MATCH NOTES - DAY 7 - SUNDAY JULY 7, 2024

[19] Emma Navarro (USA #17) vs. [2] Coco Gauff (USA #2)

Gauff leads 1-0

Gauff won the only previous meeting against Navarro, at Auckland earlier this year... This is Gauff's 12th time advancing to R16; she is 7-4 in R16 matches at the Slams, but 0-2 at Wimbledon; this is the only Slam she has not yet reached the QF... It is the first time Gauff has reached the fourth round of the first three Grand Slams of the year... Gauff has registered her 13th win in Grand Slams during 2024, only in 2023 has she registered more wins in Grand Slams (14)... Gauff will stay at No.2 in the PIF WTA Rankings after Wimbledon regardless of her result here... Gauff is the youngest Top 2 seed at Wimbledon since Maria Sharapova in 2007... Gauff is the reigning US Open champion and only player to make the SF or better at the last three Slams...

Navarro is making 7th Grand Slam appearance; by reaching R16 has equaled her best result at a Slam (also R16 at 2024 Roland Garros)... This is Navarro's third time facing a Top 2 ranked opponent; two previous times came this year against Sabalenka with a win at 2024 Indian Wells and falling at 2024 Roland Garros... This is the 56th edition of Wimbledon in the Open Era; at least one American has reached the QF 51 times (including this year)... Navarro would be the 38th different American to reach the Wimbledon QF in the Open Era... Navarro equaled her best grass court career result last month by reaching SF at Bad Homburg for a second consecutive year (I. eventual champion Shnaider)... Navarro achieved her first Tour level career title this season at Hobart (d. Mertens in F)

Three Americans are through to R16 in the top half - Gauff, Navarro, Keys - with Collins still to play; At Wimbledon, last time 3 Americans were through to R16 at Wimbledon was 2019 (3) and the last time 4 Americans were through to R16 was 2016 (4)

[7] Jasmine Paolini (ITA #7) vs. [12] Madison Keys (USA #13)

Keys leads 1-0

Keys won their only previous encounter at Dubai 2023 and today is their first meeting on grass... Paolini is playing at a career-high No.7 after making maiden Grand Slam final at Roland Garros this season... A win today for Paolini would be her first Top 20 win on grass... Paolini had not won a Tour-level main draw match on grass before this year... Paolini made her first grass semifinal last week at Eastbourne (I. eventual champion Kasatkina)... Paolini had not made a Slam R16 before this season and is through to her 3rd straight Grand Slam R16 appearance this year (Australian Open – R16; Roland Garros – F)... With a win, Paolini would equal the best result by an Italian woman at Wimbledon in the Open Era; she would join Camila Giorgi (2018), Francesca Schiavone (2009), Silvia Farina Elia (2003) and Laura Golarsa (1989) as Wimbledon quarterfinalists

With a win today, Keys would reach her third Wimbledon QF in her tenth appearance here... Keys owns 28 career wins over Top 10 players, most recently No.9 Jabeur in QF at Madrid this season; a win today would be her third top 10 win this year (also defeated No.3 Gauff)... Keys owns three career grass court titles at Eastbourne (2023, 2014) and Birmingham (2016); also reached the semifinal at Eastbourne earlier this grass season (I. Fernandez)... Among active players, only Venus Williams (79.0%, 98-26) and Petra Kvitova (76.3%, 74-23) own a better match win percentage on grass than Keys (76.2%, 48-15)

First meeting

This will be only the second time in the Open Era where a qualifier and wild card meet from the women's singles R16 onwards at a Grand Slam event, after Justine Henin defeated Yanina Wickmayer (R16) en route to the final at the 2010 Australian Open... This is the first time a player representing New Zealand will reach the R16 at Wimbledon; overall this is the fourth time in the Open Era at a Grand Slam a woman from New Zealand has reached the R16 - Judy Chaloner (1979 Australian Open; R16 was second round) and Belinda Cordwell (1988 Australian Open, 1989 Australian Open)... By reaching the R16 as a qualifier, Sun will become the first player from New Zealand to be ranked in the PIF WTA Ranking Top 100 since Marina Erakovic (week of August 31, 2015), moving into at least the Top 80

Raducanu received a main draw wild card; the best result by a wild card at Wimbledon is semifinalist (Svitolina - 2023; Lisicki - 2011; Zheng Jie - 2008)... With her win over No.9 Maria Sakkari in R32, Raducanu has become only the fifth women's player from Great Britain to achieve consecutive WTA top 10 wins in the past four decades, after Jo Durie, Laura Robson, Johanna Konta and the last to achieve the feat in 2022, Katie Boulter... A player ranked outside the WTA's Top 100 has now reached the Ladies' Singles R16 at Wimbledon each year since 2017.... Raducanu has registered her 16th win in 2024 (including Billie Jean King Cup matches), another win would see her equal her most wins in a single season in the WTA during her career (17 in 2022)... Through to her second R16 at Wimbledon, Raducanu joins Sue Barker (19767 and 1977) and Glynis Cole (1973 and 1975) as the only other British women to reach multiple R16 at Wimbledon before turning 22 years old

With a win today:

- Raducanu would be the 7th British woman to reach the QF at Wimbledon in the Open Era joining Sue Barker, Jo Durie, Ann Jones, Johanna Konta, Virginia Wade and Winnie Woolridge
- Raducanu (21 years, 243 days old) would join Sue Barker as the only British woman in the Open era to reach the Wimbledon QF at 21 years old or younger; Barker reached QF in 1976 (at 20 years, 75 days) and 1977 (at 21 years, 74 days)

The winner of Sun and Raducanu will join a list of quarterfinalists ranked outside the Top 100 in the last 40 years to reach the Wimbledon quarterfinals:

Paula Badosa (ESP #93) vs. Donna Vekic (CRO #37)

First meeting

Badosa is playing in the R16 at Wimbledon for a third time in her career (also in 2021, I. Muchova and 2022, I. Halep)... Badosa is looking to equal her best result across all Slams by reaching QF (reached QF once before at 2021 Roland Garros)... Badosa has a grass court record of 5-1 so far this season... Badosa returned to the Top 100 (at No.93) this week following a QF run at Bad Homburg; has a career-high ranking of No.2 from April 2022... Badosa would be the fifth Spanish woman to reach the QF stage at Wimbledon joining Arantxa Sanchez Vicario (6 times), Conchita Martinez (4 times), Garbine Muguruza and Magui Serna... Vekic is making her tenth main draw appearance at Wimbledon and equals her best result by reaching R16 (also in 2018, I. Goerges)... Vekic's best career result across all Grand Slams is QF at the 2019 US Open and 2023 Australian Open... Vekic owns one title on grass, lifting the title at 2017 Nottingham (d. Konta in F)... Vekic has a grass court match record of 8-3 so far in 2024 including a run to the Bad Homburg final in the week prior to Wimbledon (l. Shnaider in F)... Vekic would be the fourth Croatian woman to reach the quarterfinals at Wimbledon along with Mirjana Lucic, Karolina Sprem and Iva Majoli

- One of 3 players from United States of America to reach 4r in the top half
- Is currently ranked No.2; this time last year was ranked No.7
- Has won 35 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.3 on tour for match wins, behind Iga Swiatek, Elena Rybakina

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2023 was a stand-out year, achieving a career best with semifinal at WTA 500 San Diego (l. Kenin) and ending season with a ranking of No. 32. Also reached two quarterfinals on clay; Strasbourg (l. Blinkova) and Palermo (l. eventual champion Zheng) and one semifinal on grass; Bad Homburg (l. Siniakova).
- In 2022, posted 31-18 win-loss record. At Tour-level, made 2r at Charleston (as WC, l. Jabeur), fell 1r at Monterrey (as WC, l. Zacarias) and Indian Wells (as WC, l. Anisimova), and contested qualifying at San Diego
- Elsewhere in 2022, reached three ITF Circuit finals, including lifting second career title at this level at W60 tournament in Liepaja, Latvia, while made SF at WTA 125K Series event in Vancouver
- Broke into Top 200 for the first time on March 7, 2022
- Lifted maiden ITF Circuit title at W25 event in Orlando in November 2021
- Won the NCAA division 1 women's singles title in May 2021 to earn a WC into US Open, where she fell 1r (l. McHale)
- In 2021, reached 2r at both Charleston [500] and Charleston [250]
- Fell 1r at 2020 Monterrey (l. Stephens)
- Only other events in 2020 came on ITF Circuit, ending year ranked No.463
- Owns three ITF Circuit titles in singles and one in doubles
- Fell 2r on professional debut at \$10k Charleston, SC-USA (l. Di Lorenzo) in 2015
- Began her collegiate career by winning her first 14 NCAA singles matches and moving up to a No.6 ITA ranking
- Ended 2019 at No.3 in ITF Junior rankings, following a season that included a R-Up finish at Roland Garros (l. Fernandez), a SF run at Wimbledon and victory at the Adidas Easter
- Also R-Up in girls' doubles at 2019 Australian Open w/Beck

- Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023
 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d.
 Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles
 in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at
 Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at
 Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250
 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with
 Pegula after US Open.

CAREER MILESTONES

- 2023 was a difficult season for Badosa; while she made the SF at Adelaide #2, reached backto-back QF at Charleston and Stuttgart and an additional QF at Rome, she withdrew from Roland Garros with a back injury. Her last match of the year was at Wimbledon, where she fell in the R64. She ended her season afterwards due to continuing injury
- In 2022, Badosa rose to career-high ranking of No.2 (April 25), won one title, at Sydney and advanced to SF at Indian Wells, Stuttgart and San Jose
- Captured the first two WTA singles titles of her career in 2021 at Belgrade (d. Konjuh in F) and Indian Wells (d. Azarenka in F
- Qualified for AKRON WTA Finals Guadalajara, where she advanced to the SF stage
- Broke into the WTA Top 20 on October 18, 2021 after winning the Indian Wells title and reached the Top 10 on November 8, 2021
- Nominated for 2021 WTA Most Improved Player of the Year (won by Krejcikova), as voted on by members of the media
- In 2021 also advanced to SF at Madrid, Charleston and Lyon and QFs at Roland-Garros, Cincinnati and Olympics
- At 2020 Roland Garros, upset former finalist Stephens and 2017 champion Ostapenko en route to reaching R16 for the first time at a major. That year also reached SF at Istanbul (l. Bouchard)
- Campaign in 2019 highlighted by SF run at Palermo (l. Bertens) and QF showing at Seoul (l. Y.Wang); also fell 1r on Grand Slam main draw debut at Australian Open (as qualifier, l. Birrell)
- Finished 2018 inside Top 200 for the first time (at No.143); picked up three ITF titles at \$25k ITF/Glasgow-UK, ITF/\$25k Les Franqueses del Valles - FRA and ITF/\$60k Valencia-ESP
- Fell in qualifying at 2018 Wimbledon, Madrid and US Open
- Claimed third title on ITF Circuit in 2017 at ITF/\$25k El Espinar; Fell 1r at Miami and in qualifying at Madrid
- In 2016, fell 1r at Miami, Madrid and Mallorca and in qualifying at Rio de Janeiro
- As wildcard, made breakthrough on WTA Tour with 3r run at 2015 Miami Open (l. Ka.Pliskova)
- Came through qualifying at 2015 Madrid, fell 1r to Errani via ret. w/left leg injury
- Continued at ITF Circuit level during 2013-2014 before playing second WTA qualifying draw at

- In 2023, posted best Australian Open result with QF (l. eventual champion Sabalenka), equalling best Grand Slam result (QF finish at 2019 US Open). Claimed fourth career title at Monterrey (d. Garcia) and runner-up at Berlin (l. Kvitova). Results brought ranking back into Top 20 for first time since 2019 and qualification for Zhuhai Elite Trophy.
- 2022's highlight was R-Up finish at San Diego (as qualifier, l. Swiatek). Elsewhere, made QF at Birmingham and Tallinn
- Lifted third WTA title of her career at Courmayeur in October 2021 (d. Tauson in F)
- Underwent knee surgery at start of 2021, but experienced some setbacks since her return to Tour last summer, tearing plantar fascia and suffering from knee and foot injuries in spring 2022
- Contested the first match of the WTA Tour's resumption following the hiatus, defeating Rus in the 1r at 2020 Palermo
- Ended 2019 ranked No.19 for career-best yearend finish (up from No.34 in 2018), having cracked the Top 20 for the first time on October 21, 2019
- Produced career best Grand Slam result at 2019
 US Open, where she reached QF (l. Bencic)
- Also in 2019, finished R-Up at St. Petersburg (l. Bertens); en route to final, posted best win of career by ranking and third over a Top 5 opponent with defeat of No.2 Kvitova in QF, bettering victories over No.4 Stephens at 2018 Wimbledon and No.4 Garcia at 2018 Tokyo [PPO]
- Also made final at Nottingham (l. Garcia in third set tie-break) and ended 2019 by qualifying for WTA Elite Trophy Zhuhai (fell RR)
- Ended 2018 at then-career-high ranking of No.34, after registering 31 tour-level wins.
 Campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Washington, DC (l. Kuznetsova after holding 4mp) - her first finals appearance since winning 2017 Nottingham - and made SF showings at Nottingham and Tokyo [PPO], and reached Grand Slam R16 for first time at Wimbledon (l. Goerges)
- Enjoyed a resurgent year in 2017, breaking the Top 50 on July 24 and finishing campaign ranked No.54. Grass court season saw her lift a second WTA singles title of career, at Nottingham (d. No.8 Konta in final) - prior to this run had not posted back-to-back main draw wins since September 2015 (R-Up at Tashkent)

- 2015 Antwerp, where she advanced to 2r (l. Bodarenko)
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2013 Palermo, winning one match via retirement before falling in 2r (l.Gatto-Monticone) Won first title on ITF Circuit at \$10k ITF/Sant Jordi-ESP in 2012; now owns seven singles titles at this level
- Played first professional tournament of career at \$10k ITF/Gexto-ESP in 2012 (l. in 1r)
- Won girls' singles title at 2015 Roland Garros (d. Kalinskaya in F) and reached QF at Roland Garros and Wimbledon in 2014; finished 2015 as No.8 in ITF World Junior rankings
- Posted just four tour-level wins across 2016, but closed the campaign by reaching two ITF finals, winning her fifth and most recent title at this level at \$100k ITF/Sharm El Sheikh-EGY
- Highlights in 2015 included reaching final at Tashkent (l. Hibino) and QF at Baku
- Ranked No.95, lifted maiden WTA singles title at 2014 Kuala Lumpur (d. No.10 Cibulkova in final); aged 17 y 10 m, became youngest player to win a WTA singles title since 2006 Bangkok (Vania King)
- Reached first WTA career final at 2012 Tashkent (l. Begu) on her WTA main draw debut, and in doing so became youngest WTA finalist since 15year-old Paszek won Portoroz in 2005
- Broke into Top 100 (at No.93) on January 28, 2013 Has won five ITF Circuit singles and one doubles title
- Member of Croatian Fed Cup Team, 2012-15, 2017, 2019
