MATCH NOTES - DAY 8 - MONDAY JULY 8, 2024

[4] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #4) vs. [17] Anna Kalinskaya (#18)

Rybakina leads 2-1

Kalinskaya and Rybakina are playing for the 4th time, with Rybakina winning two of the previous meetings in 2023 at Miami and Rome and Kalinskaya advanced at 2023 Madrid... Today is their first meeting on grass... With a win today 2022 Wimbledon champion Rybakina would register 18 wins from her first 20 matches at Wimbledon; as many as Margaret Court, Maria Sharapova, Conchita Martinez, Evonne Goolagong, Chris Evert and Billie Jean King for the most during the Open Era... A win would also see Rybakina register a win percentage of 90% at Wimbledon, making her the third player in the Open Era to register a win rate of 90% in the women's singles draw at Wimbledon after Ann Jones and Steffi Graf... Rybakina could become the first player to reach 11 quarterfinals in the first seven months of the season since Carla Suarez Navarro in 2015, and the third player after Iga Swiatek and Aryna Sabalenka to register 10 wins against Top 20 during 2024... Rybakina is the only player remaining in the draw to have reached a Wimbledon final

Kalinskaya has reached her second career Grand Slam R16 (Australian Open 2024 and Wimbledon 2024)... Before this season Kalinskaya had never made a 3r at any major... Kalinskaya's record on grass in 2024 season is now 7-1, with the only loss coming against Pegula in Berlin final... Kalinskaya's record against Top 10 players stands at 7-2 in 2024 (10-7 in career), with the only two losses this year to No.5 Pegula at Berlin (in F) and No.9 Sakkari at Miami... Kalinskaya has won 23 matches so far in 2024, already her highest career tally in a single calendar year... With a win today, Kalinskaya would reach her fourth quarterfinal in 2024 (after the Australian Open - QF, Dubai - F and Berlin - F), and it would be the first season of her career with 4+ WTA level QFs

Yulia Putintseva (KAZ #35) vs. [13] Jelena Ostapenko (LAT #14)

Tied 2-2

First meeting since 2021... Ostapenko lost 10 games in the first week to make her first R16 at a Slam this season, the fewest dropped through the first three rounds at Wimbledon since 2014... Ostapenko is bidding to make first Wimbledon quarterfinal since her semifinal run in 2018... Ostapenko is one of six players to win multiple WTA titles this season (Adelaide, Linz)... Ostapenko owns two career singles titles on grass – at 2021 Eastbourne and 2023 Birmingham... Overall this is Ostapenko's 33rd Grand Slam main draw appearance and she owns one major title, winning 2017 Roland Garros... Ostapenko is one of three remaining players to have previously reached the QF at Wimbledon – along with Rybakina and Svitolina; Ostapenko reached QF in 2017 and SF in 2018

Putintseva is unbeaten on grass this year and is on an eight-match win streak; this is her longest career winning streak in Tour level main draw matches ... Before this year, Putintseva had never made it past the second round at Wimbledon... Putintseva won her first grass title and third career title overall at Birmingham last month... Putintseva won 12 of the last 15 games to defeat No.1 Iga Swiatek in the third round, her second career win over a reigning No.1... Putintseva is bidding to make her first Slam guarterfinal since 2020 US Open

[21] Elina Svitolina (UKR #21) vs. Xinyu Wang (CHN #42)

First meeting

Svitolina is looking to reach the quarterfinals of Wimbledon for the third time in her career; it could be second Grand Slam event that she has QF appearances in consecutive years after the Australian Open 2018-19... Svitolina is 17-6 against opponents ranked outside 30 in WTA events during 2024, eight of those wins have come at Grand Slams... In her tenth Wimbledon appearance, Svitolina achieved the best result by a woman from Ukraine reaching SF twice (2019, 2023)... Overall this is her 42nd Grand Slam main draw appearance, having advanced to the semifinal three times: twice at Wimbledon and also 2019 US Open... Svitolina is seeded for the 7th time at The Championships; she has now brought her Grand Slam win tally to 95 after reaching the 4r here... Svitolina has 95 career match wins at the Slams, 9th most among active players

Wang is the fifth Chinese player in the Open Era to make R16 at Wimbledon, most recently Shuai Zhang in 2019 en route to QF... Wang has equalled her best career result at a Grand Slam event, having made R16 at the US Open 2023 (I. Muchova)... Wang is the first player to make 4r at Wimbledon with three completed 3-setters en route to the R16 since 2019 (Alison Riske and Petra Martic)... Wang is looking to reach her ninth career WTA level QF, but the first on grass court (all previous eight have been on hard court)... Wang defeated No.5 and 2024 Berlin champion Jessica Pegula in 2r here for first Top 10 win of her career... Best result by a player from China at Wimbledon is SF by Zheng Jie in 2008... Wang would become the fourth Chinese woman to reach the QF at Wimbledon – Zheng Jie (2018, SF), Zhang Shuai (2019, QF) and Li Na (QF in 2006, 2010, 2013)

[11] Danielle Collins (USA #11) vs. [31] Barbora Krejcikova (CZE #32)

Krejcikova leads 1-0

Krejcikova is bidding to make her second Slam quarterfinal of the year (also Australian Open)... Wimbledon is the only Slam at which Krejcikova has not made a quarterfinal... Krejcikova reached a career-high ranking of No.2 in 2022; has also spent 19 weeks in her career at No.1 in the doubles ranking... Krejcikova is aiming for first Top 20 win of the season... Krejcikova is making her fourth main draw appearance at Wimbledon, where her best result was reaching R16 in 2021 (I. eventual champion Barty)... The 2021 French Open champion, Krejcikova is making her 18th Grand Slam appearance; other notable Grand Slam results include reaching QF four times at the Australian Open (2024, 2022), US Open (2022), and during her title run at 2021 Roland Garros... Krejcikova is the only player from the Czech Republic still in the draw...

Collins enjoyed a 15-match winning streak in the spring, winning her first WTA 1000 title in Miami followed by WTA 500 Charleston... In five previous appearances at Wimbledon, Collins made it past 2r only once... Collins is bidding to become the third American woman since 2000 to reach the Wimbledon QF after turning 30 after the Williams sisters... This is the first time four Americans have made Wimbledon R16 since 2016 (Collins, Keys, Navarro & Gauff)... Collins has won 35 matches so far in 2024; this is her second 30+ win season (also 2021)... At least one American has reached the R16 at Wimbledon every year in the Open Era with the exception of 2014... Collins has never reached a QF on grass courts... Collins is making her 27th Grand Slam main-draw appearance; her best Slam results came at the Australian Open, reaching semifinal in 2019 and runner-up in 2022... Collins announced in January that 2024 will be her final season

With a win Collins (30 years, 213 days) would become the oldest American to make her Wimbledon QF debut

- Faces No.4 Elena Rybakina in 4r today; record against Top 10 playres stands at 7-2 in 2024 (10-7 in career), with the only two losses to No. 5 Pegula at Berlin (in F) and No.9 Sakkari at Miami
- Owns 1-2 career record against players from Kazakhstan, all against today's opponent Rybakina, having won at Madrid 2023 while lost at Miami 2023 and Rome 2023
- Best career result on grass is Runner-Up at Berlin 2024
- Is currently ranked No.18 (close to peak rank No.17 at June 24, 2024); this time last year was ranked No.61
- Has won 23 matches so far in 2024, which is already her highest career tally in a single calendar year

- Has beaten Elena-gabriela Ruse, Laura Siegemund and Caroline Wozniacki to reach 4r
- Record in 4r at Grand Slams stands at 5-1, with the only loss coming at Wimbledon 2021 (l. Sabalenka)
- Faces No.18 Anna Kalinskaya in 4r today; owns 43 wins in career over Top 20 players, most recently No.19 Elina Svitolina at Roland Garros 2024
- Best result on grass was her championship run at Wimbledon in 2022
- One of 2 players from Kazakhstan to reach 4r (along with Putintseva)
- Last time 2 players from Kazakhstan reached 4r at Wimbledon was 2014
- Is currently ranked No.4; this time last year was ranked No.3 which is her peak rank (achieved on June 12)
- During last year's European Grass swing reached QF at Wimbledon, 2r at Berlin
- Has won 38 matches so far in 2024; she is ranked No.2 on tour for match wins, behind Iga Swiatek (45)

CAREER MILESTONES

- Made three QF runs across 2023 Austin (l. Collins), Charleston (l. Jabeur), and Osaka (l. Krueger).
- Highlight of 2022 was SF run at Guadalajara 250 (l. eventual champion Stephens). Also made QFs at Washington DC (l. Kanepi) and Guadalajara 1000 (l. Bouzkova)
- Won third WTA doubles title in 2022 at St. Petersburg (w/McNally)
- Ended 2021 campaign in good form, advancing to R16 at Indian Wells (as qualifier, l. Jabeur), 2r at Moscow (as qualifier, l. Sakkari) and QF at Courmayeur (l. Samsonova)
- At 2021 Monterrey, posted first QF since 2019 (as qualifier, l. Golubic), then reached 3r at Miami (as WC, l. Muguruza)
- Lifted second WTA doubles title at 2021 Portoroz (w/Mihalikova)
- Broke into Top 100 on September 30, 2019, following QF run at Tashkent
- Scored first Top-10 win over No.10 Stephens in 1r at 2019 US Open
- Reached maiden WTA SF at 2019 Washington DC (l. eventual champion Pegula)
- Enjoyed doubles success in 2019, winning Prague and finishing R-Up at St. Petersburg (both w/Kuzmova)
- Season highlights in 2018 were making Grand Slam main draw debuts at Australian Open (l. Giorgi) and US Open (l. Goerges), coming through qualifying but falling in 1r at each
- Advanced through qualifying to reach the 2r for the first time at a WTA-tour level event at 2017 Kuala Lumpur (l. Han). Backed that performance up with two more 2r finishes that year at Istanbul (l. Yastremska) and Gstaad (l. Kontaveit)
 both as a qualifier
- Hoisted her fifth career ITF title in 2017 at \$25k ITF/Obidos 4-POR (d. Frech)
- Made WTA main draw debut at 2016 Moscow (as WC, l. Mladenovic in 1r). Also won a career-high four ITF titles in 2016 and made four runner-up finishes
- Produced a successful 2015 campaign on the ITF Circuit, reaching the finals at \$10K ITF/Antalya-TUR and \$10k ITF/El Kantaoui 29-TUN. Also made a SF run at \$10K ITF/El Kantoui 28-TUN
- Made professional debut as a qualifier at Premier event at 2014 Moscow (l. Monova)
- R-Up in girls' singles at 2015 Roland Garros (l. Badosa) and won doubles at 2016 Australian Open (w/Mihalikova)

- Reached second Grand Slam final at 2023
 Australian Open (l. Sabalenka in 3s); made Top 10 debut following tournament (January 30,
 2023). Also in 2023 won first two WTA 1000 title
 at Indian Wells and Rome and finished R-Up at
 Miami. Qualified for first WTA Finals, going 1-2 in
 Group Stage.
- Lifted maiden major at 2022 Wimbledon (d. Jabeur in F)
- In 2022 also finished R-Up at Adelaide (l. Barty) and Portoroz (l. Siniakova)
- Best result of 2021 were SFs at Eastbourne, Olympics and Chicago [500], and QFs at Abu Dhabi, Roland Garros, San Jose and Ostrava
- Opened 2020 season by reaching the championship match at four of her first five tournaments, including a title run at Hobart (d. Zhang in F)
- Made first final appearance at a Premier-level tournament with R-Up finish at St. Petersburg (I. Bertens); was rewarded with Top 20 debut at No.19 following run in Russia (February 17, 2020)
