MATCH NOTES – DAY 6 – SATURDAY JULY 6, 2024

[1] Iga Swiatek (POL #1) vs. Yulia Putintseva (KAZ #35)

Swiatek leads 4-0

Swiatek won all four of their previous meetings in straight sets... Swiatek has won 45 matches so far in 2024 (45-4), ranked No.1 on tour for match-wins... The week of July 1 and July 8 will be Swiatek's 110th and 111th week atop the PIF WTA Rankings; she will remain at No.1 after Wimbledon regardless of results... Swiatek has made R32 for the 18th consecutive Grand Slam: in the Open Era, only Martina Navratilova (35), Conchita Martinez (30), Arantxa Sanchez Vicario (25) and Steffi Graf (19) had more in a row... Swiatek's 2r win over Petra Martic was her 21st consecutive match win: the last player to achieve 20+ consecutive match wins was Serena Williams between the WTA Finals 2014 and Madrid 2015... Only four times in the Open Era has the top seeded player lost in the R32 at Wimbledon: 2008 (Ana Ivanovic vs. Jie Zheng), 2014 (Serena Williams vs. Alize Cornet), 2018 (Simona Halep vs. Su Wei Hsieh) and 2022 (Iga Swiatek vs. Alize Cornet)... Swiatek could become the youngest player since Serena Williams (2002) to win Roland Garros and Wimbledon in the same season

Putintseva has made 3r at Wimbledon for the first time in her career... Putintseva is looking to make her fourth Grand Slam 4r after Roland Garros 2016, 2018 and US Open 2020... Putintseva is undefeated on grass so far this season with a consecutive grass court winning streak of 7-0 after claiming the title at Birmingham: this is her longest career winning streak in Tour level main draw matches... Putintseva won only one of her previous eight meetings against the World No.1, however this was her only such meeting on a grass court at Birmingham 2019 against Naomi Osaka

[4] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #4) vs. [WC] Caroline Wozniacki (DEN #91)

First meeting

2022 Wimbledon champion Rybakina is making her fourth main-draw appearance, where she holds a 16-2 record in main draw matches... Rybakina also reached the quarterfinals last year and lost to Ons Jabeur in a reversal of the 2022 final... With a win today, Rybakina will reach the 4r at Wimbledon for the fourth consecutive season... Rybakina is the only former champion remaining in the draw... Wozniacki is seeking her first Top 10 win since 2018 (d. Petra Kvitova at WTA Finals)... Wozniacki saved two match points in the previous round against Leylah Fernandez... Wozniacki is looking for her seventh appearance in the R16 at Wimbledon, after previously reaching the stage in 2009-2011, 2014, 2015, and 2017... This is the only Grand Slam in which Wozniacki has never reached QF or better... Wozniacki owns two singles title on grass at Eastbourne 2018 and 2009...

[10] Ons Jabeur (TUN #10) vs. [21] Elina Svitolina (UKR #21)

Svitolina leads 3-1

Svitolina won three of their four meetings, including their most recent encounter at 2021 Chicago 500; today will be their first meeting on grass... Svitolina is making her tenth appearance at Wimbledon, where she achieved the best result by a Ukrainian woman by reaching the semifinal twice (2019, 2023)... Overall this is her 42nd Grand Slam main draw appearance, having advanced to the semifinal three times: twice at Wimbledon and also 2019 US Open... Svitolina is seeded for the 7th time at The Championships; she has now brought her Grand Slam win tally to 94 after reaching the 3r here... Two-time runner-up Jabeur (2023, 2022) is making her seventh main-draw appearance at Wimbledon... This is Jabeur's 29th overall Grand Slam main draw appearance; has reached a major final three times at Wimbledon in 2023, 2022 and the US Open in 2022... Jabeur owns two career grass court titles at 2022 Berlin and 2021 Birmingham... Jabeur's consecutive runner-up runs have been Tunisia's best results at Wimbledon...

[11] Danielle Collins (USA #11) vs. [20] Beatriz Haddad Maia (BRA #20)

First meeting

Collins has won 34 matches so far in 2024; this is her second 30+ win season (also 2021)... At least one American has reached the R16 at Wimbledon every year in the Open Era with the exception of 2014... Collins has equaled her previous best result at Wimbledon, also reaching 3r in 2019 (l. Petra Martic)... Collins has never reached a QF on grass courts... Collins is making her 27th Grand Slam main-draw appearance; her best Slam results came at the Australian Open, reaching semifinal in 2019 and runner-up in 2022... Earlier this season, Collins enjoyed a 15 match winning streak spanning across three surfaces (hard court in Miami, green clay in Charleston, and red clay in Madrid)... Haddad Maia has won two of her three career titles on grass (Nottingham and Birmingham, both in 2022)... Haddad Maia is seeking her best win-by-ranking since defeating No.6 Maria Sakkari at 2024 Madrid ... Haddad Maia has not won four matches in a row yet this season; the last time she won more than three consecutive matches was during her championship run at the 2023 WTA Elite Trophy in Zhuhai

Bernarda Pera (USA #97) vs. [13] Jelena Ostapenko (LAT #14)

Tied 1-1

Pera has advanced past the 1r at Wimbledon for the first time, in her sixth main appearance... Pera last won consecutive main draw matches at WTA Tour-level at 2023 US Open, where she reached the 3r – lost to today's opponent, Ostapenko... Pera is one of five American women (and only unseeded one) to reach the 3r this year (Gauff, Collins, Navarro, Keys)... Ostapenko is in the 3r at Wimbledon for the fifth time in her career; best showing at Wimbledon remains SF run in 2018 (l. eventual champion Kerber)... Ostapenko owns two career singles titles on grass – at 2021 Eastbourne and 2023 Birmingham... Overall this is her 33rd Grand Slam main draw appearance and she owns one major title, winning 2017 Roland Garros

[17] Anna Kalinskaya (#18) vs. [15] Liudmila Samsonova (#15)

Samsonova leads 1-0

Kalinskaya is making her third main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her previous and best result here was reaching 1r in 2021 (l. Osorio)... Overall this is Kalinskaya's 16th Grand Slam main draw appearance; her best result across the Slams is reaching QF at the Australian Open this year... Kalinskaya achieved her best grass court result this season by reaching the final at Berlin... Samsonova made the Wimbledon R16 in her tournament main draw debut in 2021... Samsonova won the grass court title in 's-Hertogenbosch last month and is 8-2 on grass so far this year... Samsonova's first WTA title came on grass, when she won 2021 Berlin as a qualifier ranked outside the Top 100... Samsonova is playing the 17th Grand Slam main-draw of her career, where her best results are reaching the R16 twice: 2021 Wimbledon and 2022 US Open

[31] Barbora Krejckova (CZE #32) vs. Jessica Bouzas Maneiro (ESP #83)

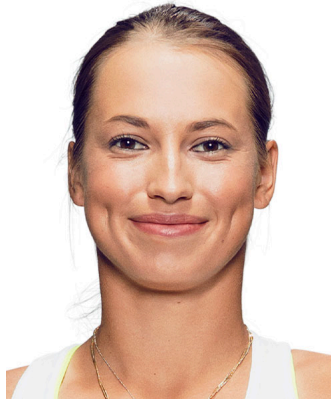
First meeting

Krejckova is making her fourth main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching R16 in 2021 (l. eventual champion Barty)... The 2021 French Open champion, Krejckova is making her 18th Grand Slam appearance; other notable Grand Slam results include reaching QF four times at the Australian Open (2024, 2022), US Open (2022), and during her title run at 2017 Roland Garros... Krejckova is the only player from the Czech Republic still in the draw... Bouzas Maneiro is making her second main draw appearance at Wimbledon and third Grand Slam main draw appearance overall... Bouzas Maneiro defeated the defending champion Marketa Vondrousova in the opening round at Wimbledon to mark her first career Top 10 win... Bouzas Maneiro is one of two players from Spain left in the draw (Paula Badosa)... Bouzas Maneiro is currently ranked at a career high of No.83 (achieved on June 24, 2024)

Harriet Dart (GBR #94) vs. Xinyu Wang (CHN #42)

Dart leads 1-0

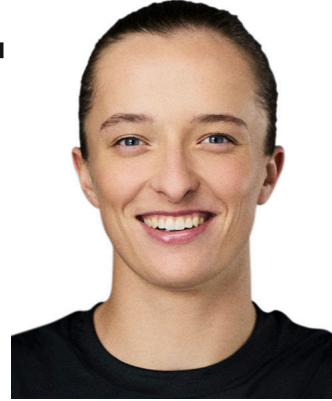
Dart won their only previous encounter in qualifying at Melbourne (250) in January 2022... Dart is looking to reach the second week of a Grand Slam for the first time in her career – previous best Slam run was 3r at 2019 Wimbledon, where she lost to world No.1 Ash Barty... Dart is one of three British women to advance to the 3r here; the last time three or more British women reached the same stage at Wimbledon was 1984 (Anne Hobbs, Julie Salmon, Jo Durie, Virginia Wade, Annabel Croft)... Wang defeated No.5 and recent Berlin champion Jessica Pegula in 2r here for first Top 10 win of her career... Wang is looking to equal her career-best Grand Slam result with a win today; also reached R16 at 2023 US Open, where she lost to Muchova... Wang is one of two Chinese women to reach the 3r here this fortnight (also Zhu Lin)... Best result by a Chinese player at Wimbledon was semifinal run by Jie Zheng in 2008

- Owns five Grand Slam singles titles (Roland Garros 2020, 2022-2024; US Open 2022)
- Has defeated Sofia Kenin and Petra Martic - both in straight-sets - so far this week
- Faces No.35 Yulia Putintseva in 3r today; looking to advance to R16 for 3rd time at Wimbledon
- Owns 15-3 record in R32 matches at the Slams (2-1 at Wimbledon)
- Owns 7-4 career record against players from Kazakhstan, with record in 2024 standing at 3-1
- Best career result on grass is semifinal run at Bad Homburg in 2023
- Best result by Poland at Wimbledon was Runner-Up run by Agnieszka Radwanska in 2012
- Is currently ranked No.1, spending her 110th and 111th career weeks atop the PIF WTA Rankings; has held the No.1 ranking for 111 of the last 119 weeks (Sabalenka held the No.1 spot for 8 weeks after 2023 US Open)
- During last year's grass swing reached QF at Wimbledon, SF at Bad Homburg; did not play any other grass-court events leading into Wimbledon in 2024
- Is currently on a 21-match winning streak; longest winning streak of her career was 37 matches in 2022; Swiatek is the 9th player in the Open Era have achieved multiple 20-match win streaks by age 24 - Goolagong, C. Evert, Navratilova, Graf, Henin, Seles, V. Williams, S. Williams in chronological order
- Has won a Tour-leading 45 matches so far in 2024

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2023 saw Putintseva reach SF at Guangzhou (l. Linette) and QF at Rabat (l. Riera) and Hobart (l. Blinkova)
- Reached two SFs in 2022, at Istanbul (l. eventual champion Potapova) and Budapest (l. Kronic), while made QF at Toronto (l. Pegula)
- Highlight of 2021 campaign was lifting second career title, at Budapest (d. Kalinina in F)
- Also last season was R-Up at Nur-Sultan (l. Van Uytvanck), advanced to SF at Portoroz and made QFs at Charleston [500], Strasbourg and San Jose
- Recorded 300th career win (at all levels) with 1r triumph over Flipkens at 2020 Roland Garros
- Standout results of 2020 were QF runs at US Open (l. Brady) - first Kazakh woman to reach last eight in New York - and Rome (l. Halep)
- Owns one win over a reigning World No.1, upsetting Osaka on grass at 2019 Birmingham

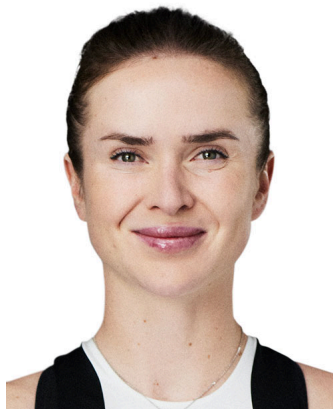

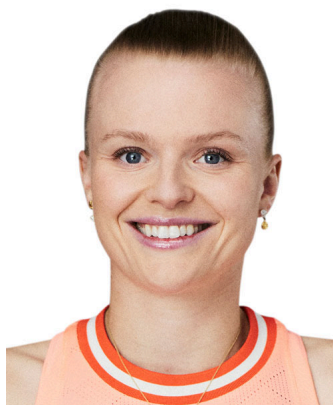

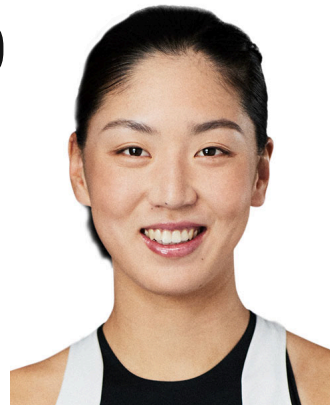
