# MATCH NOTES - DAY 4 - THURSDAY JULY 4, 2024

#### [1] Iga Swiatek (POL #1) vs. Petra Martic (CRO #85)

Swiatek leads 3-0

Swiatek has won all three of their previous meetings in straight sets, including in the Wimbledon third round last year... Swiatek has won her last 17 second-round matches at Grand Slam events... Swiatek has won 44 matches so far in 2024 (44-4), ranked No.1 on tour for match-wins... Martic is playing in her 12th Wimbledon main draw and has reached the Round of 16 three times (2017, 2019 and 2022)... Martic is contesting her 50th career Grand Slam main draw this fortnight; her career-best Grand Slam result is reaching the 2019 Roland Garros quarterfinals... Martic has posted eight Top 10 wins in her career, but she is 0-5 against reigning World No.1 players... The week of July 1 and July 8 will be Swiatek's 110th and 111th week atop the PIF WTA Rankings; she will remain at No.1 after Wimbledon regardless of results... Swiatek enters Wimbledon as the top seed for the tenth time in her career at the majors... Having won Wimbledon girls' singles title in 2018, Swiatek could become the youngest player since Serena Williams (2002) to win Roland Garros and Wimbledon in the same season...

- Swiatek's first-round win over Sofia Kenin made her the second active player to secure <u>multiple</u> 20match win streaks at WTA Tour level (also Venus Williams)
- The only other active players to secure 20-match win streaks are Naomi Osaka and Victoria Azarenka.
- The last player to achieve the feat by 24 was Justine Henin in 2005.
- Along with Henin, 7 other players in the Open Era have achieved multiple 20-match win streaks by that age Goolagong, C. Evert, Navratilova, Graf, Seles, V. Williams, S. Williams in chronological order.

## [4] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #4) vs. Laura Siegemund (GER #72) Rybakina leads 4-1

2022 Wimbledon champion Rybakina is making her fourth main-draw appearance, where she holds a 15-2 record in main draw matches... Rybakina also reached the quarterfinals last year and lost to Ons Jabeur in a reversal of the 2022 final... Rybakina has won four of the five previous encounters against Siegemund, with the most recent victory coming at 2022 Portoroz... Rybakina has won 36-tour level matches in 2024, second only to World No.1 Iga Swiatek's 44; Rybakina and Swiatek are tied for most singles final appearances this year (5 each)... Siegemund is making her fifth main-draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result has been reaching the 2r in 2019 (I. Strycova)... Siegemund owns 10 wins in career over Top 10 players, most recently against No.5 Maria Sakkari at 2022 Stuttgart... Siegemund's best career result on grass-court is QF at 2021 Bad Homburg (I. Siniakova)

#### Xinyu Wang (CHN #42) vs. [5] Jessica Pegula (USA#5)

First meeting

Pegula is making her fifth main-draw appearance at Wimbledon (8<sup>th</sup> overall), where her previous best result was reaching the quarterfinal in 2023 (I. eventual champion Vondrousova)... Pegula's best result across all majors is reaching the quarterfinal stage on six occasions (Wimbledon 2023, Australian Open 2021-2023, US Open 2022, and Roland Garros 2022)... Wang is making her third main-draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result is reaching 2r in 2023 (I. Kenin)... A win today would mark Wang's first career Top 10 win... Best result by a Chinese player at Wimbledon was semifinal run by Jie Zheng in 2008 ... Pegula has just won her first grass-court title at 2024 Berlin (d. Kasatkina in F)... The United States of American has won Wimbledon 57 times, most recently by Serena Williams in 2016

## [10] Ons Jabeur (TUN #10) vs. [Q] Robin Montgomery (USA #161) First meeting

Two-time runner-up Jabeur (2023, 2022) is making her seventh main-draw appearance at Wimbledon... This is Jabeur's 29<sup>th</sup> overall Grand Slam main draw appearance; has reached a major final three times at Wimbledon in 2023, 2022 and the US Open in 2022... Jabeur owns two career grass court titles at 2022 Berlin and 2021 Birmingham... Jabeur opened her 2024 grass-court season by reaching the quarterfinal stage at Nottingham (I. Ka. Pliskova) and Berlin (I. Gauff)... Since the start of 2019, Jabeur (38) has won more matches on grass than any other player on Tour (next most is Ostapenko, 30)... Jabeur's record against opponents outside Top 100 stands at 4-1 in 2024 season, with the only loss coming against to No.131 Volynets at Indian Wells 2024... Record in 2r matches at Grand Slams stands at 15-4, while 3-1 at Wimbledon, with the only loss coming in 2018 (I. Siniakova)... Montgomery is making main-draw debut appearance at Wimbledon, having played qualifying in 2023... Overall this is Montgomery's third Grand Slam main-draw showing, having contested 1r at US Open 2023 (I. Lys) and 2020 (I. Putintseva)... As qualifier, Montgomery has beaten Olivia Gadecki in 1r, which is her first main draw win at any Slam... With a win today Montgomery would achieve her first career Top 10 win, having failed both of her previous meetings against such opponents - I. No.2 Sabalenka at Madrid 2024, No. 6 Gauff at San Diego 2022

### [11] Danielle Collins (USA #11) vs. [Q] Dalma Galfi (HUN #127) Ga

Galfi leads 1-0

Galfi won the only previous meeting at 2023 Indian Wells... Galfi reached the main draw via qualifying... Prior to Wimbledon, Galfi reached her first career grass court semifinal at 's-Hertogenbosch... This is the third time Galfi is facing a Top 20 opponent; she is seeking her first career Top 20 win and would equal her career best Grand Slam result with a win today... Collins has won 32 matches so far in 2024; this is her second 30+ win season (also 2021)... At least one American has reached the R16 at Wimbledon every year in the Open Era with the exception of 2014... Collins is opening her 2024 grass court season here at Wimbledon in her sixth main-draw appearance, where her best result was reaching the 3r in 2022 (I. Martic)... Collins is making her 27th Grand Slam main-draw appearance; her best Slam results came at the Australian Open, reaching semifinal in 2019 and runner-up in 2022... Earlier this season, Collins enjoyed a 15 match winning streak spanning across three surfaces (hard court in Miami, green clay in Charleston, and red clay in Madrid)

#### [13] Jelena Ostapenko (LAT #14) vs. [Q] Daria Snigur (UKR #130)

First meeting

Ostapenko is making her ninth main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was making semifinal in 2018 (I. eventual champion Kerber); also made quarterfinal in 2017 (I. V. Williams) and R16 in 2022 (I. Maria)... Overall this is her 33rd Grand Slam main draw appearance and she owns one major title, winning 2017 Roland Garros... Ostapenko's best career result on grass came at 2023 Birmingham where she won the title in 2023 (d. Krejcikova in final)... As a qualifier, Snigur is making her first main draw appearance at Wimbledon... Snigur owns three wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently against Marta Kostyuk at 2024 Nottingham... Snigur opened her 2024 grass-court season by reaching the R16 at Eastbourne (I. Raducanu)... Snigur's best result at a Grand Slam was reaching R64 at the 2022 US Open (I. Marino)

#### Elina Avanesyan (#77) vs. [15] Liudmila Samsonova (#15)

First meeting

Avanesyan is making her Wimbledon main-draw debut this year after losing in the second round of qualifying last year... Avanesyan has a 5-2 career win-loss record against Top 20 players... Avanesyan has made back-to-back Round of 16 appearances at the last two editions of Roland Garros... Samsonova made the Wimbledon Round of 16 in her tournament main draw debut in 2021... Samsonova won the grass court title in 's-Hertogenbosch last month and is 7-2 on grass so far this year... Samsonova's first WTA title came on grass, when she won 2021 Berlin as a qualifier ranked outside the Top 100

#### Jule Niemeier (GER #90) vs. [21] Elina Svitolina (UKR #21)

First meeting

Six of Niemeier's nine main draw wins at the Grand Slams have come at Wimbledon; her best result was reaching QF in 2022 (I. Maria), also her best result across all Slams... Niemeier has won three Tour level main draw matches on grass so far this season with one of those a Top 10 win over No.9 Maria Sakkari at Bad Homburg... Making 10th appearance at Wimbledon, Svitolina has twice reached the SF (2019, 2023) - the best result by a Ukranian woman at the tournament... This is Svitolina's 7th time being seeded at The Championships... Svitolina is 3-3 in R64 at Wimbledon (27-7 overall at the Slams)

[WC] Caroline Wozniacki (DEN #91) vs. [30] Leylah Fernandez (CAN #25) First meeting

Wozniacki is making her 14<sup>th</sup> Wimbledon appearance and first since 2019; her best result is R16 which she has reached on six occasions... Wozniacki won the girls singles title here in 2006... Wozniacki's best result at a Slam was winning the title at Australian Open 2018 (d. Halep in F); also reached the final at US Open 2009 (l. Clijsters) and 2014 (l. S. Williams)... Wozniacki beat Alycia Parks in 1r, raising her 1r record to 12-2 at Wimbledon, with the only two losses coming in 2016 (l. Kuznetsova) and 2012 (l. Paszek)... Wozniacki owns two singles title on grass at Eastbourne 2018 and 2009... First time seeded at Wimbledon, Fernandez is making her third appearance at Wimbledon... Fernandez posted her best result at Grand Slams at US Open 2021 with R-Up (l. Raducanu)... Fernandez has beaten Lucia Bronzetti in 1r and reached consecutive 2r, after doing so in 2023 (l. Garcia)... Fernandez is looking to her first 3r at Wimbledon... Fernandez achieved her best career result on grass at Eastbourne last week with R-Up (l. Kasatkina); is currently ranked No.25; this time last year was ranked No.95

## Harriet Dart (GBR #100) vs. [29] Katie Boulter (GBR #32)

#### **Boulter leads 6-1**

Boulter and Dart are facing each other for an eighth time, with this being their third meeting at Tour level; Boulter won both those encounters at 2023 Nottingham in the QF and 2024 Nottingham in 1r... Boulter posted her best Wimbledon results in 2023 and 2022 with 3r; also her best result across all Grand Slams... Boulter and Diana Shnaider have the most grass court wins so far this season with eight... Dart is making her sixth main draw appearance at Wimbledon, with a best result of 3r as a wild card in 2019 (I. No.1 Ashleigh Barty); also her best result across all Slams... A win today would be Dart's second career 3r across all Slams after Wimbledon 2019... Dart owns 10 wins in career over Top 50 players (2-5 in 2024), most recently No.48 Sofia Kenin at Eastbourne

- Won six titles across 2023, including winning fourth Grand Slam title at Roland-Garros (d. Muchova in F) and going undefeated at the WTA Finals in Cancun (d. Pegula in F). Finished season as WTA World No.1 player for second consecutive year.


