# MATCH NOTES - DAY 3 - WEDNESDAY JULY 3, 2024

### [2] Coco Gauff (USA #2) vs. [Q] Anca Todoni (ROU #142)

### First meeting

Five years after her debut as a 15-year-old, Gauff returns to Wimbledon seeded No.2 at a Slam for the first time... Swiatek and Gauff have the youngest combined age of a Top-seeded duo at Wimbledon since Serena Williams and Kim Clijsters in 2003... Gauff is the youngest Top 2 seed at Wimbledon since Maria Sharapova in 2007... Gauff owns a 16-3 record in Slam first rounds... Gauff is the reigning US Open champion and only player to make the SF or better at the last three Slams... Gauff has made a grass court semifinal in each of the last three seasons... Todoni is making her Wimbledon and Grand Slam debut... Todoni claimed a WTA 125 clay court title last month at Gaiba... This is only the second career grass court tournament for Todoni (also WTA 125 Gaiba on grass)

### Greet Minnen (BEL #80) vs. [7] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #7)

#### First meeting

Playing in her 16th Grand Slam main draw, Minnen is bidding to equal her best result at a Slam having also reached R32 twice at the US Open (2021, 2023)... Minnen's only career Top 10 win came here at 2022 Wimbledon defeating No.10 Garbiñe Muguruza... Minnen equaled her best career result on grass recently by reaching the QF at 2024 's-Hertogenbosch... With a win today, Paolini would advance to the third round at a Slam for the third time this year - also R16 at Australian Open and R-Up at Roland Garros; prior to 2024, in her first 16 Slam appearances, she did not advance past the second round at a Slam... Paolini reached her first career grass court semifinal recently at 2024 Eastbourne

### Arantxa Rus (NED #56) vs. [9] Maria Sakkari (GRE #9)

#### Sakkari leads 5-0

Sakkari has won the previous five meetings, including an opening round win at 2021 Wimbledon 6-1, 6-1... Making her eighth main draw appearance at Wimbledon, Sakkari is bidding to equal her best result here with a win today; this is the only Slam she has not yet reached the R16... Overall this is Rus' 32nd career Grand Slam appearance, having reached the R32 three times previously; her last visit to the R32 came at 2012 Wimbledon... Rus recorded her last Top 10 win at 2012 Wimbledon (d. No.5 Samantha Stosur); since is 0-11 vs. Top 10 opponents; overall Rus has two Top 10 wins in her career... Rus reached a career-high ranking of No.41 in August 2023

### [14] Daria Kasatkina (#12) vs. [WC] Yuriko Lily Miyazaki (GBR #148)

First meeting

Kasatkina won the first grass court title of her career last week, winning Eastbourne (defeated Fernandez in the final)... Kasatkina is currently on a six-match winning streak (longest of career is seven, in 2021)... Kasatkina's best result at Wimbledon came in 2018 where she reached the QFs, losing to eventual champion Angelique Kerber... Miyazaki's defeat of Korpatsch in opening round was second Grand Slam main draw win after 1r victory over Betova at 2023 US Open.. Miyazaki owns 0-1 career record against Top 20 players; lost in 2r to No.13 Bencic at 2023 US Open... Miyazaki is currently the No.4 British woman (after Boulter, Dart and Raducanu)... At 2022 Wimbledon Miyazaki ranked No. 204 and took Caroline Garcia to a third set tiebreak in opening round

### Yafan Wang (CHN #71) vs. [12] Madison Keys (USA #13)

Keys leads 1-0

Keys won the only previous meeting at 2018 Wuhan... Wang is making her 16th Grand Slam main draw appearance; with a win today, she would equal her best result at a Slam - R32 at 2024 Australian Open... Wang owns threewins in career over Top 20 players, defeating No.7 Caroline Garcia (2023 US Open), No.5 Elina Svitolina (2019 Miami) and No.20 Samantha Stosur (2014 Guangzhou)... With a win, Wang would become the seventh Chinese woman to reach the R32 at Wimbledon... A two-time Wimbledon quarterfinalist, Keys is making her 10th appearance at Wimbledon... Keys is 30-8 in R64 matches (7-2 at Wimbledon)... Keys is one of three players in the draw with 100+ Grand Slam match wins - along with Caroline Wozniacki and Angelique Kerber

### [WC] Naomi Osaka (JPN #113) vs. [19] Emma Navarro (USA #17)

First meeting

Osaka returns to Wimbledon for the first time in five years, and her first round win over Diane Parry was her first Wimbledon win since 2018 when she reached 3r... Wimbledon is the Grand Slam where Osaka has the fewest match wins (5)... Osaka recently reached the quarterfinals at 's-Hertogenbosch (I. Andreescu)... By reaching 2r, Navarro has already reached her best result at Wimbledon after falling in the 1r last season (I. Alexandrova)... Navarro equaled her best grass court career result last month by reaching SF at Bad Homburg for a second consecutive year (I. eventual champion Shnaider)... Navarro earned her achieving her first Tour level career title this season at Hobart (d. Mertens in F)... Osaka is closing in on making her return to the Top 100

### Bianca Andreescu (CAN #176) vs. [26] Linda Noskova (CZE #26)

First meeting

Noskova is bidding to reach R32 at a Slam for the second time in her career after making QF at Australian Open this year (I. Yastremska)... Noskova is 9-1 in tie-break sets this year... Noskova's best career grass court result is 2r (Bad Homburg 2024, 2023; Berlin 2024)... Andreescu has three career Top 30 wins on grass throughout career defeating No.26 Anhelina Kalinina (2023 Wimbledon), No.27 Martina Trevisan and No.13 Daria Kasatkina (both at 2022 Bad Homburg)... Since returning from injury at 2024 Roland Garros, Andreescu reached the final at 's-Hertogenbosch on grass (I. Samsonova)... Andreescu won the US Open title in 2019 (d. S.Williams)

### Sloane Stephens (USA #50) vs. Diana Shnaider (#30)

First meeting

Stephens is making her twelfth main draw appearance at Wimbledon; her best result cam in 2013 with QF (I. Bartoli)... Stephens has reached two career Grand Slam finals in her career, winning the title at 2017 US Open (d. Keys in F) and finishing R-Up at 2018 Roland Garros (I. Halep in F)... Shnaider is making her Wimbledon main draw debut... Shnaider defeated former No.1 Karolina Pliskova in 1r... Shnaider is on a 6-match win streak (the longest of her career) following her title run at Bad Homburg; also her first grass court title

#### [WC] Emma Raducanu (GBR #135) vs. Elise Mertens (BEL #33)

First meeting

Four former Grand Slam Champions (Kerber, Raducanu, Wozniacki and Osaka) are in the Women's Singles Major main draw thanks to wild cards for the first time in the Open Era... Raducanu advanced to QF at Eastbourne last month, a run that included her first career win over a Top 10 ranked opponent (d. No.5 Pegula)... Ann Jones (1969) and Virginia Wade (1977) are the only two players from Great Britain to reach the Women's Singles final at Wimbledon... In her seventh Wimbledon main draw, Mertens reached her best result of 4r in 2022 and 2019... Mertens' best Grand Slam result was achieved at Australian Open with SF in 2018 (I. Wozniacki)... Mertens is currently No. 1 in the PIF WTA doubles ranking

### Clara Burel (FRA #45) vs. [Q] Sonay Kartal (GBR #298)

First meeting

Burel scored her first grass court victory of the 2024 season in the previous round, defeating Eva Lys... Burel is seeking her first appearance in the third round at Wimbledon ...Burel's last loss to a player outside the Top 200 was to Elina Svitolina at 2023 Strasbourg... Kartal's first round defeat of No.31 Sorana Cirstea was the first Top 50 win of her career; she is seeking her second such win today... Kartal came through qualifying to enter Wimbledon main draw, defeating Suzan Lamens, Sijia Wei, and Erika Andreeva... Kartal entered Wimbledon coming off a QF showing at ITF W100 Ilkley (I. Kimberly Birrell)

#### Paula Badosa (ESP #93) vs. Brenda Fruhvirtova (CZE #88)

First meeting

Badosa returned to the Top 100 (at No.93) this week following a QF run at Bad Homburg; has a career-high ranking of No.2 from April 2022... Badosa advanced to R16 at Wimbledon in 2021 and 2022... Badosa owns 7-4 record overall at Wimbledon after making main draw debut at Wimbledon in 2019... At 17 years and 103 days, Fruhvirtova is the youngest player remaining in the women's draw... Fruhvirtova took out fellow teenager, Mirra Andreeva – also 17 years old – in the opening round on Monday... Fruhvirtova's win over Andreeva in 1r was her second career Grand Slam main draw win (after 1r at 2024 Australian Open – d. Bogdan)... Fruhvirtova is one of eight Czech women in the main draw here this year

### **CAREER MILESTONES**

• Winner (1): 2024 - WTA 125 Bari;

- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Swiatek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top-10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Q.Wang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF
- At 15y 214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y 177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15y 144d, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Hingis won Hamburg at 14y 219d)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut defeating V.Williams in 1r (l. eventual champion Halep) - followed with 3r showing at US Open (as WC, l. Osaka)
- Made WTA main draw debut as a wildcard at 2019 Miami where she earned her first WTA main draw win over good friend McNally (l. Kasatkina in 2r)

- Made professional debut in May 2018 as a qualifier into the \$25K ITF/Osprey, FL-USA
- Member of US Billie Jean King Cup team in 2022
- Former Junior World No.1 (July 2018); won 2018
  Roland-Garros girls' title (d. McNally in F) and
  2018 US Open doubles title (w/McNally), while
  finished R-Up at 2017 US Open girls' event (l.
  Anisimova) becoming the youngest girls' singles
  finalist in tournament history at 13-years-old

### **CAREER MILESTONES**

- Won first WTA 1000 title in 2023 at Guadalajara (d. Dolehide in F). Also finished R-Up at Washington (l. Gauff). Contested WTA Finals for third consecutive season (was first alternate and went 0-3 in Group Stage following Muchova withdrawal).
- Finished 2022 ranked No.6 for the second consecutive year; a four-time finalist in 2022 including runs to the final at two WTA 1000 tournaments – Indian Wells and Guadalajara [1000]; returned to the WTA Finals advancing to the semifinals, falling to eventual champion Caroline Garcia.
- Climbed as high as No.3 in the rankings (March 21, 2022), the highest ranking every achieved by a Greek woman.

### **CAREER MILESTONES**

- 2023 was a difficult season for Badosa; while she made the SF at Adelaide #2, reached backto-back QF at Charleston and Stuttgart and an additional QF at Rome, she withdrew from Roland Garros with a back injury. Her last match of the year was at Wimbledon, where she fell in the R64. She ended her season afterwards due to continuing injury
- In 2022, Badosa rose to career-high ranking of No.2 (April 25), won one title, at Sydney and advanced to SF at Indian Wells, Stuttgart and San Jose
- Captured the first two WTA singles titles of her career in 2021 at Belgrade (d. Konjuh in F) and Indian Wells (d. Azarenka in F
- Qualified for AKRON WTA Finals Guadalajara, where she advanced to the SF stage
- Broke into the WTA Top 20 on October 18, 2021 after winning the Indian Wells title and reached the Top 10 on November 8, 2021
- Nominated for 2021 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year (won by Krejcikova), as voted on by members of the media
- In 2021 also advanced to SF at Madrid, Charleston and Lyon and QFs at Roland-Garros, Cincinnati and Olympics
- At 2020 Roland Garros, upset former finalist Stephens and 2017 champion Ostapenko en route to reaching R16 for the first time at a major. That year also reached SF at Istanbul (l. Bouchard)
