and July 8 will be Swiatek's 110th and 111th week atop the PIF WTA Rankings; she will remain at No.1 after Wimbledon regardless of results... Swiatek enters Wimbledon as the top seed for the tenth time in her career at the majors... Kenin owns one singles title on grass at Mallorca 2019 while Swiatek's best grass result was SF at Bad Homburg 2023... Having won Wimbledon girls' singles title in 2018, Swiatek could become the youngest player since Serena Williams (2002) to win Roland Garros and Wimbledon in the same season... Swiatek has won 43 matches so far in 2024 (43-4), ranked No.1 on tour for match wins... Swiatek enters the match with 19-straight wins:

- Swiatek would be the second active player to secure **multiple** 20-match win streaks at WTA Tour level after Venus Williams.
- The only other active players to secure 20-match win streaks are Naomi Osaka and Victoria Azarenka.
- The last player to achieve the feat by 24 was Justine Henin in 2005.
- Along with Henin, 7 other players in the Open Era have achieved multiple 20-match win streaks by that age – Goolagong, C. Evert, Navratilova, Graf, Seles, V. Williams, S. Williams in chronological order.

[4] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #4) vs. [Q] Elena-Gabriela Ruse (ROU #152)

Rybakina leads 1-0

Rybakina won their lone previous meeting in straight sets at 2022 Miami... Rybakina is the 2022 Wimbledon champion and is 14-2 lifetime in Wimbledon main-draw matches... Rybakina also reached the quarterfinals last year and lost to Ons Jabeur in a reversal of the 2022 final... Rybakina leads the tour in total aces this year (267) and has won 35 tour-level matches in 2024, second only to World No.1 Iga Swiatek's 43; Rybakina and Swiatek are tied for most singles final appearances this year (5 each)... Ruse is seeking her first Wimbledon main-draw win after opening-round losses in 2018, 2019 and 2022... Ruse is playing in her ninth career Grand Slam main draw after three straight-set victories in last week's qualifying event... Ruse is 1-3 against Top 10 players, with her prior Top 10 win coming over No.5 Paula Badosa at 2022 Dubai

[5] Jessica Pegula (USA #5) vs. Ashlyn Krueger (USA #75)

Pegula leads 1-0

Krueger is making main draw debut at Wimbledon, having played qualifying in 2023... This is Krueger's 4th main draw appearance across all majors, having contested 1r at US Open 2023, Australian Open 2024 and Roland Garros 2024... Krueger lost both her two previous meetings against Top 10 players, lost to today's opponent No.4 Pegula at Seoul 2023 and No.7 Jabeur at Beijing 2023... With a win today, Krueger would win her first main draw win at Grand Slams, also her first career Top 10 win... Krueger's best career result on grass is QF run at 's-Hertogenbosch 2023... Krueger currently ranked No.75 (career high No.65 achieved in May 2024)... Pegula is making her 5th main draw appearance at Wimbledon (8th overall), where her previous best result was reaching QF in 2023 (l. eventual champion Vondrousova)... Pegula's best result across all majors is QF on six occasions (Wimbledon 2023, Australian Open 2021-2023, US Open 2022 and Roland Garros 2022)... Pegula's record in 1r matches at Wimbledon is 3-1 (15-6 at all majors), with the only loss here coming in opening round in 2019 (l. Buzarnescu)... Pegula just won her first career singles title on grass at Berlin 2024 (d. Kasatkina in F)

Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (ESP #83) vs. [6] Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #6)

First meeting

Bouzas Maneiro is making her 2nd appearance at Wimbledon, where she has contested 1r in 2023 (as qualifier, l. Kalinina)... Bouzas Maneiro is making her 3rd Grand Slam main draw appearance overall, having also played opening round at Roland Garros 2024 (l. Fett)... Bouzas Maneiro is looking for her first Top 10 win today after her sole meeting against No.9 Ostapenko at Madrid 2024... A win today would be Bouzas Maneiro's first main draw win across all Grand Slams, first win on grass, and her first career Top 10 win... Bouzas Maneiro has won one Tour level match in 2024, at Madrid (as qualifier, d. Badosa)... Defending champion Vondrousova is making her 6th appearance at Wimbledon... Vondrousova is also a Roland Garros finalist (in 2019, l. Barty in F)... Vondrousova's record against opponents outside the Top 50 stands at 12-2 in 2024, with the only two losses coming at Australian Open (l. No. 93 Yastremska) and Strasbourg (l. No.56 Kalinina)... Vondrousova is currently ranked at a career-high No.6 (first achieved in Sept, 2023)... This time last year Vondrousova was ranked No.42 - the lowest ranked winner of the Women's Singles title at Wimbledon in the past 4 decades... Vondrousova is one of three Wimbledon champions in the field, along with Angelique Kerber (2018) and Elena Rybakina (2022)

[10] Ons Jabeur (TUN #10) vs. Moyuka Uchijima (JPN #68)

First meeting

Two-time runner-up Jabeur (2023, 2022) is making her seventh main-draw appearance at Wimbledon... This is Jabeur's 29th overall Grand Slam main draw appearance; has reached a major final three times at Wimbledon in 2023, 2022 and the US Open in 2022... Jabeur owns two career grass court titles at 2022 Berlin and 2021 Birmingham... Jabeur opened her 2024 grass-court season by reaching the quarterfinal stage at Nottingham (l. Ka. Pliskova) and Berlin (l. Gauff)... Since the start of 2019, Jabeur (37) has won more matches on grass than any other player to Tour (next most is Alexandrova and Ostapenko, 29 each)... Uchijima is making her first main draw appearance at Wimbledon... Uchijima is looking to earn her first career Top 10 win today in first meeting against Jabeur... Best result by a Japanese player at Wimbledon was semifinal run by Kimiko Date in 1996

[11] Danielle Collins (USA #11) vs. Clara Tauson (DEN #66)

Collins leads 2-0

Collins has won both previous encounters, with the most recent victory coming at the Australian Open in 2022... Collins is opening her 2024 grass court season here at Wimbledon in her sixth main-draw appearance, where her best result is reaching the 3r in 2022 (l. Martić)... Collins is making her 27th Grand Slam main-draw appearance; her best Slam results have come at the Australian Open, reaching the semifinal in 2019 and runner-up in 2022... Earlier this season, Collins enjoyed a 15-match win streak spanning across three surfaces (hard court in Miami, green clay in Charleston, and red clay in Madrid)... Tauson is making her third main draw appearance where her previous result was reaching 1r in 2022 (l. Hontama)... Tauson owns three wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently against No.11 Jelena Ostapenko at Roland Garros 2024... Tauson opened her 2024 grass-court season by falling first round at 's-Hertogenbosch and first round at Eastbourne qualifying

[29] Katie Boulter (GBR #32) vs. Tatjana Maria (GER #63)

Boulter leads 2-0

Boulter won both their previous meetings, one of which was on grass at 2022 Nottingham... Boulter posted her best Wimbledon results in 2023 and 2022 with 3r; also her best result across all Grand Slams... Entering 2024 Wimbledon, Boulter and Diana Shnaider have the most grass court wins this season with seven... At 36 years old, Maria is one of six players over the age of 35 in the Wimbledon main draw (along with Errani, Kerber, Siegemund, Zhang and Tsurenko)... Maria achieved her best result across all Slams at Wimbledon when she reached SF in 2022 (l. Jabeur)

[WC] Caroline Wozniacki (DEN #91) vs. [Q] Alycia Parks (USA #121)

First meeting

Wozniacki is making her 14th Wimbledon appearance and first since 2019; her best result is R16 which she has reached on six occasions... Wozniacki won the girls singles title here in 2006... Wozniacki is one of two players from Denmark, along with Clara Tauson... Wozniacki is 46-7 in opening round at Grand Slams, including 11-2 at Wimbledon... Parks is making her 2nd main draw appearance at Wimbledon previously reaching 2r in 2023 (l. Bogdan)... Parks achieved her best Slam result at Australian Open this year with 3r (l. Gauff)... Parks won WTA 125 Gaiba on grass prior to Wimbledon (d. Pera in F)

Harriet Dart (GBR #100) vs. [Q] Zhuoxuan Bai (CHN #95)

First meeting

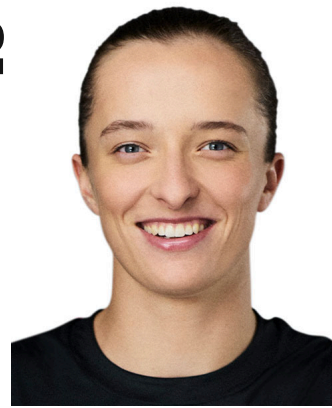
Dart's career-best showing at any Grand Slam event was her run to the Wimbledon third round in 2019 (l. to No.1 Ashleigh Barty)... Dart is a five-time tour-level quarterfinalist on grass, all in her home country of Great Britain, including at Eastbourne last week... Dart is one of seven British women contesting the singles main draw at their home major this year... Bai made her Grand Slam main-draw debut at Wimbledon last year as a qualifier, winning a round before falling to eventual finalist Ons Jabeur... Bai came through qualification again this year, winning her three matches in straight sets as the No.2 seed... Bai is one of nine Chinese women in the singles main draw

CAREER MILESTONES

- Strongest result of 2023 was runner-up at San Diego (l. Krejčíková). Also reached SF at Hobart (l. Cocciaretto) and Guadalajara (l. Dolehide). As a qualifier, posted her best Wimbledon result with 3r (l. Svitolina). Moved 202 positions up the ranking from her 2022 year-end position (from No. 235 to No.33).
- Best results of 2022 were QF at Adelaide (l. eventual champion Barty) and Cleveland (l. Pera). Missed clay and grass swings w/right ankle injury
- Missed second half of 2021 season due to ongoing foot injury and then testing positive for COVID-19
- In opening half of the 2021 campaign, standout results were QFs at Abu Dhabi and Yarra Valley Classic, and a R16 showing at Roland Garros
- Ended 2020 at career high of No.4 which she first hit on March 9, 2020 and came away with the 2020 WTA Player of the Year Award
- In last tournament of the season, finished R-Up at Roland Garros (l. Swiatek) for her first final appearance on clay
