MATCH NOTES - DAY 5 - FRIDAY JULY 5, 2024

[2] Coco Gauff (USA #2) vs. [Q] Sonay Kartal (GBR #298)

First meeting

Gauff will be the fourth player in the Open Era to face qualifiers/lucky losers in the second (Anca Todoni) and third (Sonay Kartal) rounds in women's singles at the Championships after Elena Dementieva in 2003, Alexandra Dulgheru in 2010 and Anastasia Potapova in 2023; only Dementieva made the fourth round... Among active players, only Iga Swiatek and Venus Williams hold a better winning percentage in women's singles matches at Grand Slam events than Coco Gauff (75.7%, 56-18)... Gauff only dropped one game on serve (2/3 break points saved) in the first two rounds in Wimbledon 2024... Gauff will stay at No.2 in the PIF WTA Rankings after Wimbledon regardless of her result here...Gauff is the youngest Top 2 seed at Wimbledon since Maria Sharapova in 2007... Gauff is the reigning US Open champion and only player to make the SF or better at the last three Slams... Gauff has made a grass court semifinal in each of the last three seasons

Kartal is the sixth British woman to reach R32 as a qualifier at a Slam - Sarah Loosemore (1990 Australian Open), Karen Cross (1997 Wimbledon), Elena Baltacha (2005 Australian Open), Johanna Konta (2015 US Open) and Emma Raducanu (2021 US Open)... This is Kartal's first match-up vs a Top 10 opponent (previous highest ranked opponent she faced was No.18 Madison Keys at 2023 Wimbledon)... Kartal is bidding to become the first qualifier/lucky loser to defeat a Top 2 seeded opponent at a Slam since Mirjana Lucic at the US Open 2014 (vs Simona Halep)... Kartal could become the second qualifier/lucky loser to defeat a Top 2 seeded opponent in Wimbledon after Jelena Dokic in 1999 (vs Martina Hingis)... Kartal is the first British player to make the Ladies' Singles third round at Wimbledon as a qualifier since Karen Cross in 1997 (she eventually lost in R3 to Iva Majoli)... By reaching the R32 as a qualifier, Kartal will return to the Top 200 and reach a career-high ranking

[7] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #7) vs. Bianca Andreescu (CAN #176)

Paolini leads 1-0

Paolini defeated Andreescu at the same 3r stage at Roland Garros this year in their only previous meeting... Paolini is playing at a career-high No.7 after making maiden Grand Slam final at Roland Garros last month... Paolini had not won a Tour-level main draw match on grass before this year... Paolini made her first grass semifinal last week at Eastbourne (I. eventual champion Kasatkina)... Paolini was 0-3 at Wimbledon before 1r win over Sorribes Tormo... Paolini had not made a Slam R16 before this year; a win today would put her into her 3rd straight (Australian Open – R16; Roland Garros – F)... Andreescu made 3r at Roland Garros this season after a 10-month injury lay-off... Andreescu made her second grass-court final in the second tournament of her return at 's-Hertogenbosch (I. Samsonova)... Andreescu is bidding for her first Top 10 win on grass... A win today would put Andreescu into her first R16 at a Slam since 2021 US Open

[WC] Emma Raducanu (GBR #135) vs. [9] Maria Sakkari (GRE #9) Raducanu leads 1-0

Raducanu made her first semifinal of the year and first of her career on grass at Nottingham... Raducanu earned her first Top 10 win of her career by saving match point to beat No.5 Jessica Pegula in Eastbourne last week.... Raducanu is one of three British women into the third round (Kartal, Dart)... Ann Jones (1969) and Virginia Wade (1977) are the only two players from Great Britain to reach the Ladies' Singles final at Wimbledon... Sakkari's first round win over McCartney Kessler snapped a four-match losing streak... Sakkari is bidding to make her first R16 at a Slam since 2022 Australian Open... A win today for Sakkari would be her best Wimbledon result after reaching the 3r for a fourth time

[14] Daria Kasatkina (#12) vs. Paula Badosa (ESP #93)

Tied 2-2

Badosa won their most recent meeting at 2023 Stuttgart and this is their first meeting on grass... Badosa returned to the Top 100 (at No.93) this week following a QF run at Bad Homburg; has a career-high ranking of No.2 from April 2022... Badosa advanced to R16 at Wimbledon in 2021 and 2022... Kasatkina is currently on a career-best seven-match win streak after winning her first grass court title last week at Eastbourne (d. Fernandez)... Kasatkina is bidding to make the fourth round at Wimbledon for the first time since her career-her best run was to the QF in 2018 (I. eventual champion Kerber)... Kasatkina has lost just three games in her first two rounds, including a 6-0, 6-0 win in the last round

[18] Marta Kostyuk (UKR #19) vs. [12] Madison Keys (USA #13)

Keys leads 1-0

Keys and Kostyuk meet again in the third round at Wimbledon - their only previous encounter which Keys won in straight sets last year... A two-time Wimbledon quarterfinalist, Keys is making her tenth main draw appearance here... Keys owns 63 career wins over Top 20 players, most recently against No.12 Danielle Collins at Strasbourg 2024... Keys owns three career grass court titles at Eastbourne (2023, 2014) and Birmingham (2016); also reached the semifinal at Eastbourne earlier this grass season (I. Fernandez)... Kostyuk is making her fourth main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best previous result was reaching 3r in 2023 (I. Keys)... Kostyuk owns 9 career wins over Top 20 players, most recently No.8 Marketa Vondrousova at Stuttgart 2024... Kostyuk's best career result on grass is reaching R16 at 2022 Eastbourne and 2021 Birmingham

Diana Shnaider (#30) vs. [19] Emma Navarro (USA #17)

Shnaider leads 2-0

Shnaider won first two meetings, both in 3-sets, including a recent win in the Bad Homburg SF en route to her first grass-court title... In the first two rounds Shnaider defeated a two-time Grand Slam finalist (Karolina Pliskova) and 2017 US Open champion (Sloane Stephens)... Shnaider is currently on a 7-match winning streak, the longest winning streak of her career... Shnaider owns 4 wins in career over Top 20 players, including two wins in 2024... Navarro is making her 7th Grand Slam appearance; with a win today would equal her best result at a Slam (also R16 at 2024 Roland Garros)... Navarro has won 31 matches so far in 2024 and is one of six players to reach the 30+ win mark this year... Navarro leads the Tour in 2024 in 3-set matches played (19) and 3-set match wins (13)... Navarro equaled her best grass court career result last month by reaching SF at Bad Homburg for a second consecutive year (I. eventual champion Shnaider)... Navarro achieved her first Tour level career title this season at Hobart (d. Mertens in F)

[28] Dayana Yastremska (UKR #27) vs. Donna Vekic (CRO #37)

Tied 3-3

The pair has faced each other on six occasions, with Vekic claiming their most recent meeting at 2024 Linz; Vekic also won their only match on grass at 2022 Eastbourne... Yastremska is making her third main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best previous result was reaching R16 in 2019 (I. S.Zhang)... Yastremska's career best at a Grand Slam was SF at the Australian Open earlier this year (I. Q.Zheng)... Yastremska owns 35 wins in career over Top 50 players, most recently against No.24 Mirra Andreeva at 2024 Bad Homburg... Vekic is making her tenth main draw appearance at Wimbledon, reaching a best result of R16 in 2018 (I. Goerges)... Vekic's best career result across all Grand Slams is QF at the 2019 US Open and 2023 Australian Open... Vekic owns one title on grass, lifting the title at 2017 Nottingham (d. Konta in F)... Vekic also reached the final at Bad Homburg last week (I. Shnaider in F)

[Q] Lulu Sun (NZL #123) vs. Lin Zhu (CHN #61)

First meeting

Sun is making her first main draw appearance at Wimbledon, as a qualifier... Sun has defeated No.8 seed Qinwen Zheng and qualifier Yuliia Starodubtseva en route to her first time reaching the 3r at a Grand Slam... With a win today, Sun would become the first player from New Zealand to reach the R16... Zhu is making her sixth main draw appearance here with a previous best result of 2r in 2021 (I. Mertens); fell 1r at Wimbledon last year (I. Swiatek)... Zhu's best result across all Grand Slams was a R16 run at 2023 Australian Open (I. Azarenka)... Zhu's best career result on grass is reaching SF at Brimingham in 2023 (I. Krejcikova)... The best result by a Chinese player at Wimbledon was SF run by Jie Zheng in 2008

CAREER MILESTONES

- So far in 2024, has won three ITF singles titles, W35 Loughborough, W35 Nottingham as well as W35 Monzon
- Played first Tour level main draw matches in 2022 at Nottingham and Wimbledon; both on grass
- Won first ITF title in 2021 at Antalya 15K; also won Monastir 15K that year
- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
- In 2022, reached maiden Grand Slam final at Roland-Garros (l. Swiatek); was the youngest major finalist since Sharapova won 2004 Wimbledon
- Made Top-10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was completing singles-doubles title sweep at Parma; defeated Q.Wang in singles final and teamed up w/McNally to win doubles
- In 2021 also reached SF at Adelaide and Rome, while at the Slams made QF at Roland-Garros and R16 at Wimbledon
- Finished R-Up in doubles at 2021 US Open (w/McNally, l. Stosur/Zhang)
- First cracked the Top 50 on February 24, 2020 at No.49, following a R16 appearance at Australian Open to tie her career best Grand Slam result during run, defeated V.Williams in 1r and her first Top-5 opponent in No.4 Osaka in 3r (l. eventual champion Kenin in 3s)
- Enjoyed breakout season in 2019, highlighted by maiden WTA singles title at Linz (as lucky loser, d. Ostapenko in F) - earned her first Top-10 win en route to title over No.8 Bertens in QF
- At 15y 214d, her title run in Linz made her youngest to win a WTA tour-level title since Vaidisova (15y 177d) won Tashkent in 2004
- Also claimed maiden WTA doubles titles at Washington, DC (w/McNally, d. Sanchez/Stollar in F) and Luxembourg (w/McNally, d. Christian/Guarachi in F)
- By winning the doubles title at Washington, DC at 15y 144d, became the youngest player to win a doubles title since May 1995 (Hingis won Hamburg at 14y 219d)
- Reached R16 at 2019 Wimbledon on Grand Slam main draw debut defeating V.Williams in 1r (l. eventual champion Halep) - followed with 3r showing at US Open (as WC, l. Osaka)
